

# Picking favorites for fall

he 1995 area cross-country season will open on Tuesday with some dual meets, with the bulk of duals starting Friday, and the major meet schedule opening Saturday with the Season Opener at Darlington County Park.

The girls probably will grab most of the attention this season, despite the loss of Wayne Valley stars Beth Crenshaw and three-time Passaic County champion Amy Mizzone to graduation, and the injury to defending Bergen County champion Jackle Martin of Hackensack, which will sideline her for the fall

season.

Ridgewood returns four runners from last year's Bergen County championship team, which finished second in Group 4 and a solid fourth in the State Meet of Cham-

pions, led by Stephanie Doyle and Amy Smith, and is a solid favorite for County honors again. Other talented teams include Immaculate Heart Academy, Hackensack, Ramsey [now in Group 2], and Fair Lawn. Defending State Group 1 champion Bogota returns three of its top five, including County Group 1 champion Kirsten LaFond, and

Westwood returns four of its top five, including defending County Group 2 champion Nikki Callaghan of Westwood.

Other defending group champions returning are Group 3 champ Dana Satir of Ramsey, and Kourtney Gallo of Immaculate Heart Academy, the Group 4 champion, and now the Bergen favorite. Other returning All-Bergen runners are Michlyo Kawasaki of IHA and Celeste Sedo of Ridgewood.

Wayne Valley will have difficulty winning a 10th straight Passaic County title with Mizzone, Crenshaw, and Susan Mizzone lost to graduation. But the Indians return junior Sarah Park and soph Jackie Pasek, and should contend with Kennedy, Passaic Valley, and Depaul

Paul.
Other returning All-Passaic performers are Danielle Centurione of Lakeland, Neriza Hufnagel of Ken-

nedy, and Michelle Scoble of Clifton.
Among the boys, the most wideopen season in years looms, both individually and among the teams.

The only returning Bergen
Group champion is Group 1 defender
Jamle Cortes of Palisades Park,
who figures to battle Kevin Gilman of
Bergen Catholic, Jeremy Battles of
River Dell, and the Paramus Catholic
trio of John Bryjak, Andrew Zagula, and Noah Murphy for County
honors. But there is a host of fine
sophomores including Cary Snyder of
Demarest, Jeff Clark of Bogota,
Matt Caporalettl of Westwood, and
Ridgewood juniors Nell Burt and
Eric Rogers who might be heard
from before the season is over.

Team honors should be a battle among Paramus Catholic, Ridgewood, Bergen Catholic, and perhaps dark horse Westwood.

The graduation of two-time Passaic County champion Mike Grant of Passaic Valley, now at Columbia University, opens up the individual race with Clifton's Sibi Joseph, Chris Morris of Eastside, and Bernard Fraser of Passaic the leading contenders. Look for Will Blerach of Passaic Valley to help the Hornets battle defending champ Passaic for the County title.

On the State level, defending girls champion Red Bank Catholic returns its entire team, with Bishop Eustace also returning five top runners and Hunterdon Central returning State individual favorite Autumn Fogg. Ridgewood could be in the hunt for Group 4, Ramsey for Group 2, and Bogota and Palisades Park in Group 1.

Defending champ Paul VI and eight-time winner Christian Brothers Academy head the boys field with Highland, North Hunterdon, and Westfield also in the battle. Individually, look for Brian Bennett of CBA, Matt Elmuccio of Westfield, Roger Munoz of Kearny, and Chris Robinson of North Hunterdon to be near the top individually.

## Drought jeopardizes Maroon

fter a slow first week of competition, the major meet schedule opens this morning with the Season Opener at Darlington County Park in Mahwah. Next week features the Maroon Invitational at Garret Mountain — weather permitting.

And ironically, rain, always a bane of outdoor events in the fall and spring, is the weather that is needed to permit the annual Maroon Invitational to be held.

"Garret Mountain has been closed for about three weeks because of the drought," said Maroon Invitational race director Mike Glynn. "And if it's not opened by Wednesday, we'll have to cancel the meet this year which would be a real shame."

This is one of the infrequent Septembers in which there are five Saturdays instead of the usual four. And the extra Saturday leaves the Maroon in the enviable position of being the only local meet on the calendar next week. The Bulldog Invitational at Bergen Community College, normally a rival meet for the Maroon, will battle the Passaic County Coaches Association on Sept. 30.

So with nearly a week of entries left [ordinarily teams can enter by phone as late as Friday], the Maroon already had 25 entries as of Friday.

Glynn will make a decision Wednesday and urges teams who are planning to come to enter despite the uncertainty that the meet will be held.

"We'll issue a complete refund the Monday after the meet is canceled, if it isn't held," said Glynn. "In fact, we'll send their own checks back."

<sup>6</sup>We're hoping the rains come, we're hoping that if they don't, the people at Garret Mountain can do something for us, because it's a perfect year for our meet," said Glynn.

And the loss of an early-season invitational in a year with so many inexperienced area boys teams would be a crucial blow to the development of those runners. A possibility remains that the meet could be shifted, possibly to William Paterson College in Wayne.

If the dry spell continues, the Passaic County coaches meet, one of the top invitationals in the state, could be imperiled, not to mention dozens of dual meets that are held there every year.

The meet is one of only two on the schedule this weekend, including the Williamstown Kiwanis meet in South Jersey.

Paramus Catholic, Bergen County's preseason favorite, will face CBA, along with Toms River East, Bergen Catholic, and Don Bosco.

The top five boys times on the 5,000-meter Darlington course, now in its fourth year, are Bob Keino, Ridgewood (1993) at 15:05, Matt Illian of Pascack Valley (1993) at 15:52, Regan Ladisic of Paramus Catholic (1992) at 15:53, Leigh Cadigan of Northern Valley at Old Tappan (1993) at 15:59, and Bill Grogan of Bergenfield (1992) at 16:02. The top Passaic time was 16:06 turned in by Doug Carter of Wayne Hills (1993), while BC senior Kevin Gilman is the top returnee with a best time of 16:17.

The top five girls times include Jenna Rogers of Ridgewood (1993), the course record holder at 17:49, Jackie Martin of Hackensack (1994) at 18:45, Regina Gonzales of Holy Angels (1992) at 18:46, Carli Gallo of Mahwah (1992) at 19:00, and Kourtney Gallo of Immaculate Heart Academy (1994) at 19:06. ## This year they're chasing

MAHWAH — There are different expectations this cross-country season for Karen Petouvis of Paramus and Jamie Cortes of Palisades Park.

-Last year, when both ran well enough to earn second-team All-Bergen honors — Gortes as a cross-country standout and Pétouvis as the second-best 3,200-meter runner — their success was unexpected and they were able to sneak up on some favored distance stars.

But this year they're among the favorites, and at Saturday's Season Opener Invitational they lived up to their heightened expectations.

Cortes' victory was easier as the senior led from start to finish. Midway through the race, he turned to first-year teammate Diego Gioffre and said: "Come on, pick it up!" His inspiration helped Gioffre to third place.

