Boys track: Top story lines, athletes to watch

Five story lines to watch

Pole Vault paradise

If the North Jersey vaulters can even duplicate their winter performance, they will dominate the state in this event. Tyler Hrbek of NV/Old Tappan succeeded his classmate Seth Kricheff as the State Meet of Champs titlist, and cleared 15-3 1/2 for second all time in Bergen County. Kricheff also cleared 15 feet and they became the first duo from one school to clear 15 feet in the same season. They actually did it in five different meets. Kricheff was 3rd in SMOC and Pascack Hills junior Liam Landau was 6th, clearing 14-6. A third OT vaulter, Jona Kim cleared 13-6 this winter along with Sam Pitkowsky of Pascack Valley and Jared Forer of Glen Rock while Jordan Laceste of Clifton and Justin Manne each cleared 13 feet. It wouldn't surprising if nearly one-third of the 30 boys vaulting at the State Meet of Champs June 9 are from North Jersey.

Multi-sport stars

Nearly 20 boys from more than a dozen schools who received first, second or third team All-Bergen or All-Passaic honors in football or basketball are expected to be significant contributors to their schools' track team this spring. While distance runners are unlikely to play any other sports, sprinters, jumpers and throwers abound who succeeded on the court or the gridiron this school year.

Connor Scaglione of NV/Demarest was an All-Bergen defensive lineman and helped take the Norseman basketball team to a sectional title. And he also earned a state Meet of Champions medal in the discus last spring. Carlos Pepin of Lodi was second team in both basketball and football but he is also the top returning Bergen County high jumper. And Wellington Ventura of Cresskill, who was 3rd team All-Bergen in hoops is even better in track and field as one of the state's best 400 runners and long jumpers.

Others to take note of this spring: all-county first team football players Kelvin Gonzalez of Lakeland (sprints and jumps), A.J. Bakunas of West Milford (throws), George Garrison and Quanzie Lumsden of Englewood (sprints), Frankie Negrini of Pompton Lakes (throws), Jasiah Purdie of Hasbrouck Heights (sprints) and Mario Agyen of Northern Highlands (sprints); second team: Adrain Malave, Passaic Tech (throws); Max Baker, Ramapo (sprints), Austin Albericci, NV/Demarest (multi); Greg Anderson, Becton (throws); third team: Johnny Lohrer, NV/Old Tappan (hurdles/sprints).

Freshmen to watch

A growing trend in recent years has been for freshmen boys to make a varsity mark early, mostly on the track. This

year's crop appears to be a very good one, based on the cross-country and winter track seasons. Sprinters to watch include Paramus Catholic's Jemel Carter, 3rd in the New Balance Indoor Nationals freshman 60 and BC's Adrian Taffe, 8th in the same event. Christian

Abraham of Paramus Catholic and Lukkas Londono of Cliffside Park are other top young sprinters and Andre Barrett of PC is a key jumper/hurdler. Perhaps these distance runners will also have a varsity impact: Bobby Hymans of Ramapo, Theo Davis of NV/Demarest, Collin Clinton of West Milford, Nate Armstrong of Pompton Lakes and Caleb Dalgetty of Dwight-Englewood.

What can they do for an encore?

Two Passaic County stars not only made their mark in New Jersey this winter but rose to All-American status before the end of the season. So what can Luis Peralta of Passaic and Jadon Watson of Kennedy do this spring. Peralta, just a junior, didn't lose an 800 meter race all season, including his race at the New Balance Nationals where he caught Sean Dolan of Hopewell valley with an amazing finish in 1:51.74, a Passaic County record. Two runners beat him 4 1/2 hours later in a seeded heat but Peralta was still the fastest junior in the country last winter.

Watson, who missed most of last year, came back ready to roll this winter and the senior high jumper was terrific all season, taking second on misses at 6-8 at the State Meet of champions although he was much closer to 6-10 than his opponent. Then at nationals, he set a Passaic County record at 6-10 3/4 and took fifth. Can he get seven feet this spring?

