EASTERN STATES MEET

Shenendehowa
Blazes in Relay

Shenendehowa High School won the boys' indoor distance medley yesterday with the second-fastest time at the meters distance in New York State history. By clocking 10 minutes 16.09 seconds at the Eastern States boys and girls championships in the Armory Track and Field Center in Manhattan, Shenendehowa failed to beat the state mark of 10:15.44 set by DeWitt Clinton of the Bronx in 1991.

Dan Tebanno led off for Shenendehowa with a 3:07.8 for 1,200 meters. Jason Hoffman followed with a 50.4 in the 400, Chris Jones had an 800-meter split of 1:59.4 and Rob Clouthier ran the 1,600-meter anchor leg in 4:18.4.

St. Anthony's of Long Island was runner-up to the upstate school at 10:23.66 and Notre Dame of New Jersey was third at 10:24.80. The girls' distance medley went to St. Anthony's with its best time of the season, 12:28.10.

Simon Gratz High of Philadelphia blazed to a meet record in the girls 800-meter relay with a 1:40.94 clocking. The boys' 800 relay went to Camden, N.J., in the swift time of 1:29.61; only Campus Magnet of Queens has a faster time in the East this year at 1:29.08.

Charlie Fernandez of Campus Magnet turned in his fastest time of the season in winning the 55-meter dash in 6.41 seconds. Two other New York City area winners were Paula George of Taft, the Bronx, in the girls' 200 (25.02 seconds) and Carlos Bedoya of Archbishop Stepinac in White Plains, in the boys' 200 (22.31 seconds).

Brown, Andrews blaze to victory

Camden wins 4x200; Buena girls take 4x800

NEW YORK — All season, people have been talking about how fast the brand new 200-meter banked track at the 168th Street Armory is. They weren't lying.

New Jersey's best track-and-field athletes proved that last night when they tore it apart at the 63rd Eastern States Championships as New Jersey's indoor all-time performance took a beating.

Camden won the boys' 4x200 in 1:29.61, the third fastest time in state history. Buena took first in the girls' 4x800 in 9:21.38, No. 6 all-time and Moorestown was third in the girls' 4x200 in 1:42.42, No. 5 all-time in the state.

Hackensack was second in the boys' 4x800 in 7:57.19, No. 3 in the nation this season and the fastest time by a Bergen County school since Bergen Catholic ran 7:57.8 in 1975.

Those weren't the only fast times in a meet dominated by New Jersey.

Amandi Rhett of Moorestown, who anchored the 4x200 in 24.8, won the 55-meter dash in 7.05, No. 5 all-time.

Danyne Brown of Camden won the boys' 55 hurdles in 7.34. Brown ran 7.29, in the trials, tied for second on the all-time list. Jason Andrews of Lakewood won the boys' 800 in 1:54.57, tied for No. 10 on the all-time list.

Kiera Underwood, second in the 55 hurdles at Sunday's Meet of Champions, won the hurdles on 8.27.

Marianne Herbst of Mount Olive in the two-mile 11:19.83, Angie Rosamilia of Parsippany Hills in the shot put (42-3) and Deirde Mullen of Notre Dame in the high jump (5-6).

Mullen upset M of C winner Cheryl Burdick of Ramsey in the high jump at 5-6 and Rosamilia upset M of C shot put winner Sarah Herskee of Mendham, second at 41-11½.

In the boys' 4x200, Camden had splits of 22.3 from Sean Brown, 21.9 from Jade Smith, 22.8 from John Morris and 22.5 from Tyree Jackson. The state record of 1:29.88 was set in 1988 by West Side.

"I thought we were going to get it tonight, but a bad handoff on the final exchange cost us," said Camden coach Martin Booker.

In the girls' 4x800, Buena had splits of 2:28.0 from Stephanie Maxwell, 2:21.0 from Lauren Ricci, 2:14.1 from Katrina Sye and 2:17.5 from Cheryl Ewing.

Buena is hoping to break the state record of 9:11.14 set in 1997 by Columbia.

"We think we can break the state record," said Sye. "I know we can break it when we go to Boston (the nationals on March 13-14)."

In the girls' 4x200, Moorestown's 1:42.42 is the the fastest time run in the state since Trenton ran 1:42.46 in 1986. Washington Township was fifth in the 4x200 1:42.85, No. 6 all-time.

In the boys' 4x800, Old Bridge was fourth in 8:00.81 and Lawrenceville fifth in 8:01.10. Matt Seidel anchored in 1:54.4 for Lawrenceville.

