

Kennedy is impressive

Kennedy coach Jesse Dale is pleased with this year's track conversion to the metric system. "I love the metrics. When the athletes and coaches become accustomed and educated to them, I think they will find them much easier to follow, because of their easier-to-follow numbers [200, 400, 800 instead of 220, 440, 880]," he says.

And Dale may be even more pleased with metrics after his Knights' impres-

sive opening-meet win over Bergen Catholic, defeating the Crusaders, 85-55 at BC's track.

"I was surprised by the score," said Dale. "BC is young and inexperienced and it showed in the field events." But the field events weren't the Crusaders' only problems. Jeff Walters and John Savage helped the Knights dominate the sprints and hurdles, and Passaic cross-

country champion Paul Wright dropped down to the 400 and 800 meters and won those two events, as Kennedy scored 34 of 45 points in the five running events. The three then combined with Allah Graham to win the mile relay.

"Our kids performed well," said Dale. "I don't know how this compares to last year's performances at this time, but I think it means, with Passaic Tech and

Standouts back to defend titles

Area teams will have trouble matching the achievements of last year's powerhouse Teaneck girls track team, but that doesn't mean that the caliber of the runners has deteriorated.

Bergen County record-holders Bianca O'Connell (880); Mary Ellen McGowan (mile); Chris McDonnell (two-mile); Lizz Wahler (javelin); Lynn Greene (shot); Caroline Morris (long jump); and Liz Lee (triple jump) return. Except for Wahler, all figure to face tough competition in retaining their records.

Although Teaneck was weakened by the loss of All-County stars Dawn Booth and Karen Johnson, coach Cheryl Miller's squad will battle with Hackensack and Ridgewood for Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League honors. Teaneck

will compete with Saddle Brook, Englewood, Westwood, Eastside, and Tenafly for area recognition.

League favorites appear to be Westwood (Northern Bergen Interscholastic League); Saddle Brook (Bergen County Scholastic American); Rutherford and Secaucus (BCSL National); Park Ridge (BCSL Olympic); and Ramsey (B-PSL).

NNJIL

Junior All-Bergen hurdler Karen Gaines hopes to move into State contention this year, giving Teaneck a good leg up on retaining Bergen and State Sectional Group 4 honors. Gaines is joined by sprinters Stephanie Laughlin and Se-

ened by Passaic Tech, Glen Rock, and Hawthorne. The Rams return middle-distance star Deirdre Young, hurdler Nancy Lyon, quarter-miler Melanie Orsi, and distance runners Kathy Jones and Colleen Murphy. They have a chance at a third straight title.

Passaic Tech may be a year away as their top performers, sprinter Rhonda Crawley, jumpers Pam Felts and Claudia Moodie, hurdler Margaret Bugg, and distance runner Angela Jackson are all underclassmen. The James sisters, Julie and Marilee, might win the 200, 400, and 800 for Glen Rock.

Terri Dembek, two-time State champion quarter-miler, has graduated from Hawthorne and the Bears never will fill her shoes. But no one else in the league will, either, so with shot-discus thrower Sue DeFlora, and hurdler Lauren VanderEems, Hawthorne will threaten.

Bethana Newton is Midland Park's best, while a strong junior class could provide some surprises at Manchester. Hurdler Mary Bieger, sprinters Cathy and Karen Wolons, and shot putter Bernadette Cronin will make Sue Piscatello's fourth year at Waldwick an interesting one.

Cliffside Park is also improved with weight ace Jackie LoBue, distance runner Pam Okolita, and soph high jumper Mary Samori, but shot-put star Beth Krivda has decided to pass up her senior year. Dumont has a solid distance quartet of Patty McCluskey, Chris McCann, and Noreen and Trish O'Connor. Garfield has State Group 2 two-mile champ Violetta Josevska, while shot putter Janice Welte and sprinter Shemayne Anderson make Ridgefield Park interesting.

BCSL National

Bianca O'Connell ran 2:16.9 as a sophomore and if her improvement continues, she may get near 2:12 this year in the Bergen County Scholastic League. That will help Rutherford in its effort to regain its league championship from a solid Secaucus team. Hurdler-sprinter Rosemary Jordan, jumper Terri Embser, high jumper Whitney Hiller, and hurdler-high jumper Ann Marie Brigante also make the Bulldogs strong.

Miler Simone Mele and the rest of the standout Cresskill cross-country team make the Cougars a threat in major meets. Diane Connolly, Helene Gallivan, and Cindy Wehl will provide points in distances and Doreen Sullivan will score in the javelin and jumps.

Connie Washnik takes over at Becton and if she does for the track team what she did for basketball, the Wildcats will be a surprise. Becton's basketball team made the Group 1 Sectional finals. Hurdler Donna Rohrman is Becton's best. Millie Rey returns at Leonia for first-year coach Barbara Greene.

BCSL Olympic

Last year's results: Park Ridge 98, Bogota 64, rest of league 61. This year's standings probably won't be much different. Defending Group 1 Sectional champ Park Ridge count heavily on sprinters Delia McDarby and Andrea Ostrowski, jumpers Dawn Johansmeyer and Tracey Gunther, distance star Heather Kelly and weight people Bridget Welch and Celia Mistretta.

Hurdler Joanne Hancock, quarter-miler Janice Charo, and miler Denise Murphy make Bogota strong again. Defending javelin champion Tara Price and half-miler Lois O'Donnell came on strong at the end of last season. Distance runner Chris Slodolak is Wallington's best.

NBIL

Westwood was the second-best team in Bergen County last year and the North Bergen Interscholastic League Cardinals may have enough talent to improve one spot this year. Claudia Lynch was the County 400-meter champ last year, and is versatile enough to win races from 220 yards to a mile. But that would bring her into conflict with the State's second best two-miler last year, Chris McDonnell. Sprinters Lori Morton, Carolyn Ferri, and Kim Catherman return. Weight thrower Kathi Cochran may be the key this year.

Indian Hills lost four standouts to graduation and hurdler-quartermiler Debbie Van Dyk to an injury. But the Braves still have sprinter-jumper star Carolyn Moore, a threat to win four races in every meet.

Old Tappan is another threat. Debbie Meberg, Colleen Dunn, and Sue Ellen McSweeney are members of the Knights' second-place State cross-country team, and jumpers Kris Pilatowski and Debbie Pagan are solid. Cassandra Bally and Doris Kaiser make the Old Tappan weight team formidable.

McGowan makes Pascack Valley formidable as well, and with sprinter-hurdler Ann Gaertner, high jumper Jane Porter, and distance runner Cheryl Wagner the Indians will contend. Demarest is also strong, with shot putter Yvonne Sheard, sprinters Leslie LaFronz and Marie McVeigh, and distance runner Gerylynn Abramonte impressive.

Stephanie Bembridge of Northern Highlands jumped 17 feet, 5½ inches as a freshman and is a three-time All-Bergen performer, twice in the long jump and last year as a high jumper. She could prove to be the best in the County in either event this year.

Chris Ilgner and Debbie Bishop are the best in Ramapo's lineup, while hurdler Lisa Zollo, and shot putter Sue Marshall lead Wayne Hills.

