Ridgewood's Kauke cruises at Bernards

BERNARDSVILLE — The fields may not be as deep as they had been during the 26 years of the Bernards Invitational, but the hallmark of this meet has always been outstanding individual performances.
Saturday, many of North Jersey's best

delivered outstanding performances as the track and field season entered its most exciting month.

Ridgewood senior Josh Kauke began defense of his State Meet of Champions 800-meters crown by running his fastest 800 — a wire-to-wire 1:52.1. The time was the fourth-fastest in County history and puts him within striking range of Roger Jones' 23-year-old County record of

Kauke's win was one of a dozen Bergen-Passaic wins. Fifteen other North Jersey athletes took runner-up honors as many of the area's best tuned up for next week's league championships.

"I really wanted to run 1:52 today," said Kauke. "When I heard them give my 400 split at 56 seconds [actually 56.2], I knew

it was slow and that I had to speed it up. "Usually I have my biggest problem going from 400 to 500 meters, but it felt smooth and I accelerated through the third 400.

Amazingly, Kauke does not hold the Ridgewood school record yet. That belongs to Chris Rae, who ran 1:51.61 in winning the 1987 State Meet of Champions. Kevin Byrne of Paramus Catholic (1:51.2) has also run faster than Kauke.

Ramsey's Dara Seidman isn't as high up the list in the girls 400 as Kauke is in the boys 800, but the speedy junior won perhaps the most exciting race of the day, out-leaning Danielle Harris of Piscataway in a personal-best 59.1.

"I like not knowing who I'm running against because all I can do is go out, do my best, and focus on my race," said Seidman, whose time is the fastest in Bergen County in three years. "I heard Coach

[John Kirchhof] yelling 'Who wants it more?' as we were coming to the finish line. I realized I wanted it badly and was able to win.

"Now I want to do well in the leagues and counties and make it to the State Meet of Champions, something I didn't do last year.'

Sophomore Shakia Wyche of Passaic moved into a tie for 14th on the Passaic County all-time discus list by winning with a toss of 114-5.

"It feels great to finally throw against people who can throw as well or better than I can," said Wyche, whom Passaic coach Bill Krzanowski calls the most talented thrower he's ever coached. That's saying a mouthful, since Krzanowski has coached seven of the 13 Passaic County discus throwers to better Wyche's mark.

Kennedy's Tawana Watkins, protecting a slight injury that affects her hurdling but not her running, won the 100 in 12.2, the ninth-fastest time in Passaic history, and Dan Cooper of Ridgewood became the 16th Bergen boy to clear 14 feet outdoors in winning the pole vault.

But not all the outstanding performances came in winning efforts. Ramsey's Maritsa Christoudias battled Sayreville's Claire Inskeep in the girls shot, taking a brief lead on her fifth throw when she threw 38-101/2, a school record and the 11th-best effort in Bergen history. Inskeep won the event on her last throw by 91/4 inches.

Jen Austin of Garfield threw 142-8 to win the javelin, just a couple of feet short of her County record and eight inches short of the meet record. Matt Elkas of Ramsey edged Passaic's Waldemar Auguscinski on a better second throw after both threw 56-5.



Extra practice makes perfect

rack practice at Ridgewood may be over, but not everyone leaves for home.

"We stay another two hours," Bergen County pole vault record holder Dan Cooper said about his ring of fellow enthusiasts who can't pull themselves away from the vault pit. "We have a boom box going and we keep jumping. We love it. And if it gets too dark to jump, we go inside and drag the mats behind us."

It's fun, but also beneficial. Cooper set the record March 12 with a 14-foot 3%-inch vault while finishing fifth in the National Scholastic Track and Field Championships at New York's Armory Track and Field Center.

Track could have been a major part of Cooper's life earlier, considering his father, Don, is a longtime track coach. "I almost didn't do track at all because it really didn't appeal to me," the 5-foot-11, 168-pound senior says. "I'd run the mile in the fifthgrade Olympics, but that was it. I played freshman football and freshman basketball. When I decided to give track a try, I still didn't see myself doing it when I got older."

