## Ridgewood girls

Of all the area high school track and field programs, it is literally impossible to find one as perennially successful as the Ridgewood girls team. In recent years, it has produced such athletes as Margaret Scutro, who graduated two years ago and was New Jersey state champ in the 1,600 and fourth state-wide in cross country. She is now tops on Georgetown's cross country team.

Under coach Jacob Brown, this 17 -year girls program has seen many more peaks than it has valleys, but the 1988 team is something special.

Not only have the Lady Maroons begun their '88 campaign with two relay titles (Ridgewood and Toms River), and two easy dual meet victories over Paramus Catholic and Immaculate Heart, but Brown strongly believes - though he's been criticized for saying so - that there is little question this team will go through its entire schedule without a setback.
"This is by far the best team I've ever had," said Brown. "They're not only good; they're 'powerfully good'. I have 10 girls on the team right now that have the ability that most teams only have one of."
The 1987 version of the Ridgewood girls team won every meet in which they participated last year, except for the state championships where they came in third overall. Brown said this team is even better. Furthermore, many of the members of his team were on the winter squad that recently won the state indoor championship.
Another telling fact that adds: credence to Brown's optimism, is that of the 14 events that make up high school track and field competition, six of Ridgewood's records are held by current members of the team.
"Sometimes, I just stop to wonder where they all came from," said the veteran coach.

Brown's optimism goes beyond the regular schedule though. He feels this year's team easily has enough talent to take the Group 4 state championship.

One of Ridgewood's most successful girls is Jennifer Mc Dermott, who Brown feels could hold the outdoor school record in the long. jump before season's end. Her best jump outdoors to date is $18-1$, but she is 7 th in the nation indoors where her best is $17-113 / 4$.

Lynne Collazo is another Maroon at the top of her game, and has nailed down an 800 meter spot on the team this season.
Ginny Figlar is Ridgewood's record holder in the 400 with a time of 57.1. She was also one of Ridgewood's county champs last year in her event.

Jennifer Hughes is the last in a line of Hughes distance runners. She was all county and group champion last year in the 3,200 and is specializing again this year in that event. Hughes also minors in the 1,600 .

Sheryl vander Schyff is another of the Maroon record holders. The 100 -meter hurdler was all-county indoors this year and her best time outdoors was 15.7. Brown said her goal this season is to excel at the county level.

Karen Cannon, the Maroons' 1,600 -meter specialist, will also see competition in the 3,200 and possibly the 800 .

Lynn Degelmann, Maroon record holder in the 400 -meter hundles (63.7), was second in the county and fourth in the state in '87.

Tammy Rayevich is Ridgewood's thrower, who Brown calls "a consistent county scorer." She hurls the shot, discus and javelin and is the team's all-around field star.
"I think my biggest challenge this year will be getting the girls to

 calls Ridgewood team school's best ever

RIDGEWOOD - Before the start of the girls track season, Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown thought he had the best team in the school's history. After Saturday's performance at the Ridgewood Relays, Brown is convinced.

Even with four key performers unavailable, the Maroons ran away with the large schools team title, scoring 40 points, nine in front of Toms River East and 11 ahead of North Hunterdon.
"Ridgewood had a great day," Brown said.

The small schools competition was closer, going down to the final event, the 400 -meter hurdles relay, before Pope John of Sparta won. The Lions finished with $251 / 2$ points, Bishop Loughlin of Brooklyn had 23, and Pequannock 21.

Jen McDermott led the way for Ridgewood, which picked up most of its points in the field events. The Maroons won the triple, high, and long jumps and took second in the discus.

McDermott had a leap of 35 feet 11 inches in the triple jump, went 18-1 $1 / 4$ in the long jump, and $5-2$ in the high jump. She also ran a leg on Ridgewood's 800 -meter relay, which was third. Her perfor-

mances heiped Brown forget that he was missing his top thrower, who was hurt; two of the best distance runners, who were on vacation; and one of his two best hurdlers, who was sick.

Jen Wrubel was also on the three gold-medal jumping teams. Debbie Norton was in the triple jump, Cheryl VanderScyff in the high jump and Kate McDermott in the long jump.

The Maroons finished first in only one of nine running events the $4 \times 400$ meter relay - as Kerri Reilly, running the anchor leg, caught her Mount Vernon opponent on the final curve and won by 10 yards. Lynne Collazo, Liz Figlar, and Ginny Figlar ran the first three legs.

Ridgewood was second in the 6,400 -meter relay and among the top five in three other races.
"I'm very happy with our performance, but not surprised," said Brown. "This team is dynamically good. We're always good; this year we're better.
"This is the best team we've ever had. Six of the 14 school records are held by the current kids, and we could break two more this year."

Brown said the Maroons actively sought the team title Saturday, but their focus is on the Bergen County Relays later this month.

Cliffside Park finished seventh with 13 points. The Red Raiders were second to Voorhees in the intermediate hurdles and sprint medley relay and third in the 400 meter hurdles relay and the long jump.

Pequannock was the early leader in the small schools meet, placing second in the intermediate hurdles relay, third in the long jump, and winning the high jump when Sue Lynch, Peg Vigorito and Lori Mulqueen combined to jump 13 feet 8 inches.

Garfield and Saddle Brook scored in field events. The Boilermakers were second in the javelin (257-2) with Saddle Brook fifth (218-7). In the discus the Panthers were third (228-4), while Garfield was second in the shot (84-1 1/4) and Pascack Valley was third (80$6)$.

The meet attracted about 50 schools from throughout New Jersey, New York City, Long Island, and Rockland and Westchester counties.

If Jen Mc Dermott continues to set the track world on fire, people may begin to spell her name correctly.
"It's supposed to have a space," the Ridgewood High School junior says, "but no one does it."

