TIFFANY BAUTISTA. Paramus Catholic, junior jumper: Already one of the most versatile and talented jumpers in North Jersey history, she won last year's Non-Public A and Bergen high jump titles, tied for 6th in the State Meet of Champs and was 5th in the Eastern States. She already ranks in the top 10 indoors in the high and long jump and is 14th in the triple jump.

LILLY BROWN, Lakeland, senior pole vaulter: The two-time Passaic County indoor champion, she won the Big North Independence meet last winter, and was second in both the North 1 group 2 sectional and the Coach Glynn Holiday Carnival, the latter with a leap of 11-9, her personal best. She qualified for the State Meet of Champions.

LAUREN CHAMBERLIN, Ramsey, senior multi-events: The girl with the blue lips at track meets (ask her: it's a candy superstition) hopes her injuries are behind her. She won the Bergen County pentathlon, scoring 2,805 points and helped the Rams to the small schools Bergen relays titles with four medal performances, including two golds. She also won the 2016-17 girls State group 2 high jump title.

NICOLE LESTER, Ridgewood, senior pole vault: The two-time state Group 4 state champion just missed a medal at the State Meet of Champions, finishing 9th. She also won last year's Big North Freedom and state sectional meets and teamed with the now graduated Maxine Earl to set a Bergen County record in the two-girl pole vault that clinched the

Bergen Relays large schools relays.

DAISY LILJEGREN, Northern Highlands, sophomore distance runner: In-juries and illness kept her from the cross-country season she wanted, but most forget she was the top distance runner last winter for the Highlanders winning the Coach Glynn and sectional 3,200 races and taking second in the state group 3 and Big North freedom 3,200s, before finishing 12th in the SMOC 3,200.

ALENYS MORALES, Clifton, senior multi events: The talented sprinter/ jumper/hurdler won the 200, long jump and 55 hurdles at the Big North Liberty and Passaic County championships among more than 15 medal winning performances. She also took second in the group 4 sectional high hurdles and figures to be one of the best hurdlers in the state this winter.

CAROLINE O'SULLIVAN, NV/Old

Tappan, senior middle distance runner: The University of Pennylvania commit has three indoor group 3 state titles, including winning both the 800 and 1,600 last winter and ran the eighth fastest 1,000 meter time in winning the event at the Bergen championships. She also won the 800 and 1,600 at sectionals, and sits eighth on the all-time Bergen 800 list and 13th at 1,600 meters going into the season

MELISSA PURCELL, Pascack Valley,

senior pole vaulter: The Northeastern commit had a truncated winter season last year after an early season foot injury cost her a month and a half of training. She was third in the sectionals but didn't compete at states after reinjuring her foot. Her best performance last year was an indoor PR of 11-6 while taking sixth at the Varsity Classic, but she's made 12-6 outdoors.

LAUREN STERN, Mahwah, senior hurdler/jumper: Versatile athletes who's also an excellent tennis player, she won the 55 hurdles, long and triple jumps at the Big North Patriot meet last winter, and placed in all three events at 4 major meets including the Bergen

Muccio, Hrbek score impressive wins

Katherine Muccio and Tyler Hrbek didn't play a fall sport, but that doesn't mean the two athletes weren't active during the first three months of the 2017-2018 scholastic season.

Muccio worked out with her Ridgewood sprint teammates under the direction of former Ridgewood sprint star Dusty Thomas, while Hrbek spent his fall like he spends much of his free time throughout the year at the Barn in Warwick, N.Y., the famous pole vault club.

The preseason work had apparently paid off for both, as their early season performance at Monday's Spiked Shoe Holiday Festival at the Armory Track Center showed.

Muccio won both the 55 meters and 200 meters by significant margins, while Hrbek handed his NV/Old Tappan teammate, Seth Kricheff, his first loss against New Jersey indoor competition since the end of the 2016 season in the pole vault while recording his second personal best in two meets.

pleased with my first meet," said Muccio, a junior, who won the 55 in a hand-timed 6.9 seconds, only the third time in Bergen County history that any girl had re-corded that time.


The time equates to a fully automatic time of seconds, 7.14 which would be nearly three tenths of a second faster than she ran last year en route to a sixth place finish in the tough Group 4 state race. She then won the 200 meters by more than half a second in 25.6, a top 10 time in Bergen County history.

Before Monday night, the last time Muccio had raced on the track was at June's National last Scholastic outdoor meet, when she was disqualified in her best event, the 400 hurdles, for reasons she's still not sure of.

For Hrbek, his firstever clearance of 14-6 and upset of Kricheff, came three days after he had cleared 14 feet in scholastic competition for the first time at the Tim St. Lawrence Invitational, also at the Armory. And Monday's vault came at the end of an unusually busy night for the senior.

"This was the first time I long jumped and high jumped before I vaulted," said Hrbek, who long jumped a personal best 19-8 and high jumped a disappointing 5-6 before turning to his favorite event. "I was a little tired before I vaulted but I was confident anyway."