B-PSL

Ramsey's reign as Bergen-Passaic Scholastic League champion is threat-

dins tough in the middle distances and Anne Kraemer hopes to return to her 1978 mile form.

Diane Agosta Allen takes over at Paterson Catholic and All-Passaic cross-country star Cookie Dunne and hurdler Stacy Slaughter should make her job easier. Pete Sohn takes over at Paul VI, with two fine distance runners in Pam Farinella and Joan Profita. Lynn St. Germain graduated from Queen of Peace last year, but joins the squad as an assistant coach this season. QP has 65 candidates, including All-Bergen basketball star Lisa Long.

Eastside returns County champs Melva Burns (100), Natalie Jordan (440), Yolanda Jordan (880), the entire 440 relay team, and three-fourths of the mile relay. Henry Baker's five-year dual meet record is an astounding 56-1 and doesn't figure to get any poorer this year. The Ghosts are loaded as Kartina Bease returns after a year's absence and Michelle Matthews also returns. A word about Natalie Jordan — Terri Dembek lost two races in Passaic County in four years — both to Jordan last year.

County long-jump champ Lisa Washington makes the Knights a good team and Passaic County cross-country champ Karen Kirkland might help make the Knights a great team. Sharon Livingston is another Kennedy bright spot.

Lakeland didn't win a meet last year, but Beth Sova set a County record as well as winning the Group 3 state shot put title. She enters this year's competition as the favorite to repeat.

NNJPC, Independents

Randy Krakower is Paramus Catholic's fourth coach in four years, but the Paladins are flying and could be the County's dark horses. All-Bergen indoor 1,000 champ Mary Kay Saletta and teammate Mary Hurley make the Pala-

ena Ashby, half-miler Dawn Stackhouse, and triple jumper Kris Lange as Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League standouts.

Three-time All-Bergen indoor sprint champ Renita Terry of Hackensack hopes to have a successful outdoor season. The Comets also return Morris, the County record-holder (18 feet) in the long jump, hurdlers Laurie Carter and Debbie Leichtnam, and quarter-miler Jenni Osbourne.

Ridgewood is very strong where Teaneck and Hackensack are weak, especially in distances, with frosh Mary Ellen Mileski, the Bergen cross-country runnerup, junior Carol Dickstein, and junior Kathy Duffy. Weight stars Lisa Glidewell and Janet Sauerman and sprinters Judy Davis and Julie Smith make Jock Brown's 10th team a very competitive one.

Indoor two-mile All-Bergen star Lisa Schadler leads a good Bergenfield distance team. Eileen Healy, Teri Malespina, and sprinter Kerry Good make the Bears a dark-horse possibility. Nancy Deneka is one of the state's top middle-distance runners and will make Bloomfield a threat in major meets. June O'Leary will be Fair Lawn's top performer. Passaic Valley lost its finest track athlete ever when Joyce Barmore graduated, but the Hornets hope long jumper Beth Fischer can better her fine freshman season. Triple jumper Sandy Mueller and distance standout Hannah Herman are Wayne Valley's top hopes.

Relay meets top schedule

The biggest victory in Gerry Rosen's 12-year coaching career occurred last week, but Rosen wasn't around to enjoy it. The Cresskill track coach had a severe case of bronchitis on the day his Cougars routed Rutherford, 89-51, ending the Bulldogs' 78-meet, eight-year winning streak.

"Believe me, it's a lot worse not being there and waiting for a phone call," said Rosen, who will lead the Cougars into the Rutherford Relays tomorrow. "My assistant coach, Rich Miller, said he'd call me as soon as the meet was over. I figured that would be about 6 o'clock, so I sat by the phone."

"Six went by, then 6:30, 6:45, and then 7 p.m. and no call. I figured we had lost. But the team was stuck in traffic, and he finally called me about 7:15."

The win didn't surprise Rosen as much as the margin of victory. The Cougars lost a dual meet by two points and the Bergen County Scholastic National meet by three to Rutherford last year. They also lost much less to graduation than their opponents. "We're not 40 points better than them," said Rosen. "We just

had a tremendous day and we'll have to be wary of them in the league meet."

"We have a very enthusiastic group of kids who have been together for three years," he said. "We have only four or five seniors, and we've lost only one kid from the County freshman champs."

The best of Cresskill's athletes is junior Mike Fezza, who defeated Mahwah's Ian Leavesley in the Group 1 sectional championship mile last year, Leavesley's last loss to a Bergen County runner. Fezza missed the cross-country and indoor seasons because of disciplinary reasons, but is back, better than ever.

"He's such a self-motivator that he works himself hard all the time," said Rosen. "The suspension might have been the best thing that ever happened to him beyond track, although it didn't help him in track."

Intermediate hurdler Tom Hessmer is winning a battle with a back problem that forced him to miss the basketball season, and Mark Wiley has added the discus to his point-gathering in the sprints and triple jump. "He's one of the most versatile athletes around," said Rosen, who runs the Bergen County DemiDecathlon each year. "Then we have four distance runners who helped us to a fine cross-country season even without Fezza."

"We've had promising years before," said Rosen, whose teams have one County Group 1 and one State sectional championship and a host of seconds and thirds. "This year, teams like Mahwah and Emerson are tough as always, but we are very strong," said Rosen. Rutherford can attest to that.

In addition to the Rutherford Relays, which also feature Emerson and Tenafly, three other relays meets are scheduled for Saturday.

The St. Joseph Relays in Montvale feature most of the better large-school teams in the area, including Group 3 sectional champion Englewood, defending champ Paramus, and Passaic County powers Eastside and Kennedy. But the standout teams should be Trenton Central and Plainfield with their outstanding middle and short distance teams.

Paramus Catholic and Don Bosco are among five area teams at the Nanuet Invitational Relays in Rockland County. The Dons won the Parochial A relays in State indoor competition but probably are over-matched against the top-flight teams.

The best of the meets however, is the Memorial Relays at Fairleigh Dickinson University in Teaneck. The meet, which starts today, has 135 schools, including Group 4 sectional and Bergen County champion Teaneck.

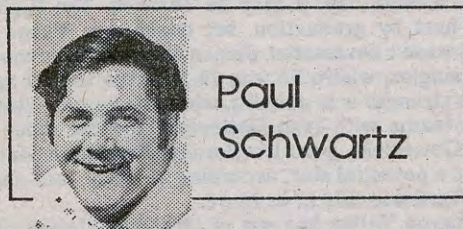

Ashby, one of Bergen County's finest sprinters, ran a sensational anchor leg in the mile relay, bringing Teaneck from 15 yards behind to win the race and apparently the meet, 60-58.

But it was Ashby's fourth race of the day and Teaneck forfeited the race and with it, the meet. The Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League stubbornly sticks to the antiquated method of determining 60 per cent of the league standings by dual meet results and only 40 per cent by the league meet, so it will be very tough for Teaneck to win the NNJIL. The Highwaymen won't win the title unless they finish two places ahead of Ridgewood at the league meet, assuming the two teams win their remaining dual meets.

