BOYS CROSS-COUNTRY: 2019 SEASON PREVIEW

North Jersey's leading runners, teams, storylines

Runners to watch

Nathan Armstrong, Pompton Lakes junior: He began to fulfill his promise last year with a win the NJIC Meadowlands meet, was second in Passaic County and North 1, Group 1 sectional and was ninth in Group 1 state competition, qualifying for the State Meet of Champions. He should have a chance at a league-county-sectional Triple Crown this season.

Taylor Barnabic, Ridgewood senior: The top returning runner from the defending Bergen County and group 4 sectional champions hopes to step up after a junior year that included a fifth place finish in Bergen A, seventh in the group 4 sectional, 10th in the Big North Freedom and 16th in the Lou Molino Bergen Meet Of Champions.

Jesse Campoverde, Lakeland senior: He had a solid cross-country season, taking second in the Big North Independence, sixth in the state sectional group 2 race and eighth in the Passaic County meet before finishing 37th in State group 2. But his spectacular spring track season seems to indicate he's going to have a breakthrough fall season.

Bobby Hymans, Ramapo junior: He's in a similar spot to Armstrong, after an outstanding freshman year and a very good sophomore year that included a third in the tough Big North Freedom, fourth in Bergen B, fifth in the group 3 state sectional and ninth in the BMOC before taking 48th in state Group 3. He could become Ramapo's first Bergen champ since Andrew Knight in 1995.

Max McLees, Don Bosco senior: The top returnee from the perennial county contenders, he finished fourth in Bergen E, fifth in the Big North United, was 14th at BMOC and 29th in state Non-Public A competition last year and should be in a position to lead a rebuilding (for them) Don Bosco unit.

Jesus Michel, Bogota junior: Another member of a strong junior class, who enjoyed a very good spring season. For a team-by-team cross-country preview, visit NorthJersey.com

He was third in the NJIC Patriot, fourth in Bergen D and eighth in the group 1 sectional before an excellent race, finishing 12th in the BMOC and was 23rd in state Group 1. Armstrong and Michel should be contenders for the title.

Carmel Ohring, Tenafly senior: Part of the terrific 1-2 punch that propelled a much improved tiger team last year, he won the group 3 state sectional, the first Tiger boy in 40 years to do that. took second in the Big North Patriot and Bergen A meets and was 13th in the BMOC and 19th in state group 3. He could become the first Bergen County champion from Tenafly since 1963.

Storvlines to follow

Can Hasbrouck Heights become the first North Jersey Group 1 state champion in nearly 20 years?

Palisades Park completed its remarkable six year run by winning a third Group 1 state championship in 2000. Since then Kinnelon (2005-2006), Bogota (2016) and Hasbrouck Heights (2018) have finished second in the group 1 meet and the Aviators return six of the seven runners who brought home the silver medal last fall and earned a trip to the State Meet of Champions for the first time. Coach Mike Ryan's top runner from last fall, Jeremy Bailey, has graduated but the Aviators return junior Jake Porco, senior Nick Bua, soph Evan Morrow, junior Cole Sonzogni, and seniors TK Kasper and TJ Singh. The first five had a very solid 47 second gap at the Group 1 meet, and the Aviators start narrowly ahead of defending champ Haddon Heights and strong Mountain Lakes and New Providence teams.

Can Nathan Armstrong and Jesse Campoverde lead a Passaic County renaissance?

The last time Passaic County had two finishers in the top 25 at the State Meet of Champions was in 2006 when Tony Salvatore of Wayne Valley finished 16th and Nicholas Roman of Passaic Valley placed 24th. Since then only three Passaic County runners have cracked the top 25. But junior Nathan Armstrong of Pompton Lakes and senior Jesse Campoverde of Lakeland showed enough last year to convince people that the time is ripe for Passaic County to make its mark on state boys cross-country again. Armstrong was second at last year's Passaic County championship and ninth in Group 1 and should be a contender for the state group 1 title.

Campoverde wasn't quite as good, coming off a fall injury, but was spectacular in the spring, running school records of 4:23.01 in the 1,600 and 9:28.38 in the 3,200 at the state group 2 meet. He is the second-fastest returning runner in both events in group 2 competition and should have a terrific year.

Who are the best runners?

Armstrong and Campoverde are the favorites in Passaic County and perhaps are the best runners in North Jersey. But even though most of the top boys in North Jersey have graduated including North Jersey Runner of the Year Bobby Oehrlein of Indian Hills, now at Lafayette, and Passaic County champion Luis Peralta of Passaic, now at Oregon, there are several runners ready to take the next step to stardom.

The top Bergen County returnees, all of whom finished in the top 25 in the Lou Molino Bergen Meet of Champions or at the top 10 at sectional championships are seniors Nick Bua of Hasbrouck Heights, Taylor Barnabic of Ridgewood, Max McLees of Don Bosco, Stephen Ritter of Northern Highlands and Carmel Ohring of Tenafly and juniors Jesus Michel of Bogota, Donald Folk of Bergen Tech. Theo Davis of NV/Demarest and Bobby Hymans of Ramapo.

In Passaic County, there are several runners who finished in the top 15 of the Passaic County championships last year in addition to Armstrong and Campoverde. Seniors Nicholas Ortiz of Passaic and Mason Murphy of Lakeland, juniors Collin Clinton of West Milford, Josh Szabo of Clifton and Justin Langbaum and Patrick Scroble of Wayne Hills and sophomore Jacob Heredia of Clifton had excellent track seasons and should give Armstrong and Campoverde some competition.