"This year I finally ran all summer and I'm lifting and working out very hard," said Cortes. "If I practiced harder last year I could have made first team. In my last year I don't want to fall short again."

Toms River East edged Immaculate Heart Academy, 49-54, in Girls Varsity A, but the Blue Eagles placed four runners in the top 12 without top runner Kourtney Gallo, who skipped the race but looked comfortable in a post-race workout. Wayne Valley was third, with junior Sarah Park fourth in the individual race in a personal best 20:38.

Westwood's girls also missed their top runner, injured Nikki Callaghan, but ran well with four runners in the top 15 behind Varsity B race winner Kittatinny, 41-58. Palisades Park placed five runners between seventh and 19th place for an impressive third-place finish with 60 points. But the race stamps the Group 1 Tigers as potential State contenders.

Stacy Hosier of Kittatinny edged Kirsten LaFond of Bogota by 75 yards to win the Varsity B race. Erica Cesario of Bogota was third, but the Bucs finished 11 points behind Palisades Park in their first meet in defense of their Group 1 title.

## CBA, RBC win as Pope John, Mt. Olive surprise

The unranked Pope John boys, who wanted to make a statement, were heard loud and clear when they cele brated a surprising sixth-runner tiebreaker victory over Morris Hills, ranked sixth in The Star-Ledger Top 10, in the D Division at the Shore Coaches Cross-Country Invitational yesterday in Holmdel Park.

The young unranked Mt. Olive girls, with four freshmen in their top five, shocked No. 3 Paul VI to capture the C Division title.

Top-ranked Christian Brothers, Top-ranked Christian Brussers, led by Eric Savoth's 16:19 victory, the fastest boys' time of the day, and the No. 1 Red Bank Catholic girls, the 1994 MISIAA Meet of Champions winner, and the state's as the state's solidified their status as the state's best with runaway victories.

CBA easily defeated No. 3 High-land Regional, the '94 Group 4 cham-pion, 45-122, in the A Division.

Red Bank Catholic, averaging 20:36, rolled over No. 8 Bishop Eustace, 44-84, to win the D Division.

In the boys' D Division, Pope John and Morris Hills finished deadlocked at 105. But Pope John was awarded the victory when its sixth man. Matt. Day placed 39th and beat Morris Hills' sixth man, who was 61st. Day, normally Pope John's fourth man, injured his foot playing soccer in gym class last week and wasn't 100 percent. Mt. Olive, which served notice that it will be in the thick of things in Group 3, received a third from freshman Kim Primavera in 19:59, a seventh from freshman Alisa Corea in 20:45, an eighth from freshman Varinka Barbini in 20:48, an 18th from junior Laura Monchinski in 21:31 and a 19th from freshman Sarah Hall in 21:34. That's an average of 20:55 and a gap of 1:35.



## RBC facing big test tomorrow against elite foes in Eastern meet

Red Bank Catholic coach Mary Banks feels it's time to see just how good her girls' cross-country team is.

She has decided to take her pack to tomorrow's 23d Manhattan Invitational to compete against some of the nation's elite teams in the girls' Eastern States 2.5-mile race at Van Cortlandt Park in The Bronx. The race is scheduled to begin at 1:37 p.m.

Red Bank Catholic is ranked No. 1 in The Star-Ledger Girls' Cross-Country Top 10 and No. 12 in the nation, according to the Foot Locker Super 25. In tomorrow's race, RBC will take on Saratoga Springs of New York, ranked No. 1 by Foot Locker; defending champion and 1994 national titlist Shenendehowa of New York, ranked No. 2; No. 9 Fayet-

teville-Manlius of New York and No. 16 Manchester Central of New Hampshire.

Also in the race are Mt. Olive, which debuts in the Top 10 at No. 4 this week after beating Paul VI (No. 3 at the time) to win the Shore Coaches C Division title last week at Holmdel, No. 6 Hunterdon Central, Ridge and Pascack

"We anticipated it being loaded with great teams," said Banks. "Last year, we were young and ranked and didn't go. This year, I felt we couldn't shy away from anyone anymore. I think this is the time they need to be there. This is about trying to justify our ranking as well. The team needs to know that the rankings are right. They need

"I don't know how we'll do against the first- and second-ranked teams, but I would like us to be the closest to them and have a good race from our front runners."

Sophomore Meghan Cunniff, an All-State choice last year, was RBC's front runner a year ago. She has gotten off to a slow start this season because of a nagging ankle sprain. But Cunniff showed signs of breaking out when she moved up from seventh to fourth for her team and 13th overall with a time of 21:00 late in the D Division race at the Shore Coaches meet.

Cunniff's time was 1:30 slower than what she ran to win the same race

"Finishing strong like that was a confidence booster for her," said Banks. "The ankle is fine. It's the taping that she's uncomfortable with. I think if she's comfortable, she'll have a nice race for us."

Whether or not Cunniff can regain last year's front-running form may be the key for RBC tomorrow.

RBC's top two all season have been junior Kerry Andrews, 14th at the state Meet of Champions last year, and senior Jerilyn Frattalone. At the Shore Coaches meet, Andrews was second in 20:03 and Frattalone fourth in 20:13.

Banks expected Andrews to be at the front of her pack, but Frattalone's early-season front-running has been a shot in the arm.

"Jerilyn has been a definite boost for the team" said Banks. "She's worked really hard for three years, has steadily improved and is developing more confidence. Getting under 20 minutes is something we anticipate and she's right there."

At the Shore meet, junior Maureen Maloney finished ninth in 20:45, junior Jackie Iovino was 16th in 21:02 and junior Erin O'Rourke was 17th in 21:03.

"Jerilyn and Maureen have really stepped it up for us," said Banks. "And Erin and Jackie have done a great job. Everyone is excited about Saturday's race. They are a little nervous, but they've been training real hard and are confident."

Also at tomorrow's Manhattan Invitational, Christian Brothers, ranked No. 1 in The Star-Ledger Boys' Cross-Country Top 10 and No. 6 by Foot Locker, is the heavy favorite to win the G Division race. There are seven boys' varsity races on the card with several New Jersey teams involved.

## Leader and The Pack on course

lways a solid girls crosscountry team, Rutherford, in the last two weekends, has taken a giant step toward being much more.

Sophomore Mahasin Pegeise is running cross-country for the first time, and has established herself as a solid No. 1 runner, after an outstanding freshman track season as an intermediate hurdler.

But it is what is behind Pegeise that has made Rutherford a team that can be special.

In a sport where the top five finishers by each team score (and in case of a tie — the top six), one or two fine runners are not enough to ensure team success. That is where the pack comes in. The Nos. 3-4-5-6 runners on a given team are what determines the ultimate record of a team.

And Rutherford's pack has become The Pack in North Jersey cross-country.

First observed in the Bulldogs' one-point win over Metuchen two weeks ago at Bergen Community College, The Pack became even more impressive at the Brett Taylor B meet at Darlington last weekend.