"I take full responsibility," said Teaneck coach Cheryl Miller. "We had one of our regular mile-relay people out of school and another one injured, and Selena volunteered to run. I just didn't realize she was ineligible."

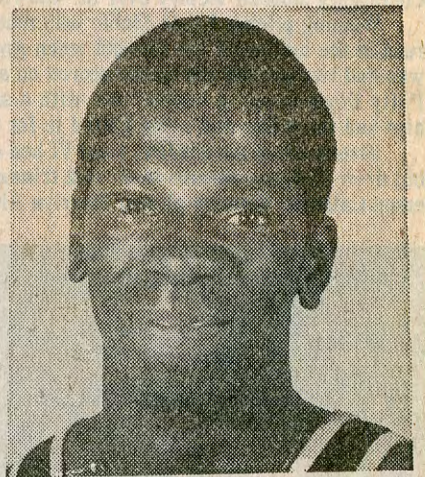

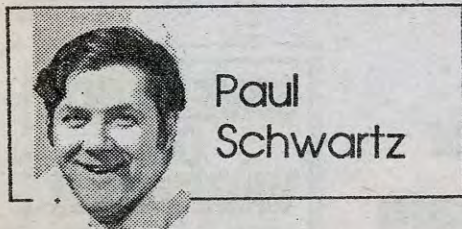

Paul VI AD points in right direction

Paul VI athletic director Roger McNeill is in his first year as AD at the Clifton school and the 27-year-old former football and basketball coach already has faced a decision that most athletic directors, fortunately, never have to face.

McNeill suspended first-year Patriot baseball coach Rolando Gonzalez Friday for two games, following the Patriots' forfeit loss to St. Joseph Regional Thursday when Gonzalez pulled his team off the field. St. Joseph was leading, 4-0, in the fifth inning when base umpire Mario Imbarrato ruled against the Patriots on the catch of a fly ball to left-centerfield. St. Joseph scored two runs on the play after Paul VI outfielders Kevin Peters and John Fitzpatrick collided. Gonzalez claimed Peters caught the ball and held on to it long enough after the collision.

"I met with our coach, and my assistant athletic director, Mary Falcone, for 45 minutes Friday," said McNeill. "And I talked to the St. Joseph coach and the two umpires involved. We hope it's no reflection on our players, who handled the situation very well. The situation just got out of hand. There's no history of this happening before."

The Patriots lost their first game without Gonzalez, 6-1, to Queen of Peace and play Pope Pius today. Gonzalez will return for a Wednesday game with Don Bosco Tech.

Gonzalez admits that he might have acted too quickly in pulling his team from the field, but he says, "Legally, I couldn't leave the field and leave the kids behind me. My

assistant coach, Ed Looney, couldn't be there because of personal business, and we had no other adult supervision."

There is a possibility of further action by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association, but neither McNeill nor Gonzalez would comment on that possibility.

"I think the suspension was unnecessary. The AD was just doing his job and I thought I was just doing mine. Maybe I made a mistake pulling the team off the field," said Gonzalez. "But it was my decision, and I'll stick with it. I'm hoping it doesn't happen again."

A comment seems appropriate here. Winning in high school sports is important, but more important is the development of young players, both as athletes and sportsmen. Paul VI has a young and struggling team, [3-7 after winning the State Parochial B title last year] and needs direction to develop its players. That direction should take the form of helping athletes learn to cope with hardships, including the occasional bad call that affects the game. Hopefully, Gonzalez has learned that lesson.

The second annual Bergen County Girls Meet of Champions will be held at Tenafly High School May 27 at 5:30 p.m. Twelve competitors will be selected for each of the events by May 20, with 24 to be picked in the hurdles and 100-meter dash. Coaches will be advised of the format for notification of invited athletes in a letter to be mailed this week.

The Pope Pius freshman distance-medley relay team broke the Cresskill Relays record in the event Saturday with a time of 12:17.7. The team was made up of Mike Otero, Jim Raymond, John Wereschagin, and Jose Rubiani.

Is national record in their grasp?

Ridgewood girls eye county marks

By WALT KEOGH

NORTHWEST BERGEN — Coach Jock Brown has a headache, but he is not crying out to spell relief. In fact, the coach of the Ridgewood High School girls' track team is rather enjoying it. His headache lies in the comfortable pondering of the question: "Which Bergen County record should the girls try to break in Saturday's Bergen County Girls' Relays at New Milford?"

Brown is trying to decide if his girls should try to better their own county 6,400-meter relay record of 22:11.2 set in last weekend's Rutherford Relays, a meet which the Maroons won with 40 points, or go instead for the distance medley relay mark which they established earlier this year.

And then, there is the tantalizing germ of an idea to take a shot at the national scholastic record in the 6,400-meters, a mark Brown says is 40 seconds away from the time turned in by his girls at the slower Rutherford track but could be made up (at the average rate of 10 seconds per girl) on the faster New Milford track.

Brown says he will wait until late in the week before passing a final judgment on what combination of girls will be the sharpest for the meet and what event shall be the target for a record attempt.

He will certainly consider last week's winning 6,400-meter relay team of Colleen Wright (5:58.3), Mary Ellen Mileski (5:21.3), Kathy Duffy (5:29.5) and Carol Dickstein (5:21.5). Just add about 1.4 seconds to each girls' time and you will have their approximate time for the mile. Using those calculations, and allowing for a 10-second

performance at New Milford, it would seem that Mileski and Dickstein would be in mid-season form to challenge the five-minute mark in the mile.

Another object of Brown's scrutiny is his distance medley relay team of Kathy Duffy (800 meters), Alison MacGregor (400 meters), Mileski (1,200 meters) and Dickstein (1,600 meters).

The distance medley quartet placed third at Rutherford, but Brown feels that his record-holders have a chance to better their own mark should he decide to seek a new record in that event.

MacGregor, who looms as a prominent figure in Brown's record planning, anchored last week's winning sprint medley team to victory at Rutherford. MacGregor, considered by Brown as one of the top half-milers (or 800 meter runners) in the county,

followed the Maroon tandem of Gretchen Sigler, Julie Smith and Judy Davis to spark her team to a victory in 4:33.1.

Ridgewood had two other winning teams at Rutherford, and Lisa Glidewell played a part in both triumphs. Glidewell did 36 feet, 9½ inches in the shot put in leading her team, which was also composed of Janet Sauerman and Joyce Sauerman, to victory with a combined effort of 96 feet, one-half inch; and threw the discus 104 feet, eight inches, as she, Cindy Slawek and Janet Sauerman teamed up for a winning total of 286 feet, 9½ inches.

Ridgewood also took third places in the 3,200-meters (10:56.1), 800-meters (1:54.8), 1,600-meters (4:27.3) and high jump (13-2), and fifth place in the 400-meters (54.1).

Other winners from last weekend's relay championship activity were Mahwah (intermediate hurdles) and Glen Rock (pole vault) at the Cresskill Relays and Ramsey (four-mile relay) and Fair Lawn (discus) at the Wayne Hills Relays.

