John Dugan, Ramsey, senior, 1,600 and 3,200 meters
 Winter was another breakthrough season for this two-time, All-Bergen cross-country runner, who took nearly 25 seconds off of his personal best in the 3,200 meters and showed surprising 1,600 speed.

Daniel Green, Clifton, senior, 800 and 1,600
 Last year's All-Passaic 800 selection is ready to have a huge year and perhaps take down Clifton's 46-year-old record in the event (1:56.3).

Selwyn Maxwell, Don Bosco, senior, 110 and 400 hurdles
 Last year's All-Bergen high hurdler hopes to improve on last year's Non-Public A and Bergen Meet of Champions titles and move up from 16th on the all-time Bergen list in the event.

Stephen Mozia, Hackensack, senior, shot put and discus
 He added more than 6 feet to his shot put best this winter. He sits 10th on the all-time Bergen list in the discus and his immediate goal is the 31-year-old County record of 189 feet, 2 inches.

Bradley Paternostro, Ramapo, senior, 800 and 1,600
 Princeton-bound star became the latest Bergen athlete to win the State Meet of Champs at 800 meters last spring and already sits sixth on the all-time 800 and 15th on the all-time 1,600 list.

John Porteous, Wood-Ridge, senior, 110 and 400 hurdles, long and triple jumps
 He already ranks eighth all time in the 400 hurdles and finally may be ready to fulfill his enormous potential in the hurdles and jumps.

Patrick Rono, Lyndhurst, senior, 800 and 1,600
 His unique double medal in last spring's State Meet of Champions in times ranking 12th and 17th, respectively, on the all-time Bergen list make him a threat to break County records in both events.

Chris Steele, Pompton Lakes, senior, pole vault
 He took down the 25-year-old school and Passaic County record this winter by vaulting 14-1. He shoots for the outdoor school record of 14 feet and the Passaic record of 14-6.

Teaneck 4-x-400 relay
 The team of Bryan Murphy, Darylan Miles, Damien Elliott and Warren Fields won the State indoor championship and Miles, Fields and Elliott were part of last year's outdoor championship team that took more than two seconds off of the previous Bergen record.

Kaleb Zuidema, Midland Park, senior, javelin
 There's not much else for the South Carolina-bound State and national champion to achieve after last year's State record 224-1 throw, being named All-American by Track & Field News and going undefeated.

Bergen Catholic is led by one of the state's top 400-meter runners, senior Tarique Gray, fellow seniors Mario Kranjac (400) and Tyler Dilworth (hurdles) and junior D.J. Dixon (sprints).

Seniors Joe Hrabovsky (middle distance) and Mario Ibrahim (distance) and junior javelin thrower Casey Paulosky lead DePaul, which also looks to senior James Severe (sprints), and juniors Joe Pagano (distance), Davon Jacobs (sprints/high jump) and Nashawn Daniels (sprints/high jump) for improvement.

Don Bosco lost many stars from last year's Non-Public A champions, but the Ironmen return seniors Mike Bassico (vault), Paul Canevari (sprints/discus), Paul Ciarravino (sprints/jumps), Jeremy Gonzalez (hurdles), Greg Hazell (All-Bergen jumper/hurdler), Selwyn Maxwell (All-Bergen hurdler), Phelan McCormack (middle distance), Steve McNicholas (middle distance), Mike Proscia (javelin), Dave Stillings (long sprints), Ryan Walsh (indoor All-Bergen high jumper) and Tyler Yee (javelin).

Paramus Catholic is led by seniors Marquise Wright (throws), Brian Feliciano (distance), Gyan Lawson (sprints) and Jarrett Burroughs (sprints). The Paladins will depend on juniors Rob Wilson (distance) and Chris Maldonado (jumps/hurdles) and sophomore Brandon Spearman (sprints). St. Joseph looks to junior sprinters John Sanford and Jabari Garvin, senior weightlifter John Connolly and John Butler and a strong distance team with seniors Kyle Gugliotta and Matt Doherty and juniors Joe Murphy and Sean Fogarty for success.

Liberty

Clifton has a great turnout of 80 athletes, but the best are seniors Daniel Green (All-Passaic middle distance), John Sunday (throws), Mike Blonci (400/long jump), Lawrence Johnson (sprints), junior Jessie Boria (distance), Noe Lara (400/HJ) and Chihua McDonald (jumps/hurdles).

Eastside has a great sprint team led by juniors Latimere Campbell and Mike Hileary, and seniors Justin McKenzie (800), Messiah Quinones (400), Jaquese Fuller (jumps) and Mike Santos (pole vault) add depth.

Kennedy lost a lot from last year but still has senior Jamaal Hillon (middle distance), junior Tomas Garcia (shot put) and sophomore Robert Laing (hurdles).


Passaic is rebuilding but seniors Tyler Danner (sprints), Demetrius Downey (sprints), Ronny Siri (800) and James Moore (shot), sophomore Anthony Navarro and freshman William Velard should speed the process.

Passaic Tech was the easy winner of the indoor Passaic meet and the Bulldogs are favored outdoors behind seniors Quatrel Huffin (All-Passaic javelin/discus), Haim McCartha (sprints), Dustin Knolmayer (throws), Lize Jarret (pole vault), Victor Reyes (distance) and juniors Nick Rodriguez (All-Passaic distance), Jabari Butler (All-Passaic high jump), Rahmir McCray (All-Passaic triple jump) and Halseem Pierson (All-Passaic long jump).

Freedom

Bergen Tech has an outstanding senior distance runner in Andreas Kellas, a solid senior vaulter in Shin HJ Jung and a good senior sprinter in Devin Toledo. Seniors Armaan Kapoor, Brian Monahan and Junior Billy Fiske are the best of the rest.

Hackensack shared the Group 4 championship last year and might be better this year. Senior Stephen Mozia is one of the state's best shot and discus throwers. Sophomore Mark Jones (hurdles/sprints) could be the best hurdler in the state. Juniors John Pujols (middle distance), Carlos Coronado (distance) and Mo Headley (hurdles) and sophomore Mike Cummings (hurdles/jumps) also should score for the Comets.

best sprinters in senior Josh Enriquez, has some good throwers in seniors Eric Lesko, Gordon Chen, John Robertson (also a fine long jumper), and Paul Stabile and looks to sophomore Mike Seireal to lead a young distance team.

Ridgewood will battle Hackensack and Teaneck for the division title. Ridgewood has a top hurdle team in seniors Matt Beausoleil, InSoo Hwang and Edward Blair IV. Beausoleil also can sprint and, if healthy, Hwang is a State contender in the intermediate hurdles. The distance team is led by seniors Pat Rynkowski, Anthony Andrews and Mohamed Eid and junior Levi Jennings. Junior jumper Evan Bartik is ready to make the next step. The Maroons' ultimate success may lie in their throwers, led by senior Stephen Etna, and long sprinters, led by senior Juan Linares.

Teaneck has the quartet of seniors Bryan Murphy and Warren Fields and juniors Darylan Miles and Damien Elliott that won the indoor State 4-x-400 relay title and were most of last year's outdoor listless. They also can race from 100-800 meters and will get major points in every meet. Seniors Sean Wimbusch and Nevon Williams and junior Jamal Williams also are outstanding jumpers. Justin Cifuentes (distance) always has been a spark for the Highways, who will make this one of the best divisions in the state.

Independence

Defending Passaic County champion Lakeland is a co-favorite in this competitive division and will be a County favorite with a great sprint team led by seniors Cody Geyer and Aaron Aquino. Junior Jason Fuehring (200, 400, 800), and seniors Connor Glacken (pole vault/jumps), Sean Kinkle (hurdles/sprints), Dan Roman (jumps) and Eric Sinker (discus) will add talent and depth.

Passaic Valley counts on distance runner Alec Stabile and thrower Jimmy Lupo, senior sprinters Eddie Nieves and Mike Claudio and junior Fedele Gallo.

Wayne Hills is led by senior sprinter Joe Ramadan, thrower Jake Schunke, mid-distance Rushi Dave and middle distance/hurdler Matt Bombard, but look out for freshman distance runner Brendan Ungemach. Wayne Valley has an excellent senior class led by Rob Palmoraza (All-Passaic middle distance), Chris Connolly (sprints/hurdles), Mike Sheptock (distance), Wisam Saadah (hurdles), Billy Duncan (throws), Matt Diana (pole vault), and Jordan Sussman (jumps/middle distance). The Patriots also have a junior distance class of Zach Post, Rom Weiss, Kenny Salvatore and Jason Frank, and

Dwight Morrow returns senior sprinter John Hernandez and hopes long/triple jumper Phil Dowell is recovered from his knee injury of October. If so, he will be one of the state's best.

