GR's Mineo takes 1,000 to remember

SUFFERN, N. Y. – One of the highlights of last year's Ridgewood Winter Games II was a rousing three-way battle in the girls' 1,000-yard run.

Wednesday night, the 1,000 was even better. The five-girl race at the front of the pack stole the show at Rockland Community College.

State outdoor 800-meter all-groups champion Kim Mineo of Glen Rock out-leaned Clair Nowakowski of Ridgewood and Panthers teammate Erin Henry at the finish to win in 2 minutes 46.5 seconds, the fastest time by a New Jersey runner in 10 years in this seldom-run event. Alexandra Brown of Kingston, N.Y., was fourth followed by Julia Emanuel of Tenafly. All finished with times that would have won any of the 11 previous meets.

"That's what makes track and field so special," said meet co-director Jacob Brown, who is also the longtime Ridgewood girls cross-country coach. "You never know when you're going to see a classic race, and when you get girls like this together and they all go after it, it's great fun."

Glen Rock coach D.J. Nimphius "told us he was entering all of us in the

1,000 and told us to get back to him if we had a problem with it, " said Mineo. "I think there were eight of us from Glen Rock in the event, and we weren't sure whether we all wanted to do it, but no one ever got back to him, so we all ran it."

The five runners quickly broke away from the rest of the field on the oversized 250-meter track. They took turns with the lead through the first three-plus laps before all launching into full-scale sprints for the final race to the finish.

Nowakowski grabbed the lead and Henry went with her, with Mineo slightly behind and Brown and Emanuel hanging on at the back of the pack. As the lead trio hit the top of the stretch, Henry grabbed the lead momentarily and then Nowakowski took it back while Mineo swung wide and drew even, finally winning with a lunge at the finish line.

After the race, the girls were all smiles, especially when their times were digested, knowing that more important races were coming, but maybe not more exciting ones.

Passaic Tech sprinter Davon Roberts and Bergen Catholic distance standout Ken Sinkovitz made their last warm-ups for Saturday's Group 4 State championships at Princeton good ones by winning the 55-meter dash and boys' 1,000-yard run, respectively.

Roberts remained unbeaten in the dash by edging Hackensack's Patel Whyte, and is looking forward to improving his record at States.

"My sophomore year I fell at the start of the race, and last year I was hurt and couldn't run," said Roberts. "This is going to be a big moment for me that I've been waiting for. Seeing [Teaneck's] Adrian Durant win Group 3 last week really pumped me up, and I'm trying to keep everything in stride while waiting."

Despite still suffering the effects of the flu, Sinkovitz ran away from 1:56 half-miler Mark Lee of South Shore (N.Y.) to win the 1,000 yards in 2:20.0, a solid performance.

"It was worse [Wednesday], so I decided to run today," said Sinkovitz, second in the indoor 800 last winter and a favorite this winter. "I had nothing to lose by running and I didn't want to go a whole week [before the State meet] without a race. I'll be ready for Saturday."