North Jersey teams ran, jumped, threw, hurdled and vaulted in seven meets between Dec. 22 and Dec. 30, in addition to the Coach Glynn Holiday Carnival on Dec. 28.

The biggest splash came at the NJCTC Relays held at the Armory Track Center on Dec. 28. The Paramus Catholic triple jump duo of juniors Tiffany Bautista and Isabelle Dely broke the Bergen County two-girl record of 72-3 by nearly two feet in winning the event.

Bautista jumped a personal best of 37-8½, second in New Jersey this winter and the seventh best performance in Bergen County history, and Dely went a personal best of 36-5, a 17-inch personal best to set the record. Bautista went 17-6½ and teammate Kennedee Cox 16-7 as PC also won the long jump with a

Bautista proves she belongs with elite regional jumpers

Tiffany Bautista is perhaps the best jumper in the state of New Jersey if you combine the high, long and triple jumps and the Paramus Catholic junior showed why Saturday at the Freedom Games at Ocean Breeze Athletic Complex in Staten Island.

Bautista jumped a state leading 18-5 1/4, seventh best jump in Bergen County indoor history to win the long jump at the major invitational meet and added thirds in both the high jump (5-2) and triple jump (37-4). Bautista ranks second in the state this winter in the high jump and is tied for seventh among high iumpers.

Teaneck's Zia Barr was fourth in the triple with a seasonal best 36-0 1/2, while PC's Isabelle Dely was third in the 55 hurdles with a time of 8.42, just .01 off her own personal best. Teaneck's Miguel Sosa was sixth in the boys 600, running 1:28.61 and was part of the sixth place Teaneck 4-x-400 relay in 3:36.30.

North Jersey athletes earned nine medals and had other fine performances at the U.S. Army Hispanic Games, held at the Armory Track Center Saturday.

Lauren Stern of Mahwah was second in the triple jump with a leap of 37-3 and also made the 55 hurdle finals. North Bergen's Wilson Reynoso was second in the boys mile steeplechase invitational in 4:56.12.

Third place finishes went to Sydney Woods of NV/ Demarest in the girls pole vault (11-7) and Paterson's Jeron Jordan, who runs for St. Benedict's in the invitational 2 mile in 9:30.54.

Hank Anderson of Indian Hills (5th, 55 hurdles, 7.81) and Liam Landau of Pacack Hills (6th, pole vault, 13-6) won boys medals while Monica Hebner of Northern Highlands (6th, varsity mile, 5:21.74), Kai Lash of Pascack Hills (4th, varsity 400, 60.76) and Melissa Purcell of Pascack Valley (6th, pole vault, 11-0) took girls honors.

Bautista impresses as sprinter

STATEN ISLAND – It isn't enough that Tiffany Bautista is a great long, high and triple jumper. Now the Paramus Catholic junior has added the 55 meter dash to her impressive arsenal.

Monday, Bautista defeated Holy Angels sophomore Maris Rodriguez in the second fastest sprint time in North Jersey this year, sizzling to a 7.52 win in the Big North United meet at Ocean Breeze Athletic Complex. She used a great start and the same strong leg action that helped her win her three jumps, including a state leading (and personal best) 38-11 in the triple jump, fourth best in Bergen County history and ninth best in the nation this winter.

"On my last triple jump I just drove my knee higher and it went the way I wanted it to," said Bautista, who added more than a foot to her indoor best and moved II inches ahead of previous state leader Samantha Lopes of Wallkill Valley.

Her jump was the best indoor jump by a Bergen

County girl since Consandria Walker, head coach at UMass Boston, jumped 39-3 in 2004. But it was the sprint that turned heads Monday.

"I never ran the race indoors before, although I ran on a 4-x-200 last week," said Bautista, who has a meter lead on Rodriguez early and held on. "The coaches told me to get out well and be patient and that's good advice in all my events."

Bautista also won the United long jump (18-1½) and high jump (5-4), and was the only quad winner of the meet, which included the Freedom and Liberty Divisions.

Ridgewood (Freedom), and Clifton (Liberty) swept the boys and girls team titles and the Bergen Catholic and Paramus Catholic girls easily got the United crowns.

Sprinters dominated, including an impressive 200-400 Liberty double by Clifton's Alenys Morales in personal bests of 26.36 and 60.46 seconds, and a terrific triple by Ridgewood's Katherine Muccio in the 55-200 and 55 hurdles, running a North Jersey leading time of 7.35.

"I feel like I'm running faster because I'm working harder," said Muccio, whose 7.35 time is already .06 of a second faster than she ran last winter. "Coach Sal (assistant coach Josh Saladino) is pushing me to get out in all my races and I even feel more comfortable running the short hurdles which I didn't do last winter."