Bogota runners went 1-2 in the race and Pegeise was third. A minute later, after four top runners from four different schools had finished, Melissa Lockheed, Jessica Larsen, Megan Vogel, Meghan Doyle, and Lauren McCann appeared as a sea of Rutherford dark blue and white. Thirteen seconds after Lockheed had finished eighth, McCann finished 12th, and a close meet had turned into a waltz. For good measure, The Bulldogs' seventh finisher, Lynn Su, finished just 28 seconds behind McCann, in 18th place.

"We had about 15 girls working out together twice a week all summer," said Rutherford coach Barbara Gundry. "They said they wanted to run as a pack, because they'd always heard about it. I said they could run as a pack, but they had to make it a fast pack."

Only Larsen is a senior.

McCann, Vogel, and Doyle are juniors and the rest sophomores, so the future is bright for Rutherford.

Don't expect the Bulldogs to finish higher than third in next week's BCSL American championships, behind undefeated Fort Lee and Westwood. The Pack is more effective in larger races. But the Oct. 28 sectionals and Nov. 11 State Group 2 championship may prove interesting for Rutherford.

## Amazing streaks still alive

ith the championship season in full swing with five league championships held last week and the Bergen County group championships set for this afternoon, two dual-meet performances must be saluted before we look forward.

Both the Wayne Valley and Ridgewood girls teams have completed an amazing 12th straight year of unbeaten dual meets, running Ridgewood's winning streak to 79 meets and Wayne Valley's to 195. All meets during the streaks have taken place within their respective leagues, the Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League for Ridgewood and the Northern Hills for Wayne Valley.

"This year every meet was pretty tough for us," said Wayne Valley coach Conan Ward, the third Indians coach during the streak, after Bill Stearns (six years) and Joann Mosley (one). "We had lost some great runners from last year and we had only one runner with a lot of varsity experience. And the others hadn't really responded when they had filled in at varsity in the past. I thought we'd have a difficult time continuing the streak."

But hard work over the summer from a group that included junior Sarah Park, the lone varsity returnee, who is favored to win the Passaic County championship on Election Day, helped the streak continue.

Other members of this year's Wayne Valley varsity include junior Lauren Katz, a former soccer player who came out for the first time. Other juniors — Mary Beth Sexton, Kerri Cleland, and Lauren Friedman — stepped forward, as did soph Jen Pasek.

And the Indians even overcame an injury to their best soph, Jackie Pasek, with the help of freshmen Catherine Getty, Jessica Monahan, Danise Cavallero, and Eryn Taormina.

"Montville and Morris Catholic are both very good teams and we were able to beat both of them in close meets. The last two meets we really began to run well, and I'm hoping it carries us into the sectionals and counties," said Ward.

Wayne Valley's last loss was to a fine DePaul team in 1983, led by Parochial A champion Rene Murphy.

"This year's team may not have the stars, but we may have the most depth we've ever had," said Ward. "I'm so proud of what they've accomplished."

Ward credits tradition as well as talent and hard work for the long streak.

"Tradition is a large part of our success," says Ward. "The kids who are already here always welcome the new kids and carry things on."

"Look at Ridgewood, they always have good leadership, great depth, and kids who love to run and love to compete."

Ridgewood's streak in numbers is smaller than Wayne Valley's, but that is more a function of the leagues than anything else.

The Northern Hills runs up to 17 teams in quadrangular and quintangular meets on five or six dates, while the NNJIL has cut to only four dates and dual or triangular meets within its own divisional, so Ridgewood won only seven meets each of the last three years while Wayne Valley was winning 17.

But the Ridgewood streak, which extends back to a 27-30 loss to Hackensack on Oct. 4, 1983, is at least as significant.

Since then, only two meets have been as close as nine points (a 24-31 win over Paramus in 1985 and 24-33 over Hackensack in 1986). And in the last six years, only this year's Kennedy team put as many as two runners ahead of Ridgewood's fifth in any meet.

"It's a real credit to the girls and their love of running," said veteran Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown.

This year's team is led by seniors Amy Smith and Stephanie Doyle, soph Celeste Sedo, and juniors Katie Cohn and Carrie Ruggles. But the Maroons also have runners like senior Beth Apsel and solid jayvee runners able to fill in to keep the streak going.

## Runners facing sloppy title quest

The forecast calls for rain Saturday afternoon during the annual Bergen County Group cross-country championships at Darlington Park in Mahwah, but that won't dampen the spirits of the County's best runners.

The always anticipated group championships will, as usual, provide their share of expected winners and surprise performers and teams, with the top three teams in each group plus the top individuals plus up to 10 wild cards qualifying for the Bergen County Meet of Champions at Darlington on Nov. 4. Here's a closer look at the eight races.

BOYS GROUP 1 - Palisades Park is favored to become the first team since Bogota (1982-84) to win three straight Group 1 titles. Seven of the top 10 individuals return from last year, including defending champ Jamie Cortes, heavily favored to become the first Group 1 repeat titlist since David Gendleman of Dwight-Englewood in 1983 and 1984. Look for BCSL Olympic rivals Emerson, Bogota, and Park Ridge, plus Becton and Saddle Brook to battle for the other two team spots. Peter Startz of Waldwick and BCSL Olympic champ Scott Menti of Cresskill should also ex-

BOYS GROUP 2 - Westwood, off its BCSL American win, is heavily favored to repeat, with a wide-open battle for second and third. The top returnee is 1994 fifth-place finisher Steve Calijone of Mahwah, with Andrew and Chris Tortora of Rutherford and soph Matt Caporaletti of Westwood also in the hunt.

BOYS GROUP 3 — With defending champ Paramus Catholic now in Group 4, look for Demarest, Ramapo, Paramus, Queen of Peace, and undefeated Garfield to scrap for the title. A fine individual race looms between Cary Snyder of NV/Demarest, Jeremy Bat-tles of River Dell, BCSL American champ Marco Alves of Queen of Peace,

and Andrew Knight of Ramapo.

BOYS GROUP 4 — Don Bosco is the defending champ but Ridgewood is the prohibitive favorite to claim its 11th tile since 1978. PC should be second with Don Bosco, Hackensack, and Bergen Catholic in a dogfight for third. Kevin Gilman of BC hopes to defend his title against Noah Murphy and Andrew Zagula of PC, Kurt Erler of Don Bosco, and Neil Burt of Ridgewood.



With apologies to the United States Postal Service and Herodotus, postal workers have nothing on the runners in Saturday's Bergen County group championships.

Somehow, at the height of the storm that wiped out many other events on the area high school schedule, Palisades Park, Westwood, Northern Valley at Demarest and Ridgewood managed to earn team championships Saturday in impressive style.

Even a tornado-like gust of wind as the Group 1 boys were finishing, which knocked down a tree 10 feet from the scoring van, couldn't stop Jamie Cortes and Palisades Park from repeating easily, 34-98 over Saddle Brook.

Cortes, who ran 16:36 for the 5,000 meters to defeat Peter Startz of Waldwick by 35 meters, led the Tigers to their third straight title and became the first runner in 11 years to repeat in Group 1. The Tigers had four runners in the top 10.

