Athletes to watch

Colin Daly, River Dell, senior: The Record Indoor Track Athlete of the Year is among the best 800, 1,600 runners in North Jersey history and the best distance medley leadoff runner in the nation.

Will Daly, River Dell, senior: The Record Cross-Country Runner of the Year is the indoor state 1,600-meter champion and was second in last year's outdoor 1,600.

Gio Gutierrez, Saddle Brook, junior: The state indoor and outdoor Group 1 shot put champion is ready to contend for a state title in the shot and discus.

Alijah Jackson, Paramus Catholic, junior: The football standout is one of the area's top sprinters and long jumpers.

Joe Jordan, NV/Old Tappan, senior: One of a trio of Bergen County track athletes headed for Penn, he is the best high hurdler in the area and was a state Meet of Champions medalist in the intermediate hurdles last spring.

Jack Kerin, Indian Hills, senior: The Dartmouth-bound 800 standout placed third in the indoor state Meet of Champions and medaled last spring in the outdoor SMOC.

Frankie Richard, Northern Highlands, senior: The one-season track performer won the state Group 3 long jump last spring and finished seventh in the state Meet of Champions triple jump.

Raheem Roberts, Eastside, senior: The outstanding three-event sprinter just missed medaling in the state Meet of Champions indoor and outdoor 400-meter runs the past two seasons.

Patrick Sullivan, Don Bosco, senior: The state's fastest two-miler indoors hopes to end his high school career with a state Meet of Champions title outdoors after medaling in the event last year, before heading to the Air Force Academy.

Michael Thurston, Ridgewood, senior: A future Dartmouth teammate of Kerin, Thurston had a terrific indoor season before an untimely illness knocked him out of a state medal at 800 meters. He is one of the best in the country at 600 meters.

Wankeith Akin, Don Bosco, junior: He had an excellent sophomore year and could be the fastest runner in North Jersey after medaling last spring in Non-Public A sprints.





RIDGEWOOD — Passaic Tech's girls distance runners best embodied the spirit of the Pawlowski Relays on Saturday with a clinical performance at Benjamin Franklin Middle School that featured wins in the 4-x-800-meter relay, the 4-x-1,600 and the distance medley.

Passaic Tech is renowned for its performances in sprint events, but the Bulldogs got two distance wins. Destiny Calo and Nancy Habib, part of the team's wins in the 4-x-800 (10:30.12) and 4-x-1,600 (23:15.5) provided the leadership and the spark. Rounding out the 800 crew were Melany Then and Carly Spinnler, and Meralis Mendez and Sarah Shannon completed the 1,600 crew. Mendez, Then, Calo and Shannon combined for a 13:46.8 in the distance medley.

Coach Jeff Cioletti made a point to emphasize the leadership traits in the distance crew.

"We've been working on the mile and it's an event to take pride in," said Cioletti. "We have done longer practices and two speed days a week this year instead of one, and less tapering. Really, we have such good leadership that we don't need a distance coach."

Interestingly, Cioletti noted that it is the sophomore, Spinnler, and the junior, Shannon, who provide a great deal of leadership for the distance events.

Ridgewood swept the meet and both its teams clinched victory prior to the final event, the girls with 117 points and the boys

with 120. In the small schools division, Ridgefield Park's boys (71 points) and Cresskill's girls (85) earned victory.

Steven Pawlowski, who the meet honors, is a Ridgewood track legend, the Class of 2001 hurdler was tragically hit by a car and killed during his freshman year of college. "He was a talented team captain with a reputation for making every member feel like they were a vital part of the team," said Ro Crispin, a former teammate of Pawlowski. Crispin's cousin, Sam Halvorsen, is captaining Ridgewood's girls this spring.

"It's important to remind these kids of who Steve is, because it's 15 years ago now and some people don't know of him," said coach Jacob Brown. "He really was a hero that died too young."

"He was almost naive in his belief that if it was there, we all could attain it. As a result, we all ran harder, stayed in the gym longer, and hung out together," said Crispin of the "Polish Machine," as Pawlowski was called by his teammates. "Even though he wasn't an extrovert and was somewhat shy, people were just drawn to his character and his positive vibes."