Bergen Catholic star running back Rahmir Johnson showed he has the speed to win a state sprints sprints. The junior, who has football scholarship offers from Nebraska, Maryland and Rutgers, ran the second fastest time in the state this year in winning the United 200 (22.10) while running a season best of 6.59 in winning the 55.

Bergen Indoor Relays is marathon for athletes

The Bergen Indoor Relays might be the most difficult meet of the year for versatile track and field athletes. Unlike the outdoor Jack Yockers Bergen County Relays, it's a one-day, four-hour meet, so there's no rest for the weary.

Seth Kricheff of NV/Old Tappan and Katherine Muccio of Ridgewood were worthy winners of the annual Alan Wedemeier and Lou Molino Awards, respectively as the top performers at the meet. Yet, there were many other nominated performers, all of whom would have been just as worthy winners.

Among the boys, junior Will Baginski of Ridgewood led his team to wins in the 4-x-1,600 and sprint medley, the latter in a stunning 1:55.3 800 split, and ran a 50.5 split on the Maroons runner-up 4-x-400 team.

Bergen Catholic junior Braedon Fiumer an a 4:31.2 on the Crusaders' winning 4-x-1,600 team, ran a 3:17.9 leadoff 1,200 on the distance medley and ran a solid leg on the 4-x-400.

Liam Landau of Pascack Hills, another junior, didn't even compete in his best event, the pole vault, but had top five small school jumps in the high (95-8), long (20-4) and triple (41-6) while running a leg on the shuttle hurdles.

Josh Munoz of NV/Demarest split 1:57.8 on its winning 4-x-800 team, split 3:15 for 1,200 on the winning DMR and ran a 51.9 400 split on the 4-x-400.

Junior Stephen Shields of Bergen Tech had top five large school performances in the long (20-3) and triple (42-8) jumps.

Among the girls, Tiffany Bautista of Paramus Catholic had another spectacular meet, with the top long (17-9) and triple jump (37-8) of the meet. She also cleared 5 feet in the high jump and ran a leg on PC's North Jersey-leading 4-x-200 relay team.

Lauren Chamberlin of Ramsey is the defending champion in the Bergen County girls pentathlon, and she showed her versatility by going 5 feet in the high jump, throwing the shot 30-2, and running legs on Ramsey's winning 4-x-200 and shuttle hurdle teams. She'd have long jumped too, but she's limited to four events.

Tara Lyons led Holy Angels to wins in the 4-x-800 and sprint medley with 2:26 800 legs and ran 62.7 on the 4x-400 team.

Oops: Apologies to River Dell thrower Laura Rizik, who committed to Division 1 Bryant University in Rhode Island, not Division 2 Bentley University in Massachusetts. Rizik led all girls small-school throwers at the Bergen relays, throwing 34 feet 5 ½ inches.

The week ahead: The Passaic Coun-

ty Championships at Ocean Breeze on Monday, Jan. 29 is the highlight of the upcoming week for North Jersey teams.

Kennedy's boys and Passaic Tech's girls are the defending champions, with Tech going for a fifth straight girls title. But Clifton, which won the boys and girls titles at the Big North Liberty meet on Jan. 15, will try to win both titles in the same year for the first time since 1998.

Defending champions scheduled to compete include Passaic's Luis Peralta (400) and Clifton's Kevin Heredia (800 and 1,600), with the area's top track rivalry potentially continuing in the 800. They are the only boys returning, but the girls feature five returnees, including triple defender Alenys Morales of Clifton (200/55 HH/long jump), Nicole Bertollo of Hawthorne (400), Carly Spinnler of Passaic Tech (800), Ashley Martinez of Passaic Tech (high jump) and Lilly Brown of Lakeland (two-time pole vault).

Fast relay times at Varsity Classic for Ridgewood, others

NEW YORK – The Varsity Classic has always been known as a place to run fast relays and put up times to qualify for both the Indoor Nationals in March and Penn Relays in April.

And Wednesday night was no excep-

The Ridgewood girls and Northern Valley/Demarest boys qualified for Penn with season leading times in the 4-x-800 relay and the Ridgewood boys earned a probable invite to the more exclusive distance medley even though none of the three teams earned gold medals at the very strong meet.

Junior Will Baginski of Ridgewood ran a splendid 4:16.2 1,600 anchor leg and battled perennial national contender Christian Brothers Academy to the finish line before falling, 10:22.01 to 10:22.45.

The team of Sid Wagh, Matt Tai, Ben Zamboldi and Baginski ran the seventh fastest time in the country this year and the No. 6 time in indoor Bergen County history.

"Sid had a great leadoff leg for us and the other guys gave me a chance to run well," said Baginski. "I think I'm going to be able to run much faster as the season gets to the end and I'm excited to race sectionals."

The Ridgewood girls got a boost from new leadoff leg Katherine Muccio, who had taken second in the 55 meter dash in 7.23 earlier in the meet.

She ran 2:22.0 and with Virginia Morley, Evelyn Kotch and Meghan Adams all running between 2:20.8 and 2:23.8, battled defending state and national champion Ridge all the way to the line, finishing second in 9:28.81, third in New jersey this and No. 5 all-time in Bergen County history.