Fort Lee is a young team with no seniors among their top performers so the Bridgemens might be a year away, but juniors Jenya Dyagilev (hurdles/400), Yu Yu Fahny (distance), Frankie Goris (sprints), Dan Koch (pole vault), Tyler Sanders (high jump) and Jonathan Spent (400), and soph Masaru Yamaguchi (sprints) should gain terrific experience and could become a factor earlier than expected.

Ridgefield Park doesn't have any stars but has a balanced and deep team including seniors Louis Jacob (throws), Kevin Alberque (sprints/jumps), Kevin Melloy (hurdles/jumps), Matko Ilic (distance), Hyun Woo Nom (pole vault) and Juan Andres Giglio (javelin). Juniors Brendan Conway (distance) and Rakesh Dataram (jumps) also are key components.

Westwood is rebuilding behind seniors Mike Rocca, Mike Penn, Sean Babak, Yave Cortes and Max Policastro, and junior Mike Gaffney.

Patriot

Bergenfield returns senior Isaiah Holder (sprints), senior Guillermo Cortez (throws), junior Eufemio Diaz (hurdles), junior Joseph Matos (distance) and senior Luis Pardo (hurdles) on a team that hopes to throw a scare into the big name teams in this division.

Indian Hills had one of the best teams in the state last year and still is a power led by seniors Nick Ward (All-Bergen distance), John Prizzi (All-Bergen middle distance), Pete Tuohy (distance) and juniors Calvin Knox (HJ/400/high jump) and Hee Jae An (jumps). Senior sprinter Ken Fobian will run and play golf this spring and the Braves found a good new jumper in soph Charley Dzienis.

Mahwah doesn't have a lot of depth but has good athletes in seniors Erik Moutenot (hurdles/800), Matt McCue (sprints) and Mike Coates (distance), and juniors Tyler Poljan (pole vault) and Alex Nielsen (jumps/hurdles). Senior weightlifter Ben Sinclair also should contribute.

Sophomore Ben Malone exploded onto the scene this year for Passaic Valley in cross-country and indoor track. But the Indians are much more than him. Seniors Lucas Hall (sprints/hurdles), JJ Hoogendoom (hurdles), Mike Hausch (sprints), Jaylen Hunter (hurdles), Adam Morrow (distance) and Conor McCarthy (jumps), and juniors Jordan Roses (sprints), Dean Piterksi (vault) and Max Lind (long sprints) make PV dangerous.

Ramsey has a good middle distance/distance team with All-Bergen and indoor State Meet of Champions medalist John Dugan (senior). Juniors Chris Eltringham and Eric Buser are strong in the 800 and 1,500 and Brian Pesota is an excellent hurdler. Seniors Joey Farrell (sprints) and Andrew Clinton (distance) and Junior Andrew Assile (shot) also will contribute. River Dell always is a good team and with All-Bergen senior pole vaulter Brad Hoey, second team All-Bergen long jumper James Canino, senior hurdler Kevin Connolly, senior sprinter Kevin Baumann and junior thrower Matt Koh, it again will be good.

Tenafly is young with James Bassen (javelin), Shigetaro Ono (middle distance), Adam Hersh (distance) and Gabe Werman (hurdles) the only seniors. Juniors Jesse Kamil (middle distance), Tetsuji Ono (distance) and Aref Afshar (hurdles/sprints) also will contribute.

NJIC

Eastern Christian has a good senior class including Sam Braen (discus/HJ), Jeremy Braunius (distance), Dave Harrison (HJ/triple jump) and Adam Hurd (discus/HJ).

leads Elmwood Park in its rebuilding with seniors Jarrod Diaz (sprints/jumps), Chris Cerda (sprints), Robert Graham (sprints/jumps) and Anthony De-Freitas (sprints), and junior Mohamed Abdalla (distance).

Garfield should be one of the favorites with a veteran team headed by seniors Angel Lora (jumps/sprints), Franklin Smith-Hinson (hurdles/sprints), Leacroft Nunes (hurdles/jumps), and juniors Brandon Pacheco (sprints) and Roman Torres (javelin). Senior newcomer Robert Marin (hurdles) and sophomore Mark Espinoza (distance) also must contribute to help the Boilemakers contend.

Glen Rock is rebuilding. Junior hurdler David Karakas leads Hawthorne.

Loft looks to seniors Dominic Trico (hurdles), Mike Calero (middle distance) and Ken Couto (javelin) for a good season.

Manchester is a team to reckon with. With seniors Clint Apaza (javelin) and Andrew Nashed (All-Passaic cross-country) and help from seniors Alex Crank, Chyemne Rivera, Ian Smith and Davonte Williams, and juniors Edwin Londono and Darryle Bugg, the Falcons again should be tough.

Pascoack Hills is another possible contender in the new division with seniors Tarou Seki (pole vault), Tyler Demmerle (javelin), Tony Greco (jumps and hurdles) and juniors Sean Krazi (sprints), Taylor Cudequest and Chet Palumbo (jumps/sprints) all potential event winners.

Pompton Lakes didn't have an indoor program (except for All-Passaic pole vaulter Chris Steele) but has nearly 70 athletes out for the spring including Steele, seniors Dave Alfa (throws), Justin Figueroa (javelin), Ryan Schwarz (distance), Randle DeGraaf (hurdles) and Andrew Cornelio (sprints). Sophs Anthony Mazzella (javelin) and Tyler Hatel-Shafer (javelin) also should help.

Rutherford is rebuilding with juniors Mike Inguanti, Francis McPartland, Chris McPartland and Jordan Matlaga its top athletes.

Patriot

Senior jumper John Fiscal leads Bogota.

Cresskill returns a good nucleus with seniors Doran Slavov (throws), Matt John (distance), Brad Young (sprints), Sam Chung (sprints), Griffin Dulligan (hurdles/pole vault), Justin Lee (distance), Killian Young (HJ/800), Mike Schultz (javelin) and Nick Collins (javelin), and juniors Paul Yun (jumps/hurdles) and Juan Alamo (hurdles/800) the leading point scorers.

Dwight-Englewood is rebuilding with senior sprinter Nick Barwell the only division medalist from last year and fellow seniors Pablo Balmaseda, Benjamin Darcy, Ian Hecht, Alec Jiao and David Singer must step up.

Emerson can contend as coach Bruce Benny aims for his 100th dual-meet win. Senior Willy Saezer (shot put) and juniors Alex Triana (800), Eric Benny (hurdles/400), Chris Fucarino (sprints) and Andrew DelPaz (pole vault) will help reach that goal.

Hawthorne Christian has two senior lettermen, Peter Milani and Malcolm Jefferson, and has a potential middle distance star in junior Jon Scott.

Leonia had some good seniors in hurdler/jumper Kemarley McIntosh and javelin thrower Kyle Youmans, and good juniors in Tim Ryan (distance) and Fitzroy Walsh (jumps).

Midland Park should be a contender with the defending State and Outdoor Nationals javelin champion Kaleb Zuidema the leader. But junior pole vaulter Steve Felice is a State contender and seniors Eric Lipurna (distance), Tom Saliba (long sprints) and Nick Acito (jumps) also are potential big meet scorers.

Maroons off to a fast start this spring

Five RHS boys to run in Division I

RIDGEWOOD — After they finish running all around New Jersey this spring, they'll be running all around the country.

On March 31, five senior members of the Ridgewood High School boys track and field team announced their plans to compete at the Division I level in college. Each helped the Maroons win a trio of titles last season, including league, County relay and State sectional championships.

"Having five Division I athletes on this team is a really strong foundation for us to build off of," said RHS head coach Josh Saladino. "They cover a lot of events, and that makes the potential for this [season's] team pretty good."

The individual profiles (in alphabetical order):

MATT BEAUSOLEIL (The Citadel) — The 6-foot-1 sprinter-hurdler-jumper heads to the Charleston, S.C. military college with designs on studying criminal justice and eventually joining the Army.