Mc Dermott led the Maroons to the team title at Saturday's Ridgewood Relays, winning three field events. She is The Record's first spring Athlete of the Week.
Mc Dermott's name has always been associated with Ridgewood sports. Her brother, Jamie, participated in football and track, and sister Kate played soccer and basketball. But both often had their names spelled without the space.
"It seems we're all interested in sports, but we usually try to do something different than the other," Mc Dermott says.
Despite her success, Mc Dermott believes there's still room for improvement.Saturday, she recorded personal bests in the long jump at $18-11 / 4$ and the high jump at $5-2$. But her $35-11$ in the triple jump was 20 inches off her best.
"I wasn't happy with the triple jump," she says, "but it was the first event of the morning and no one was close to me. I know I could have done better later in the day."
But Mc Dermott has drastically improved already. Her best high jump last season outdoors was 4-8. The triple jump is her best event. At the indoor nationals, she placed seventh against the top competitors from 41 states.

Mc Dermott, surprisingly, didn't take up track until the outdoor season of her freshman year.
"Until then I was into gymnastics because I had taken lessons since I was 5 ," she says. "By the time I was 11 or 12 , I was competing."

Mc Dermott still takes gymnastics lessons twice a week and was named to the All-County first team.
"I took up track to do something different because I was getting tired of gymnastics," she says. "But now that I don't work at it as much, I enjoy it again."

Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown believes the gymnastics background has made Mc Dermott a better track athlete.
"She has the great ability to translate words into physical performance," Brown says. "She listens to direction and understands what you're trying to do and that ability could come from her gymnastics experience. Jen is the type of an athlete who makes a coach look good. If all had her special ability, it would make coaching very easy."
Mc Dermott says the two sports complement each other and compares vaulting with jumping.
"And when coach Brown tells me to do something, such as move an arm or leg in such a way, I understand and can do it right away," she says.
At first, Brown didn't believe Mc Dermott could become a track champion.

"She didn't have a remarkable freshman year, but she had a good sophomore year," Brown says. "And when she did 18 feet in the long jump for the first time, I started wondering about her."

The outdoor season has just begun, but Mc Dermott has already set goals of qualifying for the nationals and Penn Relays in both the triple and long jumps. She won't face that caliber of competition very often in Bergen County.
"I didn't do my best in the triple and yet no one was close to me," Mc Dermott says. "I'd love to be pushed more."

Although running isn't her best event, Mc Dermott ran on the 800 -meter relay team that finished third Saturday.
"That's the glory part of track because people see what you're doing," she says. "On the other hand, the field events are held away from the fans and no one knows what you're doing."
When she isn't flipping through the air, leaping over a bar, or studying, Mc Dermott enjoys reading, puzzles, and watching basketball on television.
But most of her time is dedicated to improving her track performances.
"As good as she is," Brown says, "she hasn't reached her potential."
There were other top performances last week by Mike Theuerkauf of Demarest in track; Paul DeSimone of Lyndhurst and Creighton Drury of River Dell in baseball, and Theressa Canglalosl of Holy Angels in softball.

## GINNY FIGLAR <br> Coach Brown cites 'work ethic' factor

Though coach Jacob Brown has had a great deal to do with the success of the Ridgewood girls track program throughout the years, he attributes the program's good fortune to the fact that the youth of Ridgewood has a very dedicated work ethic.
"The kids that go through this school system know the value of hard work - whether it be academically or on the training field," said Brown. "I don't have to convince them that hard work is good, and that's one less thing I have to worry about as a coach."
-Another reason Brown gave for his teams' successes, is the fact that Ridgewood students have competitive events offered to them as early aselementary school and it gets then interested in track and other individual sports at a competitive level.
"There is a lot of support in the town for running recreationally and competitively. As kids grow up, they get a chance to see things like the Memorial Day Run and other organized running events," said Brown. "I'm lucky to be coaching in a town like this." With the success of Brown's teams, tradition at Ridgewood has also become an attractive aspect of spring track and field, though the coach claims he doesn't train his athletes any differently than other coaches do. S"Werre limited in Ridgewood to the amount of space in which to train. We don't have the abundance of parks and tracks that some other towns do," he said. "Therefore, we've had to adapt to the Ridgewood streets to do our training.
"Many of the courses that we run have acquired nicknames over, the years, such as 'O'Leary,' named after Paul O'Leary, who was followed by his brothers Bill and Jim, who is on the boys team now."
Some of the others are "Speidel-Hoffman," named after Mark and Steve respectively. They graduated in the late 70 s . Others are 'Latham,' 'Wildlife,' 'Van Yperen,' 'Elwood' and 'The Incredible Shrinking

# Ridgewood wins 8 events in Randolph Relays romp 

RANDOLPH - Ridgewood won eight of 13 girls events Saturday and romped to the Randolph Relays title. The Maroons finished second in two others.

Jennifer McDermott, Kerri Reilly, Laura Pollaci, and Ginny Figlar teamed to set a school 400 meter relay record in 1 minute, 46.9 seconds. McDermott also took part in two other victories. She had the meet's best long jump - 17 feet, one-quarter inch teaming with Jen Wrubel and Racquel Mair to win that event, and joined Wrubel and Sheryl vanderSchyff to win the high jump.

# Big day for Ridgewood track 

## FOCUS ON SCHOOL SPORTS

WILLIAMSPORT, Pa. - Jen McDermott of Ridgewood set two Bergen County records in the long jump and triple jump Saturday at the Williamsport Coaches Track and Field Invitational at Williamsport High School.

McDermott long jumped 18 feet 9 inches and triple jumped $38-81 / 2$ to shatter the marks set in 1986 by Indian Hills' Margaret Rottkamp. The triple jump record is the second longest in state history. In addition to field events, McDermott sprinted a school-record 25.6 sec onds in the 200 meters.
"She [McDermott] had a national class day," said Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown. "In all my 17 years of coaching, I've never seen such a big day by an individual."