"She just shows us so much every time she steps on the track and I think it motivates the other girls," said Ridgewood coach Patrick Ryan.

Northern Valley/Demarest finally broke the long standing school record in the boys 4-x-800, clocking 8:04.48, with second leg Tim Larsen splitting 1:59.2 and anchor Josh Munoz going 1:56.9. Meanwhile in individual events...

Luis Peralta of Passaic hadn't run an 800 all winter, concentrating on the 200 and 400 races and even running a 55 at Passaic Counties last week.

But he blew out a huge indoor PR of 1:54.96 from the second heat, just .18 from the state lead and setting up a great showdown at Saturday's group 4 sectional with Baginski and Clifton's Kevin Heredia.

There are only 16 days left in the 2017-18 indoor track season. The final stretch begins Friday when the North 2, Groups 1 and 4 kick off the second weekend of sectional championships at the Bennett Center bubble in Toms River.

Rutherford, Lyndhurst and Secaucus are among six North Jersey schools in the Group 1 meet Friday, with Jenna Rogers making her indoor state debut for Rutherford in her first visit to Bennett Center. It's also the first year for Lyndhurst indoor track, and it should advance several athletes to the state group championships, Feb. 16-17.

Saturday, the North 1, Group 1 and 4 teams get their shot with the Ridgewood boys in Group 4 the only defending champ. The Maroons could win again, but Glen Rock and Hasbrouck Heights boys and girls could be contenders in Group 1 while the Park Ridge girls will play a role in who wins the meet. North Jersey defending champs include Jake Cooper of Emerson (Group 1800), Kevin Heredia of Clifton (Group 4 800), two-time defender Carly Spinnler of Passaic Tech (Group 4 800) and Nicole Lester of Ridgewood (Group 4 pole vault).

Ridgewood sweeps North 1, Group 4 sectional meet

TOMS RIVER — Everything seemed to go right for the Ridgewood girls at the North 1 Group 4 sectional meet on Saturday at Bennett Center while the boys seemed to have nothing work at the same time.

But both Maroon teams managed to win state sectional titles at the meet, the girls with a dominating 90-71 win over defending champion Randolph and the boys with a shaky but ultimately satisfying 48-38 win over Memorial of West New York.

It marked the second time in three years that Ridgewood had swept and the first time ever that Bergen County teams had swept the four group 1 and 4 sectional team titles indoors.

The girls took advantage of an early false start by a co-favorite in the 400 to go 1-3 in the meet's opening event with juniors Katherine Muccio and Victoria Purritano grabbing the spots, but it was the eye-opening kicks by junior Cassie Keyes and senior Meghan Adams for second and third in the 1,600 that set the tone for the day.

It enabled the Maroons to break even in the event with Randolph despite a 1-4 finish by the Rams. Ran-

dolph went 1-2 in the high jump as expected, but even there the Maroons grabbed six points behind Ellie and Lizzie Veenhof who finished 4-5.

Muccio and fellow junior Virginia Morley went 3-5 in the hurdles, unexpectedly outscoring Randolph again in the event and then came the hammer.

Passaic Tech's Carly Spinnler won the 800 for third straight year with a diving finish to beat Ridgewood's Evelyn Kotch but the Maroons with Morley and Adams followed in third and fourth as Randolph was shut out.

Halfway through the meet Ridgewood had a 25 point lead and its victory seemed secure.

"From the time we got here as freshmen, we all knew each other from a distance even though some of us went George Washington Middle School and others went to Ben Franklin," said Morley as she watched her team wrap up the win with a winning 4-x-400 performance, anchored by Muccio, who also won the 55 and set a sectional record.

"When we started running track in high school, we just bonded together and the bonds are why we've done so well."

Ridgewood scored in each of the 10 girls events, even though it suffered a setback when two-time state group champ Nicole Lester, just off a bad case of the flu no-heighted in the pole vault.

While the girls' win was a thing of beauty, the boys' win was a slog. Only shot putter Austin Engelhardt scored a victory, and that was unexpected as Englehardt had not won a meet this winter and hadn't broken 45 feet until a big series at the Varsity Classic Monday.

"I was having trouble pulling through and finishing my throws," said Englehardt, who threw 48-2 1/2 to beat Clifton's Sonny Ruiz by less than three inches. "It finally came together Monday and continued today."

Ridgewood trailed for most of the meet as Clifton got off to a hot start. But the Maroons picked away with Matt Tai taking a fifth in the 400 and a sixth in the 55 despite a balky leg that kept him out of the relay. Will Baginski and Sid Wagh went 2-4 in the 1,600 but Baginski was beaten by a strong finish by Memorial's Francis Martingale. Danilo Romero got fourth in the high jump and Baginski was third in the 800. Tai's sixth place in the finish finally brought the Maroons even.