Teams to watch

Hasbrouck Heights has a chance to become the first Group 1 team to top NorthJersey.com's end-of-season rankings, although Bogota won Bergen titles in 1959 and 1960. But it won't be easy. Two-time defending Bergen County champ Ridgewood, NV/Demarest, Northern Highlands, Don Bosco and Indian Hills appear to be the top teams in Bergen County, while Lakeland and West Milford to be the class of Passaic County. Ridgewood has won 14 Bergen titles, while Don Bosco has a record 16 titles. Indian Hills won its only title in 2016, and Northern Highlands and Demarest have never won titles.

West Milford looks for its fourth Passaic title, but first since 2007, while Lakeland has won twice, in 1969 and again in 1998. Passaic has won the last three Passaic County titles and has nine total. Clifton leads all schools with 10 boys championships.

Improved Ridgewood girls dominate in big-meet debut at Bowdoin Park Classic

Ridgewood's girls cross-country team made its 2019 major meet debut Saturday at the Bowdoin XC Classic in Wappinger Falls, N.Y., and left little doubt that it's the team to beat, not only in New Jersey, but perhaps in the Northeast region.

With sophomore Camryn Wennersten winning the biggest race of her short but outstanding career, and five of the top six runners running much faster than they did last year when Ridgewood finished fifth in the Nike Northeast Regional held at the same site, the Maroons scored an impressive 44-84-90 over Holmdel and Haddonfield, two of their presumed strongest rivals for the New Jersey State Meet of Champions title in seven weeks.

Ridgewood put six runners in the top 22 ahead of Holmdel's fifth and Haddonfield's fourth, led by Wennersten, whose 18:41.1 finish was eight seconds faster than the previous North Jersey best at the course, the 18:49.1 run by UCLA sophomore Monica Hebner of Northern Highlands in qualifying for the Nike Cross Nationals final in 2017.

"I'm very pleased and very proud of this team," said Ridgewood coach Steve Opremcak. "They followed the race plan for today and they've done an amazing job of following the plans since most of them came into the school last year. We've got a long way to go but these girls are doing everything right right now."

Wennersten finished about 25 meters ahead of Greenwich (CT) junior Mari Noble, and led her team which included sophs Lily Williams (ninth, 20:10.8), Olivia Shattuck (Ilth, 20:19.3), AnnaMarie Tretola (13th, 20:35.1), and juniors Sarah Policano (14th, 20:37.7) and Claire Hamlett (22nd, 21:06.3).

Every girl but Policano, recovering from illness that cost her most of last spring, ran at least 30 seconds faster than they did last fall.

The Ridgewood boys were eighth in a strong 30 team Varsity 2 race, finishing with 240 points. Defending regional and state champ CBA won the race.

The Ridgewood team was led by 34th place finisher Jay Boogaert in 17:36.7, but the Maroons placed all seven of its runners within a 36 second span, an extremely tight pack which should Ridgewood contend to return to the State Meet of Champions.

Wild Safari

NV/Demarest junior Theo Davis showed Saturday that he is a contender for the Lou Molino Bergen County Meet of Champions boys title by winning the Boys C race at the Six Flags Wild Safari meet held on the grounds of Great Adventure in Jackson.

Davis won by more than 50 meters over Luke Lusskin of West Morris Central, a top 50 finisher in the 2018 State Meet of Champions, running 16:18, just missing a spot on the all-meet team from the meet which featured over 150 teams and more than 1,000 runners from six states.

Bobby Hymans of Ramapo was third in the same race, running 16:29, while Indian Hills' Michael Mohr was 12th in 17:08. Indian Hills, Passaic Valley and Demarest went 5-6-7 in the team standings.

Jesse Campoverde of Lakeland was fourth(16:32), and teammate Mason Murphy sixth (17:02) in the Boys D helping the Lancers to a fifth place finish. Rich Weissenborn of Park Ridge/Emerson was 11th and Ramsey's Patrick Chambers 15th in the same race, with the Leonia boys team finishing a solid sixth.

Indian Hills retained its title in the Girls C race, 61-66 over a surprising Summit team, as the Braves put three runners in the top eight behind state favorite Julia Trethway of West Morris Central. Trethway won the race in 18:25 with Corinne Barney (second, 18:50), Allison Lounsbury (sixth, 19:44) and Madeline Barney (eighth, 19:560 leading Indian Hills. Scarlett Jekic was 13th in 20:16.

Other high North Jersey finishes in the race included Lauren Judd of Ramapo (ninth, 19:58) and Ellie Lester of NV/ Demarest (10th, 19:58). Ramapo, Demarest and Holy Angels finished 6-7-8 as a team.

Kelsey Pereira was seventh in Girls B in 20:16 leading the Red Raiders to a strong fifth place finish.

