

Patrick Cole, Hasbrouck
Heights, junior, shot put: The
defending Group 1 state indoor
and outdoor state champion
and last season's runner-up in
the Bergen County meet, was a
third team all-Bergen selection
last season and should be a
State Meet of Champions
medal contender.

Jashon Dawson, Passaic, senior, 55 and 300 meters: Last season's Passaic County 55 meter champion, also placed third in the 300 and

won the Group 4, North 1 sectional 55 title before placing sixth in State Group 4 competition. After his sensational foot-

ball season look for him to get even better on the track.

Tommy Devita, Ridgewood, senior, high jump and 55 hurdles: After winning the Bergen title and two other championships last winter, the all-Bergen high jumper may be ready to become one of the state's best and improve on his own personal best of six feet four inches.

Mark Filandro, Indian Hills, senior, 55 hurdles, 400 through 1,000 meters: Filandro had a 1:54.2 anchor leg at the Varsity Classic 4-x-800 to put Indian Hills in the Penn Relays. He also won three events at the NBIL meet, won the North 1, Group 2 sectional 400 and sits eighth all-time on the Bergen County 400 list.

Larry Hilton, Kennedy, senior, 600 through 1,600 meters: The versatile middle distance runner won the Passaic and NNJIL A titles at 1,000 meters last season and earned five other medals during his last indoor campaign. He was a close second at the North 1, Group 4 800 sectional.

funior, 800 through 3,200
refers: Second team All-Passaic at 1,000 meters last winter, he just missed qualifying for the state outdoor group 4 meet at both 800 and 1,600.

Now in Group 3, after qualifying for states in cross-country, he may be ready to take the next step to stardom.

Bill Leonard, Bergen
Catholic, senior, 400 through
800 meters: His dad, Bill, was
an all-State cross-country runner at Bergen Catholic in the
late 1970s, but this Leonard is
more of a long sprinter, after
running the fastest North Jersey 600 meters last winter and
ranking 17th on the all-time
Bergen list.

Mike Reilly, Old Tappan, senior, shot put: He earned four major titles last season and finished third in the Varsity Classic, Metropolitan Invitational, and State Group 3 meets en route to All-Bergen honors last winter. His career best throw of 54 feet places him just outside the top 30 in Bergen history.

Conroy Walker, Hackensack, senior, long and triple jumps, 55 and 300 meters: After a sensational outdoor season, Walker appears ready to be one of the top jumpers

and sprinters in the state. He already ranks in the top 25 all-time in Bergen in both jumping events after winning last

season's Bergen long jump and taking ninth in the Eastern States triple jump.

Scott Weismiller, Don
Bosco, senior, pole vault
and long jump: Last season's
second team All-Bergen
vaulter had a sensational year,
winning the Non-Public A
state title, taking second in
Bergen and sixth in the Eastern States, clearing 14-6 in the
latter meet, one of only five
Bergen athletes ever to jump
that high inside. The Bergen
record of 15 feet is clearly
reachable.

Northern Highlands returns senior Matiss Batarags (middle distance) and hurdler Nick Picache. Defending champ Old Tappan lost a lot to graduation but does welcome back senior all-Bergen shot putter Mike Reilly, junior jumper Brian Choi, senior pole vaulter Andrew Hoh and senior hurdler David Kim.

Paramus Catholic moves to the NBIL in its final year and with junior shot putter Marquise Wright, senior long sprinter Keegan Carter and junior distance runner Brian Feliciano will have an impact.

Pascack Hills distance runner Joe Sabatino (senior) is the Cowboys' top returning athlete. Pascack Valley returns sophomore sprinter Max Linden.

Ramapo returns senior shot putter Tim Kologrivov and long sprinter John Burke.

Ramsey, the reigning small schools Bergen Relays champion returns seniors Troy Coonrad (sprinters), Kevin Kuruc (hurdles), Dennis Wilson (jumper) and distance runners John Dugan (junior) and Chris Eltringham (sophomore). DePaul is rebuilding.