"We needed a big race in the 3,200 and we got two," said a relieved Patrick Ryan, the Ridgewood coach. Ryan Fahey was third in a big PR of 9:49.69 and Wagh came back in fourth in 9:51.13 to open an eight point lead on Memorial, which went 1-2 in the event, but didn't field a relay team.

Purcell breaks county indoor vault record

Pascack Valley senior roars back from injury

NEW YORK - A year ago, Melissa Purcell just wanted to be healthy.

She didn't even vault at last year's Ber-gen County championships and didn't even qualify for the indoor state Meet of Champions after a series of ankle injuries destroyed her winter season, placing her vaulting future in doubt.

Fortunately for the Pascack Valley senior, time heals all wounds. It did for her as Purcell previously won the outdoor Group 3 championship and was fourth in the state Meet of Champions with a Bergen County record-tying mark of 12-6.


Wednesday, Purcell set the indoor Bergen County record, clearing 12-6½, a half-inch better than previous recordholder Michelle Rubinetti made a year ago and won the county title at the Armory Track Center.

"Last winter was so depressing be-cause I couldn't get healthy," said Purcell, who was all smiles after clearing the record height on her second attempt and just missing 12-8, which would have moved her into the No. 1 spot in New Jersey this winter. "Then I had a great spring, but at the beginning of indoors, I was putting too much pressure on myself to do well and I had a terrible start.

But instead of giving up, Purcell and coach Tim Wilson went back to the drawing board, worked on technique and fundamentals and rebuilt her form.

'Now it feels like fun again," said Purcell. "I can't wait for (states) Saturday."

As it has been all year, the pole vault is perhaps the best overall event in Bergen County, as the NV/Old Tappan duo of Seth Kricheff and Tyler Hrbek continued

Dwight Morrow's Quanzie Lumsden, who missed the state sectionals 10 days ago with an untimely illness that forced him into Englewood Hospital, came back

and swept the 55 and 200 on Wednesday night, the latter event in a personal best 22.1 seconds.

"I tried to fight through the illness, but my parents told me I needed to go the hospital, so I went," said Lumsden who has committed to play football at Coffey ville Junior College in Kansas and could also run track. "My goal for tonight was to leave it on the line and I think I did."

TOMS RIVER – Park Ridge coach Mike Farrell went home Saturday from the state Group 1 and 4 state championships with a set of certificates attesting to the runner-up team finish by the Owls behind Group 1 state champ Highland Park

The package of 20 seemed like overkill to Farrell, who admitted "we only have eight girls out for winter and only four are here."

But those four girls nearly brought a gold state group title home.

The Owls grabbed the early lead after two events as Megan Gasnick took third in the 400 and Samantha Green had a huge personal best in the 1,600, running 5:12.84 for second

And surprisingly, with just the relay to go, the Owls were still first after Green impressively took the 800. But in the end Park Ridge came up five points short of the trophy but left pleased with their overall performance.

"The two girls who didn't score, (Alli Uhl in the 400 and Sarah Geormaneanu in the 800) had seasonal bests," said Farrell. "And what can you say about Sam and Megan?"

Green, who won the Group 1 state cross-country title and then left basketball to run indoors, finally is at peace with her decision to run full-time although she admits

that running twice as many laps indoors as outdoors for the same distance takes getting used to.

"I didn't make the connection right away and I was annoyed early in the year that my mile (1,600) times weren't coming down," said Green, who won the 800 in 2:22.03, reversing a sectional loss to Verona's Kathleen Ashley. "But I'm really with the way everything has gone this winter."

Gasnick ran 58.73 for third in the 400, but was disappointed to finish behind Kayleigh Furth of Newton and Butler's Rebecca Kneppel, who she had defeated last week at sectionals.

Pentathion leads to state gold

For the second straight session, two North Jersey athletes who competed in Wednesday's Bergen County pentathlon, won gold medals at the state meet.

Of course, for Jenna Rogers of Rutherford, the runner-up in the pentathlon, her victory in the Group 1 high jump was pretty routine.

She came into the competition at 5-4, cleared it and then made 5-6 on her first attempt to eliminate Kenady Wilson of Willingboro. She took one attempt at a group record 5-9 but then stopped.

"I'm starting to feel tired because this is a long season," said Rogers, who still has Eastern States on Tuesday, State Meet of Champions on Feb. 24 and the Nationals next month. "I want to be national champ again and I have to get back to training hard and getting some rest."

That's not the issue for Hasbrouck Heights senior Monika Lucic, who won the pentathlon Wednesday with a brilliant final event 2:23.4800, a five second best and then won the Group 155 hurdles, running 8.93, for her second personal best of the day.

"I'm so pumped and excited for spring, and this just makes it even better," said Lucic, who also placed in the high jump and ran on the 4-x-400 team that just missed qualifying for the Meet of Champs."

Maybe a better team?