Tammy Rayevich of Ridgewood won both the javelin (112-0) and discus (110-2), and placed fourth in the shot put (32-11). Lynne Collazo won the 800 in 2:22.3 for the Maroons in the non-scoring event that attracted 24 schools.
The Maroons $4 \times 400$ relay team - Karen Cannon, Lynne Colazzo, Jennifer Hughes, and Jean Hughes - took second with a time of $4: 11.7$. The same combination was fourth in the $4 \times 800$.
"It was certainly a great accomplishment for our team," Brown said. "We finished right up there with Williamsport and it should prepare us for the individual meets in the next month."
ANNE WELLNGTON of Teaneck won the shot put with a throw of 39 feet $51 / 2$ inches at the Bernardsville Invitational at Bernards High Schook.and was second in the discus (109-8).
Kevin McCabe of Ridgewood finished second in the 3,200 with a time of 9:36.5, and Gregg Wykford of Pascack Valley was second in the 1,600 in $4: 31.7$.

were broken or tied and several others were approached in the two-day classic, won easily by Ridgewood's girls and Hackensack's boys.
Ridgewood's Jen McDermott broke the newest record in Bergen County, her week-old record in the girls long jump, becoming the first girl in Bergen County history to long jump 19 feet. And Don Bosco's Derrick Horner tied the oldest record in Bergen history by long jumping $24-1 \frac{1}{2}$ to tie the 23 -yearold mark set by Rich Cirner of Paramus in 1965. Walt McCall of Hackensack set the third record with a 48.6 performance in the 400 meters.

Both McDermott and Horner rallied from 1987 injuries that all but wiped out their seasons.

Horner suffered through a series of hamstring pulls in 1987 but has had a magnificent 1988 season, winning the indoor 60 -meter state all-groups title. He has dominated the sprints this spring and did again in the NNJIL meet, winning the 100 in 10.8 and the 200 in 22.0 , both times just off county records. And in the long jump, on his final attempt, he made county history.

He led the event into the final round, with a good but not great $21-11 \frac{1}{2}$ jump. Then Ridgewood's Craig Halyard leaped 22 feet and Tony Hayes of Hackensack went $22-5$, the first 22 -foot jumps of the year.

Horner then flew to his recordtying leap, nearly a foot better than his personal best, set indoors. Fifteen minutes later, he was still stunned.
"I had no idea I could jump that far," said Horner, who is headed for Harvard next school yeaz. "When I got in the pit, everybody was excited but I didn't know how far I'd jumped. I still don't know how I jumped that far, because my style is the faster I go the farther I jump. I'm not that great on technique."

If Horner is not strong on technique, junior McDermott is. She too, suffered through much of 1987 with a hip injury before coming back stronger than ever this year.
"It's so frustrating to go to all the meets and want to compete so
badly and not be able to," she said. "You just have to let it heal. I always dreamed of doing this, and normally I don't show the emotion I did today."
The official's call of 19 feet brought shrieks of joy from McDermott and her teammates. And McDermott also tripled, winning the triple jump at $38-2 \frac{1}{2}$, six inches off her county record and winning the 100 .

McCall's county record was the quietest but in some ways the most impressive. Less than an hour earlier, he had taken an important second place for Hackensack in the 800 that helped the Comets to a comfortable 67-41 margin over Don Bosco. He still had enough to run the 48.6 in the 400 , taking a 10th of a second off the six-yearold mark of Jim Woods of River Dell and showing the ability to take the record below 48 seconds before the end of the season.
"People like Walter McCall and Gerard Pescatore have sacrificed some of their own personal goals to help the team overcome its injuries and struggles this year," said Hackensack coach Ed Church. Other individual top 10 performances included:

- Horner's 10.8100 (tie for second all time).
- Horner's 21.8 (in the heat) 200 (tie for second) and Hayes' 22.0 (tie for sixth).
- Stan Finney of Hackensack's 49.6400 (seventh).
- Mark Bednarz' 1:53.1 in the 800 (fourth).
- Halyard's 47-103/4 triple jump (second, $13 / 4$ inches off the county record), Gerald Spear's 469 TJ (third), and Sean Gayle's 45$43 / 4 \mathrm{TJ}$ (10th).
- In the girls meet Jean Hughes of Ridgewood ran 5:03.4 in the 1,600 (fifth fastest) and Amy Kempf of Paramus ran 5:05.0 (seventh).
- Finally, Anne Wellington of Teaneck threw the discus 121-10, four inches from the top 10 and the longest throw in Bergen County in five years.

# 3 Bergen schools capture crowns

WAYNE - The Ridgewood, Wayne Valley, Westwood, and Waldwick girls track teams captured group titles Saturday at the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association North Jersey Section 1 track and field championships at Wayne Hills High School.
Ridgewood, which successfully defended its team title, established a sectional record with 98 points and easily outdistanced league rival Teaneck with 36 points. Wayne Valley took Group 3 with 40 points over Ramapo and Bergenfield. Westwood ( 59 points) held off Newton and Kittatinny in Group 2, while Waldwick ( 45 points) edged Saddle Brook and Midland Park for the Group 1 crown.

In Group 2, Westwood captured the first three spots in the 200 meters and the discus. Mary Sok won the 200 in 27.4 seconds. Teammates Keirsten Wailace (27.8) and Lori Jones (28.0) were second and third, respectively. In the discus, Lisa Mahle led the trio of Cardinals with a throw of 110 feet 3 inches.

# Ridgewood rolls at Bergen meet

TENAFLY - It was only a tuneup for Ridgewood before the Maroons take aim at the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association Group 4 championship at South Plainfield this weekend.

But Ridgewood showed why it is perhaps the greatest girls track team in Bergen County history by dominating the 10th annual Bergen Girls Meet of Champions Tuesday night.

The Maroons won eight of the 15 events, setting four meet and two Bergen County records, and earned medals in every event but the shot put.
Ginny Figlar and Jennifer McDermott were the two mostdominant Maroons.
Figlar set a meet record of 57.0 in winning the 400 meters and anchored the Ridgewood 1,600-relay team to a Bergen County record of 3:55.4. Those performances earned her the Red Littler Award for outstanding track performance.

But McDermott might have been even better. The junior won the invitational triple jump, which included the top jumpers from Passaic County, leaping a meetrecord 38 feet $6^{1 / 2}$ inches on her last jump. She also extended her own county record to $19-3 / 8$ in the long jump, earning the Lou Lanzalotto Field Event Award.
Other Ridgewood winners included Lynne Collazo (800), Jean Hughes ( 1,600 ), Karen Cannon (3,200), and Lynn Degelmann (400 hurdles).