Lakeland's girls nearly stole the show in the D race leading state No. 9 Voorhees by more than 10 points through the first four finishers before falling to the Hunterdon County powers, 60-97. Soph Angelina Perez ran the second fastest girls time of the day, 18:24, and finished second in the race behind Charlotte Bednar of the Lawrenceville School, who finished 12th in the nation last fall. Fellow sophs Abigail Horevay (5th, 19:16), Caitlin Fahy (ninth, 20:44) and Faith Norell (20th, 21:19) had standout efforts. Sarah Geormaneanu of Park Ridge/Emerson (10th, 20:49) and Kaitlyn Garofalo of Ramsey (14th, 21:07) also ran well

Bergen Tech senior Shannon Clancy remained unbeaten and won her third straight major race Saturday, defeating a pair of defending county champions to win the A race at the Garret Invitational at Harret Mountain.

Maroons continue strong showing

Ridgewood girls win again at Shore Meet

Ridgewood continues to power its way through the New Jersey girls cross country season.

The Maroons scored their second straight impressive victory Saturday at the New Balance Shore Coaches Invitational at the state course at Holmdel Park, defeating the only New Jersey team to beat them a year ago.

With sophomore Camryn Wennersten running the fastest time ever run by a North Jersey runner on the Holmdel course, a stunning 17:47 to finish just five meters behind North Hunterdon senior Chloe Gonzalez, and six of the seven runners running faster than they ever had at the 5,000 meter course, Ridgewood easily defeated North Hunterdon, 49-84.

"We realize that we all can be even better than we were last year and the way we were today," said Wennersten, who shattered the previous North Jersey best set by Josette Norris of Tenafly, when she ran 18:12 en route to taking second in the State Meet of Champions. "We're all excited to see what we can do this season."

Wennersten surprised herself with her time, which was more than a minute faster than the 18:59 she ran at this race a year ago.

"We go out more confidently in the back in the first mile, pick it up and run

harder the second mile and then we can get after the last mile when it's mostly downhill," said Wennersten, who nearly caught Gonzalez with a burst down the final finishing hill.

"I didn't think I had a chance to get her but when I saw the time I was excited, but I also knew I can go faster here."

Indian Hills went 1-2-3 and was impressive in dominating girls C race for the second straight year, 30-64 over Allentown. Corinne Barney won in 19:04, just off her Holmdel best, Allison Lounsbury followed in a personal best 19:15 and Madeline Barney ran her best race at Holmdel in two years for third in 19:49. Scarlett Jekic was ninth in 20:49 and freshman Kayla O'Neill had her best race, taking 21st in 21:32.

North Jersey girls dominated that race with Lauren Judd (5th, 20:01) and Jacqueline Wilchek (19th, 21:22) leading Ramapo to a third place finish and Francesca Proto of NV/Old Tappan (10th, 20:54), Elizabeth Szambel of St. Mary's (15th, 21:12) and Kayla Jarski (18th, 21:17) also running well.

Mia Dubac of Clifton was third in the girls B race in 19:21 and Andrea Dubbels was seventh in 19:54 as the Mustangs took fifth as a team. Jessica Reilly of Northern Highlands finished 20th in 20:37.

Other top girls performances included Ellie Lester of NV/Demarest, 11th in D in 20:13 and Eliza Hoover of Holy Angels, 16th in F in 21:10.

Hasbrouck Heights, Lakeland and Ridgewood boys excel

Top ranked Ridgewood took fourth in the Boys B, behind North Hunterdon and teams from New York and Connecticut. The Maroons were led by first year junior Jay Boogaert, who was 9th in 16:44 in his first look at the Holmdel course. After the two busiest weekends of the invitational season, championship season got underway with a terrific NJIC meet at Garret Mountain on Oct. 10 with a pair of stunning upsets in the boys Meadowlands (Secaucus over Hasbrouck Heights) and Colonial (Leonia over Glen Rock), and Weehaken's first ever girls title in the Patriot Division over Bogota. In each race, the team that was undefeated in dual meets lost.

This week sees the Big North divisional meets at Darlington County Park, starting with the Freedom and Liberty on Tuesday, Oct.15, the United and American on Oct. 16 and the Patriot and Independence on Oct.

Ridgewood has won the last two Freedom boys titles and figures to make it three in a row Tuesday, as Don Bosco transfer Sean Fortunato becomes eligible and makes the No. 1 team in North Jersey even better. The Cliffside Park girls have won seven straight division titles and won the batch meet as a first step in making it eight. Mahwah and Westwood could be the teams to end that streak. Sylvie Najarian of Pascack Hills is the defending champ and should battle 2017 champ Cynthia Aguero of Fort Lee, Kelsey Pereira of Cliffside Park and Kayla Jarski of Westwood for this year's crown.

Indian Hills dominated the Patriot batch meets, the last in the series, and are favored to repeat in the boys and girls division titles. Cross-country: Dubbels, Judd pull Big North upsets

Andrea Dubbels and Lauren Judd weren't the favorites at the Big North cross-country divisional championship meets held on Oct. 15 at Darlington Park in Mahwah.

In Dubbels' case, she had finished third in the early season Liberty batch meet behind Shannon Clancy of Bergen Tech, who had not lost a race this year, and her Clifton teammate Mia Dubac, whom she hadn't beaten in eight cross-country races going back to 2017.

Judd had also been third in her early season Freedom batch meet behind two of the top runners in the state in Camryn Wennersten, of Ridgewood, and defending Bergen County champion Daisy Liljegren of Northern Highlands and just ahead of Ridgewood sophomore standouts Lily Williams, AnnaMarie Tretola and Olivia Shattuck. But Wennersten and Liljegren skipped the meet with heavy schedules and big goals in front of them and the Ridgewood trio ran the race as a workout.