By spring of that year, the novice cleared 10 feet and won the Bergen County freshman championship. "I could run pretty fast and I had decent strength, so I figured I could vault."

Cooper credits the people he met that year for his quick transition. That includes older teammate Dave Warton, who is now at Taylor University in Indiana. "There were a lot of good jumpers and working with them and watching them helped me jump better," The Record's Athlete of the Week said. "I jumped with Dave my freshman and sophomore years and he's my best friend to this day. I even started going to his church [Grace Church in Ridgewood]."

Cooper will continue vaulting in college, most likely at his first choice, the University of Maryland. He's also an able sprinter. On March 10 in the same national meet, he ran a 22.9-second opening 200-meter leg of the relay. He, Josh Kauke, Chris

Cooper figures he might major in education, since his mother, Sharon, is a third-grade teacher and his father a physical education instructor.

Graphics art/design is another possibility. "I've done the whole graphics program in school; there are no more classes left," he said. "I might study Web site design. It's a lucrative field and it's new."

On the side, he designs T-shirts, some bearing the name of Ridgewood's upcoming football opponent, which the players wear under their shoulder pads.





"I had to give up the color guard," says Conway, formerly a flag bearer in Ramsey's color guard. "It's fun. All my friends are on it. But I realized it

He goes the distance

ust like a lot of people, Matt Elkas is unhappy with the cool, damp weather that has blanketed North Jersey for much of this spring. It's just that the reasons for his dismay are a little different.

Elkas, a senior at Ramsey, is a weight thrower on the track team.

"This weather is horrible," Elkas says. "I can't wait until it's warm. The warmer it is, the better it is. You can't get as loose when it's cold. You're not stretched out as well."

That may be so, but Elkas hasn't let it affect him too much. He threw 56 feet, 11½ inches in the shot put and 152-10 in the discus Saturday in the Braves Relays at Indian Hills, helping Ramsey win both events. Both throws are personal bests for Elkas and both are Bergen County bests for this season. For those accomplishments, Elkas is The Record's Athlete of the Week.

Elkas began throwing the shot put and discus in the summer of 1994, before he entered the seventh grade. His brother Mike, now a senior at Holy Cross, was a middle-distance runner at Bergen Catholic. But the running events never appealed much to Matt.

"I thought throwing was awesome," says Elkas, who attended BC before transferring to Ramsey prior to his sophomore year.

But it's not as if Matt has a one-track mind. He has also been a starter for Ramsey in football (as an offensive and defensive lineman) and in basketball (as a forward and center). But track "is definitely my first sport by far," he says.

Still, his other commitments mean that Elkas doesn't devote all of his time to track. Yet he is still quite dedicated.

"He's been a great kid to work with," Ramsey weight coach Steve Hyman says. "He does a lot of things on his own without too much motivation on my part. He does a lot of technique work on his own and looks at videotape of his throws."



"I want to get over 60 feet in the shot," he says. "Nobody [in Bergen County] has done that since 1996. In the discus, I'd like to do in the mid-160s."

But his most pressing concern this week will be the fabled event he has waited for since last spring: the Penn Relays.

Elkas qualified for a date at famed Franklin Field in Philadelphia with his performance in the State Meet of Champions last season, where he took fourth place in the shot with an effort of 56-5.

Speed is name of his game

is first name, Josh, is easy enough. Then it gets a little complicated, especially for the announcers on TV.

It's Kauke, guys, as in COW-key.

"There's always a problem with my name," says
Ridgewood's Josh Kauke, The Record's Athlete of the
Week. "People can't seem to pronounce it. Generally, they've been pretty good about typing it, but I've
heard a million-and-a-half pronunciations. So I
generally respond to anything close to it."