But the Maroons weren't the whole show. Field-event stars Elena Primerano of Lyndhurst and Keelan Craw of Waldwick joined with sprinter Sara Pieri of Ramapo to gain some glory as well.

Primerano, recovering from an early-season slump that saw her well off her best throws in the javelin, set a meet record with a throw of $134-10$, the longest in Bergen County in five years and the sec-ond-longest in the state this year.

Craw had perhaps the most dra-

matic win. The sophomore, who won the state Group 1 shot put title last year, was stunned by an insult from a driver passing by as she moved into the circle for her next-to-last throw.
But she responded with a ca-reer-best mark of $40-1$, edging favored Stacey Price of Westwood by $3 / 4$-inch. Price threw another 40 footer on her last throw, but it was not enough.
Pieri, who was edged last year in a dramatic 100 showdown with eventual state champ Neretta Freeman of Garfield, won an extremely tight race with Teaneck's Nicole Golden, this time in the 100. But the Dartmouth-bound Pieri buried the field in the 200, with a 25.6 clocking to become the first sprinter to double since Freeman in 1985.
Other winners included high jumper Dawn Reis of Lodi, who repeated her 1987 win, and discus thrower Anne Wellington of Teaneck, who had a fine throw of 121 0 after a shaky start. Beth Mayland of Northern Highlands won a wire-to-wire duel with Sheryl Vander Schyff of Ridgewood in the 100 hurdles, with a speedy 14.9 time.

## Boys track

TENAFLY - Gerald Spears of Teaneck won the triple jump and finished third in the long jump to earn Most Outstanding Field Athlete honors at the conclusion of the Bergen County Boys Meet of Champions Tuesday night.

Spears leaped a meet record 46 feet $10 \frac{1}{2}$ inches in the triple jump to nip teammate Sean Gayle by $71 / 4$ inches. Craig Halyard of Ridgewood, who set a state record of 48 $11 / 2$ the day before, was third with a jump of 46 feet.

Derrick Horner of Don Bosco capped his scholastic career with a meet-record leap of 22-11 to dominate the long jump. Larry Peters of Hackensack was second, followed by Spears.

Going for the Gold: Local athletes are unlikely to match last year's total of five golds and 18 total medals. But long-jumper Jen McDermott of Ridgewood, 400 stars Ginny Figlar of Ridgewood and Nicole Thomas of Passaic, high-jumper Gwen Manning of Passaic Tech, and the Ridgewood relay team can help make it close.
M sdal Harvest: For Ridgewood, distance stars Lynne Collazo, Jean and Jennifer Hughes, and Karen Cannon might be joined by Dannette Pritchett of Passaic and hurdler Sheryl Vander Schyff, also of Ridgewood.
Dark Horse: Anne Wellington of Teaneck should take medals in the shot and discus. She is ready to go 130 feet in the discus, which would produce a gold medal. If Bilotta or Bowles can be taken, Collazo might do it in the 800 .

SOUTH PLAINFIELD - Vet eran observers called it the coldest day in memory for the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association track and field group championships.

But area athletes sizzled in the rain and sub-60 degree temperatures of Friday, dominating several events while earning seven titles out of the 37 contested.

Lodi's one-girl track team, Dawn Reis, had the most outstanding day, winning the Group 2 high jump and running a sensational race to finish second in the 800 meters, both within a span of less than 90 minutes.

Reis cleared 5 -feet- 4 inches on her second attempt to earn one of five titles won by North Jersey girls, including three from the Ber-gen-Passaic Scholastic League.
"I was tired after the 800 ," said an excited Reis, who punctuated every sentence with a delighted giggle. "And I missed my first two
together on the last attempt and got a good jump at 5-4."

Reis made a great move in the final 20 yards to finish second in the 800 , just behind Heather Turnquest of Bernards.
"I got kicked so many times in the race, I wasn't sure how I'd feel,' she said. "But I still energy left at the end of the race and decided to try and pass the third-place girl."

Glen Rock freshman Meghan Burke defeated some familiar foes to win the Group 1 long jump with a leap of 16-9. Lee Duck of Waldwick was second, and Patti O'Hagan of Midland Park fourth, making it a near-sweep for the B-PSL.
"I was intimidated at the Girls Meet of Champions Tuesday but not today because I had beaten Lee and Patti,' said Burke. "When I saw that the three of us were doing well, I felt a lot better."

As dominant as the Bergen girls were in the Group 1 long jump, runners in the Group $3,1,600$-meter race were even more overpowering.

Group 3 cross-country championm Amy Kempf of Paramus $\operatorname{ran} 5: 05.9$ for the win. Kempf bested freshman teammate Vickee Foy, Ramapo senior Alicia St. John, and in fifth place, and state indoor 1,600-champ Cathy Feeney of Wayne Valley.
"I was very confident when I found out my strongest competition was from our area," said Kempf. "I was tired because I got in at 4 a.m. from the prom, but I wanted this very badly."

The third B-PSL gold medal belonged to Gwen Manning of Passaic Tech, who jumped 5-2 while the rain was at its peak to win the Group 4 high jump.
"It was drizzling through the whole meet,' said Manning. "The other girls were complaining about it, but I just relaxed and kept my mind on what I wanted to do."

A clearance on her first jump proved to be decisive.

Another outstanding victory came from Jen McDermott of Ridgewood, who could have won the Group 4 long jump with any of her six jumps. Her best leap, 18$81 / 2$, helped the Maroons to $183 / 8$ first-day points and a commanding position in the team race. Jean and Jennifer Hughes, and Karen Cannon went $2-3-5$ in the 1,600 , and Lynne Collazo was second in the 800 for the other first-day points by the Maroons.
And the Bergen County shotput battle to see whether Jason Miller of Elmwood Park or Mike Theuerkauf of Demarest would be the first one to get to 60 feet ended when Miller threw 60-1 on his final Group 2 throw.