"I've loved the Army since I was in fifth grade," said Beausoleil. "Both my grandfathers were in the military. My dad's father was in the Air Force during World War II, on the Pacific front, and my [maternal] grandfather was in the Army Reserve."

Beausoleil finished fifth in the 110-meter hurdles at last year's Bergen Meet Champions (BMOC), running the sixth-fastest time (15.03) in program history. He also helped Ridgewood win gold in the 4 x 110 hurdle and 3 x javelin events at the 2010 Bergen County Relays.

"It might be a decathlete in college, because I throw the javelin, do the jumps, run the sprints — all that stuff," he said.

MOHAMED EID (Marist) — One of two Maroon distance runners headed to the Poughkeepsie, N.Y. college, he plans to continue what he has started at RHS and compete in both cross-country and track and field for the Red Foxes.

"About a month ago, I was deciding between Marist and Fordham, because I felt like those two schools were right for me," Eid said. "But after visiting it, I just felt like Marist was more right for me."

The 5-10 Eid posted his best 5K time (16:26) in placing 17th at the cross-country BMOC last fall, and his personal record 3,200-meter indoor time (9:45.9) was good for sixth in the Varsity Classic on Feb. 7.


Having received partial scholarships for both athletics and academics, Eid noted that he will most likely major in biology.

INSOO HWANG (Brown) — The RHS record-holder in both the 110- (14.4) and 400-meter (53.64) hurdles also visited the University of Pennsylvania but was swayed toward the Providence, R.I. Ivy League school by a number of Ridgewood alums.

"I've wanted to go to Brown since sixth grade," said Hwang. "My cousin [Juhsee Lee, RHS Class of 2001] graduated from there, and I went to his graduation and really liked the school. Then, I took an official visit in October of last year."

Conferring with Brown distance runners Christian Trautwein (RHS '08) and Taro Shigenobu (RHS '09) sealed the deal for Hwang, who is interested in studying science and may enter the pre-med program.

Before then, the 6-0 sprinter-hurdler

Girls win Pawlowski Relays title

RIDGEWOOD — By this time next year, the Maroons once again will be able to host the Pawlowski Relays on their own track.

Within the coming weeks, finishing touches are expected to be put on the brand new track and field facility at Ben Franklin Middle School, which will serve as the home base of the boys and girls teams of Ridgewood High School.

The Pawlowski Relays, formerly known as the Ridgewood Relays, have been held in Ramsey for the past five years due to the absence of a 400-meter track in the village. Because of space constraints, the old track at RHS Stadium was only 344 meters.

The anticipated opening of the BF facility next month will change all that. "Our goal is to have a meet here May 7 and show it off to the world," Ridgewood girls coach Jacob Brown said at Wednesday's team practice.

The Maroon girls squad began the 2011 season with a 142-95½ victory over Ridgefield Park in last Saturday's 27th running of the Pawlowski Relays, while the RHS boys team scored 71 points to finish fifth.

Girls track preview

Last spring marked the first time in recent memory that the Ridgewood girls did not capture either a league, County or State sectional crown. However, the Maroons are coming off a winter in which they won Big North-Freedom and Bergen County Relays titles and finished second in the North 1, Group 4 meet.

"We have a really strong senior class and a lot of underclassmen who can all score points," said senior co-captain Sarah DeVita. "We had a really strong indoor season, and cross-country had a really successful season, too, so we're hoping to build off of those."


DeVita combined with classmate Haley Roche and younger sister Mimi DeVita, a sophomore, to win the high jump event with a combined height of 14-foot-2 at the Pawlowski Relays. She was also a part of the victorious 3 x 400-meter hurdle team (3:34.7) with senior Grayson Llerandi and junior Hanako Shigenobu, as well as the winning 4 x 100-meter hurdle quartet (1:09.2) with Shigenobu, Mimi DeVita and senior co-captain Kayla Polcari.

In all, the Ridgewood girls garnered gold in seven events, with Polcari, Mimi DeVita and junior Ilana Brown clearing a combined 29 feet in the pole vault relay. Roche, Polcari and Llerandi teamed up for a distance of 94-2¼ in the triple jump relay.

The Maroons also displayed its strength in the distances. Shigenobu, senior co-captain Clare Keating and juniors Caroline Davidson and Victoria Pan won the distance medley in 13:05.8, while the combo of Keating, Davidson, Llerandi and senior co-captain Rachel Anzano prevailed in the 4 x 1,600 (22:59.0).

In the 4 x 100, senior Charlotte Crique, junior Moriah Jennings and sophomores Micaela McPadden and Anna Caffrey ran a silver-medal time of 52.6, and the same quartet earned bronze in the sprint medley (4:31.0) as well.

"The team was just methodical, smart and skillful," coach Brown said. "We had very few mistakes for an early-season meet, which is amazing. So I'm very excited about this team."

Maroons solid on West Coast

HIGH SCHOOL TRACK

The plane ride home for Ridgewood after its annual trek to the Arcadia Invitational in Southern California had to feel good.

Kayla Polcari was coming home with a Bergen County outdoor pole-vault record of 12-2 $\frac{3}{4}$ and a stunning third-place finish against a national-level field. Plus, the boys and girls distance medley teams had commendable races.

The boys finished third in 10:12.82, eighth fastest in Bergen County history, and solidified their place in the Penn Relays later this month. The girls ran 12:23.85 for 11th place, the fastest time by Ridgewood since 1998, and the 14th fastest in County history. The girls are alive for a Penn berth, but may come up short. Polcari's vault broke a two-year-old record of 12-1 set by Michelle Favre of Saddle Brook.

"Obviously, she showed a lot of confidence," Ridgewood girls coach Jacob Brown said. "You could see her confidence building, especially when she made 12-2 $\frac{3}{4}$ on her first attempt. Then she ran through her first jump at 12-7 because she was so pumped, but her last jumps were really wonderful attempts."

The boys distance medley foursome of Levi Jennings (3:07.6/1,200), Neil Schoff (51.0/400), Juan Llinas (1:56.5/800) and Pat Rynkowski (4:17.7/1,600) was in the race from the opening gun to the final stages, placing behind California schools Dana Hills and Loyola (which has turned in the top two times of the year in the event).

"All of the guys competed at a high level and they competed to win in one of the toughest races of the year," Ridgewood boys coach Josh Saladino said. "It certainly gives those four amazing confidence going forward, and it's a lift for the rest of our team that has had some injuries."

"These guys have set the bar high for themselves and for the rest of us."

The girls distance medley Hanako Shigenobu (3:47.7/1,200), Sarah DeWitt (62.4/400), Micaela McPadden (2:26.5/800) and Caroline Davidson (5:06.2/1,600), also pleased Brown. "Caroline really had a breakthrough race and responded by running faster on each lap."

No fear in Ridgewood, Hackensack, Teaneck

For most high school sports, a team faces another team in a one-on-one battle with league championships decided by won-loss records. That's not the case in track and field, where major, multiple-school meets decide league titles. Dual meets are usually reserved for development and training, although most leagues count duals toward assessing league champions. Once in a while, however, a dual meet can be much more than that. That was the case Wednesday when traditional powerhouse Teaneck, Ridgewood and Hackensack met at Teaneck.

More than a dozen boys and girls were on the track with more than 75 perform-

ances qualifying for The Record daily track meets, including some of the best in the State this spring in the shot put, discus, 4-x-400 relay and 400 hurdles.

Ridgewood, No. 5 in the North Jersey Boys Track and Field Top 25, came from behind to beat No. 7 Hackensack, 78-62, while Hackensack edged No. 4 Teaneck, 73-67.

Teaneck, No. 9 in the North Jersey Girls Track and Field Top 25, stunned No. 3 Ridgewood, 73-67 to highlight the girls action.

"It was three great teams going after it," Ridgewood boys coach Josh Saladino said.

The stars aligned to bring more importance to this meet. Hackensack and Teaneck were postponed last week and the two asked to move the meet to join the regularly scheduled Ridgewood-Teaneck meet Wednesday.

"It's a good week for a hard dual meet because we aren't going anywhere this weekend to get ready for Penn Relays and the weather was great," Saladino said.

So were the performances. Hackensack sophomore Mark Jones ran a speedy 55.2 seconds to win the 400-meter hurdles while Ridgewood's InSoo Hwang, in his first meet back from an injury that occurred in the winter, stayed with him for eight hurdles before tiring. Stephen Mozia threw the disc 181 feet, 1.1 inches, his best and the best throw in the State this year. neck was never headed.