Ridgewood finished eighth in the Group 4 girls standings with 14 1/2, but the Maroons, who easily won the North 1, Group 4 championship over Randolph, scored in two more events than the victorious Rams did in winning the state title Saturday and in three more events than any other team in the group.

Katherine Muccio took fourth in both the 400 and 55 runs, while Virginia Morley took sixth from the unseeded heat of the 800 with a PR 2:19.73.

Cassie Keyes was fifth in the 1,600 with a PR 5:11.83, while Lexi Uzoaru took fourth in the shot and Ellie Veenhof tied for 5th in the high jump. Only Uzoaru graduates from this stellar group.

Outlook: The Maroons and Golden Hawks have solid chances to take medals here and even contend with Union Catholic and Ridge, the favorites. Indian Hills has a chance to grab a medal by making the top eight.

Outlook: Butler's Rebecca Kneppel and Park Ridge's Megan Gasnick have the best chances to earn medals in this wide open race with five runners under 58 seconds in last week's group meets.

1,600

North Jersey seeds: Caroline O'Sullivan, NV/Old Tappan (1)

Outlook: If O'Sullivan can come close to duplicating her race of last weekend, she could be the first North Jersey girl in 25 years to win the title. Madison Brand of Middletown South and Abby Loveys of Randolph are the closest contenders. Cassie Keyes of Ridgewood and Samantha Green of

Park Ridge are medal contenders.

55 hurdles

North Jersey seeds: Isabelle Dely, Paramus Catholic (2); Grace O'Shea, Ramapo (6); Mariah Fede, Paramus Catholic (8).

Outlook: North Jersey has never had two medalists in the same year in this event since the Girls Meets of Champs started in 1979 but this year there could be three. Claudine Smith of Atlantic City is the favorite and Dely could be in the mix for gold. O'Shea gets better with every race and Fede can medal if she has a clean race.

55 meters

Outlook: With Katherine Muccio of Ridgewood probably in the 4-x-800 and 200 instead of this race, medal chances defend on big races by Kneppel and Group 2 runner-up Nicole Vadon of Pascack Hills. Phillipsburg's Sydney Hawkins is the favorite.

800

Outlook: Defending champion Victoria Van Riele of Governor Livingston is four seconds better than anyone in the race. Potential local contenders have chosen other events leaving the chances for a medal bare.

200

North Jersey seeds: Fede (4); Alenys Morales, Clifton (6); Katherine Muccio, Ridgewood (8).

Outlook: The one-lap race has the reputation for upsets and this year may be no different. Shanelle Colmon of East Brunswick is the top seed.

Outlook: Of course, Rogers, the co-US leader and outdoor champion is the favorite in this event, but it's not an easy road with defending outdoor state champ Abrianna Barrett of Montgomery and Tierra Hooker of Timber Creek (who's cleared 5-10 this winter) also in the field. No North Jersey high jumper has won since 1999.

Pole vault

North Jersey seeds: Melissa Purcell, Pascack Valley (2); Sydney Woods, NV/ Demarest (t-3).

Outlook: North Jersey girls have scored multiple medals in each of the last four meets and if form holds this should be the fifth straight year. There are nine girls in the field that have cleared at least 11-6 this winter. Look for a 12 foot clearance on the first attempt to provide the gold.

North Jersey seed: Ramapo (7)

Outlook: It's a two-team race between Union Catholic and Winslow Township for the gold. Ramapo looks to become North Jersey's first medalist in the event since 1996.

Peralta, Hrbek win at State Meet of Champions

TOMS RIVER – Luis Peralta and Tyler Hrbek made history at the Boys Indoor Track State Meet of Champions at the Bennett Center and it was not just because each won a state title.

Peralta, a junior from Passaic, became his school's first indoor boys champion when he overtook Atharv Kulkarni of West Windsor Plainsboro North and Damien Dilcher of Brick Township with a ferocious finish over the final 100 meters to take the 800-meter title in a personal indoor best 1:54.54.

Thirty minutes after the rest of the meet ended, Hrbek became the first boy to dethrone a teammate who had won the Meet of Champions title in any event by defeating his NV/Old Tappan classmate in the pole vault with a first attempt clearance of 15 feet, the fourth straight meet he has reached the height.

Kricheff, the 2017 champion, finished third, making 14-6. Hunterdon Central's David Bausmith made 15 feet on his third attempt to claim second.

Peralta, who led wire-to-wire to win the group 4 800 last Saturday, took a different tack this time sitting in third or fourth place for most of the race, that went out in a quick but not overly fast 56.7 for the first 400. Dilcher took the lead with a lap to go, followed by Kulkarni and Peralta. As they went down the backstretch they gapped the rest of the field and then Peralta made his move, blowing by the senior twosome and racing to a five-meter win, thrusting his fist in the air as he crossed the finish line.

"I've been thinking about this race since last summer," said Peralta. "I was not as confident to take the race out as I was last week, but I knew nobody in the race has my 200 or 400 speed so I was confident in my kick."