Changes are a coming

There are several changes affecting North Jersey teams in the state series beginning in May 21. Clifton will host the Group 1 and 4 state sectionals May 25 and 26, the first time the meet has returned to Clifton Stadium in many years, and Don Bosco hosts the Non-Public North sectionals for the first time, with the Non-Public sectionals moving to Monday and Tuesday instead of Friday-Saturday.

The group meets move from Northern Burlington to Central Regional in Berkeley Township (2,3, and B) and from Egg Harbor Township to Franklin (1,4, and A). but that's not the biggest change.

The state Meet of Champions, set for June 9 at Northern Burlington High School, will see just 30 qualifiers per individual event instead of the previous 42. The top two finishers in each event in each group meet will advance to SMOC along with nine wild cards from each group venue. Top two relays advance from each group plus six wild cards from each venue to make the relays a total of 24 teams.

Athletes to watch

Hank Anderson, Indian Hills senior jumper/hurdler

The Braves may be best known for their cross-country and distance programs, but Anderson shows that they can also hurdle and jump. He was the fastest 55-meter hurdler in North Jersey

this winter and made it to the State Meet of Champions. He also won several championships in the high jump and should be primed for an excellent final season.

Tyler Hayek, NV/Old Tappan, senior pole vaulter

With his classmate Seth Kricheff, the two Golden Knights' vaulter have dominated the indoor season for two years with Hrbek succeeding Kricheff as the state champion this winter. He made 15-3 ½ at Nationals, second only to the Bergen County record of 15-6 set by Luke Annichiarco of NV/OT in 2014. Annichiarco holds the outdoor record of

15-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ that Hrbek has his sights set on this spring.

Rahmir Johnson, Bergen Catholic junior sprinter

He's ready to make his mark at the next level after injuries hampered him this winter and previous obligations cost him a chance to win state sprinting medals last spring after a spectacular early season in the 100 and 200. But he's ready to go now, as the 2nd place finish in the SMOC 200 indoors and a 9th at Emerging Elite Nationals shows. He's also a potentially strong long jumper and 400-meter runner, too.

Jordan Laceste, Clifton senior pole vaulter

His pole vault win at the Passaic County championships this winter continued his steady improvement over his career and he became just the 9th Passaic County vaulter to clear 13 feet indoors when he made the height at the State Meet of Champions. Only four Clifton vaulters had ever made that height before indoors or outdoors.

Emmanuel Montoya, Fort Lee senior jumper/hurdler

An important cog in the tremendous success enjoyed by the 2017 Bridgemen, Manny has become the unquestioned star of this year's team, in the hurdles

and in all three jumps. He became Fort Lee's first indoor state champion he won the Group 2 state title in February and he is one of the best jumpers in the area in the long and triple jump as well.

Carlos Pepin, Lodi senior jumper/ thrower

A tremendous three-sport athlete, he starred on the football field and earned the Record's Athlete of the Week honors in basketball. But his versatility shines most in track, or more properly in the field. A solid javelin thrower, he is one of the area's top long and triple jumpers. His best event though is the high jump, where he cleared a Bergen leading and school record 6-6 last spring.

Luis Peralta, Passaic junior long sprinter

What's next for the brilliant young runner, who can run 6.78 for 55 meters and sub 16 minutes on the 5,000 meter Darlington County cross-country course? Peralta comes off a winter where he won a state championship, his first, at 800 meters and two weeks later, nearly took the national title from an unseeded heat. He holds the Passaic indoor record of 1:51.77 and the outdoor record, 1:49.08 by Georgetown All-American Joe White of DePaul is in

Connor Scaglione, NV/Demarest senior thrower

Connor was prepared to throw the shot in the Emerging Elite Division at Nationals in early March but had to drop out when his other winter sport, basketball, interfered. Scaglione was a very important member of Demarest's sectional championship team. But basketnall obligations, finished, he turns to the throws where he is one of the state's top returnees at the shot and discus, earning an SMOC medal in the latter event.