Reflecting his nickname, Ridgewood gave Pawlowski a wrench as a gift in 2001. After a great start to 2016, Passaic Tech, Ridgewood, Ridgefield Park and Cresskill could be similarly well-oiled machines this season.



"To have a shared title with Hasbrouck Heights and coach Brady is an honor, and even with a tie," said Lyndhurst coach Tom Shoebridge. "With three or four kids in every event, a lot can go wrong. We had a two-day meet in which almost all our relays had [personal records], and we've now broken our school [4-x-100 meters] and [4-x-200] records twice in the last [several] weeks."

Clarence Reyes, Niko Regus, Matt Moretto and LeRoy Casimir won multiple events for the Aviators, while Peter Guerrero, Kevin Santos, Chris Furtado and Benny Franchino did the same for Lyndhurst.

Emerson won its second title in three years with 104 points in Group D. Runner-up Saddle Brook scored 85.

"It doesn't matter how many points you score, these meets are lot closer than the score might



Boys squad
begins a
new streak

At this point in their careers, Kobi Grant and Matt Tai might not be the most highly acclaimed members of the Ridgewood High School boys track and field team, but they're certainly the fastest — a fact that much of Bergen County is quickly learning.

"They like to be racing in the big spotlight, so championship meets are going to be where they are at their best," RHS head coach Josh Saladino said of Grant, a junior, and Tai, a sophomore.

The sprinters helped lead a runaway performance by Ridgewood in Monday's Big North Freedom Division meet at Hackensack. They finished 1-2 in the 100- and 200-meter races to help their team score 168 points and easily top runner-up Indian Hills' 111.

The Maroons received six first-place efforts, including a pair by Michael Thurston, to recapture the Freedom crown after having their string of 14 straight league titles snapped in 2015.

"It was a very strong performance for our team," Saladino said. "Indian Hills, Northern Highlands and Hackensack are all very strong teams."

In fact, the Comets (No. 6), Highlanders (No. 7) and Braves (No. 8) all sat within the top 10 of the most recent rankings by *The Record*.

Ridgewood, the No. 1 squad in North Jersey, maintained the momentum it built with a narrow victory in the Bergen County Relays at the end of April. It also appears to be a team capable of contending for a state-sectional championship after the program's streak of five straight came to an end last year.

The emergence of the young sprinters has been a key reason that the Maroons have become such a balanced team in 2016.

Following the graduation of the team's best sprinters in 2014, Grant and Tai ascended to the top spots last season and worked their way through growing pains while gaining valuable experience racing in major meets.

"They're young as a junior and a sophomore, but they're very experienced," Saladino said. "They've run in Nationals before, they've run in California and Philadelphia. So, certainly, they know how to perform well when it matters most."

In the Freedom meet — which was originally scheduled for last Friday but postponed due to rain — Grant grabbed gold in the 100, clocking 11.07 seconds to edge Tai's time of 11.14.

Tai turned the tables in the 200, placing first in 22.72 just ahead of his teammate's time of 23.11.

"This spring especially, they've embraced the practices at a little different level," Saladino said of the sprinters. "That was big for us to do so well in both those events."

Meanwhile, Thurston continued to display his all-around athleticism in the meet.

The senior placed first in the 400, with junior teammate Kyle Mack coming home third in the race. He also led a 1-2-3 showing by the Maroons in the 800, just beating out freshman Will Bagniski and senior Andrew Taggart at the finish line.

"His 400 [and] 800, he went 49.74 and then 2:01.65 with about 25 minutes off in between," Saladino said.

Thurston added a second-place performance in the high jump (6-foot-4).

Senior Kenny Ekeri backed up his first-place finish in the Group A shot put with another gold-medal performance on Monday, recording a distance of 50 feet, 10 inches.

The pole vaulting contingent of Luc Bontoux, Ryan Vimba and Danny Schechter placed 1-3-6 to put another 17 points on the board for Ridgewood.

"Coach Steve Opremcak, who's also the girls' coach, has really done an awesome job with the pole vaulters this year," Saladino said. "They've all improved at least a foot over last year, and we're only in early May right now."

