TEAMS TO WATCH

Bergen Catholic: The Crusaders are the returning United Division champions and also won the non-public division at the Bergen County Championships. A senior heavy team, Bergen Catholic is the favorite to defend its pair of titles while also making a run at a sectional title. Senior sprinter Rahmir Johnson will play football at Nebraska next year but might prove to be the state's fastest athlete before all is said and done. Other key returners include: seniors Braedon Fiume (distance), Dean Williamson (throws), James Blair (hurdles/jumps) and Jack Welch (distance) and Ivan Jacob (high jump).

Ramapo: A well-rounded team was the highest-finishing public school at the indoor county championships. Ramapo will lean on a group of sprinters, headed by senior Max Baker while trying to win with depth across in the middle distance and distance events. Look for a strong 4x400, which ran 3:29.26 indoors. In the field, senior Michael Connor is one of the state's top returners in javelin with a personal best of 178-0

Ridgewood: Senior Will Baginski was the indoor Meet of Champions winner in the 1,600 and leads the way for a team that came up five points shy of winning a sectional title last spring. Senior Ryan Fahey is also a key returner in the distance events while senior Luke Reinke can pick up points in the hurdles and javelin.

Runners, throwers raising bar this season

Here's what we're keeping an eye on for the boys track & field season:

Athletes to watch

Will Baginski, Ridgewood senior: Baginski had a magnificent winter, winning his first state group title in the 1,600 meters and following it up with an emphatic win in the State Meet of Champions 1,600, the sixth one in North Jersey history. This spring the Dartmouth bound star hopes to become the sixth Bergen runner under 4:10 in the 1,600.

Braedon Fiume, Bergen Catholic senior: Fiume came in as a heralded freshman and has had a very good career. But the Amherst-bound middle distance looks primed for a great season after a winter that saw him nearly bring the Crusader sprint medley team to All-American status with a 1:55 800 anchor leg and a near miss for a medal at the State Meet of Champions 1,600.

Andrew Laguttuta, Glen Rock senior: Laguttuta came back from a broken foot which cut short his cross-country season to have a solid indoor season and reached the State Meet of Champions in the 1,600. William & Mary commit broke 4:20 last spring and is also a threat at 800 or 3,200 meters.

Liam Landau, Pascack Hills senior. Landau broke the Bergen County pole vault record outdoors last spring and then broke the Indoor mark en route to a State Meet of Champions title last winter. But the Northeastern commit and 15-9 pole vaulter is also a talented long jumper and hurdler too and could lead the Cowboys to sectional success.

Matt Lange, NV/Demarest senior: Lange committed to Columbia and should be one of the state's top discus throwers this spring after winning the Bergen Meet of Champions last spring and just missing the finals at the State Meet of Champions in June, he should be one of the area's top shot putters.

Connor Mathis, Don Bosco senior: It's a reflection of how good Mathis can be, that the Wake Forest signee could play basketball all winter and then enter the New Balance Indoor Nationals and have the top North Jersey shot put throw of the season. He's the top returning shot putter from last spring, taking seventh in the state Meet of Champions.

Luis Peralta, Passaic senior: He chose not to run with the school in mid-

January and did not defend his indoor state 800 meters title. But the Oregonbound Peralta is back for the spring and hopes to repeat as state and National champion. His 1:49.10 last spring is well within the all-time American high school top 75 and ranks sixth in New Jersey history. He needs to run 1:48.43 or better to set the state record.

Jason Santa Cruz, NV/Old Tappan senior: He finished fifth in the State Meet of Champions with a career best throw of 186-6, and is the top returning javelin thrower in the state. He ranks 19th among all-time Bergen County throwers and will be one of three top throwers in the area this year along with John Lee of NV/Demarest and Michael Connor of Ramapo.

Adam Stavash, Hasbrouck Heights senior: The state group I outdoor champion last spring seemed on his way to an indoor title when he suffered a back injury in late January. A healthy Stavash was sixth in the State Meet of Champions last spring and he should become North Jersey's next 15-footer. He'll vault at Lehigh next year.

Jamier Wright-Collins, Kennedy junior: The Knights have had a great recent run of high jumpers including last year's State Meet of Champions titlist, the graduated Jadon Watson, who also took second at Penn Relays last spring. But Wright-Collins could be the best of all of them. The junior was fourth in the State Meet of Champions last spring and won the State Group 4 and Eastern States titles last winter, losing the State Meet of Champions on misses at 6-8.

Storylines to watch

Middle distance excellence: North Jersey is blessed with two of the best middle distance runners in the state, if not in the nation and Passaic's Luis Peralta and Ridgewood's Will Baginski seem to end their high school careers in style. Peralta, who did compete with the Passaic team during the winter, still led the nation at 600 meters, was third at 1,000 meters and was second at the New Balance National indoors at 800 meters. He is the defending state and national 800 champion and hopes to break the state record of 1:48.44.