Phil Brophy and Thabani Muller were Glen Rock's standouts at Cresskill where the team finished in a tie for fifth place. Brophy did 12 feet in the pole vault, while teammate Scott Klodowski did 11-0, to spark the Panthers to a combined height of 23 feet, a mark that equalled the meet record set by Mahwah in 1979.

Brophy did 17 feet, 8¼ inches in the long jump, behind Muller's 18 feet, 10¼ inches, as the two combined for a third place effort of 36 feet, seven inches.

Muller ran a 2:02.7 half-mile to lead Glen Rock to a second place finish in 3:35.5 in the sprint medley.

RIDGEWOOD — Lisa Glidewell is a senior track and field star whose outstanding efforts Saturday paid off as she helped lead Ridgewood High School to championship honors in the Rutherford Girls Relays. By doing so, she has been selected as The Ridgewood News "Athlete of the Week."

Glidewell, one of four talented seniors on eight-year veteran coach Jock Brown's Maroon squad, led her shot put and discus teams to gold medals with tosses of 36 feet, nine and one-half inches and 104-8, respectively, to earn the athlete of the week.

The 18-year-old performer, originally came out for the team as a sprinter but has done well in many instances for the team.

"I hope we'll do well again this Saturday in the Bergen County Relays," said Glidewell. "The team is doing well and I hope we can turn in another good effort," she remarked.

When not in a track uniform, the Ridgewood athlete is busy on the sidelines during the basketball and football seasons performing with the varsity cheerleaders.

Glidewell, who stands 5-4, originally threw the eight-pound ball in the shot put competi-

tion. But they've switched to the international four-kilogram style and she is getting better results each time out.

"She occasionally runs on a relay team and has also triple jumped for us," said coach Brown who ran track and cross-country at Penn State. He graduated in 1967.

"Lisa is a good athlete. She has good qualities, shows good coordination and has the strength to go with it," the Ridgewood coach said.

"I feel that as the season goes along Lisa will do better in both weight events for us. She should be able to throw a lot farther," Brown said.

"We should be a contender in both the Bergen County Relays and Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League title run.

"Teaneck is very strong. They have some awesome talent while Hackensack also has several good athletes. Westwood is also very strong with some tough kids. I hope we can put in a good effort and possibly get some breaks."

Ridgewood girls set national mark

NEW MILFORD — Two dramatic stories emerged at the third annual Bergen County Girls Relay Championships. The first was how champions Teaneck in Group 3-4 and Saddle Brook among the Group 1-2 schools squeaked by for half-point and one-point wins over the runners-up.

The other was Ridgewood's four-mile relay team's run to a national high-school record of 21:25.7. The combined effort of Alison McGregor, Mary Ellen Mileski, Kathy Duffy, and Carol Dickstein bettered the 21:33.9 set only last week by a Maryland high school team.

The relay was another milestone for the Ridgewood girls, each of whom bettered her previous mile best.

Dickstein, who anchored the team and was timed in 5:15, said, "I wouldn't have been as motivated if it wasn't for the record."

"We knew we'd have to work hard ourselves because no one else would work us," she said. The second team to cross the line was Pascack Valley, and the Indians were lapped by the winner.

The Maroons' only challenge came on the first leg when Ramsey took the lead for a couple of laps. From then on, the challenge was only against the clock.

Although the Maroons were ahead of their hoped-for splits, coach Jock Brown was not without worries. Duffy was one. She had been to the prom Friday night, but she bettered her expected time.

Brown was also concerned about Dickstein's third lap. He yelled "This is the

big one" to the junior as she rounded the turn into the third lap. "The third lap is the time when runners tend to let down," he said.

Ridgewood wasn't the only team to break records. Teaneck broke the Bergen County sprint medley and triple jump records. Stephanie Laughlin, Selena Ashby, Judy Palmer, and Dawn Stuckhouse turned in a 4:15.1. Karen Gaines jumped 36 feet, 2 1/2 inches to lead the triple jumpers.

Records didn't allay coach Cheryl Miller's fears as Westwood closed in on the Highwaymen in their attempt to re-

peat as team champions. Going into the mile relay, Westwood was 2 1/2 points behind. All the Cardinals needed was to win the event and have Teaneck finished anywhere from third place down. Westwood won, but Teaneck came in second. Teaneck finished with 37 1/2 points and Westwood with 37.

"I didn't anticipate Westwood at all," said Miller, who had worried about Ridgewood. "I realized their runners were good, but I didn't expect them to do so well in the field."

Westwood coach Bill Morrow lamented about the errant handoff in the 880 relay. Morrow said he thought his team would have finished either second or third if it hadn't had the bad handoff. Westwood finished out of the money.

"That cost us the meet," Morrow said.

While Westwood fell short at the finish, Saddle Brook succeeded and thereby won its third County trophy. The Falcons captured the final events, the two-mile and mile relays, to overcome Tenafly. The Tigers, who had kept the Group 1-2 lead all day, did no better than fourth in the mile relay.

Ridgewood made plans to set national mark

Setting a national record is no fluke. It's mapped out step by step. The Ridgewood girls four-mile relay team followed that exact approach in setting a national record of 21:25.7 at the recent Bergen County Relays in New Milford.

"The week before, when we ran at the Rutherford Relays, we broke the County record on a slow track with a 22:11," coach Jock Brown said. "I began to think that we could have a good chance to go

for the State and possibly the national record. So I began to make a few calls to check the exact times."

A national record had been set a week earlier by Bethesda-Chevy Chase High School in Maryland. Its time was 21:33.9, and looking at some past times from his runners, Brown knew his team of Alison McGregor, Mary Ellen Mileski, Kathy Duffy, and Carol Dickstein had an excellent shot.

"I approached the kids with the idea and they got all excited," Brown said.

"You really have to want to do something like this. I thought I'd get a 'maybe' reaction from the girls, but instead they got really psyched. There never seemed to be a doubt in their minds."

Brown and his relay team began to work on times that would be needed from each member. As it turned out, they all ran personal bests in the race. McGregor, a senior, started things off with a 5:33.1 leg, two seconds faster than anticipated. Freshman Mileski was next.

"She shot out like a bandit," the coach

said. "By the third lap, I knew we looked good. Mary Ellen was a few seconds ahead of our projected time and was maintaining her pace." She finished the second leg with a 5:13.0.

Duffy, a junior, had a solid time of 5:24.4, with only Dickstein to run the last part of the race. "I had confidence in Carol. She's such a good runner."

But Dickstein got out too fast and it worried Brown a little. "She was so up, she ran the first lap in 72 seconds. I was hoping she wouldn't burn out." Dickstein

was able to finish at her projected time, 5:15.2, and lapped second-place Pascack Valley in the process.

"Everything was perfect for the race," Brown said. "There was a slight breeze, and we got some cloud covering when the race started, so it wasn't too hot. And the fans were great. All the cheering helped us."

The four-mile relay team wasn't the only first-place finisher at the relays. The discus team won, with a combined throw of 305feet 2 inches.

Defending champs, records fall in Bergen meet

It became apparent yesterday that the Bergen County Girls Track Championships this year will be anything but easy for defending champions. In yesterday's opening three field events, held at Ridgewood High School, three defending champions were defeated and three Bergen County records were set.