"This is such an unusual bunch," said Palisades Park coach Frank Donahue. "They're able to get pumped up every week and they think they can do some great things."

"Our team is really strong," said Cortes, who with Group 3 winner Andrew Knight of Ramapo and Group 4 winner Kevin

Gilman of Bergen Catholic are the favorites to win the Bergen Meet of Champions in two weeks. "We want to be in the top three as a team in the BMOC.



## No. 1 RBC girls to face strong foes in Shore X-c meet

Judging by what the coaches are saying, tomorrow's girls' race at the Shore Conference Cross-Country Championships, which is one of the most eagerly awaited showdowns of the season, should be a real barn burner.

Red Bank Catholic will put its No. 1 ranking in The Star-Ledger Girls' Top 10 on the line against No. 3 Brick and No. 7 Middletown South. The race is scheduled to go off at 3:45 p.m. at Ocean County Park, Lakewood.

This will be the first meeting of the

eason between Brick and Red Bank Catholic. RBC beat Middletown South, 47-72, to win the Monmouth County Championship and Brick defeated Middletown South, 56-119, in the B Division race at last month's Shore Coaches Invitational at Holmdel Park.

In the boys' race at 4:10 p.m., No. 1 Christian Brothers is favored to repeat against No. 5 Toms River East and No. 7 Toms River South. Toms River East has finished ahead of Toms River South in all three meetings this season.

'It should be pretty tight," said Brick girls' coach Bill McGuire, whose team is looking for its first Shore Conference title since winning a fifth straight in 1989. "If we run the way we're capable of, it should be close. All three teams are running great and it's wide open."

"It's going to be close," agreed Red Bank Catholic coach Mary Banks, whose teams have won the last two Shore Conference titles. "This is one of our toughest races of the season."

RBC's frontrumers are junior Kerry Andrews and senior Jerilyn Frattalone. Andrews won the Shore Conference race as a freshman. The rest of RBC's pack consists of junior twins Maureen and Mara Maloney; sophomore Meghan Cunniff, the runner-up in the Shore Conference race last year, who has struggled to regain her freshman form, and sophomore Jackie Iovino and junior Erin O'Rourke. RBC will be without Maureen Maloney, the No. 3 or 4 runner most of the season, who is sidelined with an injured foot. Junior Maureen Vasile will take her place.

Brick's lineup, although intact, won't be 100 percent. Junior Jaimie Silva, normally Brick's No. 2 runner, has been running with a stress fracture in her left leg. That injury caused her to drop to No. 4 in the pack in the NJSIAA South Jersey, Group 3 state sectional race last Saturday at Kingsway in Swedesboro. But without Silva's courageous effort, Brick would've had a tough time retaining its title.

"She has clearance to run and has been training in the pool," McGuire said. "She has dropped a little bit, but is still in the middle of our pack."

Much to McGuire's surprise and delight, Brick's No. 1 runner has been freshman Cheryl Wroblewski.

"We knew she'd be good," said McGuire. "But we were just hoping that she'd be in our top five. She's made a big jump."

The rest of Brick's five are sophomores K.C. Meehan and Sarah Chase and senior Jen Newman. At the South Jersey meet, Brick's first four were separated by 57 seconds and its five by 1:25. RBC's first five were separated by just 36 seconds when they won the New Jersey Catholic Conference title on Saturday in Elizabeth's Warinanco Park.

At the Shore Coaches meet, Brick's top five averaged 20:49 and were separated by 54 seconds in the B race, while RBC's five averaged 20:36 and were separated by 59 seconds in the D race.

"I think we're the favorite, but Brick has been running very strong and if Jaimie is healthy, they have a very good chance," said Banks. "And Middletown South is really coming together. The key for us is for our frontrunners to get out early and our 4-5-6 runners to keep a small gap. I'm anxious to see how we'll run."

"For us to win, our top five have to run close to their max," said McGuire. "Red Bank Catholic has the most talent on their roster and I'd say they have the edge."

Ocean County Park, a flat, fast and open course, is Brick's home, and RBC has yet to run on it this season. The Shore Conference alternates sites each year between Ocean County Park and Holmdel Park. Last year, RBC won at Holmdel, which is its home course. Holmdel is ideal for hill climbing, which is RBC's strength.

"It's to their advantage to run at Ocean County Park," said Banks. "They are used to it and I think the course will play into it."

Middletown South, fresh off its 43-57 upset victory over Hunterdon Central in the Central Jersey, Group 4 race, should be in the thick of things. Middletown South relies on pack running rather than front running, and it has paid off. Middletown South's top five are senior Jen Griffin, juniors Colleen Glass, Teresa Joerger and Tara Cullen and freshman Cate Guiney.

Individually, Tems River North sophomore Jenn Pesce, the Ocean County champion, Pinelands junior Amy Beykirch, Manchester Township junior Lorena Adams and St. Rose freshman Maura Bolger, the Monmouth County champion, will hook up in what should be a dramatic girls' race.

The boys' individual race could also be a dandy as CBA's Eric Savoth, Brian Bennett and Brian Cunniff, Central Regional's Sean McCafferty and Toms River South's Jason Klophaus go head-to-head.

"I think Savoth, Bennett, Cunniff and Klophaus will all be factors," said McCafferty, who beat Klophaus and avenged an earlier loss to Mainland's Scott Keyser to win the South Jersey, Group 3 title. "But Savoth is the best right now. I'll try and stay up there as long as I can and, hopefully, I'll have a shot with a half mile left."

## Two races the fans want to see

oday's Bergen County
Meet of Champions and

meet are not the most important meets on the schedule.
That honor belongs to the State

But the County championships are the only place where all the top runners in a given area get to run against each other in the same race, making them perhaps the most awaited meets of the year.

Today, at Darlington County Park in Mahwah, Ridgewood is favored to sweep the boys and girls Bergen meets for the fourth time.

In the boys race, the Maroons, who last won the title in 1991, should have little trouble, with their top five runners all expected to be within the top 25 in the race. The team interest will come in the battle for second place, with Group 1 champion Palisades Park, Group 2 champ Westwood, Group 3 champ Northern Valley at Demarest, Paramus Catholic, and Don Bosco Prep all possible team runners-up.

Pal Park and Paramus Catholic have the best 1-2-3 punch, but Demarest has gotten better with every race, Westwood is young but solid, and Don Bosco has the second-best pack behind Don Bosco.

Individually, the race appears to be between Group 1 champ Jamie Cortes of Palisades Park, Group 3 champ Andrew Knight of Ramapo, and two-time Group 4 champ Kevin Gilman of Bergen Catholic.

Tuesday's Passaic meet at Garret Mountain is harder to predict. Passaic's fine third-place finish in the Group 4 sectional make the defending champions a favorite to repeat in the boys race. But Clifton also ran well, and has the top trio in the race and Passaic Valley could also challenge.

## Knight holds on; Ridgewood sweeps

MAHWAH — As Andrew Knight pounded down the final straightaway towards the finish line at the Bergen County Meet of Champions, he was running scared. Scared of the footsteps he was hearing behind him, footsteps that had dogged him from when he had taken the lead two-thirds of the way into the 5,000-meter race.