That opened the door for Dubbels and Judd and they raced right through, with personal-best performances and divisional victories.

Dubbels ran a stunning 18:29, the fifth-fastest time ever run by a Passaic County runner and raced away from Clancy (18:36) and Dubac (18:45) over the final half mile to win the Liberty title

"This was a big surprise," Dubbels said. "We went step for step for the first 2½ miles, but on the second-to-last uphill, Shannon and I broke away from Mia, and on the final downhill, I was able to get away from Shannon."

"Tve had a lot of trouble finishing races in cross-country because I always had too much energy left when I was finished," Dubbels said. "(Tuesday) I finally gave it my all and I was tired."

Dubbels and Dubac led Clifton to a ninth divisional title in 10 years and third straight, 25-44 over Bergen Tech, placing five runners in the top 10, including Dubac's freshman sister Remy, who was fourth on Tuesday.

Judd realized quickly that she was in a rare position to win the race when the first mile went slower than expected, and she reacted accordingly.

"I've learned to listen to my body and be stronger mentally," said Judd, who opened up a large lead over runner-up Holly Latz of NV/Old Tappan, going on to win by 125 meters in a personal best 19:16. "Running by myself made it harder but it also motivated me to push a little more"

It also gave her added confidence for the tough races to come, starting with next weekend's Bergen County group championships.

"I know I'm good enough to go against these girls," Judd said. "This helped."

Ridgewood rested Wennersten and Claire Hamlett and lost Anna Dort for the season with a stress fracture, in addition to holding back the others, but still went 3-4-5-8-13 and still easily won 32-58 over Northern Highlands, its seventh title in 10 seasons.

Clifton, Ridgewood, Heredia and Hymans win boys titles

Clifton and Ridgewood dominated the boys races as well. Jacob Heredia of Clifton held off Julius Pallero of Passaic Tech by 35 meters in the Liberty race, running 16:21, as the Mustangs won their first league meet since 2013, reversing a batch meet loss to Passaic, 35-46

46.
"The boys ran great," veteran coach
John Pontes said. "They've really come
together and jelled after we had some
setbacks in the early season. They've
become a good team."

Senior Josh Szabo missed a few weeks recovering from surgery and senior newcomer Mohammad Nidaazzi has been a revelation, finishing sixth on Tuesday. Szabo, improving with every race, was fourth. Heredia was pleased with his race, winning again after two losses at the Garret Invitational and in his first trip to Holmdel for the Shore Coaches Invitational.

"Not every race is going to be a PR," he said after coming up just short of his Darlington best of 16:15. "I went out too hard at Holmdel and I think I learned a lot from that."

"JP (Pallero) and I pushed each other a lot and that was good."

Ridgewood's top boy in the Freedom Division was fifth-place finisher Jay Boogaert in 16:33. But the Maroons packed their next six runners in the next eight places, 37 seconds behind Boogaert for an easy 42-61 win over NV/Old Tappan.

"We ran in training shoes and ran conservatively because we have a lot of big races left," said Maroons coach Patrick Ryan, who will let his team run all out next weekend. "It's been a lot of fun coaching these guys because none of them have been in the spotlight before and now they're all in it together."

Ramapo's Bobby Hymans won the race in 16:21, 15 meters ahead of Jin Woo Song of NV/Old Tappan. It was Hymans' best race of the season, but the junior knows he can do a lot more.

"The last few races I haven't been with it mentally the way I should," said Hymans. "My training has been consistent but when I get in races I stress about all kinds of things. I think that I'm getting near getting my head clearer."

Ridgewood, Heights sweep Bergen crowns

MAHWAH — History is still being written.

And for the Ridgewood girls crosscountry team, they're smack right in the middle of it.

The Maroons fired off a salvo on Saturday that reverberated through the woods at Darlington Park when they claimed a second straight Bergen County Group Championship title. It is Ridgewood's 3lst divisional or group title in the 39 years since the meet was split into multiple sections.

Operating at reduced power with three of their top seven runners resting, Ridgewood still managed to capture the Varsity A team title to easily outdistance runner-up Northern Highlands 33-70.

Five Ridgewood runners finished in the top 12 despite the absence of 2018 meet runner-up and All-State sophomore Camryn Wennersten and juniors Sarah Policano and Claire Hamlet.

The sophomore trio of Lily Williams, AnnaMarie Tretola and Olivia Shattuck, finished 3-4-5 in 19:35 and sophomore Lucia Rabolli (20:13) and senior Jules Einemer (20:43) came in ninth and 12th place respectively as the Maroons recorded a 19:56.2 average.

"We kept three of our top six runners out today. By rotating girls in and out it gives some of our other girls the opportunity to respond to a varsity situation and to test themselves," said Ridgewood coach Steve Opremcak.

"That's really important for our other kids. It's our belief, and most coaches' philosophy, to be really successful you need a core of 12 to 15 kids to train really hard the way you're supposed to in order to challenge each other to get better. You have 15 girls competing for seven spots."

The top two teams from each division on points plus two wild cards advance to the Lou Molino Bergen Meet of Champions next Saturday, Nov. 2 at Darlington Park. The wild cards will be the fastest

two teams by total five-man team time, unless a slower team finishes higher within the same division.