Matt Tai, Ridgewood senior sprint-

The Maroons may have more talented athletes, but if they are to contend for league, Bergen County and state sectional group 4 honors, their senior sprinter has to stay healthy. He's a solid

100-200 guy but his strength may be on the various relays like the 4-x-100, ex-400 and sprint medleys where he is an important leg.

Wellington Ventura, senior sprinter/jumper

Another one season track athlete who had a terrific winter on the basketball court as Cresskill reached the group 1 state finals. But his main sport is track and field and he has signed to compete for the University of Connecticut with an eye towards becoming a decathlete. This spring he might be the best long and triple jumper in the area AND the best 400 runner with personal bests of 22-4, 44-5 ½ and 48.94 respectively.

Track and field is off to a running start

The first week of the track and field season, like other outdoor spring sports, was ravaged by the very unspringlike weather. But before the weather came, there was a very nice first Saturday.

Seven North Jersey girls teams and individuals took the early-season state lead in their events with good performances on opening day. It's no surprise that Tiffany Bautista of Paramus Catholic leads all triple jumpers with her 37-9 effort at the Season Opener at River Dell -- she led the state all indoor season and won the Eastern State championship. And Melissa Purcell's state leading 11-6 pole vault at the Pawlowski Relays isn't a shock since she was fourth in last spring's state Meet of Champions and third this past winter. But the javelin leader is a huge surprise. Bergen Tech freshman Alianna Eucker threw the spear 129-4 at the Season Opener, three feet better than anyone else did in the state and six feet further than any freshman in the United States has recorded so far this year. The top freshman throw in the country last year was 131-10 and Eucker's throw is the second best by any New Jersey freshman since the implement was changed in 2001.

Eucker, from Westwood, finished third in the 13-14 division nationally at the Junior Olympics in Lawrence, Kansas last summer with a throw of 127-1. Ironically one of the two girls to beat her was Mahwah's Hailey Romero, who was second at 128-5. Romero is still in eighth grade.

Park Ridge (4:02.5) and Paramus Catholic (4:03.5) are the top two 4-x-400 teams in the state after wins at the Pawlowski Relays and Season Opener Invitational, respectively. Holy Angels ran 9:54.0 to lead all 4-x-800 teams the first week, Paramus Catholic leads all shuttle hurdles teams at 61.7 and Ridgewood ran 21:58.4 for the 4-x-1,600, all excellent midseason times earned on the first day.

Peralta, third in the New Balance Indoor 800 last month out of an unseeded heat gets his shot at National champ Jett Charvet of Heritage at 6:46 pm PDT Saturday in the 800. Look for sub 1:51 half milers Alex Scales of Bellarmine and Jason Gomez of Westmont as well.

Ridgewood's girls are in the 4-x-800 invitational 4:44 PDT Friday, and the distance medley invite 7:44 Saturday, but the race to watch for the Maroons might be the shuttle hurdles at 5:55 Friday. The quartet of Virginia Morley, Victoria Purritano, Sara VandenAssem and Katherine Muccio look to become the first North Jersey team under 60 seconds. PCTI will get a battle from Wayne Valley and Clifton, who were second and third last year while Lakeland looks to beat Hawthorne for a 4th straight year.

Wayne Hills edged Passaic Tech for the girls A title last year but Clifton, which won the indoor county title this winter with a record score is favored to regain the girls title it last won in 2016. Lakeland edged Hawthorne for the girls B title last year and the two teams should battle again this year. Field events start at 9:30 a.m. and running events start at 10 a.m.

The other North Jersey meet is the Comet Relays at Hackensack at 9 a.m. with the cancellation of the Lyndhurst Relays due to a smaller-than-expected entry. North Jersey teams are also expected at the Metuchen Relays and the Pirate Relays in Pearl River, NY. The Summit Relays were cancelled because of projected weather problems.