Up next is the Gene "Red" Little Bergen County championships starting this afternoon and continuing Saturday morning at Northern Valley/Old Tappan. In addition to the strong teams Ridgewood beat in the Freedom Division, the Maroons will have its hands full against the host school, currently ranked No. 2 in *The Record* Top 25.

The Maroons edged NV/Old Tappan, 120-117, in the County Relays. However, the Bergen County group meet represents a different test.

"Old Tappan is a better individual team than they are a relay team," said Saladino, "so we know they're going to be maybe even more of a challenge in this one."





Boys earn first title since 2013

The Ridgewood High School boys track team received a few elite performances at last weekend's Gene "Red" Little Bergen County championships, but the Maroons once again proved that their biggest strength is the sheer number of talented athletes they can put out there in any event.

Ridgewood held a talented Northern Valley/Old Tappan squad 146-135, to win the program's fifth Group A title and first since 2013, thanks to team depth that picked up points in 14 of 16 events.

"We've got guys in every event that can compete really well," senior Michael Thurston said Monday night in a phone interview. "It's definitely a really big win."

Following Ridgewood's victories at the Bergen County Relays and in the Big North Freedom Division meet, the county Group A title is the biggest accomplishment in a resurgent season for the Maroons.

You look at the state sectionals, the North 1, Group 1 and Group 4 winners, more times than not those teams come from Bergen County," head coach Josh Sadino said in a phone interview Monday. "We certainly are excited about the win."

NV/Old Tappan led Ridge wood by 12 points entering the second day of the meet Saturday, but the Maroons felt they had done their jobs by remaining within striking distance despite the Golden Knights thriving in their best events.

NV/Old Tappan seniors Thomas Rienas, William Rienas and Andrew Schumacher finished 1-3-4 in the 400, but Thurston claimed second and junior Kyle Mack grabbed fifth to minimize the Golden Knights' advantage.

The something occurred in the 400 hurdles, in which Schumacher and senior Joseph Jordan placed first and second for NV/Old Tappan. However, Zach Stavins and Mack recorded personal best times to take fourth and sixth.

"We hung in there close on Friday," Sadino said. "Then they were able to slowly chip away at the lead on Saturday." Ridgewood picked up points in bunches, thanks to a quartet of first-place efforts.

Junior Kobi Grant claimed the 100-meter dash in 11.28, becoming the first Maroon to do so since Dan Cooper in 2000. Grant also anchored Ridgewood's victorious 4-x-100 relay, teaming with Matt Tai, Jason Chinn and Will Migliorelli to beat NV/Old Tappan by 0.09 seconds.

Meanwhile, Thurston earned his first career county gold with a

state season-best time of 1:52.79 in the 800.

"Ridgewood High School has had a tradition of really great 800 runners," said Thurston, who earned the program's 16th gold medal in the event since 1980. "Bergen County has also had really great 800 runners, so winning that championship was pretty big."

In the field, senior Kenny Pleit earned a gold medal in the shot put with a throw of 51 feet, 2 inches.

While the Maroons picked up four gold medals, a couple second-place finishes were key in lifting the team over the Golden Knights.

Junior Michael Gentle stepped up in a big way, earning a silver in the discus.

He came through with a 15-foot personal best for 40 feet, 6 inches," Sadino said. "That was a big eight points and because we score eight that pushes Old Tappan down two points."

Sid Wach led a nice effort in the 3,200 along with Billie Byrne and Kenny Marshall to pick up 17 points in the event.

"Indian Hills got the better of us in that race; they went 1:54, but our guys went 2:55," Sadino said.

Thurston added silver medals in the 400 and the high jump, as well as part of the 4-x-800 relay.

Girls fall just short of crown

The season-long rivalry between Ridgewood and Northern Highlands finally turned in the Highlanders' favor at last weekend's Gene "Red" Little Bergen County championships.

Northern Highlands ran away with the meet's final event — the 4-x-400 relay — and received a little help from Teaneck, which edged the Maroons for second place to give the Highlanders the Group A crown, 127-121.