He later added a shot put toss of 62-8½, second in New Jersey this spring and the best throw, dual or major meet, since Andy Papathanassiou of Emerson set the County record at 68-3 in 1985. At one point, Hackensack led Ridgewood by 11 points.

Ridgewood's Juan Linaas ran a personal best of 50.2 to beat Teaneck standouts Bryan Murphy and Daryan Miles in the 400 and when Levi Jennings and Pat Rynkowski went 1-2 in the 800, Ridgewood went ahead to stay in the boys meet. Teaneck also used the 800 for a decisive win in the girls meet. Janay Ferrel of Teaneck, who ran a personal best of 58.9 to win the 400, upset Ridgewood's Caroline Davidson in 2:22.1, another best, and Teaneck was never headed.

AROUND THE TRACK

The Jack Yockers Bergen County Relays always is the place for very good early season performances, and this year's meet was no exception.

While Stephen Mozia of Hackensack (boys field), Patrick Rono of Lynchurst (boys track), Aresha Hampton of Teaneck (girls field) and Maggie Loudon of Old Tappan (girls track) were deserved winners of the Most Valuable Athlete awards, there were a host of other top-notch nominees.

In boys field events, Dante Toler of New Milford had a 20 feet, ¼ inch (long), 41-5½ (triple) and 5-10 (high) jumps, and anchored the Division C gold medal Knights' 4-x-100 relay team.

Chet Palumbo of Pascack Hills shared the day's top high jump at 6-0, had C's best long jump at 21-4 and triple jumped 39-2.

Ridgewood's Evan Bartlik triple jumped 44-5, long jumped 20-11 and was pulled from the high jump after clearing 5-8.

In boys track, Brad Paternostro of Ramapo went from seventh to first in 1 minute, 52.9 seconds for the anchor 800 leg of the sprint medley. He also had a 4:25.0 leg

on Ramapo's 4-x-1,600 relay.

RHS girls win County Relays championship

Maroon boys claim two relay titles, finish 2nd in Division A

When Jacob Brown was on the verge of walking, his team kept right on running.

The Ridgewood High School girls track and field squad overcame a pair of disqualifications on Saturday morning and rallied to capture the Division A title at last weekend's Jack Yockers Bergen County Relays, 85-72, over rival Immaculate Heart at River Dell. The Maroons' last previous championship had come in 2007, before IHA reallocated three in a row.

The RHS boys won the 4 x 800-meter and 4 x 1,600-meter relays to score 64 points and finish third, while Don Bosco topped Teaneck, 110-69, for the Division A crown.

IHA took a 48-45 lead on the Ridgewood girls after 10 events, as Brown's charges were disqualified from the 4 x 100 hurdles (running around a hurdle) and 4 x 100 (baton pass out of the exchange zone).

"After being DQ'ed in the first two relays [on Saturday], I was ready to take a walk," the coach said. "But fortunately, the team stayed tough and battled in every relay. The kids knew what they had to do, and they did it."

The RHS distance medley relay of freshman Emily Fishbein (4:06.5 in 1,200 leg), sophomore Micaela McPadden (61.4 in 400), senior Clare Keating (2:33.3 in 800) and junior Caroline Davidson (5:14.7 in 1,600) immediately responded with a victory in 12:50.4, and the Maroons followed with bronze medals in the sprint medley (4:24.1) and 4 x 800 (10:14.0) relays.

Needing to finish at least second in the 4 x 400 to clinch the title, Ridgewood cruised to a comfortable win over Tenafly, with senior Charlotte Criqui (62.5), juniors Hanako Shigenobu (63.8) and Andina

Toscano (62.1) and McPadden (61.5) combining for a time of 4:08.4. IHA placed fifth in 4:27.1. RHS started off the meet with the lead after winning the pole vault relay on April 13 at Ramsey. Senior Kayia Polcari (11 feet), junior Ilana Brown (9-0) and sophomore Mimi DeVita (9-0) produced a new school record of 29 feet, a mere six inches, off the County record. DeVita also combined with her older sister, Sarah (5-0), and senior Haley Roche (4-10) to tie for second in the high jump (14-2).

"We typically have a good field day on Wednesday," said Polcari. "It was a good confidence boost going into Friday and Saturday."


Friday night highlights



"I think it makes it more a Ridgewood thing," said Shigenobu, "and not just the five of us going. It's actually a team. And we can cheer each other on and congratulate each other when it's over."



Distance medley has Bergen touch

Win streak ends, Kaleb presses on

PHILADELPHIA — A rebuilt knee, a case of nerves — throw in a mischievous wind and it is as too much for Kaleb Zuidema to overcome.

The Midland Park senior struggled to find his form Friday and failed to defend his javelin championship at the 117th Penn Relays. He finished fourth with a throw of 203 feet, 6 inches.

"I just had a bad day," said Zuidema, who has committed to South Carolina. "Last week I threw 207 [feet] and that would have been right up at the top here. Obviously, some of it is my knee, but most of it is that I didn't perform up to my abilities."

Just four months ago the Panthers standout underwent reconstructive surgery on his left ACL and meniscus. It's his plant leg and throwing for the first time on an all-weather track, instead of grass, was another hurdle.

"I was trying to get off of it as fast as I could," said Zuidema, who owns the state and county javelin record. "It was hard. It's easier to plant on grass because it's not so hard, but everything was off today."

"I think it's amazing that he is even throwing," said Midland Park track coach Steve Ferro. "I mean it's only been four months, so what he is doing is fantastic. I think it was a little bit more nerves, and being that big No. 1 seed, this is what he has been thinking about all year."

Competing under Pennsylvania rules, the 20-man field was split into two flights of 10. But instead of having the lower 10 compete first, the top 10 went with Zuidema starting.

His nerves were apparent when he pulled up

PHILADELPHIA — Out front, CBA and Central Bucks West were battling for the Penn Relays distance medley championship title. Behind them, St. Benedict's star sophomore Ed Cheserek was burning up the Franklin Field track. But in the middle, in third and fourth places, Ridgewood and Indian Hills were running what seemed to be a private Bergen county race at the most prestigious invitational meet in the country.

CBA won the race with Central Bucks West second. Cheserek ran one of the fastest 1,600-meter legs in Penn Relays history to finish fifth, and Ridgewood edged Indian Hills for third place, the first time two Bergen County teams medaled in the same Penn Relays distance medley race.

"It's a fantastic result for Bergen County and it was an amazing race to be in," said Indian Hills anchor Nick Ward.

It was all that.

Indian Hills leadoff John Prizzi took the lead 800 meters into his 1,200-meter leg and handed off fifth, two places behind Ridgewood's Levi Jennings, who split a very good 3:07.06.

"I was worried about being too far behind, so I went for it," said Prizzi. "I just had to get the baton to my teammate."

"I didn't know where Indian Hills was but I knew we had a chance to finish high and I knew we were up there," said Jennings.

Indian Hills' 400 leg, Calvin Knox, ran 50.89 to draw the Braves a little closer to the Maroons as InSoo Hwang, back from injury, split 51.69.


"I expected to be a little further behind the leaders when I got the baton," said Knox. "I didn't see Ridgewood until the 200 but I knew we had a chance."

While the first two legs weren't aware of their local rivals, 800 legs Juan Llinas of Ridgewood and Peter Tuohy of Indian Hills couldn't miss them. The two teams were well clear of the rest of the 18-team field except for the two leaders and could run their two laps with each other.

"It gave me confidence because we've run against them so many times in the past," said Llinas, who split 1:59.34.

"I knew if we were with Ridgewood, we'd have a chance to win a medal and I wanted a medal for us," said Tuohy, who ran 1:58.99.

Then as it seems to always be, it

was Pat Rynkowski and Ward on the anchor.

In cross-country, Ward outkicked Rynkowski for second in the Bergen Meet of Champions. Indoors it was Rynkowski running away from Ward at the Varsity Classic DMR that helped put both teams into this race and again Friday it was the two of them, in front of more than 38,000 fans, this time for third place in the world's oldest track meet.

"It's so funny that it seems to always come down to us," said Rynkowski. "I heard the announcer say Cheserek was closing in on

the last lap and when I looked at the guy coming alongside me, instead of him, it was Nick."

Rynkowski finally broke away to finish the race in an event time of 10:18.47, 1.79 seconds ahead of Indian Hills.