Peralta Runs 4:16 & Ridgewood Posts Four NJ#1s at Arcadia

A few teams from New Jersey traveled all the way to California this weekend to compete at the Arcadia Invitational and they didn't waste the trip.

Passaic's Luis Peralta won the open division of the boys mile run with a quick time of 4:16.62! That is his fastest mile and well ahead of his 1600m PR of 4:22.90. The junior mid-distance star is coming off a great indoor season in the 800m where he won the indoor Meet of Champions before finishing third at New Balance Nationals Indoor running 1:51.74. At Arcadia he doubled back that same day to run 1:59.72 in the 800m, his outdoor PR is 1:53.09.



Ridgewood's relays had a great meet as a whole with the girls running THREE state leading times! A 1:04.53 in the shuttle, 9:25.26 for the 4x800m, and 12:17.53 for the distance medley relay. On the boys side they posted a 10:35.69 NJ#2 in the DMR and a 3:34.25 NJ#1 in the sprint medley relay. What a meet for Ridgewood!

We saw four top ten New Jersey triple jump marks at this invitational. The girls were led by Samantha Lopes of Wallkill Valley who cleared 36-11.5 NJ#2, Gianna Macones of Sparta, 36-10 NJ#3, and Lauren Stern of Mahwah, 36-05 NJ#7, behind her. Stern also ran NJ#3 in the 100m hurdles with a 15.38 at this meet as well. In the boys triple Ridgewood's Max Bartlik measured to 43-2.5 NJ#8.

Christian Brothers Academy junior Tim McInerney had a very strong early season meet running 9:32.34 for the 3200m and then 1:55.95 in the 800m. That 800 time is only a second off his best of 1:54.92 which was run for a State Non-Public A Group title in June of 2017.

After cutting back her race appearances this past indoor season, state champion Alyssa Aldridge of Mainland Regional ran the earliest 3200m we've seen in her high school career with a state leading 10:58.46.


Ridgewood hurdlers set county best at Bergen Relays

ORADELL — Juniors Katherine Muccio, Virginia Morley and Victoria Purritano have lots of goals for the spring track season, lots of championships for their Ridgewood team, one of the best in the state, and lots of success in their individual events.

From the day spring track started, the trio also set their sights on a record — the 11-year-old school and Bergen County record in the 3-x-400 intermediate hurdles. They surprised even themselves when they came within .6 of a second of breaking the mark on opening day three weeks ago at the Pawlowski Relays.

And Friday, on the first day of the Jack Yockers Bergen County Relays at River Dell High School, in spite of illness almost keeping Morley from the starting line, in spite of strong winds that buffeted them in the final straightaway of the sport's most demanding event and in spite of being paired with a team that

was non-competitive, the Maroons accomplished their goal.

With Muccio running a personal best of 61.7 seconds, Purritano adding her own personal best of 66.7 and Morley battling her way to a season's best of 65.8, the Maroons combined for a 3:14.2 total, .7 better than the 2007 team.

"I tried to go through every hurdle as hard as I can staying as low as I can to stay beneath the wind," said Purritano.

"And we had to finish strong because

we had that goal in mind and knew that every tenth mattered," added Muccio, who improved her seventh-best performance in Bergen history.

The original thought preseason was to take a couple of shots at the record early and then go hard in the event at the East Coast Relays at Randolph on May 21, the same meet where the Ridgewood trio of Cristina Law, Alice Wisener and Allyson Llerandi set the mark.

Golden Hawks go fast in the 4-x-1,600

Ridgewood also ran very fast in the girls 4-x-1,600, running 21:16.5 with a quartet of freshman Sarah Policano, seniors Evelyn Kotch and Meghan Adams and junior Cassie Keyes shattering the meet record by more than eight seconds and running the sixth fastest time in county history.