Don Bosco, the defending Bergen Relays large school champs had a disappointing state meet, finishing fourth in Non-Public A 6½ points out of first. But with a group like seniors Mike Belgiovine, Howie Rosas and Rafael Vargas off of the State championship crosscountry team, the distances are strong, and junior jumper Greg Hazell (jumps/hurdies), senior Tim Byrne (shot put), and senior Scott Weismiller (pole vault/long jump) among the best at their events in the area, the Ironmen might return to the top of the Non-Public A heap this winter. Senior John Clifford (distance) and junior Mike Baselice (pole vault) adds depth.

Eastside has a terrific distance duo in senior Salim Corbin, the two-time Passaic County crosscountry champ and Tahlief Jackson, the junior who made first team All-Passaic in the fall. But the Ghosts need help in the other events.

Senior distance runner Mike Obsuth is **Fair Lawn's** best but look out for junior pole vaulter Kevin Guy.

Hackensack has two of the top athletes in Bergen County in seniors Conroy Walker, one of the state's top long and triple jumpers and an excellent sprinter as well and middle distance star Joel Douglas, who was a second team All-Bergen cross-country runner. But they'll need an outstanding soph class, led by middle distance runners John Pujols and Carlos Coronado to enjoy a successful team season.

Kennedy has some terrific star power in senior hurdler-jumper Keshon Brown, and senior middie distance runner Larry Hilton. But the Knights will need juniors Zaid Aburumeileh (distance), Craig Hall (jumps) and Jamaal Hilton (middle distance) to step up in order to contend for the

Lakeland makes a big jump from the now defunct Northern Hills Conference but has some good talent led by senior sprinter Kevin Amditis and senior distance runner Dan Arnold.

Paramus is rebuilding after being hard hit by graduation.

Passaic has one of the state's top sprinters in All-Passaic choice Jashon Dawson, fresh off his breakout football season. Reigning Passaic County

champ Passaic Tech lost a lot to graduation but also returns a lot including seniors Mike Bennett (300-400), Shavoy Lawrence (long sprints), Lonnie Day (shot put) and Victor Arias (jumps) and sophomore Halim McCartha (sprints) and could

win again.

Passaic Valley has an excellent sprinter in senior Omar Abbasi, a good shot putter in senior Jonathan Martinez and a solid distance runner in Joe Vasta.

Ridgewood is always one of the best teams in the area and the Maroons should be again helped by All-Bergen crosscountry selections Brian Cleary (senior) and Pat Rynkowski (junior), senior hurdler/jumper Tommy DeVita, last season's indoor and outdoor all-Bergen high jumper, junior long sprinter/hurdier in Soo Hwang and relay standouts Matt Grundy (senior) and Jon Reimer (junior).

St. Joseph is improving year by year and seniors K'Waun Williams (sprints/jumps), Kamal Hogan (sprints), Malcolm Carter (long sprints) and junior John Butler (shot put) will help that improvement continue.

Teaneck is known for great sprinters and with seniors Casey Pleasants and Zadique White and sophomore Daryian Miles that tradition will move forward. Juniors Justin Cifuentes (distance) and Nevon Williams (jumps) give depth to the Highwaymen.

Wayne Hills is rebuilding after a strong cross-country season.

Wayne Valley is another Passaic County contender led by senior all-Passaic cross-country runners Mark Sheptock and Mike Maglio, seniors Franco Roselta (shot put), Dan Losowyj (jumps), Ryan Meek (jumps) and Kensai Hughes (sprints).

West Milford is also a contender behind seniors James Merse (shot put), and Michael Stitt (pole vault).

athletes in the country, she was the Colgate Winter Games 400 meters champion last winter, took second in State Group 4 and third in the

State Meet of Champions before winning at Eastern States.

Jaivaria Bacote, Kennedy, senior, 55 hurdles, 300 through 600 meters, high and triple jumps: One of the busiest athletes in the state, she won seven major titles last season, including three in the Passaic County meet and could be one of the top triple jumpers in the state.