"We've tried to educate [the athletes] and tell them how hard it is to win the County A championship, one of the longest championships in the entire state," Ridgewood head coach Steve Opremcak said in a phone interview Monday. "We had a very strong effort, but it wasn't enough across the board improvement."

Northern Highlands became the first school to win back-to-back Group A titles since Immaculate Heart (now in Group F) won four straight from 2008-11. Ridgewood fell just short of its first county title since 2012.

The Maroons did receive some breakthrough performances, however, starting with sophomore Len Uzoatu, who claimed a gold medal in the discus as well as third place in the shot put.

Three weeks after finishing 10th among the same group of athletes in Group A at the Bergen County Relays, the sophomore unleashed a discus throw of 115 feet, 32 feet, 5 inches better than in the County Relays — to outdistance runner-up Maya Vanderhinden of Northern Valley/Old Tappan by more than eight feet.

Her discus win was unexpected but not surprising considering the amount of work and focus that she put in, Opremcak said. "As she continues to improve her craft, she is going to be the best thrower in Bergen County."

Ridgewood benefited from three other first-place performances as well.

Senior Keri Colleburn ran the 100-meter hurdles in 10.94 to take gold, and senior distance runner Sam Halvorsen crossed the line first in the 3,200 in 11:09.06.

Halvorsen teamed with Evelyn Reichen, Meghan Adams and Leah Rosenfeld on the Maroons' first-place 4-x-800 relay, which blew away the competition (9:56.5), well ahead of Northern Highlands' time (10:32.5).

Adams, a sophomore, ran in four events for Ridgewood and showed no signs of fatigue in a "truly exceptional" effort, according to her coach. "Meghan Adams had just an extraordinary meet," Opremcak said. "She [set personal bests] in

the [1,600] and then just a tremendous winning 4-x-800 a 4-x-400 relay at the meet."

The Maroons' 1-point lead headed 4-x-400 but Northern claimed first place 4:00.49. Teaneck crossed the finish line of 4:05.51. Ridgewood's 4:10 robbed the Maroon and gave the Highlanders the championship.

"Some years you get enough momentum and win," Opremcak said. "Some years you have to work hard and use grit. Neither of the two years we've had have been easy."

Despite falling just short of the championship, the Highlanders still qualified as the second best team in Bergen County and earned a spot in the state tournament.

"It's been a terrible year," Opremcak said. "Northern Highlands this season has been stuck in the mud with

the Avon, the Bayonne, the New Jersey and the Hudson Divisions before Northern got on the scoreboard this weekend."

The Ridgewood High School senior crossed the finish line first in the final event of the North 1, Group 4 sectional boys track and field meet. His need to speed having ended at that point, he moved at a much more leisurely pace en route to joining mates with the championship trophy.

Thurston involved in two of their event victories at John J. Bauer Memorial Field, the Maroons scored 163 points to recapture the title over Morris town (69) and West Orange (60). Junior Kohl Grant added a gold medal in the 100-meter dash, which was held on Friday evening.

Host Randolph finished eighth one year after snapping a long string of Ridgewood triumphs.

"We'd won five in a row and lost last year," RHS head coach Josh Saladino said. "Our goal is always to go through the season undefeated, and we were able to do that. We went undefeated in our dual meets, we won the county relays, won the county individual [meet] and the league championship, and then this."

Sixteen Maroons qualified to compete in this weekend's State Group 4 finals at Egg Harbor Township by finishing in the top six of their respective events at sectionals.

In addition to anchoring the 4x400 to victory, Thurston defended his North 1, Group 4 800-meter title in 1:54.45. He was unaware of his finishing time until afterward, since the display clock at the start/finish line froze midway through the first lap of the two-lap race.

"I was trying to run a 55 [second] high for the first 400," Thurston said, "so not being able to see the clock, I didn't know if I was on pace or not."

The timer worked just fine for the 4x400, though the Dartmouth-bound standout had his attention focused elsewhere for that event.

Ghost of a chance

Eastside took the lead on the first leg of the relay thanks to leadoff man Marco Joseph. Junior Kyle Mack passed the baton to Ridgewood teammate Matt Tai in second, and Tai was able to reel in the Ghosts' Roy Davis within the first 200 meters of the second leg.