"I had no idea who was behind me," said the Ramapo senior after he held on for the victory in the year's best time of 16:18, just 25 meters ahead of surprising runner-up Kurt Erler of Don Bosco Prep. "I thought it might be Kevin [Bergen Catholic's Gilman, who led for much of the race] or Jamie Cortes [of Palisades Park] or even [Peter] Startz of Waldwick. I figured I could hold on, but I wasn't

Knight was joined in victory by Amy Smith of Ridgewood and the Ridgewood boys and girls teams, all of whom won as expected, and won comfortably. But Knight's victory was anything but comfortable.

"My lungs are still hurting from the cold," Knight said about 20 minutes after the race. "If we were practicing in it, you can could get used to it. But it was 70 degrees Friday and 45 today."

Gilman took the race out hard as usual, with Knight second and Erler, who was 11th in the Bergen Group 4 race two weeks ago, third. Gilman led until the 2-mile mark, when Knight, loser of only one race all season, blew by with Erler close behind.

"I injured my back lifting about two

months ago, and I haven't raced very much," said Erler, who finished second to Gilman in the NNJIL meet last month. "But my coaches thought I could do it anyway and I trained through a lot of races."



"We were both disappointed the way we ran last week," said Cohn. "The cold weather helped us I think, and Ramsey and IHA have been so hot, we knew that if Carrie and I didn't run well, we'd be in trouble."

"It's probably fair to say that was true," said Ridgewood coach Jacob Brown. "The kids gave them some heat, but they took it and came through as I knew they would."

So did Smith. As they have been nearly all season, she and teammate Stephanie Doyle ran one-two almost the entire race and Smith never broke stride from the opening gun until she crossed the finish line.

## Cunniff leads RBC; CBA triumphs again

Red Bank Catholic, No. 1 in The Star-Ledger Girls' Cross-Country Top 10, received a season-best performance from sophomore Meghan Cunniff, who placed sixth, and ran its top team race of the year for a surprisingly easy victory over No. 3 Brick and No. 7 Middletown South to take its third straight Shore Conference championship yesterday at Ocean County Park in Lake-

Individually, both races provided plenty of drama. In the girls' race, jun-ior Amy Beykirch of Pinelands, who lost to Jenn Pesce, a Toms River North sophomore, at the Ocean County Championships on the same course on Oct. 20, pulled away from Pesce at the 2.5-mile mark to win the biggest race in her career in a personal-best 18:08.8. According to race officials, the flat and fast course is closer to 3.0 miles than it is to 3.1. At the Ocean County meet, Pesce won in 18:24 and Beykirch was second in 18:34.

In the boys' race, junior Brian Bennett broke away from teammate Eric Savoth and Sean McCafferty of Central Regional over the final half mile to win in 15:37.1 and lead No. 1 ranked Christian Brothers to its 14th straight title. CBA averaged 15:57, which, according to CBA coach Tom Heath, surpassed the course record team average of 16:13 that his CBA team ran in 1991.

But the story of the day was how convincing Red Bank Catholic's victory was over two of the state's better teams.

Based on the times both teams had been running all season, almost evervone, including the coaches, figured it was going to be a tossup between Red Bank Catholic and Brick.

But RBC, with junior Kerry Andrews fifth in 18:38.0 and Cunniff sixth in 18:38.5, put its fourth runner in ahead of Brick's second, averaged 18:51 and had a spread of 45 seconds between Andrews and No. 5 Erin O'Rourke. O'Rourke finished 17th in 19:23.1 for a team total of 40 points. Brick was second with 89 and Middletown South third with 99.

"I can't really point to any one person who ran well because everyone did," said Red Bank Catholic coach Mary Banks. "But Meghan's race was outstanding. We felt the pressure coming into the race. We knew Brick was strong and Middletown South was hungry. This is definitely the best team race we've had this season. I've been looking for us to run a race like this all year. This win is very big and the sweetest of the three that we've won.'

Cunniff, third at the Meet of Champions and a Star-Ledger All-State choice last year, has struggled to regain her freshman form. Yesterday's performance was a step in the right direction. Most of this season, Cunniff has been anywhere from third to fifth in her team's pack.

"I knew I had to have a good race some time and today it finally happened," said a thrilled and relieved Cunniff. "This is the the best race I've had this season and this should give me more confidence for the rest of the sea-

"This win is really key for us," said Andrews. "Mentally, this is the most focused we've been all season. We wanted to win this real bad."

When Pesce beat Beykirch in their only other meeting in the Ocean County meet, she broke Beykirch at the two-mile mark on her way to the 10-second victory. This time, Beykirch stayed at Pesce's side and refused to let her get away.

"Losing to her was a learning ex-perience for me," said Beykirch. "It made me want this even more. Losing made me more hungry.

"I knew I had to stick to her shoul-. der and not let her get away this time. When I was with her at two miles I began to gain some confidence and when I started to pull away I tried to sprint for as long as I could. I didn't know if she was back there just waiting to kick. She pushed me the whole way. Yeah, this is the biggest victory I've ever had. I dreamed about winning this, but I never really thought about it. This is a great feeling."

In the boys' race, Savoth and Bennett stayed side by side, with McCaf-ferty a step back between in a three-man pack for the first 2.5 miles. Then Bennett, the best kicker in the race, used his superior leg turnover to win his biggest race in 15:37.7. McCafferty was second in 15:39.0 and Savoth, losing his first in-state race of the season, was third in 15:40.2.

McCafferty, who ran for CBA as a sophomore two years ago, Savoth and Bennett all ran together at CBA's Colt Camp in the Poconos over the summer.

The three of us made a pact over the summer that we'd make this race exciting," said Bennett, "I felt good with a half mile to go because I know I have more speed than they do. I felt I'd be able to outkick them.

"I'm not surprised that I won, because from race to race you never know what's going to happen. This was a breakout race for me. I've been waiting to pop a good one."

'In a way I think it's better that I lost because it gives me more to look forward to," said McCafferty, alluding to the state group championships next Saturday and the state Meet of Champions on Nov. 19 at Holmdel. "Sure, I would have liked to have won, but from here on out I think a different guy is going to win each week and I still feel Savoth is the one to beat because he's

## Fraulo comes out a winner

ou Fraulo might have taken a lot of criticism Monday afternoon when he postponed the Passaic County cross-country championships set for Tuesday, based on the weather report.

But Fraulo, the meet director, had also directed the sectional meet at a soggy Garret Mountain the week before, and decided that discretion was the better part of valor.

Paramus sophomore Kelly Ortiz lost her shoes before the Group 3 Bergen race three weeks ago, and finished 12th instead of perhaps winning. She found her shoes after the race, and at the BMOC finished a sizzling third.

"I just decided to run as hard as I could for as long as I could," said Ortiz. "As we got into the final straightaway, someone yelled that if I passed one more person, I'd get a [third place] trophy. So I pushed even harder."