The top 10 individuals in each division also qualify as well as up to 10 varsity runners who don't otherwise qualify as members of a team but finish in the top 25 of their race and faster than the slowest 10th place finisher in any division.

Shannon Clancy of Bergen Tech won the Varsity A individual race in 18:39 and well ahead of second-place Holly Latz (19:13) of NV-Old Tappan. Clancy just missed eclipsing her course school record of 18:36, set at the Big North-Liberty Championships two weeks ago when she finished right behind winner Andrea Dubbels of Clifton.

"Ridgewood has a really solid team, so my plan was originally to pace with them," said Clancy, who earned her fifth win of the season.

"When I saw that no one was really going for it I decided to take the early lead and go for it. I went out pretty fast and stayed with it. This win gives me the confidence to achieve my goals and I hope to keep setting personal records. I'm happy with my overall performance."

Maroon Five

The Ridgewood boys had no trouble winning their fourth-straight group title, racing past runner-up Old Tappan 27-79 to claim the Varsity A division.

Junior Jay Boogaert (16:18), senior Aidan Sheridan (16:20) and sophomore Sean Fortunato (16:21) finished 2-3-4 and seniors Frank Orlando (16:39) and Taylor Barnabic (16:51) took eighth and 10th place respectively as the Maroons averaged a meet-best 16:29.8.

In his first season running cross country, junior Steven Hatano of NV-Old Tappan won the Varsity A race in a meet-best 16:14, smashing his previous PR by 15 seconds, set at the Big North meet two weeks ago with a third-place finish. A lifetime soccer player, Hatano made the switch from the pitch to distance running as a way to stay in shape and improve his half-mile and mile times in spring track.

Indian Hills keep up with tradition

Senior Corinne Barney of Indian Hills claimed a third-straight Varsity B title in a meet-best 18:34 and guided the Braves to a fourth-consecutive team crown.

Indian Hills placed three runners in the top five as the Braves outdistanced runner-up Ramapo 35-58.

Sophomore Allison Lounsbury (18:51) and senior Madeline Barney (19:27) finished second and fourth, while senior Scarlett Jekic (20:55) and freshman Kayla O'Neil (21:02) rounded out the scoring.

On the boys side, the Braves won a 13th divisional title in the last 17 years with a 47-56 win over NV-Demarest in Varsity B.

Indian Hills runners finished 3-4-6 as senior Michael Mohr (16:50), and juniors Jake Calviello (17:05) and Anthony Macejka (17:20) picked up the scoring.

Junior Theodore Davis of NV-Demarest was the fastest to the finish line in 16:15, just missing a meet-best by a tenth of a second.

Aviators fly high

Both Hasbrouck Heights teams won a third-consecutive Varsity D team titles.

The boys finished ahead of runnerup Bogota 20-52 as the Aviators had five runners finish in the top seven.

Sophomore Evan Morrow (16:56), senior Nick Bua (17:06), juniors Jake Porco (17:22) and Cole Sonzogni (17:33) and senior Damian Summers (17:39) finished 2-4-5-6-7.

Bogota junior Jesus Michel won the individual title in 16:46.

"This is the best boys team we've ever had, without a doubt," Hasbrouck Heights coach Mike Ryan said. "We're still very young. The program has come a long way. We're hoping to place in the top five next week for the first time. We have to keep the pack tight and together."

The Heights girls were equally impressive, finishing ahead of runner-up Saddle Brook 36-48.

Sophomore Isabella Drezek (21:00) and junior Emily Estrada (21:58) finished second and fifth, while junior Shannon Artuso (22:11) and senior Roberta LaBarbera (22:50) finished in the top 10.

"We won this meet with smoke in mirrors today," said Ryan of his girls team win. "We have so many injuries. We had to move up girls from the junior varsity and piece it together. We're doing this with some younger kids who stepped up for us today."

Cresskill senior Jacqueline Lulaj (20:05) turned in the top time to win the Varsity D individual title.

"My last meet was two weeks ago so my coach pushed me by giving me tougher workouts while motivating me to run faster," Lulaj said. "I knew I had to get out pretty fast and maintain my pace. I knew I had the lead the second time around the sand trap and I figured I had the race."

St. Mary's Szambel rides solo

Senior Elizabeth Szambel of St. Mary's captured her first group title with a winning time of 19:48 to win Group E.

Szambel, the only runner on the Gaels girls team, is the first county champion for St. Mary's since Nancy Sinclair won the Group 1 meet in 1997. Two weeks ago, Szambel won the NJIC-Meadowlands title at Garret Mountain.

"My strategy was to stay behind, but I ended up going out in second and then took the lead before the first mile," Szambel said. "I feel like I'm back on track. I'm hoping to do well in Groups and have a good time at the Meet of Champions."



Ridgewood Sweeps, Barney, Hatano Run Top Times at Bergen



The <u>Ridgewood</u> boys and girls came away with the best team performances of the day while Indian Hills senior <u>Corinne Barney</u> and Old Tappan junior <u>Steven Hatano</u> posted the fastest runs of the meet at the Bergen County Group Championships on Saturday at Darlington Park in Mahwah.

The top two teams in each division plus three wild cards qualify automatically for the Lou Molino Bergen County Meet of Champions next Saturday, also at Darlington.

The Ridgewood girls, ranked No. 1 in New Jersey, made a statement today which resounded loud and clear for the rest of the county – and for that matter, the state – to hear.