Peralta had expected to contend for the outdoor SMOC title last spring, but ran a poor race and finished a badly beaten tenth. "I didn't want to feel that disappointment again," said Peralta."

Kevin Heredia of Clifton took fifth place in the 800 out of the unseeded heat for the second straight after finished fourth last winter. Heredia led every step of his heat, being clocked in 1:57.49.

Hayek's win took longer on Sunday but also was crafted in disappointment. He no-heighted in last year's indoor meet and came up well short of a medal outdoors, but after a scary injury in the long jump while competing in the event at the Big North National meet on January 17, he seemed to find his way, finally making 15 feet for the first time at the Bergen County championships on February 14.

"I was afraid (that the injury) would be more lasting and more serious," said Hrbek, who still wears a support sock on his left ankle. "But when I was okay I got even more competitive and worked even harder."

Hrbek was totally happy with his day, expecting that he was now ready to clear 15-6, but did not. "But I'm really happy to be the state champ."

Pascack Hills junior Liam Landau was sixth in the pole vault, making 14 fact

Jadon Watson of Kennedy almost gave North Jersey a third champion, as he was the best jumper all day in the high jump. But a first try miss at 6-8 proved costly as A'nan Bridgett of West Windsor South, made 6-8 on his first try and although Watson had the three best tries at 6-10, he finished second because of the miss at 6-8.

North Jersey athletes also grabbed medals in the 200 (Rahmir Johnson of Bergen Catholic, 2nd), 1,600 (Will Baginski of Ridgewood, 6th), shot put (Kyle Patel of Glen Rock, 5th; Asim Greene of River Dell, 8th) and 55 hurdles (Giano Roberts of North Bergen, 7th).

Rogers, O'Shea win state meet of champions titles

TOMS RIVER — Jenna Rogers grabbed the national spotlight in the first big meet of the 2017-2018 indoor track season when she cleared a Bergen County record 5 feet 10 inches at the AT&T Hall of Fame Coaches Invitational high jump on Dec. 16 and never let it go.

Because of a series of injuries, including a stress fracture in her back last fall, Grace O'Shea of Ramapo didn't even run a 55 meter hurdle race until she won the North 1 Group 2 state sectional on February 3.

Yet both Bergen County athletes reached the same summit Saturday when they earned state titles at the Girls Meet of Champions at Bennett Center.

Rogers, the sophomore from Rutherford who was invited to jump against the nation's best at Millrose Games on the same weekend O'Shea was starting her season, cleared 5-10 on her first attempt Saturday to grab her first state crown and the first by a county girl since 1999. She then missed three attempts at a state record 6 feet½ inch,¾-inch below her outdoor best of 6-0¾, which she cleared during her run to a stunning national outdoor title in June.

"I'm so excited to win State Meet of Champions in my first indoor season," said Rogers, who played club volleyball last winter. "My jumps at 6-0 ½ weren't my best because I think I was mentally drained after making 5-10 this time."

The winning jump came moments after O'Shea had capped her incredible three week run by becoming Bergen County's first hurdles champ since 1998 and tying the county record of 8.08 seconds set just four days earlier by Paramus Catholic junior Isabelle Dely, who was second in Saturday's race in 8.14.

"I was surprised that I had the top seed in trials (8.21) but then I knew I had a real good chance to win the race," said O'Shea, who set an almost unfathomable sixth personal best in eight races at the event where improvement is measured in hundreths of seconds.

"This is the best feeling ever," said O'Shea, who probably first suffered the back injury last spring and then dealt with a hip flexor injury late in the fall which resulted in knocking her out until February 3. "Each time I ran I tried to concentrate on getting my lead leg down faster in the hurdles so I could get faster between hurdles. When I crossed the line I had a sense that I had won."

Rogers and O'Shea produced the only two wins Saturday but were far from the only top performances by North Jersey athletes who combined for 17 medals and just missed six more.

The day started with a sensational 2-4 finish by Ridgewood and River Dell respectively in the 4-x-800 relay behind defending national champion Ridge. Ridgewood, with a revamped lineup moving sprinter Katherine Muccio to second leg and Virginia Morley to anchor, stayed in the top four places from the opening gun and Morley's sprint finish grabbed second place away from

Union Catholic at the line in 9:28.95, while River Dell used freshman twins Maggie and Amanda Mircovich and veterans Kellie O'Donnell and Shannon Goria to take fourth in 9:30.70.

Two other sets of twins, the Hebners of Northern Highlands and the Barneys of Indian Hills, combined for four medals in the 3,200 meters although state cross-country champion Monica Hebner was stunned by sophomore Nicole Vanasse of Pingry, who won in state leading 10:34.49. Monica Hebner ran a personal best 10:38.39 (third best in Bergen history) while Isabel Hebner was third in 10:45.13. Corinne Barney PR'd in 5th in 10:51.01 (#12 alltime) while Madeline Barney was 7th in a personal best 11:00.71 (18th).