But both Theuerkauf and Miller won state titles, with Theuerkauf earning his second Group 3 crown with a fine throw of $58-31 / 2$.
"It's nice to see them fly out again," said Theuerkauf, who won as a sophomore but failed to make the finals last year. "Now I can go after the 'elusive' 60 -footer."

Theuerkauf was trailing after the trials, but popped the 58 -footer on his first throw in the finals. He had earlier drawn the crowd's attention by just fouling on consecutive throws estimated at 62 feet.
"I know I can get a big throw and when it comes, it'll be 61 or: 62," he said.

Miller, who clinched the Group 2 title with an opening throw of $59-61 / 2$, was clearly elated by his 60 -foot throw.
"When I heard the judge say 60 , I couldn't think - I was so happy,' said Miller, who will attend West Point this fall. "It's what I've been shooting for for weeks and months."

But Miller is certain that even though he was the first thrower in the state to reach the coveted mark, he'll only get better.
"This will help me because I know I can do better, and it helps my head to know I can have a competition won and still get my best throw on my last throw," he said.

## Ridgewood rolls to Group 4 title

## SOUTH PLAINFIELD -

Ridgewood has been a dominant force all season, but in Saturday's New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association Group Championships, the Maroons proved they are one of the state's premier teams, easily capturing the Group 4 title.

Ridgewood became the first girls team in Bergen County history to win a group title, and the Maroons also broke the record for most points by a Group 4 team, scoring $493 / 8$ points to shatter the previous mark of $35^{1 / 2}$ points set by Matawan in 1973.

The Maroons accomplished this with solid teamwork, not behind one or two runners. Ridgewood won only two events - Jen McDermott in the long jump and the 1,600 -meter relay - but it placed in 12 of 14 events.
"Normally, the championship is won by a team with two superstars," said Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown. "We placed in 12 events. That's an astounding thing to do. All of the kids did well today. We had a meeting, and they were psyched."
McDermott earned two seconds - in the 100 and 200 - both times behind Dawn Boulles of Neptune. The Maroons received a big boost in the 3,200 , with Jean Hughes, Karen Cannon, and Jennifer Hughes finishing second, third, and fifth, respectively.
Lynn Degelmann, Kerri Reilly, Lynne Collazo, and Ginny Figlar won the 1,600 relay in 3 minutes, 59.9 seconds to edge out Neptune. Reilly brought Ridgewood from last place to third, setting up the Maroons' victory.
"Not to be conceited, but I knew all along that this track team was

exceptional," Brown said. "I knew it right from the beginning. They won everything [during the] indoors [season]."

Stacey Price of Westwood captured the Group 2 title in shot put with a throw of 42 -feet-1. For Price, a sophomore, it was her second straight state championship.
"It was the best throw of the day and it was way overdue," Price said. "I've been waiting for this for four years. Shawn Walsh [of Toms River South] beat me in the indoors [championships] on the last throw. That's not going to happen in the Meet of Champions. This is my year, and no one is going to take it away from me."
Nicole Thomas of Passaic, a senior who has run track for only two years, won the 400 meters over Figlar with a time of 57.74 .
Michele Straut used a burst of energy in the last 200 yards to win the Group 13,200 title over sophomore Cathy Acevedo of Saddle Brook. Straut, a Waldwick senior, trailed Acevedo by almost 70 yards with a half lap to go.

Laura Gilligan of Glen Rock beat out Beth-Ellen Haberstrott at the finish to take third place.
Amy Kempf of Paramus won the Group 33200 race in 10:51.18, and teammate Vickee Fox took a fifth. Catherine Feeney finished second for Wayne Valley (11:14.97).
Waldwick's Keelan Craw won the Group 1 shot put with a toss of 37-81/, and Lisa Kohut of Boonton captured the Group 2 javelin with a throw of $136-1$ and the discus with a tifirow of $120-2$. She also was fifth in the shot put.

Ginny Figlar wanted to finish her high school career on her feet. But she almost didn't.
The Ridgewood senior staggered across the finish line in 56.55 seconds in the 400 meters Saturday at the Keebler Invitational in Elmhurst, Ill., and was helped to the sideline by an official. Figlar applied ice and gulped Gatorade. "I wasn't going to miss the ceremony," she says.
Figlar finished second in a field of six of the top 400 -meter runners in the country. The awards were given out Olympic-style.
"I made it to my step, and they placed the medal around my neck," says Figlar. "That was a real exciting moment for me."

After it was over, her legs started to give out and she was helped to the first-aid tent. Forty-five minutes later, she emerged in top shape.
There was nothing mysterious about her postrace problems - it was 98 degrees Saturday in Elmhurst. "There were a lot of people passing out," she says.
"She did a tremendous job," says Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown. "She's a very strong and heady runner."
Figlar has had many thrills during her high school career, but nothing to equal the Keebler, which attracted more than 200 of the country's finest scholastic competitors. "I went there with the idea of breaking 56 seconds," she says. "I had done 55.7 last Tuesday, when our distance medley team won the Eastern States [12:01, top time in country]. So I had confidence I could do it. But I didn't count on the weather."
She checked out her competitors and was slightly intimidated. "The top seed had run 55 seconds, so I was just hoping I wouldn't get blown away." (The top seed finished last.)
Her final two high school performances earned her The Record's Athlete of the Week honors.
"I felt less pressure out there," she says, "maybe because I didn't know anyone. When I run here, it's the opposite. It was a great way to end my school career. At the opening, we marched around the track and they played the Olympic march. Then Wilma Rudolph [three, gold medals in the 1960 Games] wished us well."

Next season, Figlar will be a member of the University of Virginia mile-relay team, and might run the 400 -meter hurdles. "I selected the school because of its high academics and the fact that I'll get a chance to be a member of the team right away," Figlar says. "I'm going to study business."

Her one regret that is she'll have to give up soccer. "I really love that sport and will miss it a lot. Maybe I'll ask the coach if I can play."