Bergen County boys champion Andrew Knight is one of the most analytical and talkative runners in recent years. Jeremy Battles of River Dell had struggled all season following early season shinsplints. That made it unlikely that last year's sixth place BMOC could be duplicated — until Battles ran his best race of the year Saturday and finished fourth.

## Elmuccio, Fogg, RBC girls, CBA boys take aim at titles

The Red Bank Catholic girls will seek a rare repeat, Christian Brothers will try to regain its title and Westfield's Matt Elmuccio and Hunterdon Central's Autumn Fogg will aim for the final jewel in running's triple crown tomorrow during the NJSIAA's 24th Cross-Country Meet of Champions in Holmdel Park.

The girls' race will start at 11 a.m.

and the boys' race at 11:45.

The boys' course record of 15:16.2 was set in 1988 by Jason DiJoseph of Paul VI in the Parochial A race. Brendan Heffernan of North Hunterdon set the M of C record of 15:31 in 1991. Janet Smith of J.P. Stevens ran 17:35.5 in 1983, which is the girls' meet and course record.

The triple crown consists of M of C titles both indoors and outdoors in track and one in cross-country. Elmuccio and Fogg each won M of C track titles indoors and outdoors in the 1,600

Red Bank Catholic, No. 1 in The Star-Ledger Top 10, is favored to become the first girls' team since North Hunterdon won its fourth straight in 1986 to win back-to-back M of C titles. Last year, Hunterdon Central was a heavy favorite to win the girls' M of C race for the second straight time, but had a subpar race and allowed RBC to spring the upset. RBC won last year with 70 points. Bishop Eustace, which has never won the M of C, placed second with 77 points while Hunterdon Central, which didn't qualify for tomorrow's race, was third with 97.

This time around, No. 2 Shawnee, No. 3 Brick, which won M of C titles in 1977 and 1988, and No. 4 Bishop Eustace are among the teams looking to spoil RBC's historic quest. RBC is tied with North Hunterdon for the most M

of C titles with six.

## **CROSS COUNTRY**

"Shawnee is very strong and so are some of the other teams," said RBC coach Mary Banks. "Anything can happen. Look what happened last year. But our team is confident. They are always confident when they are running well as a team and right now they are running well. They are very focused and motivated to try to win again.'

At last Saturday's state group championships at hilly Holmdel, RBC, running before the heavy rain came, had the best average of the day (20:14) and a gap of 1:09 as it defeated Bishop Eustace, 31-38. Bishop Eustace had the second-best average (20:16), followed

It wasn't raining when Shawnee ran, but its No. 3, Rachel Wick, who had the flu all week, dropped out with a mile left when the symptoms returned. Shawnee's usual No. 6, Nikki Thiemann, stepped up and finished No. 3 for the team and 11th overall in 20:20.6.

"I think it's a tossup between a few teams," said Shawnee coach Mike Yurcho, who guided Shawnee to M of C title in 1991. "I think Red Bank Catholic, ourselves, Brick and Bishop Eustace all have a chance and I think our chances are as good as anybody's."

RBC has remained ranked No. 1 since the preseason, but is considerably stronger now, thanks to the resurgence of sophomore Meghan Cunniff. Cunniff an All-Stater who was third at the M of C last year, got off to a slow start this season partly because of a sprained ankle. She was her team's No. 3 runner until the Shore Conference meet two weeks ago, when she was RBC's No. 2 behind Kerry Andrews. This past week, Cunniff was RBC's No. 1 for the first time this season when she placed second in the Parochial B race. Cunniff and Andrews give RBC the best one-two punch in

"We know that everyone is looking to knock us off, but we want to prove to everyone that we can win again," said Cunniff, the brother of CBA star Brian Cunniff.

There isn't nearly as much drama surrounding the boys' team race. CBA, ranked No. 1, is just too far ahead of everyone else and should run away with its eighth M of C trophy, thus extending its state record. CBA won the M of C in 1979, '80, '86, '87, '90, '91 and '93. Last year, Paul VI won by outscoring runner-up CBA, 63-81.

Last week, CBA's top five, running when it was dry, averaged 16:49 and had a spread of 52 seconds. By comparison, No. 2 Westfield, running in pretty good conditions when it won Group 4, had the second-best average at 17:16. Group 3 champion North Hunterdon, which ran when the course was a swamp, was next with a 17:28 average, followed by Group 4 runner-up Ridgewood (17:31).

A plic school has not won the boys' M of C race since Bernards in 1986. Westfield, which won its lone M of C race in 1976, is among the teams trying to end that drought.

This race is the ultimate challenge," said Westfield coach Jack Martin, whose team placed third at the M of C in each of the last two years. "We are tremendous underdogs, but a lot can happen."

CBA has the state's top trio in Eric Savoth, Brian Bennett and Brian Cunniff. Savoth and Bennett like to go out hard together and set the early pace. Savoth and Bennett are among the individual favorites.

The 16:19 that Savoth ran to win the A Division race at the Shore Coaches Invitational last month is the fastest time run at Holmdel this season. Last week, Savoth ran 16:27.2 to win the Parochial A race.

Also running 16:27.2 last week was Westfield's Elmuccio, who won Group 4 and owns the best kick in the race.

"I should be right there at the end and I feel good about my chances of winning," said Elmuccio, who at the M of C was fourth as a freshman and eighth after cramping last year.

Other top individuals include Mainland's Scott Keyser, the Group 3 winner; Central Regional's Sean McCafferty, Seton Hall Prep's Adam Daniels, North Hunterdon's Chris Robinson, Highland Regional's Jay Wassell, Kearny's Roger Munoz and Mt. Olive's Steve Slattery.

This will be the fourth meeting of the season between Keyser and McCafferty. Keyser holds a 2-1 edge with both victories coming at Holmdel, including last week's two-second win in Group 3. McCafferty beat Keyser at the South Jersey sectional on Kingsway's flat lay-

"I do feel six of seven guys can win," said McCafferty, second at the Shore Conference meet behind Bennett and ahead of Savoth. "I think I will be there, but it will come down the last mile and if it's a slow pace, it will definitely favor Elmuccio."

As for the girls' individual race. look for Fogg to go out hard and dare someone to catch her. That's what she did last week when she wasn't pushed and became the only girl in the state this season to break 19 minutes at Holmdel as she won Group 4 in 18:53. Fogg was second at last year's M of C to Woodstown's Jamie Weisgerber.

Fogg will be challenged by a field that includes Toms River North sophomore Jenn Pesce, who was second to Fogg in Group 4 in 19:12; Bishop Eustace junior Ann Klocke, the Parochial B winner in 19:20; Bernards sophomore Laura Nann, who won Group 1 in 19:23; Group 2 champion Amy Beykirch of Pinelands, who beat Pesce to win the Shore Conference title; Group 3 champion Abbey Hartman and Cunniff.

"I will try to stay with whoever is in the lead, not let them out of my sight and run like a maniac," said Klocke.

While on the subject of the State group meet, congratulations should go to Lou Fraulo of Clifton and Fred Torres of Clifton and his Elite cing System. The computerized cering of the State cross-country meet worked wonderfully under sometimes messy conditions, making it easier for coaches, athletes, and the press to get accurate results.