Tai, a sophomore, handed the lead to freshman Will Baginski, who got passed by Eastside's Chad Bradley before surging to regain first place in the final 100 meters of leg No. 3.

"He keeps fighting," Thurston said of Baginski. "It happened to him in the mile [on Friday], too. He got taken, and then he fought back and got a spot."

Baginski's resilience afforded Thurston the chance to start the anchor leg with the lead, and the latter went all-out to hold off a hard-charging Raheem Roberts from Eastside for the win.

"He [Roberts] beat me in the 400 [on Friday], so I wanted to make sure that I got him today," Thurston said at the end of Saturday's events.

Ridgewood clocked an official time of 3:20.97, just over a half-second faster than the Ghosts (3:21.30).

Kohi for three

Mack opened the meet with a bronze in the 400 hurdles (57.03). Baginski then made his run to silver in the 1,600 (4:19.72) before joining with seniors Kenneth Marshall and Andrew Taggart and junior Matteo Robazza to place fifth in the 4x800 relay (8:07.21).

On Saturday, Baginski ran a sixth-place 1:59.12, and sophomore Sid Wagh led the RHS 3,200-meter contingent with a fourth-place 9:49.14.



"I was a little bit surprised at my time, because I was seeded third," Grant said. "But I was really happy to get first... because then I definitely knew I had a chance at winning."

The finals were interrupted by a false start, and on the retry, Grant ran 11.09 to edge out Morris Township's Ricky Webber (11.12). Tai ended up fifth in the race, clocking 11.21.

Grant and Tai ran the 200 as well, placing fourth and sixth with times of 22.43 and 22.56, respectively. In the 4-x-100 relay, they combined with senior Will Migliorelli and sophomore Jason Chun for a silver-medal 43.32.

Thurston also competed in the high jump, where he cleared six feet. In the 400, his bronze-medal 50.25 put him 0.1 behind Roberts (second, 49.15) and just ahead of teammate Mack (fifth, 49.36).

Mack opened the meet with a bronze in the 400 hurdles (57.03). Baginski then made his run to silver in the 1,600 (4:19.72) before joining with seniors Kenneth Marshall and Andrew Taggart and junior Matteo Robazza to place fifth in the 4-x-800 relay (8:07.21).

On Saturday, Baginski ran a sixth-place 1:59.12, and sophomore Sid Wagh led the RHS 3,200-meter contingent with a fourth-place 9:49.14.

Ridgewood padded its point total with strong showings in the field. Senior Kenny Ekeri took third in the shot put (53-7 1/4) and fourth in the discus (135-4), senior Spencer McAvey was fourth in the shot put (49-1 1/4), and junior Michael Gentile placed sixth in the discus (129-2).

In the pole vault, senior Luc Bontoux (13 feet) and junior Ryan Vimba (12 6) finished 2-4.

"This is one of the more complete teams that we've had here," said Saladino, now in his 15th season. "We cover all the events - sprints, throws, distance, hurdles, jumps - and I think we showed it."



Girls team ends 9-year drought

RANDOLPH — Sprinters, including one in particular, have helped put the Ridgewood High School girls track and field team over the top in its past two North 1, Group 4 championship wins.

The Maroons enjoyed their usual distance-race success at last weekend's state-sectional meet, claiming gold in the 1,600 meters, 3,200 meters and 4-x-800 relay. Their always-formidable pole vault contingent turned in a 1-2 finish as well.

The icing on the cake was a 49.52-second win in the 4-x-100 relay, in which senior Isabel Park joined forces with the freshman trio of Clara Emmanuel, Katherine Muccio and Victoria Purriano.

Ridgewood rode those victories, plus a bevy of top-six medal finishes, to a 96-70½ win over Montclair for its first North 1, Group 4 title since 2007. Host school and seven-time reigning champ Randolph (69) placed third.

"This year, we have some of the best sprinters that we've had in a while," Purriano said last Saturday, "since Coach Davenport's [senior] year."

The fleet-footed frosh was referring to RHS sprint coach Erica Davenport (nee Cigolini), who was a senior on the 2007 squad and earned a bronze medal in the sectional 100-meter dash.