Figlar has always been a fast runner, but hadn't thought of competing in track until eighth grade. "A

friend of mine was into track, so I joined up to be with her. As a freshman, she decided she didn't care for track, but I found that I like it and stayed with it."
Brown says that from the start, she demonstrated she was a tough competitor. "She ran the hurdles as a freshman, but we never needed her for that on the varsity. She could be a good college hurdler, but I feel her ultimate strength is the 800 ."
Figlar holds Bergen County individual records in the 400 ( 56.1 ) and 600 ( $1: 24.58$ ), and was a member of the top mile-relay team (3:55.8). And her sister Liz is a promising freshman runner in the half-mile and mile.
"Ginny is just an outstanding athlete," says Brown.
As an example of her athletic ability, he cited a relay in which an opponent fell in front of her. Figlar did what any soccer player would have done: She jumped over the girl and continued.
"It feels good that I've finished my high school career," says Figlar. "I'm a little sad, but I am happy to be moving on to college."

# Ridgewood dominates All-Bergen selections

 CorrespondentThe Ridgewood girls track team continued its dominance in Bergen County as eight members were named to the first-team All-County squad. In addition to fine performances in the league meets, local invitationals, and sectional competitions, 12 of the 14 selections participated in the State Meet of Champions in South Plainfield June 8.
Here's a closer look at the first team:
SARA PIERI, Ramapo, 100 and 200 meters Pieri recorded the top times in the county at 100 meters ( 12.4 seconds) and 200 ( 25.6 ), both at the county Meet of Champions. "She was an inspiration and a role model for most of the younger runners," said Ramapo coach Joe Buesing. She will compete for Dartmouth in the fall.
GINNY FIGLAR, Ridgewood, 400- and $\mathbf{1 , 6 0 0}$-meter relay - Figlar concluded her high school career last weekend at the Keebler International Prep Invitational in Elmhurst, Ill., with a second-place finish and set a county record in the $400(56.1)$ at the state Group 4 sectional meet. The Virginia-bound senior also ran a leg of the distance medley relay at the Eastern States Invitational in Hempstead, N.Y.

LYNNE COLLAZO, Ridgewood, 800 and $\mathbf{1 , 6 0 0}$ relay - The junior overcame a midseason hip injury to finish third in the state Meet of Champions in the 800 and ran her best time in the 800 ( $2: 13.6$ ) at the Bergen County Meet of Champions. "T'm pleased how she was able to come back after the injury and the way she finished the season," says Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown. Collazo competed this weekend in The Athletics Congress National Junior Meet in Tallahassee, Fla.
JEAN HUGHES, Ridgewood, $\mathbf{1 , 6 0 0}$ - Hughes is a versatile runner who could excel from the 400 to the 3,200 . Her time of $10: 43$ in the 3,200 was one of the fastest in the nation on the high school level and qualified her for the TAC Junior Meet this weekend in Florida, where the distance was 3,000 meters. Hughes, a junior, ran her best time in the 1,600 ( $5: 03$ ) at the county Meet of Champions.

AMY KEMPF, Paramus, 3,200 - "She was our best runner and competed in the $1,600,3,200$, and even the 800 when we needed her," said Paramus coach Jim Garofalo. Kempf, who will compete for Wisconsin-Parkside, a National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics power, captured the Group 3 sectionals in 3,200 with a sectional record time of 10:57.4.
KAREN CANNON, Ridgewood, 3,200 - Of the five Ridgewood graduating seniors, Brown said Cannon realized her potential in the state sectionals at Wayne Hills when she defeated Liz Duarte of Kearny with a time of 10:46. Cannon will attend Georgetown in the fall and run cross country and track.
BETH MAYLAND, Northern Highlands, 100 hurdles - "She combined better than average speed with near flawless hurdling skills to become one of the best hurdlers in the area," said Northern Highlands
coach Bill Lenskold. Mayland, who will attend Brown, recorded the fastest time in the county for the 100 high hurdles (14.9) at the county Meet of Champions. However, in the state Group 3 sectionals she failed to qualify for the state Meet of Champions.

SHERYL VANDER SCHYFF, Ridgewood, 100 hurdles - In the county Meet of Champions, vander Schyff will be remembered for her remarkable duel with Mayland of Northern Highlands, in which she took second (15.0). She was fourth in the state Group 4 meet and seventh at the state Meet of Champions. She plans to run for Rutgers in the fall.
LYNN DEGELMANN, RIdgewood, 400 hurdles, 1,600 relay - Degelmann recorded her best time in the 400 intermediate hurdles (1:04.6) at the county Meet of Champions and ran a leg of the fourth-place 1,600 relay team ( $1: 54.29$ ) at the state Meet of Champions. The senior cocaptain of the Maroons will compete for Delaware next year.
KERRI REILLY, RIdgewood, $\mathbf{1 , 6 0 0}$ relay - Reilly, a junior, was used in the sprints and sprint relays during the early portion of the schedule and ran her best split on the 1,600 relay in the Group 4 state meet with a time of 57.9 . She should return next spring as one of the top 400 -meter runners in the state.

JEN McDERMOTT, Ridgewood, triple Jump and long Jump - After losing the long jump title at the Pathmark National Indoor Championships at Yale in March, McDermott was unbeatable outdoors. At the Easterns she sailed 19 feet 5 inches for 12 th best jump in the nation. "We're very high on her. She'll be one the top jumpers in the country next year," Brown said of the junior, who competed in Florida this weekend.
McDermott was selected to practice with the U.S. jump coach in August at the U.S. Olympic Training facility in Colorado Springs, Colo.
DAWN REIS, Lodi, high Jump - Reis started her midseason surge with a victory at the Bergen-Passaic Scholastic League King Division championships with a jump of 5-2. Later at the Group 2 state championships she cleared 5-4 to earn a berth in the state Meet of Champions.

STACEY PRICE, Westwood, shot put - Price capped her senior year at the state Meet of Champions with a second-place finish ( $41-81 / 4$ ). She earned all-league honors and helped the Cardinals to the North Jersey Group 2, Section 1 title. She recorded a toss of 42-1 to capture the state sectional meet.