The biggest upset came in the Group 1-2 javelin, where defending Bergen County and State Group 2 champ Liz Wahler of Saddle Brook was stunned by senior Carla Cusate of North Arlington. Cusate won the competition with a toss of 130 feet, 2 inches, 1½ feet better than Wahler's County record, set earlier in the season.

Cusate, who never had thrown the javelin before this year, became only the second Bergen County

thrower to reach 120 feet. Her second preliminary throw of 123 feet established her as a threat to dethrone Wahler, who had never lost in Bergen County. She then set the record on her third throw, and Wahler fell six feet short in an attempt to catch up. Wahler was second.

County shot put record-holder Lynn Greene of Englewood finished third behind Demarest's Yvonne Sheard and Ridgewood's Lisa Glidewell in the Group 3-4 event. Sheard threw the four-kilogram [about 8 pounds, 8 ounces] shot 38 feet, 1 inch, the longest Bergen put ever with the larger shot. Greene threw 42-9 with the eight-pounder last year.

Karen Gaines extended her County record triple jump to 36-6 in the Group 3-4 event to lead the defending champion Highwaymen to a second-place standing after three events, one point behind West-

wood. Carolyn Grissoni of Westwood won the javelin, edging Cliffside Park's Anne Revechioon on a better second throw after both had a best throw of 112-5. Other Group 1-2 winners were Liz Lee of Tenafly in the triple jump, and Fran Bonczykowski of Lyndhurst in the shot put.

The meet resumes tonight at 5 p.m. at New Milford. Surprisingly, while most high school meets are going to metrics, the Bergen meet is returning to yards for one final year as the New Milford track has yet to be converted to the metric system.

That gives standouts like Claudia Lynch of Westwood [Group 3-4 440], Bianca O'Connell of Rutherford [1-2 880] and Chris McDonnell of Westwood [3-4 two mile] one last chance to break or extend County records at the Imperial distances.

But the runner who is probably happiest with

the old distances is Mary Ellen McGowan of Pascack Valley, who will get another chance to crack the five-minute barrier in the mile. McGowan's best is 5:03.3 in her third-place finish in the State Meet of Champs last year, but she has run some sensational 1500s this year.

In the team races, Teaneck, Westwood, and Ridgewood figure to battle in Group 3-4, with Teaneck's sprinting and jumping matched against Ridgewood's distance running and Westwood's overall depth.

In Group 1-2, Saddle Brook will battle Rutherford, Tenafly, and Group 1 powerhouse Park Ridge. Saddle Brook is strong in nearly every event, but Tenafly and Rutherford can match Saddle Brook's strength in some events, while the Owls have very good balance.

RIDGEWOOD — From tireless junior running star Kathy Duffy to Cindy Slawek, a sophomore who surprised with four crucial points in the weights the unbeaten Ridgewood High girls track team came through with a magnificent team effort to eke out an important 61-57 victory over a swift and talented Hackensack squad Monday.

Kathy's days work totalled some three and 4/10th miles in her races, and it came just two days after she teamed with senior Alison MacGregor, junior Carol Dickstein and freshman Mary Ellen Mileski to set a national scholastic record in the four-mile relay. Their 21:25.7 clocking clipped eight seconds off the mark established by a Maryland team the past week.

All four showered their star quality Monday in the close struggle with the Comets that turned into a three-hour marathon due to delaying wind gusts and passing threats of a thunder storm. Wayne Valley also competed in the triple dual meet.

Coach Jock Brown's Maroons were 72 1/2-45 1/2 victors over Wayne Valley which lacked the depth of the powerful host team and Comets. Ridgewood is 6-0 in the NNJIL following the two wins and in a solid position to capture the title. Hackensack, which bested Wayne Valley, 71-46, is 5-1 and the Passaic County team has a 6-3 record.

Duffy won the 3000 meters with an 11:49 clocking, finishing 41 seconds ahead of WV's Hannah Herman and lapping runners in the process. She was runnerup to Dickstein in the 1500 meters, although both finished together in an easy triumph and Carol was given a one-second edge in 5:26. Any Kathy placed fourth in the 800-meter contest which Mileski won in 2:24.7. "Kathy was very important to us today," Brown said.

Ridgewood won although school record discus thrower Janet Sauerman (115-6) was ill. Tossing out the winning 103-6 mark by overall winner Monica Vollman of Wayne Valley, Lisa Glidewell of the Maroons took five points over the Comets with her 95-3 toss and Slawek prevented Hackensack from getting second place with an 84-8 effort. "It was the discus that put us over the top," Brown said.

Brown knew the Maroons would have to own a winning edge before the final event, the mile relay, because the Comet quartet has not been beaten in league competition. Any they breezed to a 4:20.6 victory, anchored by Renita Terry.

But it was all over before the relay, because of Slawek's scoring in the weights. "I guess the surprise was Cindy basically getting four points," Brown said.

"She usually just throws the discus. She also throws the javelin, which is not a league event though. She came through for us in the shot by entering the event getting third against Hackensack. She throws it a little bit in practice but doesn't normally throw it in a meet."

Kim Slawek, Cindy's sister, holds the school record in the javelin (110-0) set last season.

"Everyone did really well," the coach remarked.

Hackensack's Caroline Morris was the day's lone triple winner—flashing to victories in the 100 (12.0) and 200 (25.7) meters and spanning 16-6 3/4 in the long jump. Teammate Lori Carter won the low hurdles, 15.1, and triple jump, 32-11, and ran the third leg of the mile relay.

Discussing the national record, Brown said:

"All four ran their best times. To have all four do their best in one race is really tough."

Defending champs may not keep titles

There may be some new boys track teams on top of the Bergen County Scholastic League National and Olympic Divisions, Northern Bergen Interscholastic League, and the Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League after this weekend.

In each league, one team has dominated in recent years, with Rutherford winning seven straight BCSL National titles, Bogota four straight in the Olympic, Indian Hills four in a row in the NBIL, and Teaneck two straight in the NNJIL.

But while each of these schools may be a contender in this year's competition, other schools are favored to take the league titles.

The most interesting meet looms in the BCSL National Division. Cresskill easily handled Rutherford, 85-55, in an opening-week dual meet, but clashes in relay meets showed Rutherford to be stronger. Both schools won their respective Bergen County individual Group titles last week, with the Cougars out-pointing Mahwah, 63-45, in Group 1, while Rutherford edged Queen of Peace, 49-43 1/2, in Group 2.

Cresskill seems to have more strength in more events as the Bulldogs got most of their points in just four events last week — the discus, hurdles, and long jump. But Cresskill has scorers in Mark Wiley and Tom Hessmer who can break into Rutherford's strengths, and has performers such as distance star Mike Fezza, a possible tripler in the 800, 1500, and 3000, who can dominate in the running events. Rutherford bases much of its hopes on hurdler Roger Wilms and weightman John Pecora.

In the Olympic Division, both Ridge-

field and Bergen Tech appear to be ready to handle Bogota. Bill Broderick is the heart of the Ridgefield team, while Theo Smith is Bergen Tech's best performer. Greg Kohles will help the Bucs stay close. Both meets start today with field events at Emerson and end tomorrow with the track meet at Cresskill.