Tiffany Bautista of Paramus Catholic was third with a personal best 5-6 behind Rogers in the high jump, while teammate Mariah Fede earned the county's third medal in the 55 hurdles in 6th place. Nicole Vadon of Pascack Hills (5th in the 55), Megan Gasnick of Park Ridge (5th in the 400), Caroline O'Sullivan of NV/Old Tappan (7th in the 1,600) and Melissa Purcell of Pascack Valley (3rd) and Sydney Woods of NV/Demarest (5th) in the pole vault also medalled. Muccio came back in the 200 and placed 6th, the only double medal winner of the day.

Not medalling standout performances included Rebecca Kneppel of Butler, who missed ina medal in the 55 by .02 seconds and in the 400 by .14, Andrea Dubbels of Clifton who ran a two second PR of 2:20.11 in the 800 and Samantha Green of Park Ridge, who PR'd by nearly 6 seconds in the 1,600 (5:06.90) performed well on the track, while Ramsey's Kaela Monte (9th in the high jump) and Lakeland's Lilly Brown, PCT's Sydney Shannon and Holy Angels' Caroline McGann shared ninth in the pole vault at 11 feet.

Recap: Great season offered fair share of highlights

There should be a significant North Jersey presence at the New Balance Indoor Nationals at the Armory on March 9-10-11, with 50 team and individual entries already announced.

Despite that, it's time to put the winter track and field season in the books. The 2017-2018 campaign will go down as one of the most successful seasons in North Jersey history with athletes claiming 16 state group titles, third most in history, four State Meet of Champs titles, the most since 2002 and 27 total SMOC medals, second only to 2015.

State champs Luis Peralta of Passaic (800), Tyler Hrbek of NV/Old Tappan (pole vault), Jenna Rogers of Rutherford (high jump) and Grace O'Shea of Ramapo (55 hurdles) finished the year as the best in New Jersey, but it was a reflection of the overall depth of talent in the area that they were far from the only good stories this winter.

Take for instance the girls sprint duo of Nicole Vadon of Pascack Hills and Megan Gasnick of Park Ridge.

Vadon never had a bad 55 meter race all season, with a personal best of 7.27 seconds as she made the finals of the Eastern States championship out of a field of more than 100 runners and then grabbed fifth in the state Meet of Champions.

Gasnick also raced well all season, although she was disappointed when she finished third in the state Group 1 race that she entered as the top-seed. It didn't take long for her to snap back as she beat both of her group conquerors at the Meet of Champions, running fifth,

the highest finish in the event by a North Jersey girl since 2010. She finished her career ranked sixth all-time in Bergen history.

Vadon and Gasnick go to high schools about 1 ½ miles apart but have never raced against each other but next year they'll be teammates at The College of New Jersey, where they well may be part of several sprint relay teams.

Everyone knows how good the Hebner twins are and the Northern Highlands senior pair of Monica and Isabel didn't disappoint, taking 2-3 at the State Meet of Champs in the 3,200 after going 1-4 in

cross-country. And the sophomore Barney twins from Indian Hills, Corinne and Madeline keep getting better, also earning SMOC medals in the 3,200 while moving into the top 20 all-time in the event.

But now there's a third set of twins, Maggie and Amanda Mircovich of River Dell, who, as freshmen, have already made their mark with hopefully, much more to come. Amanda led all North Jersey girls in the 800, running 2:18.52 to place at the group meet while Maggie was second among freshmen in the state at 1,600 meters, running 5:11.51 to

medal at the same group meet.

And the duo combined with Shannon Goria, Eve Schoenberg and Kellie O'Donnell to produce two of the top 4x-800 times in the state this winter, earning the Golden Hawks fourth place medals at the state Meet of Champions and a spot in April's Penn Relays.

And don't forget about the boys.

Kevin Heredia's feat of medalling in the Meet of Champions 800 from an unseeded heat two years in a row is probably unprecedented, and the Clifton senior also grabbed a medal in the very tough Group 4 meet from the same disadvantage.

Ridgewood junior Will Baginski shook off a difficult sophomore year and propelled himself into the top echelon of state middle distance runners, with a series of outstanding races this winter, first with a stunning 1,600 anchor leg at the Varsity Classic distance medley and later with a pair of sub 4:20 open races at groups and Meet of Champions, the latter putting him in the top 20 in Bergen history with a full year left to run.

Shot putters Kyle Patel of Glen Rock and Asim Greene of River Dell seemed to PR every other meet and moved ateadily up the all-time Bergen County shot list, both ending up in the top 25.

And pole vaulter Liam Landau of Pascack Hills, in the shadow of the top 1-2 punch in state history in his own home county, put together a splendid season that earned him Pascack Hills' first boys state group title in more than a decade and only the second boys SMOC medal in school history.

It was quite an indoor season indeed. Outdoor track and field practice is now underway and opening day is March 31. Who else will step up this spring?