ANNE WELLINGTON, Teaneck, discus - At the county Meet of Champions, Wellington's winning throw in the discus measured $121-0$. She also won the discus (121-10) and the shot put (37-10) at the NNJIL Bergen Division Championships.
elena primerano, Lyndhurst, Javelln - Primerano uncorked a throw of 134-10, the longest in the county in five years, to win the Group 2 sectional meet in Wayne last month. She also captured the county Group 2 title.

# Track aces sizzle

The 1988 spring track season was marked by unusually cold weather and sizzling performances.
The cool temperatures that affected all but two weekends of the 10 -week season were the worst in the memory of most track coaches and fans, but it didn't stop area performers from enjoying one of the finest seasons in many years.
The two-year domination of Group 4 boys by area teams ended, although Hackensack finished second in state Group 4 despite a series of injuries and defections. Ridgewood's girls, however, more than made up for the end of the boys' reign with a record-setting $493 / 8$-point win in the Group 4 competition.

Jacob Brown's team from the Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League scored in all nine running events and three field events to earn its first group title. The Maroons set records for points scored in the Bergen Relays, league, county, and sectional Group 4 meets.

Ridgewood was generally considered to have the finest girls track team in state history.

Area girls teams finished in the top five in every group, with Waldwick finishing second and Kinnelon third in Group 1, Paramus third in Group 3, Boonton and Westwood tied for fourth in Group 2, and Queen of Peace and DePaul fifth in Parochial A and B, respectively.

Individually, the season was dominated by five competitiors: Jen McDermott of Ridgewood, Walt McCall of Hackensack, Derrick Horner of Don Bosco, Nicole Thomas of Passaic, and Lamont Harris of Eastside.

## TRACK

McDermott was just amazing. After suffering an injury-plagued sophomore year, the junior leaped into prominence the first week in May by setting Bergen County records in the long and triple jumps at the Williamsport (Pa.) Coaches Track and Field Invitational. Her triple jump of $38-81 / 2$ established a New Jersey record.

McDermott was undefeated in the jumps, and won the state longjump title with a leap of $19-1 / 4$,or $1 / 4$-inch short of the county record she set in the Bergen Girls Meet of Champions.

McCall became only the second athlete in Bergen County history to break 48 seconds for either the 400 meters or 440 yards. He was undefeated at 400 meters, setting a Bergen record of 47.69 seconds in destroying a quality field in the State Meet of Champions, including defending champ David Fields of Monmouth.

Horner was the finest sprinter in New Jersey but was unable to participate in the state meet, as graduation conflicted with the Pa rochial A title meet.

The Harvard-bound senior did not lose a race at 100 or 200 meters all year, tying the county record of 10.6 in winning the Eastern States Championship. He also tied the oldest Bergen"County record, set in 1965, by long jumping $24-11 / 2$ at the NNJIL meet.

A mediocre sprinter as a junior, Thomas turned into a sensational 400 - and 800 -meter runner as a senior, climaxing her season with a state Group 4 title in the 400 with a 56.34 clocking.

Earlier, she had dominated Passaic County competition in both the 400 and 800 . Thomas also
helped the Indians to impressive runner-up performances in both the Passaic County and sectional 4 meets and a record-setting NNJIL Passaic-Essex championship.

Harris, the major returnee from the 1987 State Group 4 championship, was undefeated in area competition in the 110 and 400 hurdles. He helped hold an inexperienced Ghosts squad together and led to them to respectable third-place finishes in both county and NNJIL competition and a fourth in the state sectionals.

Harris finished second in the intermediates in both the state Group 4 and Meet of Champions.

Other outstanding performances came from junior Craig Halyard of Ridgewood, who set a state record in the triple jump with a leap of $48-11 / 4$ and ran on the Ridgewood 1600 -relay team, which set a county mark of $3: 19.25$ in finishing fifth in the state finals; junior Mark Bednarz of Paramus Catholic, second in the state in the 800 , with a best of 1 minute 52.7 seconds; and Demarest shot putter

Mike Theuerkauf, who won his fourth straight Group 3 sectional title, but trailed Jason Miller of Elmwood Park all year until he uncorked a monstrous $62-61 / 2$ toss on his last scholastic throw to win the state title.

Ridgewood's Ginny Figlar set a county record in the 400 at 56.1 and the Ridgewood mile-relay team ran 3:54.29 for another county mark. Elena Primerano of Lyndhurst had a career best 13410 in the javelin for the top throw in five years in the area. Westwood's Stacey Price, who repeated her second-place finish in the shot, had a terrific throw of 421 in winning the Group 2 state title.

In Passaic County, Adolfo Colon of Passaic Tech was the top distance runner, taking a fourth in the Group 43,200 , while teammate and long jumper Sherwin Tann also qualified for the state Meet of Champions. Dave Singletary of Passaic Tech was fifth in the state championship 100 , recovering well from an early-season iniurv.

# Swift, Bowles, Smead among picks

Two athletes who have dominated their events in New Jersey competition, Jodi Bilotta of North Hunterdon and Dawn Bowles of Neptune, head The Star-Ledger 1988 Outdoor Track and Field All-State Team with three firstteam slots apiece.

Bilotta, All-State in both 1,600 and 3,200 meters in her sophomore and junior years, added the 800 this season and won all three races last Wednesday night at the Meet of Champions in South Plainfield. For the third consecutive outdoor season, she won every major race she entered.

Bowles, All-State last year in the 100 -meter hurdles, yesterday was selected as the Scholastic Coach-Ga-

torade Circle of Champions New Jersey Girls' Track Athlete of the Year.

Bowles dominated the 100 - and 200 -meter dashes. She won every race by a wide margin and did not score a triple at the Meet of Champions only because a tight time schedule kept her from entering three events.

A third multiple first-team selection is Charity Smead of Southern Regional in the shot put and javelin. Completing the team are Michelle Samuels of Red Bank in the 400 meters, Tonya Lee of Rancocas Valley in the 400 meter hurdles, Jen McDermott of Ridgewood in the long jump, Shelley Mitchell of Lakewood in the high jump and Rachel Swift of Phillipsburg in the discus.