Pascack Valley and Old Tappan tied for second place in last week's Group 3 County championships and figure to battle for the NBIL title Saturday at Pascack Hills. Valley hopes Dan Porter and Rob Doran will have better days than last week, when they combined for just 16 points, about half of what coach Bill Henshaw expected from them. Old Tappan has a fine distance and jumping team with John Nelson and Andy Palahnik both County champs. Demarest and Ramapo, with double County titlist Dana Ellis, will cause some problems.

Hackensack is favored to upend Teaneck and Wayne Valley in the NNJIL meet. Doug Jackson, a triple winner last Saturday, may attempt the feat again at Saturday's meet at Hackensack.

In other meets, Paramus Catholic, Queen of Peace, and St. Joseph Regional will battle for today's Northern New Jersey Parochial Conference Meet at St. Joe's, while Kennedy is the Passaic Valley Conference favorite today at William Paterson. Passaic Tech is a prohibitive favorite to win its second Bergen-Passaic Scholastic League title in three years tomorrow night at Hawthorne, while Saddle Brook, Dumont, Tenafly, and Englewood will battle for the Bergen County Scholastic American title Saturday at Englewood.

Tenafly girls look ahead to States

Last year, the Tenafly girls track team scored only one point in the state Group 2 track meet. But that wasn't too bad, considering it was the first time the Tigers had ever scored any points in the meet.

This season that same team is back, and head coach Ellen Alford and assistant coach Gordon Wallace are hoping for some good things in the meet this year.

"We had 60 girls come out for track this spring," Alford said, "and they're all dedicated. They run all week to stay in shape, and at practices the girls run with the boys. Sort of a combined effort."

Alford feels that practicing with the boys team has helped her squad tremendously, particularly in the distance events. But the Tigers, who are 4-0 in dual meets this season, have strength in every department. "We don't have to rely on just one event to give us points," Alford said. "We can get a few points in almost everything, and I think that's a key factor to our success."

Tenafly took top honors last Thursday in Groups 1-2 at the Bergen County Track and Field Championships. The Tigers took first in four events and picked up four second-place finishes. Senior Liz Lee had an excellent day, with two firsts (triple and long jumps) and a second (100M low hurdles).

"Liz has been an outstanding athlete for four years," assistant coach Wallace said. "She's been triple jumping for four years and she's ahead of most schools which only have been triple jumping the past two years. You might say Liz is a pioneer in establishing technique."

Lee triple-jumped 33-4 1/2 at Saturday's meet, but her top jump is more than 35 feet, a measure she accomplished in 1978. "I think the reason she hasn't topped that jump is because the league has cut down on dual meets and she hasn't been working that much on the event. But she has had more time to improve her hurdling," Wallace said.

She did a 16.1 Saturday in the hurdles and bettered that Tuesday against Fort Lee with a 16-flat. "That was her best time ever. And she also is a good long jumper."

Sophomore Anne Faley is Tenafly's asset in the weights. "She's very enthusiastic about the discus, but has no problems with the javelin and shot put," Wallace said. Faley led the field Saturday with a toss of 107-2, teammate Barbara Wolff, a freshman, was second.

"Anne does weightlifting to help her in the three events. Barbara also has been doing well. She had her best throw [95-2] in the championships," the assistant coach said.

Jeanne Quinn is another sophomore who is improving with every meet. She ran her best Saturday in the 400M, 62.2, then topped that against Fort Lee with a 61.1. Her sister Jill also competes in the relays.

Eileen Kees, yet another sophomore, is the Tigers best long distance runner. "She's steadily improved since her freshman year," Wallace continued. "She has the confidence to compete with the best in Bergen County." She had her best time (10:42.9) in the 3000M at the Bergen County Championships but finished behind Saddle Brook's Laura Falci.

"I'm hoping we do well in the sectionals," Alford said. "Our section [Group 2, Section 1] tends to be strong. But we think we can send a few girls to the States."

Passaic Tech won five events, including a 200-400 double by Crawley, who would be the premier long sprinter in Passaic County this year if not for the presence of Eastside's Natalie Jordan. The Bulldogs won both relays with solid performances, and Claudia Moodie took the long jump.

Hawthorne impressed, finishing third and winning the 100 [Aytac Dotday], hurdles [Lauren Van Der Eems] and discus [Sue DeFlora], and Waldwick won the small-schools title, paced by shot putter Bernadette Cronin, who won her specialty and has made the Warriors a more versatile team.

Perhaps the happiest school of all was Elmwood Park. Shot putter Marta Barillo took second, winning the first girls track medal ever at EP.

Outstanding times of the night were Crawley's 26.7-61.6 double, Jones' 5:12.9-11:08.4 double, and a 2:26.9 by Murphy in the 800 meters, defeating a strong field.

Park Ridge, Rutherford roll to titles

PARK RIDGE — The Park Ridge girls track team won the Bergen County Scholastic League Olympic Division championship for the third straight year yesterday and Rutherford took home National Division honors.

The Owls scored in every event to finish with 108 points. Rutherford, also scoring in each event, had 89 points, defeating Secaucus (63), the defending champs.

"I'm very happy with our team," Park Ridge coach Jean Kosits said. "I thought we would do well. We finished second in the Bergen County Championships last

Thursday, and I think we woke up a lot of people in the county that a Group 1 school could do that well."

All of the Owl runners in the winning mile relay (4:21.3) had firsts in at least one other event. Andrea Ostrowski won the 400 meters (1:03) and the 200 (28.0). Cindy Prusha was a winner in the 100 (13.3) and finished behind Ostrowski in the 400 (1:03.7). Tracey Gunther long jumped 15-5½ in Wednesday's events and placed second (31-4) in the triple jump behind teammate Dawn Johansmeyer (33-3¼), who ran the last leg of the relay. Johansmeyer also led the charge in the hurdles with a 16.2.

Rutherford coach John Parisi has been

preparing his team for the National Division meet since March 15. "We've put in a lot of work, sweat, and pain to get to this meet. And it's paid off. I told them if they wanted to soar like eagles, they can't think like sparrows. Today, they were eagles."

Bianca O'Connell did a bit of her own soaring. The junior had the top time in both divisions in the 1,500, running a personal best of 4:50. She also outdistanced the field in the 800 with a 2:22.7, 5.2 faster than Secaucus's Marie Martorano. O'Connell anchored winning mile relay team (4:19.1).

"I could have done better in the 1,500 if I sprinted at the end," O'Connell said,

"but I wanted to stay fresh for my other two events."

"Bianca is an exceptional individual," Parisi said. "She's a glutton for punishment, and she'll do whatever you tell her. She hasn't lost yet this year in the half and mile."