While resting three of their top seven runners – sophomore All-Stater <u>Camryn Wennersten</u> as well as juniors <u>Sarah Policano</u> and <u>Claire Hamlet</u> – the Maroons still jammed five runners into the top 12, claimed their second straight Varsity A title with a 19:56.2 average, placed first in the team merge, and had an exceptional compression of 68 seconds. They handled runner-up Northern Highlands 33-70.

Sophomores <u>Lily Williams</u>, <u>AnnaMarie Tretola</u> and <u>Olivia Shattuck</u> placed third, fourth and fifth, respectively, all with times of 19:35. Sophomore <u>Lucia Rabolli</u> was ninth (20:13) and senior <u>Jules Einemer</u> was 12th (20:43) rounded out the Ridgewood top five.

The fastest girl of the meet was Indian Hills senior <u>Corinne Barney</u>, who claimed her third straight Bergen County Varsity B title in a meet-best 18:34, five ticks faster than Varsity A winner Shannon Clancy. Barney logged her third win of the season, following wins at Shore Coaches and the Big North Patriot batch meet.

Ridgewood boys, girls sweep BMOC titles

MAHWAH — It was a mix of old and new at the Lou Molino Bergen County Cross-Country Meet of Champions on Saturday.

The Ridgewood boys and girls swept the team titles to repeat as champions, but it was the individual races that had a new look at Darlington Park.

After finishing in the runner-up spot in 2018, sophomore Camryn Wennersten captured her first county title when she crossed the finish line in 17:42, 30 seconds ahead of second place Corinne Barney (18:12) of Indian Hills.

"My original strategy was to hold back a little at the start of the race," said Wennersten, who ran the fifth fastest time in Darlington history and beat her personal record by 20 seconds. "But things didn't go according to plan. I was a bit nervous and anxious and adrenaline took over. I took an early lead and was able to stay in front."

Wennersten led a pack of Ridgewood runners, who all set personal records en route to a record-setting victory. The Maroons scored an impressive 25 points to finish 39 points better than runner-up Indian Hills (64) and smashed the five-girl course record by more than 90 seconds.

A total of five Ridgewood runners finished in the top 10, with sophomores Olivia Shattuck (18:26), AnnaMarie Tretola (18:27) and Lily Williams (18:28) finishing 4-5-6, respectively. Junior Sarah Policano (18:49) finished ninth.

"I'm happy with their performance

and they've worked really hard this season," coach Steve Opremcak said. "We're right where we want to be at this time of the year.

"Camryn ran a great race. She's very focused and determined. Everyone hit their PR's today and that's impressive."

Senior Shannon Clancy of Bergen Tech finished third in 18:15.

On the boys' side, sophomore Jin Woo Song of NV/Old Tappan stunned the field when he finished first in a PR 16:12 to become the first Golden Knight boy or girl to win an individual county title.

Song finished six seconds ahead of runner-up Aidan Sheridan (16:18) of Ridgewood to claim only his second individual title of his career. In 2018, Song finished in 34th place at the BMOC.

Ridgewood dominated the field, win-

ning its third-straight title with 30 points to finish ahead of runner-up Hackensack (II8) and third-place Hasbrouck Heights (I28).

The Maroons placed four runners in the top 10, with junior Jay Boogaert (16:20), sophomore Sean Fortunato (16:21) and senior Taylor Barnabic (16:29) going 3-4-8.

"We performed as expected. We're coming together at the right time," coach Pat Ryan said. "This is an important meet because it was in front of the entire county.

"We're a young team in terms of inexperience running behind some great runners last year. But they've learned a lot and they continue to get better. We're going to start cutting back on miles this week in preparation for the upcoming meets."

Ridgewood Sweeps, Camryn Wennersten & Jin Woo Song Win BMOC



Ridgewood boys and girls swept the team titles for the second straight year, the boys their third straight. <u>Camryn Wennersten</u> of Ridgewood and <u>Old Tappan</u>'s with <u>Jin Woo Song</u> both picked up their first cross country individual BMOC titles!

In the boys race <u>Jin Woo Song</u> wowed the crowed with his Bergen County Meet of Champions win running a course PR of 16:12. He led the way with a six second lead over the field and this is just the second individual victory of his career, the other coming during a Big North batch meet in September.

Jin Woo Song battled with the leaders early before taking sole possession of the lead about midway through the race. He was 34th at this race in 2018, a year plagued by injuries, and he's worked hard to come back stronger.

"It really means a lot to me to win the county champs," Song stated post-race, "I had been suffering a few injuries a while back and I knew I had to step up this season and it feels great to be back."

He also stated he did it for his team and his teammate Steven Hatano who fell in the pack at the start of the race, he's okay other than some bruises, and didn't finish the race.

If you move to second place you'll find <u>Aidan Sheridan</u> who ran 16:18 to start the maroon wave of Ridgewood runners who scored 30 points for their third straight BMOC victory. Ridgewood finished three in the top five and had their fourth in by eight place. <u>Jay Boogaert</u> was second at 16:20, <u>Sean Fortunato</u> fourth 16:21, <u>Taylor Barnabic</u> eighth at 16:29, and bringing in their fifth was <u>Frank Orlando</u> in 21st at 16:45.

All together they split a mere 27 seconds and averaged 16:26!