"At that point they're not racing Ridgewood against Indian Hills, but just two teams going for third place," said Ridgewood coach Josh Saladino.

"I've been to 44 Penn Relays and my teams have some success in the past," said Braves coach Bill Barry. "But this is phenomenal and for both teams to get medals says something for where we run."

Hackensack's Mozia has a shot at history

MAHWAH - One of the oldest track and field records in Bergen County is in jeopardy tonight at the Ironman Invitational at Ramapo College.

Hackensack's Stephen Mozia takes another crack at the discus record of 189-2 set by two-time Olympian Mike Buncic of Fair Lawn in 1980.

Mozia threw the identical distance in Monday's dual meet, but County records must be set in major meets of four teams or more so his current major best is 179-10, thrown earlier in the year at the Comet Relays. Mozia also will try to become Bergen County's 18th outdoor 60-footer in the shot put. His major meet best is 59-4, but he has thrown 62-8½ in a dual meet.

There will be no team title awarded at the meet, but some of the best athletes in New Jersey and Southern New York state will compete with some sensational races expected.

The boys and girls 400 intermediate hurdles are highlight races with the boys race featuring sophomore Mark Jones of Hackensack, Greg Hazell of Don Bosco, InSoo


Hwang of Ridgewood, a State meet of champs medalist last year and Brandon Gregory of Old Tappan as the top seeds.

Nichole Candelaria of Newark Tech, 2009 SMOC medalist Katelyn Ary of Demarest, Allison Forsighieri of Tenafly and Cat McQuade of River Dell headline the girls intermediates - all shooting for the New Jersey seasonal best of 63.4.

The rarely run 1,500 meters will match Bergen County's best miler, Caroline Davidson of Ridgewood against three of Rockland County's best, Kelly Hayes, Molly Shine and Maria Kohlbrenner of Pearl River.

The two newest Bergen County record-holders, Theresa Picciallo of IFA (shares the shot record) and pole vaulter Kayla Polcari of Ridgewood are also on display.

Feature races in the boys meet include the 110 hurdles with Jones, Hwang and State Non-Public A champ Selwyn Maxwell of Don Bosco the leading contenders, the 800 meter sprint medley, also known as the super sprint medley, with Teaneck battling Don Bosco and St. Joseph, and the long jump with seven 21-footers in the meet.

RHS athletes merit Penn silver, bronze

Polcari adds to girls County vault record; boys distance medley bests rival for third



Kayla Polcari knows pole vaulting inside-out and has the records to prove it.

The Ridgewood High School senior cleared 12-foot-5½, the top girls height in Bergen County history, to earn a silver medal at the 117th Penn Relays on April 28.

A day later, the Maroon boys distance medley relay of junior Levi Jennings and seniors InSoo Hwang, Juan Llinas and Pat Rynkowski clocked a bronze-medal 10:18.47, tying the second-best finish ever by a Bergeñ squad at Penn.

Here is a day-by-day overview of the Maroons' performances at Franklin Field in Philadelphia:

Due to inclement weather, the girls pole vault was moved indoors to a nearby field house, raising the question of whether Polcari's effort would count as an indoor or outdoor record.

"No one knows," she said at Wednesday's RHS team practice. "But I figure, if I break it again, then we won't have to worry about it."

Polcari went into Penn already owning both the County indoor (12-3) and outdoor (12-2¾) marks before raising the bar to 12-5½. She tied Cameron Overstreet of Atlee (Mechanicsville, Va.), but the latter cleared the height in fewer tries to win gold.

Each girl made three attempts at 12-9½, but each went 0-for-3.

Still, Polcari continues to inch closer to her stated goal of reaching 13 feet by the time her varsity career concludes. "I realize 13 is not that far of a reach," she said. "It's only six [and a half] more inches, and I do have about two months left. So I feel like it's definitely possible."

The Maroon girls had three entries on the track as well. The

distance medley grouping of junior Hanako Shigenobu (3:48.6 split in the 1,200-meter leg), sophomore Micaela McPadden (60.7, 400), senior Clare Keating (2:25.0, 800) and junior Caroline Davidson (5:08.5, 1,600) combined for a 15th-place 12:23.01.

"They ran a second faster than their season best," said RHS girls coach Jacob Brown. "In that level of competition, they had to go out faster than they really were ready for, and they really competed well."

The quartet of senior Charlotte Cricqui, juniors Moriah Jennings and Andina Toscano and sophomore Anna Caffrey took part in two relays, running the 4 x 100 in 51.6 seconds, the 10th-best time by a North Jersey team. They placed seventh in their heat, in which The Queen's School of Kingston, Jamaica (47.39) bested Piscataway (49.09) for first.

In the 4 x 400, Cricqui (61.0), Caffrey (65.5), Jennings (63.9) and Toscano (61.7) ran a 4:12.01, good for seventh in their heat.

Friday, April 29

The RHS boys distance medley

squad placed third at a national meet for the second time in less than a month. After running a 10:12.82 at the Arcadia (Calif.) Invitational on April 9, Jennings (3:07.06 in the 1,200), Hwang (51.69, 400), Llinas (1:59.34, 800) and Rynkowski (4:20.38, 1,600) registered the second-fastest Penn time in school history.

The only Bergen County DMR team to win gold at the relay carnival was the 1973 Paramus Catholic quartet that ran a 10:07.3, back when the race was measured in yards.

That PC group was coached by Mike Glynn, who is now the boys distance coach at Ridgewood. In fact, "two of the guys on the '73 team were there Friday, watching our guys," Glynn noted. "Tim Conheaney, who was the miler, was there, as was Ralph Bolognese, the 800 guy. They were there in the stands, and they met our kids and were thrilled to see them run so well."

Glynn's 1996 Paramus Catholic team (10:10.09), the 1985 RHS team (10:11.1) and the 1993

RHS team featuring Bob Keino (10:22.36) are the other Bergen entries to earn bronze at Penn.

The current Maroons had to hold off rival Indian Hills (10:20.26) for third, and the 1-mile anchor leg once again came down to Rynkowski and Braves senior Nick Ward (4:21.79 split), as it did in last month's County Relays.

"When I got the baton, Nick was right on my tail, and I thought, 'Oh, it's going to be this again,'" Rynkowski said. "I have kind of a personal [rivalry] against him - and he's a great guy - but team-wise, we weren't thinking, 'beat Indian Hills'; we were thinking, 'get third'."

"When you race in that kind of competition, you can't really worry about beating or not beating a certain other team," said RHS boys coach Josh Saladino. "The goal is to place high, no matter which teams are in the race. And for us to place third there was a great accomplishment."

Christian Brothers of Lincroft (10:13.04) and Central Bucks South of Warrington, Pa. (10:15.46) finished 1-2.

Despite a quick turnaround after competing in the distance medley at 5:45 p.m. on Friday, Hwang was able to come back the next day at 9 a.m. and place 14th in the boys 400 hurdles with a season-best 56.66.


Penn marked only the second time this spring that the senior ran in the event after recuperating from a torn hamstring he sustained during winter track. "I was a little bit sore, but I just had to fight through and finish the race," he said.

Hwang's was the fourth-fastest time by a New Jersey hurdler, as Jermaine Collier of Trenton Central won in 53.11.

"I ran 53-something last year [at Penn], so I thought I could do much better," said Hwang. "But coming back from an injury, I think 56 was a pretty good time, for now."

In the boys 4 x 400, Llinas (51.87) teamed up with senior Sean Mattson (54.54), junior Nick Tai (52.96) and sophomore Neil Schoff (51.49) for a 3:30.84 that placed the Maroons sixth in their heat, with Tai and Schoff splitting personal bests. In the same heat, Don Bosco (3:23.31) won gold.

Teaneck's Williams is no long shot anymore

MAHWAH — It's been a steady climb for Teaneck's Jamal Williams.

Williams started to make a name for himself during an All-Bergen indoor track season, but he used Thursday's Ironman Invitational at Ramapo College to make a statement outdoors.

Going up against Don Bosco's Gregory Hazell and Benjamin Davis, Williams popped a personal-best 22 feet, 2¼ inches in the long jump to edge second-place Hazell's 21-9½.

"I actually wasn't that good in the long jump going into my freshman year," said Williams, a junior. "So I just took my time in indoor and I just got better."

Williams felt early on it was going to be a good day, even if his start wasn't what he wanted.