That's just flat-out unfair. And this year, the long-advanced argument that the reason the top runners by time are not invited back because bad weather might slow the course for those who run later in the day, doesn't hold water (pun intended).

The heavy rainfall in the afternoon did not prevent the boys and girls Group 3 races from having significantly faster times than some of the earlier races, run in dry, perfect conditions.

Enough is enough. Change the rules. Allow the top 10 runners in each race to qualify and the next 25 fastest times. Let the best runners run in the State Meet of Champi-

This year, there will be 31 boys and 24 girls who failed to finish in the top 10 as individual qualifiers to the SMOC, but again they won't be the right 31 boys and 24 girls.

The qualifying standards for the SMOC remain simple - members of the top three teams in each of the 12 group races and the top 10 individuals not on those teams advance. In theory, that makes for 120 wild cards. But since the top 10 finishers in each group have qualified for nearly 20 years, only those finishers outside the top 10 can be classified as wild cards.

# Doyle, Knight save best for Meet of Champions

HOLMDEL — For Stephanie Doyle of Ridgewood and Andrew Knight of Ramapo, the quality of their pre-meet practices retained their importance even at the end of the long cross-country season. As a result, both runners ran their best races of the year at the New Jersey State Meet of Champions Saturday.

Doyle ran 19:12.9, the sixth-fastest race by a Bergen County girl in the long history of the Holmdel County Park course — the State venue ever since the race became 5,000 meters in 1979. Knight, the Bergen County champion, was 10th in 16:21.8, the 12th-fastest boys time recorded by a Bergen runner.

Favored Red Bank Catholic and Autumn Fogg of Hunterdon Central won girls titles, while Christian Brothers won its sixth boys title in 10 years. Chris Robinson of North Hunterdon was the surprise boys winner.

"Usually we taper off the week after the group meet before the Meet of Champions, and we haven't always run well in the Meet of Champs," said Doyle. "This year we told Coach [Jacob Brown] we wanted to work as hard as we usually did."

So Doyle and teammate Amy Smith, running as individuals in the SMOC for the first time in their illustrious four-year careers, did their usual series of workouts in preparation for the race, despite a subpar Smith, who was suffering the effects of a lingering cold.

And when the gun went off, Doyle, a disappointing ninth last week in the State Group 4 meet, shot to the front, just off the pace set by Fogg, and ran in a pack of four, taking over second place with little more than a mile to go.

"I was positive the whole race," said Doyle. "It's the last big race of the year and I felt confident all the way."

Doyle'slipped to fifth as the pack made its way to the final downhill toward the finish line and she felt a moment of doubt.

"I got a little nervous because a whole bunch of girls seemed to be

catching up," said Doyle. "But when I passed the Deptford girl [Shari Hewel] and knew I was going to finish with a good race, I thought — wow, this is neat."

Smith ran a personal best of 19:39.9 for 15th place and was pleased with her effort. Immaculate Heart edged Ramsey for 10th place, as the Rams ran without the injured Dana Satir.

Knight credited the decision of coaches Matt Kohlbrenner and Steve Opremchak to run speed workouts at the Mahwah track the last three Tuesdays for his spectacular race, more than 40 seconds faster than his fifth place Group 3 race of the week before.

"I had a goal to make the top seven today and I knew I could break 16:30 because several guys who I'd beaten had run in the 16:30s before the weather got bad last week," said Knight. "And with the great mental and physical workout I had Tuesday, I knew I'd run with confidence."

That he did, even after running the first mile in a slower-than-expected 5:20. He was 14th at the mile mark and then picked up the page.

"I wanted to run this race like a two-mile race and hang on," said Knight. "I know my last mile was slow, but I gave it all I had."

Ridgewood's boys ran another fine team race, placing a strong fifth with its usual tight 24-second pack from first to fifth.

"This was a great experience for our underclassmen," said Ridgewood coach Larry Coyle, who will have five runners returning next year. "They learned you have to get out better on this course and it'll help them next year."

Palisades Park's Group 1 State champions ran a terrific race and finished seventh overall in the 18-team field, led by Jamie Cortes in 29th place. Waldwick's Peter Startz was the second area finisher overall in 27th.



of Ramapo and Amy Smith of Ridgewood. Knight never lost to a North
Jersey runner and finished 10th in
the State Meet of Champions, running his best race of the year.

Smith lost only to teammate Stephanie Doyle at the Shore Invitational and at the State Meet of Champions, both at Holmdel. But the rest of the year she dominated and became the fastest girl on the Darlington County Park course in more than two years in winning the BMOC title.

ROOKIES OF THE YEAR — For the boys, juniors Hugo Juarez and Diego Gioffre of Palisades Park, in their first seasons, share the honor. The duo, recruited by last year's Rookie winner Jamie Cortes, ran 2-3 all season for the Pal Park Group 1 champions, who also finished seventh in the SMOC and second in the BMOC, the best Bergen Group 1 performance ever.

Freshmen Jamie Siegrist of Northern Valley at Demarest and Tina Romic of Hawthorne share the honor for the girls. Siegrist, the daughter of Demarest coach Ray Siegrist, had an excellent year. Her best performance was a 14th place in the Bergen Meet of Champions. She moved to the head of a good freshman class in Bergen with a consistently successful season.

Romic, better known as the East's No. 2 14-and-under tennis player, decided to run scholastically for a change of pace and excelled immediately, finishing second in Passaic County and fourth in the Group 1 State championship race. She is the Bears' first female representative to the SMOC.

RACES OF THE YEAR — From an individual standpoint, the Bergen County Group 2 championship battle between juniors Nikki Callaghan of Westwood and Dana Satir of Ramsey was an easy choice. It was one of the most thrilling finishes ever. Callaghan held off the faster Satir in the long stretch run at Darlington and won by less than a yard.

From the team standpoint, a three-way tie — Ramsey and Palisades Park in winning the girls Group 2 and boys Group 1 State titles, and Kennedy's girls for breaking the nine-year streak of Wayne Valley at the Passaic County championship.

The Ramsey and Palisades Park wins confirmed the superiority of those teams.

WHAT ABOUT NEXT YEAR? — An early look at next year's local prospects shows a positive sign. Twelve girls and 10 boys who finished in the top 20 of the Bergen Meet of Champions return, as do the top five girls and eight of the top 10 in Passaic County. Only two of Passaic's top 10 boys return, however.



KATIE COHN, Ridgewood -Every good team needs solid runners in the fourth and fifth spots, and this junior qualifies as a solid fourth runner who should only get better next year. She placed 13th in the -Bulldog A Meet, 36th in the Shore A Meet and 12th in the Ridgewood Invitational in the early season, then was fifth in the NNJIL Atlantic Division run and 12th in the Bergen Group 4 race. She finished 25th in the Group 4 state-sectional run, 21st in the BMOC and 51st in the state Group 4 event.