Running second as a team was <u>Hackensack</u> at 118 points followed by <u>Hasbrouck Heights</u> with 128

The girls race was led by a familiar face with <u>Camryn Wennersten</u> out front early, the star sophomore posted a red hot 17:42 holding a 30 second lead over second place <u>Corinne Barney</u> of <u>Indian Hills</u> at 18:12 and third place <u>Shannon Clancy</u> of <u>Bergen County Tech</u> running 18:15.

Wennersten's one card led a strong Ridgewood attack that saw their entire scoring five in the top ten. Eating up fourth to sixth was her teammates <u>Olivia Shattuck</u>, 18:26, <u>AnnaMarie Tretola</u>, 18:27, and <u>Lily Williams</u>, 18:28, who are all sophomores as well. Their fifth scorer was junior <u>Sarah Policano running ninth</u> with a time of 18:49.

This all came to a dominating 25 points and impressive 18:22 average. After a long season of training to get to this point the squad, and Wennersten, is excited to unload all that work during championship season. The Ridgewood girls have <u>ranked NJ#1 in our state rankings</u> <u>poll</u> since the pre-season.

Running second in the team scores was NJ#8<u>Indian Hills</u> with 64 points, <u>Northern Highlands</u> third at 115.

WOODLAND PARK — A friendly rivalry between two teammates resulted in a greater cause Saturday at the North 1 State Sectional Cross Country Championships.

Over the last few weeks, NV/Old Tappan running mates Steven Hatano and Jin Woo Song have gone back and forth at different races while motivating one another down the stretch leading into the most important time of the season.

With Song's signature win coming at last week's Bergen County Meet of Champions at Darlington Park, Hatano redeemed himself on Saturday when he captured the Section 1, Group 3 individual title at Garret Mountain.

The duo finished 1-3 and the Golden Knights captured their seventh team title and first since 2011 when they dethroned two-time defending champions Morris Hills 64-80.

"Last week was an upset for me," said

Hatano, who did not finish last week's race at Darlington Park after falling and suffering an injury early on the course. "I was focused this week and I trained smart. This win means a lot."

Hatano was clocked in 16:41 and the junior managed to pass Song (17:01)

Secaucus dominates North 2 Boys Group 1

From the opening meet of the year, the Secaucus boys team has clicked. Every step they've taken seems to be

Every step they've taken seems to be the right one and every thing they've done has worked.

The Patriots returned an outstanding trio of seniors Dan Chinchilla, Sebastian Flood and Mohammed Alobaidi and were expected to have a good chance at their second sectional title under veteran coach Stan Fryczynski.

Saturday at the Central Park of Morris County in Morris Plains, after a nearly flawless regular season, Secaucus delivered, placing six runners in the top 14 en route to a dominating 37-75 victory over McNair to get the North 2, group 1 title

"Sometimes the stars align," said Fryczynski, who scheduled a set of strong invitationals on a variety of tough courses for the Patriots. "We haven't had a bad meet all year and I think our kids haven't had a bad race individually all season."

The only setbacks came when freshman Younes Abada had to miss a race with an injury early in the season and last week when Flood missed the Hudson County championship with his own injury, which turned out to be minor.

"We did the right things by holding them out and they did the right things by doing what they had to therapy and treatment to get back quickly," said Fryczynski. "The other guys all knew that they had to keep doing their jobs in order for us to keep going."

Chinchilla was second in 17:00.9 behind race winner James Troiano of Whippany Park. Flood was sixth in 17:18.9, Abada was seventh in 17:23.5 and Alobaidi ninth in 17:40.8 on the 5,000 meter course.

Abada's senior brother Mohammed completed the scoring for Secaucus in 13th in 18:07.9 and Vishwa Naik was right behind him in 18:08.7.

"We used that depth all year and it's been a big plus," said Fryczynski. "We knew about Younes coming in and knew he would really help us. And he talked his brother the big guy in coming out for cross country for the first time so he helped us even more."

So it's on to Holmdel for the state group I race on November 16.

"It's a tough step up, but we spent a lot of this week training for next week," said Fryczynski, whose team's best finish in 21 previous group trips was eighth in 1999. "I'd like to have our best finish but we realize that we are a contender (for a State Meet of Champions berth) for more."

"I'm so proud of this team, because they've gotten the most out of what they have. There's pressure but it's nice to know we have a chance."

Other North Jersey boys advancing from the North 2 sectional were Collin Shevlin of Weehawken, third in group 1, his teammate Abdourahmane Diouf who was 10th, Rutherford's team, fifth in group 2 and Ridgefield Park junior Ezequiel Reyes, 11th in group 2.

Secaucus' joy wasn't just limited to the boys success. Freshman Haley Nowak outraced Delaney Rice of Weehawken for the third straight week and won the Patriots' first ever girls sectional title, taking the North 1, group 1 race in 20:09.5, about 15 meters ahead of Rice, who made the state meet for the second straight year.

"She's such a competitor," said Fryczynski. "We brought her along a little slowly, keeping her in freshman races to give her a chance to enjoy herself. But she's going to be special. She can open her stride and kick and she's only going to get better."

Secaucus junior Carmelina Sanci was sixth in the race and the Patriots took fifth as a team and with fourth place Weehawken will advance to the group race. In group 2, Rutherford was fourth and Mia Martinez of Ridgefield Park was 15th to advance. **CROSS COUNTRY**

tion of North Jersey will end soon.