This time, however, the Maroons weren't the gold medal winners -- that honor, and the meet record went to River Dell, with its quartet of freshman Amanda Mircovich, senior Shannon Goria, junior Kellie O'Donnell and freshman Maggie Mirkovich.

The Golden Hawks took an astounding 45 seconds off their own school record and ran 21:12.5, a time beaten by only the 1983 Ridgewood team which set a national record at the time that lasted for 20 years and the 2009 IHA team which ran 20:59.57 at the East Coast Relays in 2009.

"I just wanted to stay with the leaders early and get Shannon the lead late," said Amanda Mircovich, who led off in 5:17. Goria, who was part of the previous school record holding team as a freshman, increased the lead over second place Ridgewood, running 5:19 and then O'Donnell ran her best ever split of 5:24 to turn the baton over to Maggie Mircovich with a 10 meter lead over Ridgewood and Keyes.

The two matched strides down the backstretch with Mircovich maintaining the better position on the inside.

"Then with 200 to go I gave it all I have and was able to hold her off," said

Mircovich, who split 5:13 for her leg.

The boys 4-x-1,600 was also exciting with longtime friends and rivals Will Baginski of Ridgewood and Steve Fiumefreddo of Indian Hills matching 61 second final 400s with Baginski holding on by about a meter in 18:33.6.

Bergen Catholic earns track title

County relays championship is team's first since '01

ORADELL — Bergen Catholic ended a long drought Saturday afternoon at River Dell High School, edging Paramus Catholic to capture the E Division of the 2018 Jack Yockers Bergen County Relays.

The Crusaders collected 117 points to squeak by the Paladins (113) in what proved to be the closest division on the boys' side of the ledger. The victory marked the first Bergen County Relays title for Bergen Catholic since 2001. Ridgewood (107) took the top spot in A Division while Demarest (B Division, 120), Glen Rock (C Division, 109) and Emerson (D Division, 134) all took home titles.

"We've been very close the last two years and it has come down to some freaky stuff," Bergen Catholic coach Bill Leonard said. "It's a relief because we've had lots of talented kids come through [the program] and we haven't been able to put it together on this day. We've won County and group titles but the Relays have always eluded us."

That the Crusaders were able to overcome several setbacks proved to be crucial. Bergen Catholic was disqualified in the 4-x-200 relay and then nearly lost the eight points it gained in the 4-x-100, an event in which the Crusaders finished second simply because of Javontae Jean-Baptiste's determination.

The senior, who committed to play football for Ohio State, was running the anchor leg in the 4-x-100 when he began to limp with about 40 yards remaining in the race. He was clearly distressed and in pain yet hobbled to the finish line before collapsing and grabbing his right hamstring.

"I'm not sure of the extent of the injury," Leonard said. "But he's up and he's walking around so it's not as bad as it first looked. The average kid would have just went down there and shut down and I wouldn't have blamed him if he did.

"That's the difference between us getting eight points and zero points. Without that, we lose. He finds a way to get across the finish line and we win. He doesn't and we lose."

Jean-Baptiste's effort, however, wasn't the only heroic one. Lodi's Carlos Pepin earned Most Valuable Performer honors for the field competitors after clearing 6-foot-8 in high jump. The senior cleared 6-9 earlier in the week at Manchester. He drew a crowd of nearly 70 spectators as he systematically cleared 6-feet, 6-2, 6-4 and 6-8 before knocking off the bar in each of his three attempts at 6-10.

Pepin was clearly energized by the crowd, which clapped collectively in rhythm as he approached the bar in what would be his final jump of the day before letting out an equally as loud collective groan.

"I still have the whole track season," said Pepin, who also starred on the Lodi basketball and football teams. "I believe anything is possible now. Coming into the season I didn't think 6-8 was possible. Expect the unexpected."