"On the previous jump I fouled, but it was only by a little bit," Williams said. "But it was still really far. So I took that and I felt confident."

Williams was among a group of strong performers on a rare day of decent weather during a season when Mother

Nature has been the deterrent to great performances.

Don Bosco's 4-x-200 relay team of sophomore Davis, freshman Jabrill Peppers and juniors Elijah Shumate and Leonte Carroo ran the second-best time in New Jersey this season with a 1:28.99, beating second-place Old Tappan's 1:31.17.

Bergen shot put record-holder Theresa Picciallo of Immaculate Heart didn't match her record-tying Penn Relays performance of 46-7¼, but she came away victorious with a 43-2, more than 7 feet farther than the rest of the pack.

Fellow record-setter Kayla Polcari of Ridgewood won the pole vault with a height of 11-6 - 1½ feet better than the second-place finisher and just days after setting the Bergen mark at 12-5½ at the Penn Relays.

Don Bosco's sprint medley team of Shumate, Peppers, Carroo and Justin Wimberly beat out a number of strong teams — including second-place St. Joseph and third-place Teaneck — with a time of 1:32.91.

In somewhat of an upset, Northern Highlands' Madison Holleran edged De-

marest teammates Victoria Davis and Katelyn Ary in the girls 400 IH. Holleran and Davis were so close they finished with the same time (1:05.55), but Holleran was awarded the victory.


In the boys intermediates, three runners were sub-56.0, with Hackensack's Mark Jones coming away with the win in 55.37 over Old Tappan's Brandon Gregory and Ridgewood's InSoo Hwang.

Hackensack senior Stephen Mozia was in a chase for history in the shot put and discus.

There are a lot of expectations for Mozia to live up to as he looks to become only the 18th shot putter in Bergen history to cross the 60-foot mark outdoors. He threw 57.6. In the discus, he set a personal-best 180-2, but fell short of his goal of breaking Mike Buncic's County-record of 189-2, set in 1980 for Fair Lawn.

But it's still in his sights.

"With my team behind me and warmer weather, hopefully I'll get it," said Mozia, who believes he's on pace to hit the 200-foot mark. "The season really has just begun."



Demarest the best of old rivals

HACKENSACK - It doesn't matter that the league name has changed from NBIL to the Big North National Division, or that the site of the league meet is Hackensack and not Mahwah. The rivalry in track and field between Demarest and Old Tappan remains one of the best in North Jersey.

BIG NORTH TRACK

In the first of three days of meets in the Big North, the old rivals waged a tremendous battle in the boys meet before Demarest pulled out a 114-109½ victory on the strength of a 1-2 finish in the high jump. Before that event, the teams rarely were separated by more than three points.



Lim clears way for team

Lyndhurst repeats in 'C'

OLD TAPPAN - Justin Lim is valedictorian of the graduating class at Lyndhurst, an accomplished violinist and will study pharmacy at Rutgers next fall.

Saturday at the Bergen County track championships at Old Tappan High School, the senior was just trying to figure out how to get over the pole vault bar at a pedestrian 11 feet, a height he'd easily made in every meet he'd been in this year.

"I can't say what I was thinking after my misses," said Lim, who cleared on his final try, and went on to finish fourth in the event.

He combined with junior Mike Morreale, who finished second, to clinch Lyndhurst's second consecutive Division C title before the final event of the two-day meet, the 4-x-400 relay. The Golden Bears outpointed Pascack Hills, 130-115.

"I asked coach [Tom Shoebridge] whether I could switch to a new pole for the last attempt and he told me whatever gets you over [the height]," said Lim. "So I switched from a 13-foot, 150-pound pole to a 13-7, 150 because I was getting too much bend on the pole. The hardest height to clear sometimes is the opening height and I was thinking about it."

Lim cleared the height, and then both made 11-6, clinching the six points the Golden Bears needed for the win.

"Our expectations are a lot higher than they have been after we won last year," said Morreale. "Coach never lets us relax and keeps us sharp and maybe this year is our year to win states [sectionals]."

"When you win [the group meet] once, it can be a shot in the dark, but when you win twice, it really means something," said Lim. "We've got something going here

and we want to keep it going."

One team that's kept its undefeated season going is Don Bosco, which had to sweat more than expected before earning a 113-98 Division A win over Ridgewood.

"I'm really impressed with [the] Ridgewood team," said Don Bosco coach Rob DeCarlo, whose team won a fifth straight title. "I didn't realize how good they were in some events. I never realized that they were that strong. I'm happy we got a push and were able to beat a very good team."

The key event was the 3,200, where Ridgewood had a 1-2 finish.


"I was really afraid of them going 1-2-3 there and for most of the race it looked like they were going to get that," DeCarlo said.

But Don Bosco juniors Nick Carapezza, Ryan Tucker and Christian Costello all ran personal bests behind the 1-2 finish of Levi Jennings and Patrick Rynkowski, and Bosco only lost six points in the team score.

River Dell's key event was the discus. The 2-3-4 finish by Steve and Pat Sellers and Matt Koh broke open a close Division B meet with Indian Hills and the Golden Hawks went on to an 83-67 win, for its second title all time.

"Coach Lou [Sirignano] gets our throwers so ready for this meet and we had six kids combine in our throws," said River Dell head coach Adam Herman, whose team got 50 points in throws.

Hasbrouck Heights set meet records for most points (211) and the biggest margin of victory (144) in winning its third straight Division D title.



Zuidema's injury no longer a soar subject

RANDOLPH - After the disappointment he suffered when he didn't repeat his championship javelin win at the Penn Relays, some people told Kaleb

Zuidema, "you have your national title, you have your scholarship to South Carolina, no one is going to break your state record this year. Take it easy, go to physical therapy - end your high school career." After all, he was just five months off of reconstructive surgery on his left knee.

Zuidema was having none of that so he simply changed his approach - both

mentally and physically.

"I went from a full approach to a shorter, five-step approach," said the Midland Park senior Friday after he threw 220-10, the second longest throw of his career, to easily win his third straight North 1, Group 1 title. "And I stopped thinking about my injury and just let it go."

After his 202-foot, fourth-place finish at Penn, Zuidema switched his approach and has thrown 214, 213, and 219 in his next three meets. Included in Friday's series were throws of 216, 214 and 211 and Zuidema feels that another massive improvement is in the offing.

"I think I'm ready to unload one," said Zuidema, whose personal best is 224-1. "I've still got Bergen Meet of Champions, state groups and state Meet of Champions and then I've got Nationals and Pan Am qualifying. My knee feels like I never tore my ACL."

Zuidema's big throw was one of many

ry was Bergen Tech's Michelle Okereke, who won the Group 4 400 in 38.21.

"Last year I never even made it to this meet and I was afraid it would happen again," said Okereke, who injured her left hamstring at the county's last year and has struggled with it for much of this season. "But when I saw it was going to be a warm day today, I was excited because I run much better when it's warm."

"I went online and looked at my competition and I knew I had a good chance," said Okereke, who fought off Passaic Tech's Breisha Morton and held off Monika Miazga of Clifton to score the win.

Ridgewood's boys thought they'd be in a war with West Orange to try and hold on to its Group 4 title, but an almost perfect day for the Maroons put them with a dominating 20-point lead halfway through the meet.

"We had a very good day across the board," said Ridgewood coach Josh Sa-

aladino. "we scored in multiple events and almost all of kids had personal bests."

In fact the Maroons scored in seven of eight events, missing only the discus. In fact, Soo Hwang got the Maroons started with a stirring win in the 400 hurdles in a season's best of 34.18, continuing his long recovery from an injury that has nagged at him since late last season.

Evan Bartlik won the triple jump. But perhaps the events that really reflected Ridgewood's great day was the 100 and pole vault.

Matt Beansoleil had a huge PR in the event to just five points. And pole vaulter James Knight had a one-foot PR at 12 feet to finish sixth.

Ridgewood wins sectional title

RANDOLPH — When the season started, Ridgewood and Hasbrouck Heights had huge goals for their boys track and field programs. And both teams impressively won North 1 sectionals Saturday and kept the dreams alive for state championships next weekend at Old Bridge.

While there have been no bumps in Hasbrouck Heights' undefeated and untested North 1, Group 1 season, the Maroons have had to struggle through a rash of injuries, some defections and some plain bad luck en route to their second straight North 1, Group 4 title.