The best mispronunciation he's ever heard? "Wood." That's what how the startled announcers referred to Kauke as last spring when he won the 800-meter dash at the State Meet of Champions. "It came out of nowhere," Kauke says. "I guess 'Wood' was short for Ridgewood."

Kauke went on to make a name for himself by winning the 800 at the indoor State Meet of Champions this winter, and Saturday he ran a personal best 1:52.21 to win the 800 at the Bernards Invitational. "Nobody knew his name, nobody could pronounce his name when he won that [first] State Meet of Champions," says Ridgewood track coach Mike Mullin. "But this is a kid who is one of the top track

Two years ago, Mullin had no idea he would ever be saying that. From first grade through his freshman year, Kauke's sport was soccer. Then, as a sophomore, he started running winter track, and one day in the spring of his junior year, Kauke arrived as a star

That day at the Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League championship meet, Kauke was again facing his nemesis, Hackensack's Thomas Baldwin. Kauke had just lost to Baldwin in the mile, and was now some 40 meters behind Baldwin with 300 meters to go in the 800. This, it turns out, would be the turning point in Kauke's career.


"Something inside me just snapped and I took off," said Kauke, who caught and beat Baldwin — for the first time — by a half-step.

Baldwin, of course, vowed to get Kauke two weeks later at the Bergen County Group 4 meet. Kauke was up to the challenge, and didn't run the mile beforehand, allowing himself to run the 800 fresh for the first time. "And this time I didn't let him get 40 meters on me," he says.

"I still remember that race," says Mullin. "That's the first time we really saw the true potential. That proved he was going to be great."

Kauke crossed the finish line in first place, with a 1:53 — a personal best by an astonishing four seconds. "You could here a buzz in the stands," recalls Mullin. "Everyone was in disbelief. A 1:53 is something special. As soon as you saw the kid run it, you knew this kid was not just another high school runner, this kid is a true college runner, and beyond that, who knows."

A senior captain of both the winter and spring track teams at Ramsey, Rodak won four events at the NBIL Championships by registering a personal best time of :14.9 in the 110-meter high hurdles, before running the 400meter intermediate hurdles in :56.1, triple jumping a distance of 42-feet, one-half inch and

clearing six-feet in the high jump. Unbeaten in all four events so far this spring, Rodak has won 10 league championships in his varsity career and has garnered three silver medals, as well. t was almost as if Ian Sample stepped into a phone booth carrying his javelin and exiting with an "S" emblazoned on his chest — that's "S" for sprinter.

"When he came out for track for the first time last year we had no idea that he could sprint," says Westwood coach Steve Lurie. "This year we threw him into the sprints in the opening dual meet and he surprised all of us and has gotten better throughout the year."

The Westwood junior swept the Group 2 sprints in the Bergen County championships in addition to winning the javelin and taking third place in the triple jump for 36 points. It adds up to being named The Record's Athlete of the Week.

Sample points to playing wide receiver and cornerback on the football team, plus lifting weights all winter, for the amazing increase of speed. "Last year I ran the 400, plus throwing the javelin," says the junior. "I always knew I was fast, but I am surprised at what I'm doing in the sprints, and believe if I keep working hard I can get even faster."

He was clocked in 11.1 in the 100 and 22.6 in the 200, second best in Bergen this year to the outstanding Chris Charles of Park Ridge, last week's AOW.

"I'll throw the javelin and run the 100 in college," says Sample, who will study architecture or zoology. "Maybe I can design a zoo."

In addition to the two sports, he also played golf as a freshman. Naturally this moves to the oft-asked question of why the son of former major-leaguer, Billy Sample, doesn't play baseball. "I did until seventh grade but I didn't enjoy it as I found it boring. I hardly watch it because that's even more boring."

He says his father never tried to influence him after he decided to give up baseball. "He knew football was my favorite sport, back to when I was in the second grade, and was behind my decision to quit baseball," he says.


for the Rangers, and moved to Fair Lawn when he was with the Yankees. "After that we moved to Washington Township when I was in kindergarten and that's where we remained."