"It's nice having her to push us to be better, because she knows what she's talking about," added Purriano.

The '07 Maroons clinched their crown by beating East Orange in the final event, the 4-x-400, which gave them an 83-79 victory over the Jaguars.

Clifton captured the North 1, Group 4 title the following year, before Randolph went on its streak - a fact not lost on the current Ridgewood squad.

"Randolph won seven years in a row, so we've definitely got a long history with them," senior Sam Halvorsen said.

Distance girls deliver

The sectional meet began Friday night, with Halvorsen (5:03.12) and junior Olympia Martin (5:05.11) placing 1-2 ahead of Randolph's top runners, who finished 4-5.

The former then combined with senior Leah Rosenfeld and sophomores Meghan Adams and Evelyn Kotch to win the 4-x-800 in a meet-record time of 9:32.84.

"That was definitely an exciting race," Halvorsen said. "Being the first leg of the relay, I still had a lot of adrenaline to cheer everyone on."

The Wake Forest-bound miller came back on a sunny Saturday and took fourth in the open 800 (2:18.03) before completing the individual distance

trifecta with a third in the 3,200.

The longest race of the sectional proved to be the top drama. Martin and Halvorsen ran early before moving up late, while freshman Abby McLaughlin of Bergen Tech set the pace.

Martin kicked into another gear on the final stretch and she was able to pass McLaughlin to with 600 meters to go and close out the 10:58.62. McLaughlin (11:08.42) stayed ahead of Halvorsen (11:09.04) for third.

"As soon as we reached the last lap, I started kicking it and going as fast as I can," Martin said. "It was the same thing here last year. I was sixth, and I was seventh," said McLaughlin, a Waldwick resident. "It's good competition."

The top six finishers in each event add this weekend's State Group 4 finale in Egg Harbor Township. Fifteen Ridgewood girls qualify, one-third of that group shares another common away from the track.

I'll tumble for you

Long have the Maroons found success in pole vault by employing members of the gymnastics team - including 2007 senior Anna Polcari and her sister Kayla, who set record at 12 feet in 2011.

This year was no exception, as gymnasts Lester and Maxine Earl both cleared 12 feet on attempts.


"Me and Nicole have a healthy rivalry challenging each other," Earl said. "And same team, so either way, we're still winning points for our team."

Muccio, Purriano and senior Kenny Cigolini were the other gymnasts/tracksters to hit the points.

Besides running the 4-x-100, Muccio fourth in the 400-meter hurdles (1:07.31), in the 200 (26.20) and combined with Adams and Rosenfeld on the third-place 4-x-

(4:03.00). Callaghan was sixth in both the 1,600 (5:17.5) and long jump (16 feet, 8 inches). Rosenfeld added a sixth in the 400 (1:07.64). Elsewhere in the field, Ridgefield placed showings from senior Cate Sibley in the triple jump (33-1 1/4), junior Sophia Callaghan in the javelin (99 feet) and sophomore Lexi Callaghan in the shot put (35-2 1/4).

"We have quality in all the different events. We competed very well," said RHS head coach Steve Opremcak. "The theme coming in is to compete at our best. Everybody's got to personal records right through the day. And it's the perfect meet, but it was pretty darn close."

"Last year I had a rough time against 4:10 milers as a 4:20 miler, but now I have what they have and it feels special," the senior said. "From that day last year, all I was thinking about was this race. I'm 100 percent happy about it, and it's almost hard to think about."

NV/Old Tappan's relay team of Andrew Schumacher, Joe Jordan, Will Rienas and Thomas Rienas won the boys' 4-x-400 in 3:15.43.

Northern Highlands' Frankie Richard achieved a personal record when he triple jumped a 47-1/2 to place third.

"I was happy that I got that on my first jump because I was focused today on not tiring myself out for the long jump," Richard said.

Matt Wierba of Garfield also had a strong jump performance, finishing fifth in the long jump with a 22-4 1/2.

"I just wanted to tough it out all season and it was cathartic constantly working through the adversity," the senior said. "I still got something out of it even though it was difficult. I was surprised I medaled today so it was definitely worth it."