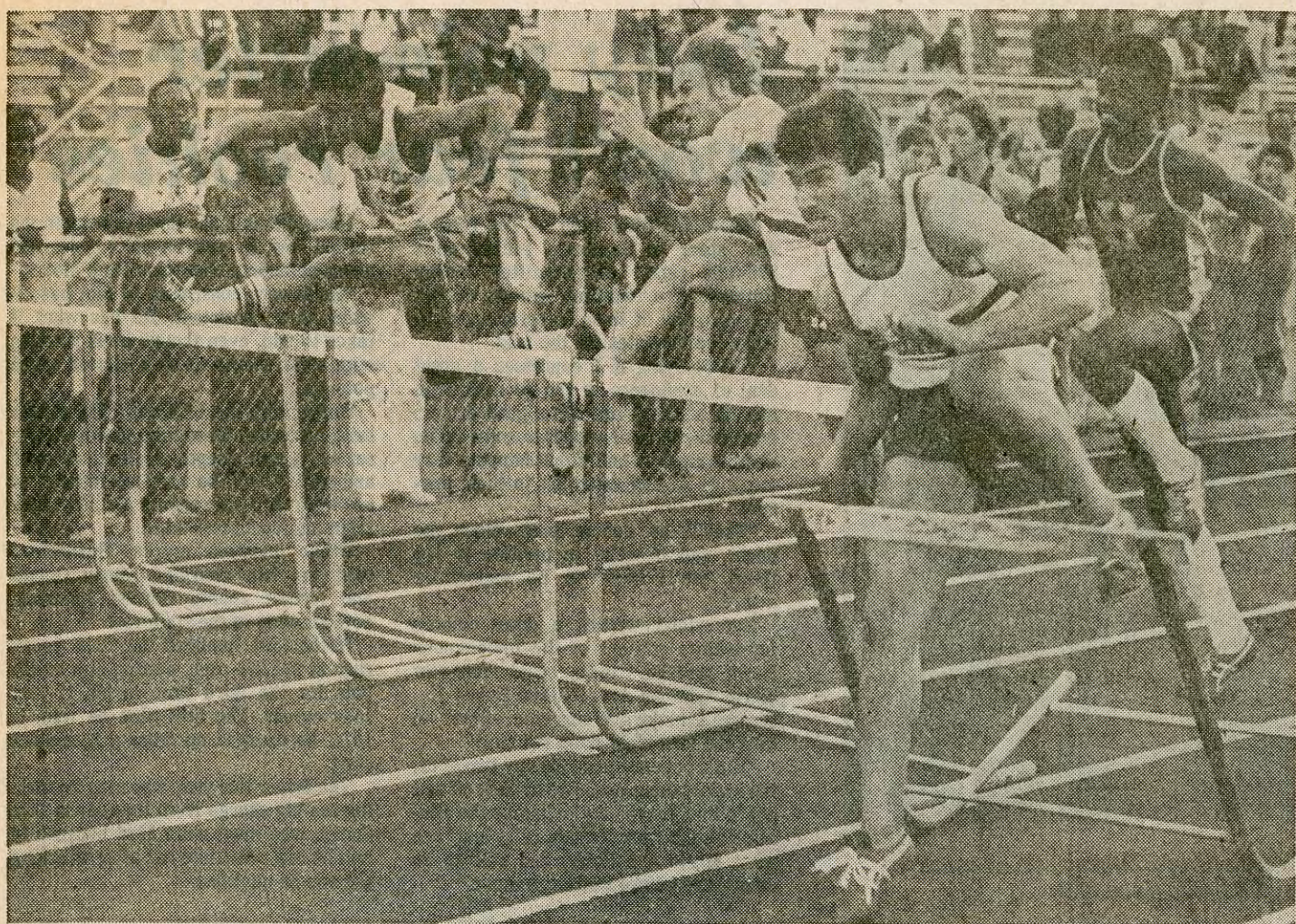

Hackensack wins Meet of Champs

HACKENSACK — There wasn't much daylight left yesterday as the 1600-meter relay started at the Bergen County Meet of Champions. By the final leg, the sky was almost completely black, and it was difficult to see.

But Doug Jackson saw Don Bosco's John McLaughlin ahead of him in the backstretch and flew past him to give Hackensack a two-yard win in the event, which lived up to expectations. Don Bosco had lost to Hackensack at the New Jersey Relays on a bad handoff while holding a substantial lead, and both teams were anxious for a rematch that would help determine the County's finest relay team.

Al Yankowski gave Bosco the early lead, but Hackensack's Conrad Whittingham took a two-yard lead into the third leg. Don Bosco's Mike Geraghty put the Dons ahead again with a sub-50 leg, but Jackson just shifted into overdrive to outrun McLaughlin, who also turned in a sub-50 400.

Don Bosco had gambled that holding both Geraghty and McLaughlin out of the open races would enable them to defeat the Comets and possibly break 3:20 in the event. Geraghty had run a 50.3 400 and a 22.8 200 in the afternoon trials, while McLaughlin had qualified in the 400. But Jackson spoiled the plan.

The win clinched the outstanding-track-performer award for the soft-spoken Jackson, who had earlier run a 54.1 400 intermediate hurdles masterpiece to shake off a late challenge by Mahwah's Robbie Porter.

"Doug just got out too far too fast," said Porter, whose time of 54.7 makes him a prime contender for State Group 1 honors in his specialty. Another Group 1 State contender may be Emerson's Roger Storm, who remained unbeaten in the 100 meters in 11.3 with a burst in the final 30 meters.

"Who cares about the time?" said an exuberant Storm, who shook off a hamstring pull suffered earlier in the season to out race a top-notch field. It in-

cluded defending champion Brian Anthony of Englewood, Group 3 champion Sam Cureton of Englewood, and Group 2 champion Mike Pishadze of Elmwood Park. "I'm up on a cloud now. It's the first time all year I've really felt that I hit a race."

While Storm was celebrating, Ridgefield Park's Ralph Ferraro was trying to shake off his disastrous loss in the 110-meter high hurdles. Ferraro was leading the field by more than a step going into the last hurdle, but hit the final hurdle squarely and tumbled to the ground as Teaneck's Darryl McFarland went on to win the race.

"I hit the top of the hurdle with my toe," said a disconsolate Ferraro.

Ian Leavesley of Mahwah ran the fastest 3000 ever in Bergen County, posting a time of 8:36.0 in running away from an 18-man field. Leavesley, who had run 8:40.5 and 8:43.5 earlier in the year, broke off from the pack after a relatively slow opening 1,500 of 4:22 and sped to an uncharacteristically fast 66.5 400 as his fifth lap. He left the field behind, and beat Bergen Catholic's Sean Gormley by more than 40 yards.

Mike Buncic of Fair Lawn took second in the shot and threw the discus 175-5 to win the outstanding-field-performer award, beating out sophomore sensation Ed Alston of Hackensack. Alston established a sophomore State record in the triple jump with a leap of 45-5, besting University of Houston standout Carl Lewis's record of 44-8. Only one Bergen athlete has ever jumped farther.

Paramus Catholic's Jim DeLorenzo avoided a box in the first lap and raced from fourth place in the second lap to nip Bergenfield's Mike Boccellari in a very competitive 800. The first six finishers were under two minutes.

Other winners were: Jim Wagner of Teaneck (200), Rod Wallace of Englewood (400), Mike Fezza of Cresskill (second straight 1,500), Terry Martin of Teaneck (along jump), Tom Haskins of Don Bosco (javelin), John Farrell of Teaneck (shot put), Dan Porter of Passaic Valley (high jump), and Alex Levay of Tenafly (pole vault).