Diane Bain, Ramsey, senior, 400 through 1,000 meters: She ran the fastest 600 meters in New Jersey last winter and third fastest in Bergen County history when she won the Bergen title in 1:36.6. She also took the North 1, Group 2 800 and was second in the 400.

Myasia Jacobs, Paramus Catholic, sophomore, 55 through 400 meters: Seldom has any freshman had the impact Jacobs had last year. She

400 through 1,600 meters: Last
winter's North Jersey Athlete of
the Year won the Bergen and
Non-Public A 800 titles, took
fourth in the State Meet of
Champions, became just the
minutes in the 1,000 and ranks
third all-time in the 800.

Emily Urcluoli, Clifton, senior, pole vault, 55 hurdles, long and high jumps. She won three major pole vault titles last winter, took second in State Group 4, third in the State Meet of Champions and fourth in the Eastern States. She holds the Passaic County Indoor and outdoor records.

Jenni Zymet, Paramus, senior, 55 though 800 meters: Last season's Cinderella story came from nowhere (actually the basketball team) to win the Bergen 400, take third in State Group 3, and sixth in the Eastern States. She ranks 13th all-time in the 300, fourth in the 400 and 29th in the 800.

North Jersey shot putters: The depth of talent in this event is unprecedented and it's possible that all six places at the State Meet of Champions could go to local throwers.

Seniors Ashley Sims and Olivia Wade have had amazing ca-

reers at Paramus Catholic, going 2-3 in State Non-Public 'A, 2-5 in Bergen, 6-7 in the State Meet of Champions and 4-5 in the Eastern States

Indian Hills' Crawford n the right foot

NEW YORK – From the time he started jumping, everyone kept telling Corey Crawford he had talent, big-time talent. And everyone believed that except Crawford.

"All my coaches, all my friends, everyone who saw me jump said I could easily be a 22foot long-jumper," said Craw-ford, a senior at Indian Hills. "I never had doubters, except for

myself."

But Crawford's not doubting himself anymore, and after his performance Monday night at the Spiked Shoe Holiday Festival only doubts might be how long the Bergen County indoor long jump record might stand.

Crawford leaped 22 feet, 10 inches, the seventh best perform ance in Bergen County history to win the event. His jump is only 91/4 inches short of the Bergen County indoor mark set by Hackensack's Darius Pemberton

"I was jumping in the 20s, and in the Bergen County group meet [in mid-May], I got into a battle with the kid from Englewood [Ackeme Brown] and jumped 22-7," said Crawford. "Then I jumped 6-4 in the high jump for the first time and I finally believed I could do it.'

The second key date came about a month later, when Crawford traveled to Willingboro for a track-and-field clinic with coach Bill Barry and several other team-

"It was really a great setting and they had coaches who had won Olympic gold medals and had competed at the highest levels helping us."

When Olympic gold medalist Carol Lewis and Hall of Famer Norman Tate told Crawford that they felt he had the potential to jump 23 feet and farther, Crawford

"When you have people who've been the best in the world at what they do, and they tell us what to do, now I know I can do it," said Crawford, who also ran a leg on Indian Hills' winning sprint-mediey team and cleared a personal best 6-6 in the high jump for third.



"Coming off of Dartmouth, we really came together as a team ... and this is


a good meet to establish ourselves."







NEW YORK – It would have been the perfect time to panic.

Ridgewood pole vaulter Kayla Polcari had missed twice at 10 feet, 6 inches and the junior seemed on the verge of finishing third in the Bergen County championships Monday at the Armory Track Center.

With the State Group 4 meet on Saturday, no one would have been surprised if Polcari had missed her third try, packed up days later.

But Polcari is not that type of

competitor.

"She's such a great vaulter," said Polcari. "And she was doing so many events that day."

The Ridgewood High School indoor track and field teams had plenty of star power at the Monday's Bergen County individual championships, but it was two girls in particular that shined the

brightest. Monday at The Armory Track Center in Manhattan, juniors Kayla Polcari and Sarah DeVita led a Maroons squad that saw one relay team and 10 individuals place in the top three across eight different varsity events.