Pepin has narrowed his choice of collegiate sports to basketball and track. He's spoken to Rowan, Monmouth and East Stroudsburg about running track, and Iona and St. Michael's for basketball. He said he'd like to have a decision made by the end of May because he doesn't want to go into June not knowing. Pepin added that if possible he'd like to explore playing both sports in college.

Ridgewood's Will Baginski took home Most Outstanding Runner honors to lead his squad to its third consecutive A Division crown. The Maroons finished 15 points better than Northern Valley/Old Tappan. Northern Valley/Demarest successfully defended its B Division title ahead of second-place River Dell (80 points).

"It was a good team effort," Demarest coach Mike Theuerkauf said. "We won because of our depth. We didn't look pretty at times; so many of the events we were flat. But others we looked stellar. To not be perfect and still win is a sign of the character of this team."

Trusty and Roberts lead Saddle Brook

OLD TAPPAN – Lance Trusty and Sean Roberts have been friends since they met in first grade in Saddle Brook – "Well, by third grade, anyway," says Trusty with a laugh. "When we were younger, we did some stunid stuff."

Both boys played recreational basketball and Roberts dabbled in football as well, before the duo turned to track and field by middle school.

As seniors, they are the centerpiece of a very good Falcon team that sits in second place in Division D behind Emerson after the first day of the Red Littler Bergen County Group championships, combining for three wins and a second place finish and 38 of their team's 54 points.

"We both were on the team that won as freshmen," said Roberts, the former NJIC divisional cross country champion, who won the 100 and 400 meters impressively in season best times of 11.35 and 50.34 respectively. "But we were just there – this time we want to be part of winning it."

Roberts had quicker success in his events than Trusty did in his, excelling throughout middle school and scoring during his first few years in high school. But Trusty saw his friend's passion for the sport and it pushed him to excel as well.

"I saw what he did and last year I started pushing him in practice the way he's always pushed me," said Trusty who won the 400 hurdles and was a strong second behind Roberts in the 400. "We always have a lot of fun together in practice with the team and it shows in our performances."

The duo will separate for college, as Roberts will study criminal justice and run at East Stroudsburg in Pennsylvania with an eye towards a career in the FBI or CIA. Trusty will head to Montclair State to study

film and will run if his schedule permits.

But first there's the rest of the track season starting with tomorrow, where both will run the 200 and then separate to run events they're relatively unfamiliar with

Trusty will run the 110 meter hurdles, while Roberts will run his first open 800, having run a great leg in the Bergen Relays sprint medley last month.

"I'm more excited than nervous about that," said Roberts. "It's an event people always thought I'd be good at."

An event Jeremy Bronstein always thought he'd be good at is the 1,600 meters, and while the Dwight-Englewood junior has run some good races in the past, Friday's Division E showed he good is now and can be in the future.

Running a controlled first 800 meters with Bergen Catholic's Braedon Fiume in just over 2:14, Bronstein took command in the third of four laps and powered

Ventura wins double at sectional track meet

CLIFTON -- Wellington Ventura envisioned his high school athletic career would take place on the basketball court and maybe lead to a Division1college opportunity. But his friend Evan Miliones had other ideas.

"He tried to get me to run track as a freshman because he said it would be fun, and I told him, why would I have fun running around a track?," said Ventura, a senior at Cresskill. "Then he kept after me and I came out as a sophomore."

Ventura's basketball career turned out pretty well, as he was an important part of this year's Cougar squad that reached the Group 1 state final, but when he discovered track, the road to Division 1 got a lot smoother.

Ventura, who will run at the University of Connecticut next year, won the Group 1 100 and 400 meter races at the first day of the state sectional championships, which returned to Clifton Stadium for the first time in 18 years, and in the process ran season's best times of 11.19 and 49.39, respectively.

"Earlier in the year, I was coming into some meets without the right mental attitude, but we were working on so many different things to get ready for states," said Ventura. "I ran the 800 a few times, which I'd never done before and I didn't work much on my jumping."

