O'REILLY GETS NATIONAL RECORD AT VARSITY CLASSIC

VARSITY CLASSIC, Feb. 9, NY Armory Ctr: This was easily the meet of the season at this point, topped by a national girls' PV record of 13-5 from Danielle O'Reilly of Shawnee.

O'Reilly, who had earlier jumps of 12-10 and 13-0 at the new HIP vertical jump center in Mount Laurel (managed by the parents of Haddonfield's Mike Davis, who also won here at 15-0), had some trouble at 12-0, getting over only on her third try, but then cleared 12-6 and 13-0 before having the bar set at the record height, which she soared over on her second try.

But this was by no means the only highlight of a meet which had 130-plus schools entered and had to turn others away. The boys' 800M had the first meeting of Greg Gomez of Franklin and Mike Carmody of Berkeley Heights with Gomez leading all the way for a 1:54.3 victory.

Adian Sanderson of Ewing doubled the 200 and 400 in 21.7 and 48.4, Mohamed Khadroui dropped down to the 1600 and set a MR of 4:17.8, Justin Scheid of Pope John had a 4:18.4 anchor as the Lions easily qualified for Penn with a season-leading 10:22.0 and there were sterling field events marks from Ell Ash of Willingboro in the SP (59-3), Val Sisti of DePaul in the LJ (22-10) and Gabe Knutson of Ridgewood in the TJ (45-9 1/2). And Ridgewood had a season-leading 8:01.7 in the 3200R, while Willingboro had a 3:23.1 in the 1600R.

In other girls' action, frosh Symone O'Connor of Franklin made her first big splash with a solo win in the 200 in 25.0 (over fellow yearling Racquel Vassell of East Orange) and a tie with Avionne Sloan of Camden in the 400 in 57.2, Janine Davis had a season-leading 2:14.0 in the 800, Brittnee Bynoe of Willingboro won the 3200 from newcomer Ann Hay of Blair in 11:20.2 and her teammate, Kim Allen, took a hot 55H in 8.2.

Other field marks included a horizontal jump double by Consandria Walker of Hackensack at 18-6 and 37-5 1/4.

Westfield took the 3200R in 9:33.1 and Cherokee had a 12:26.8 for 4th in the DMR with Lisa Burkholder anchoring in 4:59.1. (Voorhees ran a creditable 12:42.5 in this one with half its team still leading the Vikings' basketball team.)