"They're both great kids," said a proud Ridgewood head coach Mike Mullin. "They're hard work-ers, and they go above and beyond every practice and every competition.

Polcari, competing in the girls pole vault, literally went "above and beyond," by breaking her own school record while also setting the all-time County mark by clearing 12 feet. She admitted to being "completely excited" about her day, and with the Group 4 State championships set for tomorrow in Toms River, she may be on to something.

When the competition gets underway at 4 p.m. at the Bennett Center, Polcari figures to be one of the favorites after becoming just the third New Jersey girl this season to clear the 12-foot mark.

"I still feel like there is a lot to improve on," said Polcari, who also placed fifth in the triple jump (32-11.5) on Monday. "My form could be better. I could always drop my head and shoulders a little more to get myself as inverted as possible. My ultimate goal would be 13 feet - to clear that in high school would be amazing."

Equally amazing was her teammate DeVita, who took home first place in perhaps the County's most grueling competition, the pentathlon. She scored 2,873 points to beat out Old Tappan senior and former Maroon Christine Spilka (2,604), whose family

two years ago.

Covering five different events, the pentathlon is a test of both endurance and all-around athleticism. DeVita passed both with flying colors. "Last year I finished second, so coming in, I had the mindset that I was going to do whatever it took to get the win," she said.

DeVita started strong by winning the 55-meter hurdles in 8.5 seconds. She then met a momentary setback in the form of the shot put (26 feet, 6.5 inches) before regaining the lead through the high jump (5-0) and long jump (15-10.5) events.

Tm not that great at the shot ;" admitted DeVita. "I excel more in the hurdles and high iump, which I attribute to my background in gymnastics. Both events require a certain leaping aspect that is quite prominent in that sport."

From there, the junior was able to coast in the 800 meters (2:38.5) on her way to the victory

Kayla won, my brother [Tommy] won [clearing 6-6 in the boys high jump], and my sister [Mimi] did really well, too, So, it was an all-around great day, with a lot of people to share the success with.

Also sharing in the success were a number of other Maroons, including senior Brian Cleary (4:28.6), sophomore Levi Jennings (4:31.2) and junior Pat Rynkowski (4:31.5), who fin-ished 1-4-6 in the boys 1,600 meters.

Junior InSoo Hwang brought home Ridgewood's fifth gold medal, clocking 7.7 second to win a photo-finish 55-meter hurdle race with Bergen Catholic's Ernest Wingate (second, 7.7) and teammate Eddie Blair IV (third, 7.8). In addition, Hwang finished fourth in the 300 (35.8) and helped the boys 4 x 400-meter relay squad take third in 3:26.1.

Also adding medals for the Maroon boys were senior John Wisener in the pole vault (third, moved from Ridgewood to the "It was great meet, and it was a" 13-6) and juniors Matt Beausoleil Northern Valley school district lot of fun," DeVita said. "I won, in the pentathlon (fifth, 2,550

points) and Juan Llinas in the 600 (fifth, 1:27.0).

The girls were equally impres-sive thanks to junior Haley Roche placing third in the high jump (4-8), and freshman Micaela McPadden running sixth in the 400 (1:01.4).

"Overall, I was very pleased with the way things turned out," said Mullin. "There were a lot of best times, heights and distances.

"This was an individual meet," the coach added, "So I think it helped that a lot of them only had to do one or two events and not spread themselves too thin. At the same time, though, they stuck together as a team and were there to cheer one another every step of

GR's Artesona wins 55 meters

TOMS RIVER – Al Artesona was going through a walk-through prior to Glen Rock's first State playoff game in late November, when he suffered an ankle injury that ended his high school football career and threatened his winter track season.

Saturday, that injury was just a distant memory, after Artesona became the first Glen Rock boy to win a State group title since 1967 while he blazed to the State Group 1 55-meter dash title.