But in the hurdles, Hwang slightly tweaked his injured hamstring and he was pulled from the relay.

"Levi came to me and said he'd run it, even though he'd run the 3,200 for his third race of the weekend already," said Saladino. "That's the kind of kids we have."

In fact, Jennings didn't run the race and Ridgewood didn't qualify in the relay, just missing with a makeshift

team. But it didn't matter.

Hasbrouck Heights coach Rob Brady tried to make it sound as if the Aviators were in trouble when Boonton closed to within 15 points with six events to go behind Joey Marini's fourth straight win. But Heights had a quadruple winner of its own in Kevin Condal, who won the 100, 200 and 400, and ran a sterling leg on the winning relay. The Aviators also had a double weight winner in Patrick Cole in the shot put and discus and scored more than enough in the 100, 200, 400, shot and discus alone to achieve victory. Their final 130½-75 margin was just 5½ points short of the sectional scoring record set by Glen Rock in 2003, a week before the Panthers won the Group 1 title.

"We were happy [Saturday]," said Brady. "All the kids got through and with quality performances to set them up for seeding next week. We have some great competition next week from Lyndhurst, Woodbury and even Boonton. But we're ready."

Six other sub-1:58 runners also are in this amazing field.



At 6 feet 4, Wimbush just now is growing into his body. His form has improved and his results are showing. Now, even of


"I love throwing in this weather," Klein said, "and I feel that these next two meets [Non-Public A and State Meet of Champions] I can throw even farther."

Wimbush and Klein were only examples of several noteworthy performances.



Three in a row for girls lacrosse

RIDGEWOOD — Karla Nixon took some time to reflect back on the dramatic ways her girls lacrosse team has won the North 1 Group 4 title in each of the last three years.

"You've got to be kidding me," the ninth-year Ridgewood High School coach quipped.

For two straight seasons, the Maroons have been given a boost by ailing captains and overcome late decisions to take home the hardware.

In 2010, with RHS trailing by four goals in the second half, defender Abby Van Home entered the game after being held out of the starting lineup due to illness. She helped the Maroons outscore Bridgewater-Raritan, 6-1, over the final 10 minutes, and fellow tri-captain Sammy Cerneck delivered the game-winner with 27 seconds left in a 16-15 victory.

This time around, it was senior midfielder Sammy Giordano — who missed Ridgewood's sectional semifinal game on May 24 with strep throat — delivering an impassioned speech to her teammates during a second-half time out in the May 26th North Group 4 finals against Hillsborough.

With the Maroons trailing by seven goals and just 13 minutes remaining, the Georgetown-bound Giordano told her squad that despite what the scoreboard read, RHS would win its third consecutive sectional championship. "I was trying to motivate everyone," she said. "We weren't play-

ing the way we normally play." "I have confidence in the girls," said Nixon, "and they have confidence in themselves. It was great coming from the captains that they could push their teammates, pull that out of them and come back."

Top-seeded Ridgewood (19-1) responded by scoring eight unanswered goals down the stretch to defeat the No. 3 Raiders, 15-14.

"We're kind of a tough team to read," senior Jess Miller said. "Sometimes we start off really slow, and it's almost like we like to get behind so we can push ourselves to get ahead."

"It's bizarre," the Richmond-bound midfielder added. "We pick ourselves up, and we push ourselves. The second half is always ours. We learn from our first-half mistakes."

RHS midfielder Kelci Smesko found the back of the net with 1:36 remaining to complete the late scoring barrage and epic comeback. The junior, who has made a verbal commitment to Duke, scored five goals on the afternoon, upping her season total to 82.

"It was a feeling we weren't familiar with, and it's a feeling we don't want to experience again," Smesko said about her team falling behind.

Mixon noted that Ridgewood was "not playing its normal game." "We were not aggressive on the ball," she said. "We were sluggish in the field and weren't communicating defensively."

Mixon added that the Maroons were a bit "shell shocked" with the speed of Hillsborough (20-3) and the visitors' ability to score.

"It was an eye-opener," said the coach, who noted that her team is normally the one lighting up the scoreboard.

"The last 12 minutes were all about momentum," said Giordano, who tallied three goals and three assists. "Making a stop on defense and responding on offense."

Senior goalie Isabel Sippel came up with her two biggest saves of the game during Ridgewood's comeback, both on free-position shots by the Raiders.

"It was do-or-die," said Sippel, who made nine saves overall. "I had to give it my all. If I didn't save it, I know I could say at least I tried and gave it my best."

"Of course," she added with a laugh, "I really wanted to save it." "I think it shows our character, being able to come back with such little time," said Miller, who scored twice. "We need to work hard no matter who we play."

The next opponent standing in the way of Ridgewood's State title defense was Gloucester County's Washington Township (17-2), which the Maroons faced in yesterday's Group 4 finals in Basking Ridge (after press deadline).

Against Hillsborough, Kaitlin Concilio and Lindsay Weiner each added two goals for RHS. Senior Renee Olsen, who dominated on draws in the second half — controlling all nine that she took the center circle for — also found the back of the net.

"They are a championship team, and they proved it to themselves," Nixon said.

Boys track makes it back-to-back

From the very first race, it was clear that the Ridgewood High School boys track and field team refused to have its title taken away.

In Soo Hwang led off the North 1, Group 4 championships with a victory in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles last Friday. By the time the meet at Randolph's John J. Bauer Memorial Field drew to a close on Saturday afternoon, Ridgewood had secured its second straight sectional crown, 94-71, over Montclair.

The Maroons also got an individual title from junior Evan Bardlik in the triple jump (45 feet, 3 inches) and scored in 12-of-16 events. Eight Ridgewood athletes qualified for this weekend's State Group 4 finals in Old Bridge.

Hwang ran the 400 hurdles in 54.18 seconds, the fourth-fastest time in RHS history — in fact, the Brown-bound senior now owns three of the program's top four all-time clockings in the event.

However, he re-aggravated his recent hamstring injury in the 110 hurdles on Saturday, though not before posting a silver-medal time of 14.64 and leading a 2-3 finish with classmate Matt Beausoleil (14.83).

Ridgewood entered the meet without the services of sprinters Jon Riemer and Nick Tai due to injuries but rose up to build a 53-33 lead on West Orange at the conclusion of Friday's events.

"The kids on this team really love each other and care about doing what's best for the team," Maroon head coach Josh Saladino told *The Record*. "They've faced adversity, and every time it strikes, they find a way as a team to overcome it."

Ridgewood last captured back-to-back North 1, Group 4 titles in 2003 and 2004.

After Hwang's gold medal got things started, the team got a 2-3 showing in the 1,600 from junior Levi Jennings (4:16.25) and senior Pat Rynkowski (4:18.60), both of whom set personal records in the race. Beausoleil added a PR in the 100 (11.11, second place), and senior Juan Linares logged a career-best time in the 400 (49.97, second), helping the Maroons offset wins in both events by West Orange junior Dexter Valley and allowing them to maintain their cushion on the Mountaineers.

In Friday's other field events, Beausoleil was fifth in the javelin (159-8, also a PR), while junior James Knight's sixth-place pole vault of 12-0 was a personal best by one foot.

On Saturday, Montclair overtook West Orange for second place by scoring big in the 200, shot put and long jump, but Ridgewood continued its dominance in the distances. Jennings (1:54.99) and Linares (1:56.01) went 2-3 in the 800, while Rynkowski (9:35.11) and Jennings (9:52.40) placed 2-6 in the 3,200.

Bardlik chipped in points with a fifth-place long jump of 20-9½, and junior Anthony Balboa was fifth in the shot put with a career-long throw of 46-5¼.

The RHS girls track and field team notched its best finish at the North 1, Group 4 meet since 2007, placing second to host Randolph, 98½-86¼.

Sarah DeVita successfully defended her sectional title in the 100 hurdles, clocking 15.03 to hold off West Orange's Alya Barnes by .03. The University of Virginia-bound senior also won the high jump on a tiebreaker, clearing the same height (5-0) as teammate and runner-up Haley Roche in fewer attempts.

Senior Kayla Polcari garnered gold in the pole vault (12-0), leading a 1-3-6 Ridgewood showing that included sophomore Mimi DeVita (10-6) and junior Iana Brown (9-6).