Athlete of the Week

Chris MacDonnell is the finest female distance runner in Bergen County history and one of the best ever in New Jersey. However, when she crossed the finish line in Wednesday's State Meet of Champions after finishing third in the 1500-meter run, it marked her last competitive race as a member of a school track team.

The Westwood senior will attend Loyola University of New Orleans in the fall, but the prestigious Louisiana school does not have women's intercollegiate sports. So MacDonnell will concentrate on the clarinet and saxophone, her proficiency with which earned her a four-year scholarship in music.

"I'm going to miss it," said MacDonnell, who turned in an unprecedented double at the State Meet of Champions despite not running either the 1500 or the 3000. MacDonnell, who had set a State

record of 9:50 in the 3000 the week before, finished second in the All Groups 3000 and was third in the 1500, becoming the first runner, male or female, in State history to place in both distance races at the end-of-season meet.

Her effort earned her Bergen Athlete of the Week honors and wrapped up an outstanding career in girls track. During her four-year career, MacDonnell held County records at one time or another in the mile, two-mile, 1500 and 3000. She has the third-fastest mile and second-fastest 1500 in County history in addition to being the only Bergen girl ever to break 11 minutes in the two-mile and 10 minutes in the 3000.

MacDonnell never ran cross-country and was never the runner in indoor season that she turned out to be each spring. "I needed a season off to work on my studies so I never ran cross-country. Then in indoors this year, I don't know what happened, I just wasn't in shape," she says. "I like running outdoors better, anyway."

Her opponents have figured that out over the years. MacDonnell likes to lay back and then pick off runners with a



blistering finishing kick. That's how she beat freshman sensation Theresa Gschwind from Summit in the Group 3 3000 in setting the State 3000 record.

"It was a real challenge," she recalls. "It was an even-paced race that was faster than I had ever run. I liked the track because I felt really strong and I just ran the kind of race I wanted."

At the Meet of Champs, however, Gschwind turned the tables. "I was following [Bergenfield's] Lisa Schadler, who was right behind Gschwind. By the time I saw Gschwind make her move, my mind was on Schadler. I thought Lisa was going to go with her, but Gschwind got away."

"I was disappointed in the race, so I decided to run the 1500 to see how I could do." The result was a 4:40.7 for third

behind longtime rival Mary Ellen McGowan of Pascack Valley and race winner Judy Ruff of Highland Park.

And that race may turn out to be the last competitive race on the track for MacDonnell. But the Westwood senior, who was a member of the North Jersey Regional and All-State High School bands, intends to keep running all the same.

"I've only run one road race in the past and I liked it," said MacDonnell. "There's a half-marathon race June 22 and I intend to run this summer. I've promised myself that I would run in the past, but I never did before. Now I think I'm more interested in running than I ever have been."

But she won't be doing it in a school uniform anymore.

Teaneck and Westwood runners dominate stars

The 1980 All-Bergen girls track and field team is headed, predictably, by athletes from Teaneck and Westwood. The two schools clearly demonstrated their class this spring as their runners and jumpers turned in some of Bergen County's most memorable performances.

Teaneck was led by triple-threat Karen Gaines in the hurdles, long, and triple jumps. The junior won All-County honors in each, and also was part of the top 400 relay team. Teammates Stephanie Laughlin (100), and Selina Ashby (200) join Gaines on that quartet.

Westwood's girls had a clear edge in the middle distances. Among the most outstanding performances rendered in the County and the State was that of Westwood's Christine MacDonnell as she posted a State-record 9:50.5 in the 3,000.

A closer look at the All-Bergen squad follows:

Karen Gaines, Teaneck, 100 Low Hurdles, Triple Jump, Long Jump — By now everyone who knows anything about local track, knows about this junior. Gaines recorded a series of performances that astounded watchers: a 13.8 in the hurdles at the State groups meet; an 18-foot, 3/4-inch long jump at the State Meet of Champions for a County record; and 36's and 37's in the triple jump.

Stephanie Laughlin, Teaneck, 100 — Another of Teaneck's juniors, Laughlin won the County Group 4 meet 100 with a 12.4 performance. Laughlin placed fourth with a 12.5 in the State group meet and in one of the toughest fields of any event.

Selina Ashby, Teaneck, 200 — Ashby, a junior, won the County Meet of Champions in 25.4. Combined with her Teaneck

teammates, Ashby scored valuable points in helping the Highwaywomen the strongest team in the County.

Claudia Lynch, Westwood, 400 and 800 — Coach Bill Morrow would like to move Lynch up to the 1,500 next year, an idea "She doesn't want to hear anything about." Lynch's instincts may be right as she moved from second team in 1979 in the 880 to a first-team berth in the 800; Lynch also tied with Bianca O'Connell of Rutherford for the County record, 2:15.9. Morrow describes Lynch this way: "She's the type of runner who goes with the flow, and gives whatever it takes to win."

Mary Ellen Mileski, Ridgewood, 1,500 — Mileski, a freshman, may not hold the

County record, but she's proven to be one of the most consistent runners in one of the most hotly-contested races in the area. Mileski is the State Group 4 champion, having run the 1,500 in 4:46.5.

Christine MacDonnell, Westwood, 3000 — "I really truly believe that Chris is among the best distance runners in County history," Morrow says. "She's a consistent performer, and she's always been tough on the State level." MacDonnell showed her grit and her strength in running to the State record a week ago. The senior, supported by her coach, intends on running in development meets this summer and the half-marathon in Westchester.

Teaneck 400 relay team — Gaines plus Laughlin plus Ashby plus Lydia Deering add up to a team that beat Eastside in the State sectionals in 48.6.

Westwood 1,600 relay team — Sophomore Lori Morton is the only rookie on this team. Her leg is followed by those of Lynch, Carolyn Ferri, and Kim Catherman. Morrow, although generally happy with this quartet's development, regrets his team didn't break the County record. "They have a lot of pride and tradition," Morrow says. "But I wanted the County record. I hope it was their youth. More confidence is the key."

Deneen Steiner, Ridgefield, High Jump — Steiner is a sophomore whose 5-foot, 5-inch jump at the State sectional meet two weeks ago was the second-best high-jump performance in the County's short girls track history.

Lisa Glidewell, Ridgewood, Shot Put — Glidewell finished her high-school career by establishing a County record with a put of 38-6/8 at the County Meet of Champions. Glidewell finished fifth at the State Group 4 championship.

Carla Cusate, North Arlington, Javelin — This senior came out for track, or rather to the javelin, for the first time in her high-school career, and threw the javelin 132 feet once, and was consistently in the 120 range. She'll be sorely missed by coach Sharon Lonigan Cooper, who has counted on Cusate in the javelin, shot, discus, and 400 relay.

Janice Welte, Ridgefield Park, Discus — Welte, a senior, is another rookie in the field. Her best throw was 125-10 1/2. Welte has the least-orthodox methods of training, she paddles her kayak. Welte is considering continuing in the discus in college.