"I sprained my right ankle in

the walkthrough," said Artesona with a shrug. "A walkthrough! And it kept me out the first month of the season, but by the middle of January it was starting to feel good and it kept feeling better and better."

Artesona improved enough to take a pair of major invitational titles, and win the North 1 sectional title in the second-fastest time in the group behind Alex McGee of Whippany Park, the North 2 winner.

And in the trials Saturday, Artesona took command with the fastest time, winning the final in a personal-best 6.69 seconds.

"I was a little nervous at the end of the race because I thought I won, but I wasn't really sure," said Artesona, one of six North Jersey winners in the afternoon part of Saturday's meet. "This is great and it gives me even more confidence to take into spring."

Passaic Tech's Amber Allen and Clifton's Emily Urciuoli don't need a lot more confidence to know that they can succeed after winning outdoor State Meet of Champions titles last spring.

But Saturday, each earned her first State group title, indoor or outdoor, with wins in the Group

4 championship.

Urciuoli cleared a personalbest 12 feet, 6½ inches to easily win the vault, a week after being upset by Ridgewood's Kayla Polcari in the North 1 sectional.

"There were a lot of factors that day, but Kayla really jumped great," said Urciuoli. "But I didn't think about it last week – I just tried to concentrate on having fun at the next meet."

"Vaulting is such a mental thing, but I was OK with it and ready to do well today," said Urciuoli, who clinched the win with a 12-foot jump on her third attempt and then went 12-6½ on her second. "It's a little different for me with the Meet of Champs, because I've always been chasing someone and now they're chasing me."

Allen won the Group 4 400, running 56.91 and capturing the first seed in next Saturday's Meet

of Champions.

Kevin Condal and Patrick Cole of Hasbrouck Heights won the 400 and shot put to lead the Aviators to second place overall in Group 1 and Keshon Brown of Kennedy set himself up as a contender for the Meet of Champions 55 hurdles title by winning Group 4 in 7.51 seconds.



Two of North Jersey's best track athletes all winter capped their seasons over the weekend with outstanding performances at the National Scholastic Indoor Classic at the Armory Track Center in New York.

Paramus Catholic sophomore Myasia Jacobs was third in the girls 60 meters in 7.56 seconds after just missing the State record of 7.45 by winning her semifinal in 7.47, and set a Bergen County record of 24.37 in taking fifth in the 200 meters, breaking her mark of 24.6 set a month ago.

Indian Hills senior Corey Crawford was fourth in the boys long jump with a leap of 23 feet, 9 inches, just off his County record of 23- $11^{3/4}$.

Perhaps his most impressive effort was finishing fourth in the pentathlon with a score of 3,520 points, nearly 300 better than he scored at the Bergen meet four weeks ago. Crawford won the long jump with a solid 22-71/4, was fourth in the 1,000 and fifth in the high jump

The top relays performance was Don Bosco's quartet of Howie Rosas, Rafael Vargas, Mike Belgiovine and Phelan McCormack who finished second to Haddonfield in the boys 4-x-1-mile relay in 17:52.12. Other impressive performances included IHA, seventh in the sprint medley in 4:07.98; Tommy DeVita of Ridgewood, seventh in the high jump at 6-5; Amber Allen of Passaic Tech, seventh in the 400 in 56.29; and Mark Filandro of Indian Hills, seventh in the boys 400 in 48.83, after running 48.64 in the trials.

Kristin Traub of Eastern Christian returned to the track after a winter of basketball and took seventh in the girls 2-mile in 11:05.68, while Juan Andres Giglio of Ridgefield Park was eighth in the boys pole vault at 14-6 and Emily Urciuoli of Clifton was ninth in the girls vault at 12-1½.

Old Tappan's girls ran 9:40.97 in the 4-x-800 relay to keep their hopes alive for a Penn Relays bid next month, while Regis High School of New York ran 8:06.10 with Ridgewood residents Myles and Ryan Phillips as part of the team to put itself in great shape for a bid.