JODI BILOTTA: The senior had the state's fastest times in all three of her events: 2:11.0 for the 800, $4: 51.2$ for the 1,600 and $10: 24.18$ for the 3,200 . Her leading times in the 800 and 3,200 came at the Meet of Champions. The 1,600 was run at the Mid-State Conference meet. Bilotta will remain active, trying for a berth on the U. S. junior team that will go to the worid championships in Sudbury, Ontario, next month. Bilotta will be at Stanford next fall.

DAWN BOWLES: Bowles, headed for Fairleigh Dickinson in the fall, used the high school season as a warmup for the summer campaign. She has qualified for the U. S. Olympic Trials in Indianapolis in the hurdles, where her best time of 13.1 in the 100 at the Monmouth County Meet in Holmdel stands as the state record. Her top automatic time of 13.33 places her among the top 10 of any age group in the nation.

In the 100 and 200 , Bowles is also among the nation's top high school runners with times of 11.9 and 23.8 . She tripled her three specialties at the Monmouth County, Shore Conference, Central Jersey and Group 4 meets.

CHARITY SMEAD: Smead was undefeated in both the shot put and javelin until the Meet of Champions, when she failed to make the shop put final. She made up for that with a 148 -2 throw, the best effort of the season in
the state, to win the javelin. Smead four times had beaten the All-Groups shot put winner, Shawn Walsh of Toms River East.

MICHELLE SAMUELS: The sophomore was unbeaten in the 400 this spring and dominated the run in the Shore Conference. She finished her sweep with a 55.81 victory in the Meet of Champions to better her winning 56.1 in the Shore Conference Meet.

TONYA LEE: The Bergen County senior and Lakewood's Mitchell staged a great rivalry in the 400 -meter hurdles. Lee won the first round at the South Jersey, Group 3 meet in 1:01.6. Mitchell took the Group 3 title in 1:00.56. Lee came back with a meet record of 58.9 (59.03 automatic time) at the All-Groups Meet. She will now try to meet the Olympic Trials qualifying time of 58.80.

JEN MC DERMOTT: The junior saved her two longest jumps for the Group 4 championships and the Meet of Champions. In the meet, her winning long jump of $18-81 / 2$ was the season's best in New Jersey. But she erased that standard with a $19-0^{1 / 4}$ in the Meet of Champions that concluded the state season.

SHELLEY MITCHELL: Mitchell was by herself in the high jump all season, just as she had been during the indoor season. She cleared 5-8 or better in every major meet except Group $3_{*}^{*}$ when rain fell during the event. Her best of 5-9 came in the sectionals. Mitchell, who is headed to Penn State in the fall, is one of the best all-around athletes in the nation, with the 100 meter hurdles, 400 -meter run and long jump also in her repertoire.

RACHEL SWIFT: Swift, the first to win girls all-state honors in track and field for Phillipsburg, earned hes berth by taking two of three state meem contests from Natasha Criss of Montclair. Swift won at the North Jersey, Section 2, Group 4 meet at 124-1, and in the Group 4 championships with a throw of 128-9. Criss each time was second. Then Swift finished a close sece ond in the Meet of Champions, where she threw 126-7 and Swift 127-1.

This team had its destiney. As $9 t h$ graders you were our last separate jr hi team and you were probably the best of Jack Parish's long line of great gth grade teams. The $4 \times 400$ relay was bth in the varsity county final and several of the girls ran in the varsity championships at the end of the season.

The next three years (86, 87, 8: 88) were years of dominance for Ridgewood track. finmite all dual meets for 3 seasonso you won ally championships except the state in 87 . wou woing all meets and poy ser point scoring records in all championship meets in 1988. Ridgewood's planele achievement was the 1988 State Championship when we scored in 12 of 14 events piling up a record 47 3/8 points. At this point Ed Grant, a long time Jersey track writer called us the "greatest girls team in state history." Upon reflection and checking some old results I'm sure he is right.

Working with you was not always easy. Most of you refused to take leadership from peers and some were downRight difficult to coach. I felt like a college coach this spring. I had supreme confidence in you as athletes but also found you a bunch of self-centered premidonas quite often. This is a common lament heard from my college friends. Part of being a great athlete is confidence almost to the point of arrogance. Learning to blend that into a supportative team framework was something we didn't accomplish. It is ironic that what I consider myself best at: creating a loving supportive team was what this team was worst at. The future challange for seniors going to college and underclass people returning next year is to keep your confidence but be supportive of a teammates efforts. It is helpful to look beyond ourselves sometimes. We can gain personal strength by helping a teammate with her challanges.

What this team was best at was kicking ass! I always knew we would win. When I studied the 4 state sectional results and realized we could absolutely dominate at the state championship meet I got scared! Could I be wrong? Could a record day actually happen? Cauld my confident posturing be just som much hot air? .... Naw! We romped and stomped, chewed them up and spit them autb You are a team that would beat most division II and III college teams and some division I teams. You are probably a better team than you realize. Most of you have college potential. I challange you to realize it. I hope one of you write a story about this team some day. There are many examples in professional sports where the great season begats a book. Our great season derseves at least a short story and certainly has all the elements to make for good reading.

As one would expect I won coach of the year honors this spring. But as all in sports know athletes and assistant coaches win this award for the head coachi. THANKS! I worked with a great group of coaches. Ken Sficlyog気e is a great motivator of women distance runners, Nancy Larena can teach competitive spark with a look and a shout, and Don Fatterson is a great technician whose thoughtful approace is an important counter balance to my
scattered passion. I think this is the greatest group of coaches ever assembeled for a girls tack team in at least Bergen county and perhaps the entire state. Few division I college staffs are as good.

You will notice that I have mentioned gonawes of teammembers in my remarks. That is both ZEliGeate and unique as it is traditional for me to say several things about each senior. When one, has sogmany great athletes it is hard to give each her due and unfair to single any one out for special comments. I have strong feelings of concern for all of you. Some of you are easier to work with than others. Some of you make me angry a lot. Same of you fill me with great jay. Same of you have not grown up yet. Some of you need a hug. Some of you need a kick in the ass. All of you have incredible futures. One thing I realize standing here is I love all of you and consider myself a lucky man to have been associated with you.