STEPHANIE DOYLE, Ridgewood

— In nine major races, she never finished worse than ninth, and while the victory lane was never achieved, this senior had a stellar season nonetheless. She opened the campaign by placing fifth at the Maroon Invitational, and then took second in the Bulldog A Meet, fourth in the Shore A Meet and eighth in the

Ridegwood Invitational. Four straight second-place finishes behind teammate Smith followed in the NNJIL Atlantic Division race, the Bergen Group 4 run, the Group 4 state-sectional event and the BMOC. After placing ninth in the state Group 4 run, she had her best race last, coming in fourth in the SMOC.

CELESTE SEDO, Ridgewood — With six top 10 finishes this year, this Maroon proved there was no sophomore jinx for her, and she could very well be the number-one runner for her team next year. Her season got underway with a 10th-place finish in the Maroon Invitational, a fifth in the Bulldog A Meet, a 21st in the Shore A Meet and a fourth in the Ridgewood Invitational. After placing third in the NNJIL Atlantic Division race, she was fourth in the Bergen Group 4 meet, ninth in the Group 4 state-sectional run and 13th in the BMOC.

> AMY SMITH, Ridgewood — The season saw this senior appear in the winner's circle five times, as she closed out her high school career with eight top 10 finishes in nine major races. A fourthplace showing in the Maroon Invitational got things started, and she won her first race in the Bulldog A Meet before running fifth in the Shore A Meet and third in the Ridgewood Intvitational. Four straight wins opened the post-season, as she won the NNJIL Atlantic Division event, the Bergen Group 4 run, the Group 4 state-sectional race and the BMOC. A seventhplace finish in the state Group 4 run and a 15th-place showing in the SMOC concluded her campaign and high school career.

> > There continues to be no stopping the Maroons when it comes to Bergen County competition, as they increased their 12-year unbeaten streak in dual meets to 79 and continued their prowess in the post-season. The team eclipsed team titles in the Bulldog A, the NNJIL Atlantic Division, the Bergen Group 4, the Group 4 state-sectional and BMOC meets and was second in the state Group 4 race. Year after year, the veteran mentor continues to run a strong program, and the talent on the Maroon junior varsity level suggests that there should be little change in his program's

prestigious status next season.

# Veteran Bergen stars in class all their own

Five seniors make up more than half of the 1995 All-Bergen girls cross-country team. But each of the five graduating runners completed their careers having reached All-County status in different ways.

For Bergen champion Amy Smith of Ridgewood, All-County status came as a freshman and was never lost, as Smith became one of the few four-time All-Bergen honorees. For Kourtney Gallo of Immaculate Heart Academy, improvement came as a sophomore, and this was her third selection.

Stephanie Doyle of Ridgewood went from the junior varsity midway through her sophomore season to a second straight All-Bergen slot, while Nikki Henry of Northern Valley at Demarest made her big move this year from honorable mention to the first team. Jennie Meighan of Northern Highlands, a fine track athlete, decided not to play field hockey this fall and made a most successful transition.

Rounding out the 1995 All-Bergen team selected by the Bergen County Women's Coaches Association are sophomores Kelly Ortiz of Paramus and Jackie Martin of Hackensack, and juniors Dana Satir of Ramsey and Nikki Callaghan of Westwood.

Here's a closer look:

NIKKI CALLAGHAN, Westwood — Injuries slowed her early in the season, but Callaghan came back to repeat on the first team by winning the Bergen County Scholastic League American championship and the Bergen 2 title within five days in October, the latter with a thrilling stretch duel with Satir. She was third in the sectional Group 2 race, seventh at State Group 2, and ninth in the Bergen Meet of Champions before placing 44th in the State Meet of Champs, an improvement over last year.

STEPHANIE DOYLE, Ridgewood — Part of the best 1-2 punch in New Jersey, Doyle had nine top-10 finishes in 10 races, missing only with a solid 41st place in the Northeast Regional. She was second in the Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League Atlantic, Bergen 4, sectional 4, and BMOC races, each time to teammate Smith. She was fourth in the Shore A, fifth in the Maroon Invitational 4, eighth in the Ridgewood Invitational, and ninth in State Group 4. But her top race was a fourth place at the SMOC.

kourtney gallo, Immaculate Heart — Gallo concluded one of the finest careers in Bergen County cross-country history with her third selection. In her final three years she had 19 finishes in the top five of major meets, including five in eight major meets this year. She won the NNJIL Pacific, was third in Bergen 4, State Parochial A, and the Catholic Track Conference Senior Class race as well as the NJCTC championship. She was seventh in the BMOC, 11th at the Shore B race, and a disappointing 39th in the

SMOC. But she snapped back with her best race of the year, 35th in the Foot Locker Northeast Regional, tops in Bergen and the eighth New Jersey finisher.

NIKKI HENRY, NV/Demarest — Perhaps the most improved runner in Bergen County this year, Henry teamed with freshman Jamie Siegrist to help the Norsewomen to one of their best seasons. Her top race was the Bergen 3 championship where she finished second. She also was fourth in the Brett Taylor A race, seventh in the Northern Bergen Interscholastic League, eighth in the BMOC and Sectional 3 races, and 29th in a sloppy Group 3 State race. Her best time at Darlington is 21st all-time.

JACKIE MARTIN, Hackensack — The 1994 Bergen County champion, who was fifth in the state as a freshman, suffered through an injury-shortened season which limited her to little practice and only four major races. But Martin managed to place fourth in the sectional 4 race, sixth in both the Bergen 4 and BMOC races, and 21st in State Group 4. Had the State correctly advanced the fastest runners in the State meet, she easily would have qualified for the SMOC.

JENNIE MEIGHAN, Northern Highlands — Meighan made her only cross-country season a very successful one, placing in the top 10 in seven of the her nine major meets. She won three of them — the NBIL, Bergen 3, and sectional 3 — in eight days, earning one of two 1995 area triple crowns. She also was fourth in the BMOC, fifth in the Red Raider B, seventh in the Shore D, ninth in State Group 3, and a respectable 53rd in the SMOC. Her best time of 19:11 at Darlington is ninth all-time.

KELLY ORTIZ, Paramus — One of the bright young stars in cross-country, Otiz's season was solid and included seven top-10 finishes in 10 major races. She was second in sectional 3 and the NNJIL Pacific championships and was third in the Season Opener A, Passaic Invitational 3, Brett Taylor A, and in her best race, the BMOC. She also was sixth in the Maroon Invitational 3, 12th in Bergen 3 (after losing her shoes), and 20th in the Group 3 State meet. Her best time at Darlington is 19:09 for eighth place overall.

DANA SATIR, Ramsey — The top runner on the impressive State Group 2 champions, Satir moved up from second team to become one of the state's top runners. She won the Section 2 and Passaic Invitational 2 titles, was second in the NBIL 2 and Bergen 2 races, fourth in the Red Raider A, fifth in the BMOC, and 12th in the Shore D. Despite a burst cyst, she ran courageously in the State Group 3 race, placing 18th, enough to help the Rams win. With a year left, she already ranks 11th on the all-time Darlington list.