The Maroons' 4 x 400 quartet of Charlotte Criquei, Hanako Shigenobu, Andina Toscano and Micaela McPadden capped the meet with a victory in 4:02.38, but Randolph (4:09.30) came home third to wrap up the championship. The Rams held a huge advantage in the three throwing events as well, outscoring Ridgewood, 30-0.

"My hat is off to Randolph," Maroon girls coach Jacob Brown said. "They have a great team."

North Jersey athletes won a record eight gold medals and 44 medals overall at last year's State Meet of Champions. This year's group might not do quite as well at the new site, Lombardi Field at Carl Sandburg Middle School in Old Bridge, but with four returning gold medalists from last year and 15 total, another nice haul of medals is expected.

North Jersey athletes are contenders in nearly every event and Pascack Valley sophomore Jeron Calderon should repeat his four victories in the wheelchair events that have been a part of this meet for more than a decade against the largest wheelchair field in state history.

Boys

100: No North Jersey sprinters figure to place in the top eight for the fifth straight year.

200: Things are not much better here and a shutout is likely.

400: Local athletes have earned medals the past seven years and with Leonte Carroo of Don Bosco, Tarique Gray of Bergen Catholic, Kevin Condal of Hasbrouck Heights (seventh last year) and Bryan Murphy of Teaneck, at least one medal is likely.

800: The race of the night for North Jersey fans with the top two seeds being defending champ Brad Paternostro of Ramapo and last year's runner-up Patrick Rono of Lyndhurst hooking up in a rematch of last week's Bergen Meet of Champions, won by Rono.

1,600: Rono medaled in the 1,600 and 800 last year and should do it again. He even could win both races, although Tim Ball of Piscataway is the favorite. Ridgewood's Levi Jennings also is in the mix for the win. Andreas Kellas of Bergen Tech and John Prizzi of Indian Hills are other potential North Jersey medalists.

3,200: A sensational race up front won't include any North Jersey runners. If Nick Ward of Indian Hills runs smart, he could earn a surprise medal.

110 HH: Don Bosco's Selwyn Maxwell is unbeaten and could

The Wood-Ridge senior left ankle at the beginning of the field season while playing basketball. He felt something pop back in. Ever since, it's been a constant battle with justments.





OLD BRIDGE — Brad Paternostro looked at his rival and friend Patrick Rono after both had electrified the crowd in the boys 800 at the State Meet of Champions on Thursday night.


"That was the greatest double I've ever seen," said the Ramapo senior after he had run the fastest race of his life and lost.

Rono, the Lyndhurst senior, became just the second boy to win both the 800 and 1,600 at the state's biggest meet and capped his remarkable night by breaking the Bergen County record in the 800 meters as he caught and passed Paternostro, the defending state champion.

"I did exactly what I wanted to do throughout the entire race and even if I lost I knew I did everything I could," said Paternostro, whose second-place time of 1:50.72 would have won more than two-thirds of the previous 30 800-meter races and was more than a second faster than his winning time at last year's meet.

But Rono was magnificent in joining 2003 winner John Richardson of Ocean City in winning the mid-distance double.

First he sat on the shoulders of Piscataway's Tim Ball and Mountain Lakes' Stephen Lewandowski for the first 3½ laps of the 1,600

That helped. What didn't help was finding out that the shot put and the discus were at the same time.


Picciallo was put in the first flight for the shot put. She threw over 42 feet to

Carcione's serve is driving force

Leads Ramapo junior to his first state tennis title

WEST WINDSOR — Jonathan Carcione didn't stand and watch his backhand sail down the line Thursday afternoon.

He was too busy preparing for the return that would never come.

The memories of three years of hard work came flooding back as he dropped his racquet, pumped his fists to the gallery and rolled onto his back.

The junior from Ramapo won six of the final seven games of the match to stun returning state champ Michael Lippens of Shore Regional, 7-5, 6-2, and win the state boys tennis championship indoors at Mercer County Park.

"I can't even describe it," said Carcione, who lost in the quarterfinals as a freshman and the semifinals as a sophomore. "So many great players have won this tournament and to know that I'm now a part of that group is amazing. It's probably the biggest achievement of my tennis career."

"I just thought, it's finally over," Ramapo coach Kim Marchese said. "We had so many tough matches that Jonathan had wished would have come down to him. Well this was his chance with some part of the Ramapo season on the line, and he nailed it."

Carcione (33-0) was facing an opponent in the Louisville-bound Lippens who hadn't lost since the 2009 state final and had beaten Carcione in three sets in a tournament last August.

And they went right at each other from the get-go, pounding ground strokes and ripping serves down the middle and wide at will during the first set.

"His forehand is huge, so my goal was to try to keep it to his backhand," Carcione said. "That first set was tight. I've played good players before where I got steamrolled early so I had to hold serve and stay with him."

Carcione did that, battling back from 15-40 down in the eighth game to hold for 4-4 and coming in behind his serve for a beautiful volley and ripping two of his seven aces in the first set to hold at 5-3.

Finally Lippens cracked as Car-

cione ripped a beautiful backhand passing shot down the line on break point to go up 6-5. He followed with three service winners, including an impressive kick serve on set point, to win the first set, 7-5.

"His service game was the biggest part of his game today," Marchese said. "It really helped him get out of trouble and allowed him to put pressure on Lippens' service game."

"That was definitely one of my best matches serving-wise," said Carcione, who did not suffer a break the entire match. "It was a very high level of play at the beginning. Winning a game early is big for me because then I can get on a roll."

Carcione won early in the second set, breaking Lippens in the third game of the set to go up, 2-1, and then holding serve for 5-1.

"He played very well," Lippens said. "He was picking his spots very nicely and hit the right ball at the right time."

Lippens held to get as close as 3-2, but Carcione won the next two to open up a 5-2 lead and serve the match.

Lippens got up love-30. But the junior wasn't going to be denied.

He battled back to take a 40-30 lead and followed up his serve on match point by sending another backhand passing shot down the line that Lippens failed to return.

"When he missed that shot, my brain just shut down," Carcione said.

Jacobs reaches peak of state sprint heights

OLD BRIDGE — On paper, it would seem as if everything has come easy for Paramus Catholic junior Myasia Jacobs.

But that's all it is — paper. Even for an athlete as accomplished as Jacobs, she has continuously had to deal with her confidence level.

"It was a weakness," Jacobs said, "because I used to psyche myself out all the time."

Jacobs — who became the first to win the state Meet of Champions 100 meters and 200 double three straight years Thursday — doesn't have those confidence issues any longer.

Her 100 time of 11.47 broke her own meet record of 11.48 set last season. It is the fourth-fastest time run in the country this season. No one at the state Meet of Champions had run below 11.5 prior to Jacobs' arrival.

She's done it twice.

"It's once in a lifetime," said Paramus Catholic sprints coach Dustin Thomas. "What we're seeing in New Jersey and in the country right now, what she's doing now after only three years, she's accomplishing things that, if we ever see it again, it'll be a long time before we see it again."

Thomas and Jacobs' coach-athlete relationship has blossomed since he joined the Paramus Catholic staff this year.

Thomas' decision to hold Jacobs out of the 100 and 200 early in the season turned into the best decision for both parties as Jacobs had to consider both her high school season and her summer state of events.

"I like people to peak at the right time," Thomas said. "It's a long season. Track and field — when you include indoor track and training for indoor track — it's like a nine- or 10-month season. I definitely think it was a good idea. As you can see in how she's running right now, she's peaking at the right time."


Jacobs' peak has only been topped by a younger version of Jacobs. Last season's highly anticipated race with former Eastern star English Gardner wasn't available this time as motivation. She didn't have anyone running with her. She had to run against herself, against her own goals and her own aspirations.

Even in victory, Jacobs could still fall.

She didn't.

"I just ran for time and ran my hardest," Jacobs said.

Jacobs doesn't get as nervous as she did two years ago. She understands what is expected of her and what she expects of herself. The nerves have subsided and now she can just focus on performing at a level only she's been

able to perform at in New Jersey history.

"Her confidence," Thomas said. "When you come from a state like New Jersey, that has such a great sprint history, they've never done what she's done. Right now, it's starting to sink in."

Jacobs is still adjusting to the attention. Even with international meets in Singapore behind her and in France in front of her, the spectacle of it all still keeps her selective with her words.

But her performances are as loud as they need to be.

"It's definitely a one-of-a-kind thing," Thomas said. "And as a coach, I have to sit back sometimes in awe and just watch."