Seniors Taylor Barnabic, Aidan Sheridan, Frank Orlando and Mason Zamboldi were part of all four major championship teams this year and Barnabic was part of his third straight Triple Crown (league, county and sectional) team.

But by the end of the year, first-year junior Jay Boogaert was the top runner on the team with sophomore Sean Fortunato not far behind.

The Maroons ran very well as a pack

but might have approached the Group 4 race too conservatively. They finished in a tight 22-second pack but came up short of a state wild card by less than two seconds a man.

Lakeland leads Passaic County renaissance

It's been 13 years since more than one Passaic County boy qualified for the

State Meet of Champions and more than 30 since a Passaic County public school team finished in the top five of a state group meet.

But those two long droughts ended this year as both Nathan Armstrong of Pompton Lakes and Passaic champion Jesse Campoverde of Lakeland finished in the top 10 of their respective group meets and the Lancers were a strong fifth in Group 2 after becoming Passaic County's first boys sectional team champion in 10 years and the first Passaic team ever to win the Group 2 sectional.

Armstrong became the first Pompton Lakes runner to qualify for consecutive State Meet of Champions and went to a strong 27th-place finish in this year's race, running 16:25 on the famed Holmdel course, the 11th fastest time ever run by a Passaic County runer and the best race by a North Jersey boy this year.

Small school success

Lakeland wasn't the only North Jersey small school to enjoy success this year. Secaucus had the best year of its long history, winning several invitational meets, upsetting Hasbrouck Heights to win the NJIC Meadowlands title, won just its second ever sectional title (in North 1 group 2) and went on to a program best sixth place finish in State Group 1.

Hasbrouck Heights didn't match its second place finish in State Group 1, but the Aviators had a second straight spectacular season, winning the North 1, group 1 sectional for the first time since 1974, and finishing third in the Bergen Meet of Champions, the top finish by a Group 1 school since Palisades Park was third in 2000.

Don Bosco, Class of 2012

Costello was a mainstay of the Don Bosco teams that reached three straight State Meet of Champions as a team and won three straight Bergen County titles, and finished first or second in state Non-Public A meets. He was fifth and third in the Non-Public A championships and 10th in the State Meet of Champions in 2011. He ranks 38th at Darlington all-time and is tied with Byrne for 11th at Holmdel. He later ran at Providence College.

Colin Daly

River Dell, Class of 2016

The best set of twins in New Jersey in the 2010s, are now running at the University of Pennsylvania. Colin shared the 2015 Bergen County title with twin brother, Will, and was third and sixth in consecutive group meets and was 15th in the State Meet of Champions.

He ranks second all-time at Darlington,

and is tied for 19th all-time at Holmdel.

Will Daly

River Dell, Class of 2016

Will had a better cross-country career than Colin, mostly because of two illtimed illnesses for Colin.

Will was eighth, second and second in group meets, was seventh and 16th in his last two State Meet of Champions races and, of course, shared the Bergen County title in 2015, in 15:09 at Darlington, just four seconds off of the course record. His 15:48 clocking at Holmdel was fifth all-time among North Jersey runners.

Mike Higgins

Don Bosco, Class of 2014

Higgins transferred from Montville after his freshman year and had a spectacular career, including three straight podium finishes at the State Meet of Champions and top five finishes at the Nike Northeast Regionals. He was eighth and second in consecutive State Non-Public A championships and sixth in the 2013

State Meet of Champions.
His 15:42 at Holmdel is a school record
and is third all-time at the state cross

and is third all-time at the state cross country course. He ran for a year at the University of North Carolina.

Kyle Levermore

Don Bosco, Class of 2014

Championships and high finishes are synonymous with Levermore, from track and cross country at Don Bosco to Oregon and Arkansas, where he was part of multiple Southeastern Conference championship teams.

He won the 2012 Bergen County Meet of Champions title and was a part of four consecutive Ironmen Bergen County champion teams. He was seventh in three consecutive Non-Public A races and finished 25th, seventh and 16th in SMOC races. He ranks 11th all-time at Darlington and tied for ninth among North Jerseyans at Holmdel.

Ben Malone

Pascack Valley, Class of 2013
Malone had the one of the greatest
years any North Jersey cross country
athlete ever had as a junior. He won the
Bergen County Meet of Champions and
Group 3, North 1 sectional titles, running 15:38 at Darlington, 16th best in
Bergen history and a Bergen County
record of 15:40 at Holmdel that still
stands.

He was the last North Jersey runner to qualify for the Foot Locker National Championship, finishing seventh at the 2010 Northeast Regional. He went on to an all-American career at Arkansas.

David Rosas

Don Bosco, Class of 2017

There have been many great runners during the long run of Don Bosco success, but Rosas is the only Ironman to win a Non-Public A title. Rosas was fourth and second in Non-Public A before winning the 2016 title and also won the Bergen Meet of Champions title. He finished 25th, 15th and fifth in consecutive State Meets of Champions. He ranks fifth all-time at Darlington and is eighth all-time at Holmdel. He now runs for Providence College.

Brendan Ungemach

Wayne Hills, Class of 2013

It's a reflection of how good Ungemach's senior season was and how good the competition was in the state that year that he ran the second fastest time ever by a Passaic County runner and 10th among all North Jersey runners but finished just 18th in the State Meet of Champs that year.
