### O'REILLY GETS NATIONAL RECORD AT VARSITY CLASSIC

**VARSITY CLASSIC, Feb. 9, NY Armory Ctr:** This was easily the meet of the season at this point, topped by a national girls' PV record of 13-5 from Danielle O'Reilly of Shawnee.

O'Reilly, who had earlier jumps of 12-10 and 13-0 at the new HIP vertical jump center in Mount Laurel (managed by the parents of Haddonfield's Mike Davis, who also won here at 15-0), had some trouble at 12-0, getting over only on her third try, but then cleared 12-6 and 13-0 before having the bar set at the record height, which she soared over on her second try.

But this was by no means the only highlight of a meet which had 130-plus schools entered and had to turn others away. The boys' 800M had the first meeting of Greg Gomez of Franklin and Mike Carmody of Berkeley Heights with Gomez leading all the way for a 1:54.3 victory.

Adian Sanderson of Ewing doubled the 200 and 400 in 21.7 and 48.4, Mohamed Khadrui dropped down to the 1600 and set a MR of 4:17.8, Justin Scheid of Pope John had a 4:18.4 anchor as the Lions easily qualified for Penn with a season-leading 10:22.0 and there were sterling field events marks from Ell Ash of Willingboro in the SP (59-3), Val Sisti of DePaul in the LJ (22-10) and Gabe Knutson of Ridgewood in the TJ (45-9 1/2). And Ridgewood had a season-leading 8:01.7 in the 3200R, while Willingboro had a 3:23.1 in the 1600R.

In other girls' action, frosh Symone O'Connor of Franklin made her first big splash with a solo win in the 200 in 25.0 (over fellow yearling Racquel Vassell of East Orange) and a tie with Avionne Sloan of Camden in the 400 in 57.2, Janine Davis had a season-leading 2:14.0 in the 800, Brittnee Bynoe of Willingboro won the 3200 from newcomer Ann Hay of Blair in 11:20.2 and her teammate, Kim Allen, took a hot 55H in 8.2.

Other field marks included a horizontal jump double by Consandria Walker of Hackensack at 18-6 and 37-5 1/4.

Westfield took the 3200R in 9:33.1 and Cherokee had a 12:26.8 for 4th in the DMR with Lisa Burkholder anchoring in 4:59.1. (Voorhees ran a creditable 12:42.5 in this one with half its team still leading the Vikings' basketball team.)

### CBA, JACKSON TAKE SHORE CONFERENCE TITLES

**SHORE CONFERENCE, Feb. 11, Red Bank:** Christian Brothers completed the hat trick here, winning its third major title in five days, 54 1/3-32, over Lakewood, while Jackson easily repeated in the girls' meet, 61-41, over TR East, despite the continued absence of its top hurdler, Jessica Fortune, who will, we hear, return outdoors.

CBA won just two events, Will Melofchik taking the 3200 in 9:50.31 and the 1600R team wrapping it up with a 3:35.12 win in a tough race with Lakewood. Top marks of the night were a 1:59.39 by Steve Iannaccone of Toms River East in the 800, a 6-6 in the HJ by Tom Rice of Middletown and a 56-6 1/2 by Dave Zaycek of Wall in the SP.

Jen Clausen led the Jackson victory as she won a battle of group champions in the 3200, finishing 50 yards ahead of Julie Ullmeyer of Shore in 11:24.36 and then ran 2nd to Alexi Gray of TRE in the 1600 in 5:16.14. Alisa Budd gave the Raiders another gold with a runaway 800 win in 2:18.98 and then joined Gray in a 4:11.11 relay win over Jackson.

Sonya Sullivan of Manchester won a hot hurdles duel from Bryanna Johnson of Jackson in 8.35 and the Jaguars wrapped it up with a 2-3 finish in the SP behind a 40-6 1/2 win for Amanda Harmata of Raritan.

There were several notable absentee from the meet, principally the Red Bank boys' distance crew, who were resting up for the Group III meet four days later.

# Maher caps Ridgewood's record win

**NEW YORK** — Dave Maher got an unexpected opportunity to redeem himself at the Varsity Classic on Monday night and the Ridgewood senior didn't bobble the chance — or drop the baton.

Five days after Maher dropped the baton on the opening turn of the 3,200 relay race at the Metropolitan Invitational, pushing the Maroons back to fourth, he came back to anchor the fastest 3,200 relay in the nation this season.

Erik Nygaard, Byron Williams, Mike Cator, and Maher won in 8:01.7 at the Ar-

mory Track Center.

"It would have been very easy for me to feel that because I messed up last week that I let the team down and feel sorry for myself," said Maher, one of two seniors on the team. "But the guys all came up to me and hugged me after the race and said not to worry, that we'd get another chance."

The chance came Monday after indoor coach Mike Mullin decided to rest Ari Zaminir after a minor injury at the Millrose Games and allow the other four members of the area's top distance team to have another shot at qualifying for the Penn Relays in April.

"We were going to try to run a fast dis-

her. He delivered a 2:00.5 anchor and the Maroons won by more than a quarter lap over runner-up Seton Hall.

"I was a little bit nervous before the race and my hands were sweating," said Nygaard, the team's other senior. "Then I didn't start too well, but the last two laps I began to hit my stride and the guys took it from there."

The Ridgewood win was one of seven North Jersey wins in the meet that attracted more than 140 schools and featured a national record by Shawnee's Danielle O'Reilly, who cleared 13 feet 5 inches in the girls pole vault.

Consandria Walker of Hackensack

won the long jump (18-6) and triple jump (37-5¼) despite spiking herself in the hand in the finals of the long jump.

Kennedy's Mohamed Khadraoui was severely tested in the 1,600 by Dave Alfano of West Orange, but pulled away to win in a meet and Passaic County record 4:17.8.

DePaul's Val Sisti had a North Jersey leading long jump of 22-10 to win that event, and Karen Langner of Clifton became the first North Jersey girl to clear 10 feet in the vault, taking fifth behind O'Reilly.