But Ventura kept working hard and had a breakthrough race in winning the

400 at the Bergen Meet of Champions a week ago.

"My time was good not great that night but I finished the race strong for the first time all year," he said.

As the Cougars battle Saddle Brook and Boonton in an attempt to win their first title since 1998, Ventura will prepare to run the 200 and long ump today at 9 a.m.

"It's an important day and we want to win this title," he said.

Passaic isn't really in the hunt for a Group 4 team title, although the Indians

Cresskill ends drought with boys sectional title

CLIFTON -- If Rich Miller ever retires as the Cresskill boys track coach, the name Wellington Ventura will be at or near the top of his list of great Cougar

But Miller, whose team captured its first sectional title since 1998 Saturday was clear that even though the Connecticut-bound senior finished off one of the all-time great sectional meets with dominating wins in the 200 and long jump Saturday to add to his 100 and 400 wins Friday, the Cougars North I, Group I title wasn't only about his superstar.

"Wellington Ventura is going to go down as of the best athletes we've ever had in Cresskill, but he didn't win the meet for us, he gave us the opportunity to win the meet," said Miller, who is finishing his 50th year of coaching at Cresskill and 38th as the head coach.

"We have a great team and we covered nearly event event," said Miller, whose team held off Saddle Brook, 88-75, scoring in 13 of the 18 events."Each one of the guys on the team went after it and that's why we're sectional champions, even those who didn't score."

Like Jae Won Cho, who placed fifth in

Like Jae Won Cho, who placed fifth in the 100 hurdles and fourth in the intermediate hurdles, and who took up the sport because his mother had been a hurdle champion in her native Korea. Cho also ran on the winning 4-x-100 and third place 4-x-400 relays.

Or George Sikoryak, the senior basketball player, who transferred back from Bergen Catholic after his sophomore year and had never even tried track and field until teammate Evan Milionis finally convinced him to join for his final season. Sikoryak was 6th in the 200 and 400, and had legs on both short relays as well.

Or Dan Castano, who was second in the triple jump and sixth in the long jump, the former with a nearly two foot PR.

Or Milionis, the prime recruiter for

the team, who convinced Ventura and Sikoryak and several others to join the Cougars track team over the years even though his preferred sport is soccer. Milionis, unfortunately suffered a hip injury that kept him out most of the season, and forced him out of the 110 hurdles final after he had run a personal best for fourth in the trials.

"These kids are what team is about, and why it's always such a pleasure to coach them," said Miller. Luis Peralta of Passaic had his own

Luis Peralta of Passaic had his own memorable sectional meet, breaking not only a North 1, Group 4 sectional mark in the 800, but running the fastest 800 ever in any sectional, a sizzling 1:50.89. Peralta also won the 400 on Priday.

Despite his individual success, the Indian junior called Friday's win and Passaic County record in the 4-x-800, his favorite race of the meet.

"We didn't have a 4-x-800 team last year but the rest of the team worked so hard to have one this year and to get better that it really motivated me to run fast," said Peralta, who split 1:51.5 on the anchor Friday, and then split 47.9 to take silver in the 4-x-400 to end the meet Saturday. "I want to run 1:47 or 1:48 (in the 800)," said Peralta, who is aiming for the state record of 1:48.2 set by former Olympian John Marshall in 1981. "That's going to happen. But running with my team is the best thise."

Ridgewood's boys, led by game performances by jumper/hurdler Max Bartlik and sprinter Matt Tai, came up just short of West Orange in an attempt for an eighth title in nine years in Group 4, losing to the Mountaineers, 59-54.

Bartlik won the triple jump and took second in the high jump Friday, but got caught in a squeeze between the long jump and 110 hurdles final Saturday and managed only one point, while Tai, who had struggled with leg injuries all year, managed to grab a fifth in the 200 and ran a leg on the fifth-place 4-x-400 team 40 minutes later.