In the boys' distance medley, Notre Dame, despite dropping the

NEW YORK — Pat McManus is a junior defensive back on a perennial powerhouse, the St. Joseph Regional football team. Corey Kunz is a senior and a three-time All-Bergen cross-country runner at the same school.
But when winter and spring comes, the two athletes with widely divergent fall interests are the foundation of a very good track team. Tuesday night, they also were the only boys duo from the same school to win individual titles at the 63rd Eastern States indoor track meet at the Armory Track and Field Center.
McManus leaped 22 feet, 9½ inches to win the long jump, while Kunz won the two-mile in 9:30.77 over a field that included State 1,600-meter champion Jon Fasullo of Hunterdon Central. That highlighted a very good night for the North

Jersey contingent at the 260-school meet, the largest high school meet in the East.
"We both do such different things," said Kunz, referring to McManus. "Most of the time outdoors, I'm running three races and he's in four different events."
Kunz snapped back from a subpar performance in Sunday's State Meet of Champions 1,600 to defeat Washingtonville (N.Y.) standout Manuel Thomas for the second time in two weeks. Fasullo was third.
"I think Sunday had more to do with just running at Princeton than running poorly," said Kunz, who was eighth Sunday. "I run my best races here. I just wish they ran the State meet here."
McManus feels the same way about the Armory. For the second time in little more

than a week, the junior leaped to a personal best on his final attempt to snatch victory from another long jumper.
On Feb. 15, he had leaped 22 feet, one-half inch to defeat Westwood's Gareth Hedges at the Bergen County championships. Tuesday, it was the leap of 22-9½, second longest of the year in New Jersey and the sixth longest in Bergen history, that edged Diamond Woodford of Girard College High School in Philadelphia for the title by a half-inch.
"I knew it was a big meet and no matter how much it was for myself, the other kids drive me," said McManus, who had leaped 22-3½ in the earlier rounds before getting off his winning attempt. "Now I want to get 23 feet."
There were other historic local performances Tuesday as 16 area medals were awarded. Joe Velasquez of Paramus, run-

ning from the slowest seeded of five heats in the boys 400, set a Bergen County record by nearly a second, running 49.36 to beat Rutgers receiver Walter King's three-year-old mark by nearly a second. He finished fifth in the race.
Hackensack's 3,200-meter team of Leroy Brooks, Marquise and Maurice Singletary, and Thomas Baldwin was second in 7:57.19, third fastest in the nation this year and the fastest time by a Bergen team in 24 years.
Sheldon Smith of Teaneck was third in the triple jump and Natalie Popowicz of Clifton was third in the girls 800 despite inexplicably being placed in the second heat. Cheryl Burdick of Ramsey suffered her first loss of the year in the high jump, clearing 5-6 but losing in a jumpoff to Deirdre Mullen of Notre Dame.

THIRTEEN NOT ALWAYS AN UNLUCKY NUMBER

EASTERNS, Feb. 23, 168th St. Armory: Thirteen is not always an unlucky number, New Jersey athletes discovered as they notched just that number of victories at the 63rd edition of this meet: seven for the boys and six for the girls. And there could have been more as Lauren Contursi of Hunterdon Central, prohibitive favorite in the PV, no-heighted, Camden failed to compete a relay double when Sean Brown almost went down at the first exchange and Jain Ja Williams of Notre Dame lost out in the 200M after easily leading the trials.

But to the good news. The big individual breakthrough of the night came in the boys' 800 where Jason Andrews, who had picked the wrong event at the AG meet two days earlier, got it right this time and won the 800 from the second-seeded section in 1:54.57. Matching this in the relays was Camden's 1:29.61 in the 800R which came within a whisker of its own state record.

Danyne Brown of Camden led the other winners with a 7.29 heat in the HH before his 7.34 final runaway. St. Joseph Montvale had two winners, Corey Kunz in the 2M at 9:30.77 and Pat McManus in the LJ at 22-9 1/2. Terrance Glover added the final touch with his easy SP win at a PR of 59-8 3/4.

There were also a number of interesting non-winning efforts: three boys under 50.0 in the 400, led by Lenape's Mohamed Kanu in 2nd at 49.13, followed by his anchor leg on a 2nd place 3:20.82 1600R team; Trenton's 1:30.20 2nd in the 800R; Notre Dame's 10:24.80 3rd in the DMR after dropping the stick at the start.

There was one major upset in the girls' meet when Deirdre Mullen of Notre Dame won the HJ on misses from AG champ Cheryl Burdick of Ramsey at 5-6. And AG 55H champ Bridgette Ingram went down in the semi-finals of that even, leaving it to Kiera Underwood of Linden to win in 8.27. Angie Rosamilia reversed her AG loss to season-long rival Sarah Herskee of Mendham with a 42-3 in the SP.

Some other AG champs fared better. Amandi Rhett of Moores-town edged Magenta Taylor of Willingboro in the 55 in 7.05 and Cate Guiney of Middletown South switched to the mile and won in 5:03.39. This opened the door for Marianne Herbst to take the 2M in 11:19.83.

Buena put the finishing touches on with a splendid 9:21.38 win in the 3200R, Katrina Sye running 2:14 on the 3rd leg and Cheryl Ewing 2:17 on the anchor and then came back to place 2nd in the 1600R, Sye edging Medea Ashton of Washington Twp in 3:56.52.

Williams led a 2-3-4 200 finish in 25.25 and Mia Campo of St. Mary's JC just missed catching Shevonne Stodart of Uniondale in the 400 at 56.32.