Baginski had a terrific winter, capping his winter with a sensational runaway win in the State Meet of Champions 1,600 in 4:12.90 and a terrific

1:53.53 800 leg on Ridgewood's 4-x-800 relay team at Eastern States. He hopes to repeat the feat this spring and become the first North Jersey boy to win the indoor and outdoor 1,600 in history.

Look for Glen Rock's Andrew Lagut-Dwight-Englewood's Bronstein and Bergen Catholic's Brae don Fiume to also contend for SMOC middle distance medals.

How high can they go?

Liam Landau of Pascack Hills had an incredible winter, adding the Bergen County indoor pole vault record of 15-9 to his outdoor record of 15-7½ last spring. He won the state Group 2 title, the State Meet of Champions and Eastern States title. All that's left in high school is to become North Jersey's first 16-footer and an outdoor Meet of Champions title.

Jamier Wright-Collins of Kennedy was almost as good in the high jump as Landau was in the pole vault. The junior won the state Group 4 title and the Eastern States, lost the State Meet of Champions on misses and looks to become North Jersey's second 7-footer before he graduates. He was fourth in the State Meet of Champions last spring.

Lots of good throwers

Connor Mathis of Don Bosco should become North Jersey's next 60-footer in the shot after throwing 59-8½ for seventh in the State Meet of Champions last year, while Jason Santa Cruz of NV/

Old Tappan might be the next 200-foot javelin thrower after throwing 186-6 for fifth at the SMOC. John Griffith of Northern Highlands just missed the SMOC discus final, finishing ninth with

a personal best throw of 161-7.

And then there are these top 15 returnees in the state: Patrick Passalac qua of NV/Old Tappan, Max Langsam of NV/Demarest and Marc Santonocito of NV/Demarest (shot); Matt Lange of NV/ Demarest and Mathis (discus) and John Lee and Calvin Hroncich of NV/Demarest, Michael Connor of Ramapo, Husaly Paredes of Fort Lee and Taylor Boorse of Lakeland (javelin).

Glynn humbled by track named in honor at PC

Mike Glynn will not need help to find his track.

"He knows how to get to his home and Paramus Catholic and Ridgewood and his place in the Poconos," laughed Glynn's longtime friend Ed Church. "But I get calls from him all the time asking for advice on how to get from one place to another."

The Bergen County track pioneer may suffer a few faults, as Church also says Glynn's handwriting is illegible, but Paramus Catholic turned its track into a certifiable landmark, naming its track complex for Glynn at a ceremony Saturday afternoon that saw athletes from across the generations come to pay tribute.

"No one is going to believe this," laughed Glynn, 74. "But I'm humbled by this. I really am. When I started out in 1966, this was not one of my goals, my goal was to win track meets and that's what we did at Paramus Catholic. I have nothing but wonderful memories of that place and all the kids I coached."

Glynn, who is from Staten Island and ran at Iona (he can still tell you his times, because, of course he can), had just graduated when he found out Paramus Catholic needed a track coach and English teacher in 1966.

Back then Paramus Catholic had a track (the second all weather track in Bergen County – St. Joseph was the first), but only a freshman and sophomore class. The school was even divided into a boys school and girls school.

With an honest, genuine style, Glynn was sometimes profane but never mean. He turned Paramus Catholic into a state power.

The school had three state champions in 1968 and kept building. The number of coaches and athletes Glynn impacted is immeasurable.

"Genuine, that's the word," said current Ridgewood boys track coach Josh Saladino. "It didn't matter if the kid wanted to hear what he had to say, he said what they needed to hear. There was a genuine love and respect that came back from the kid. He had more trust between kids and athletes then I

have ever seen."

A better-paying opportunity came along at Ridgewood to be a coach and guidance counselor in 1979. At first Glynn resisted, but he eventually took the position, and formed one of the greatest coaching duos in Bergen County history with Ridgewood girls track coach Jacob Brown.

"There are days that stick out in your life," said Brown. "Meeting Mike Glynn is one of the top five best days of my life."

Although the pair were different away from the track, Brown always slim and dapper and way ahead of the technological curve, and Glynn, well, Church describes his style as "rumpled," they were a perfect combination.

"He was a country boy from Pennsylvania and I was a city kid, but in all the years we worked together as coaches and then as co-meet directors, we never had one disagreement," said Glynn. "I don't think a school has ever been blessed with two head coaches as successful as Jacob and I have been."

"I have met two genuinely charismatic people in my life and Mike is one of them," said Brown. "He's people oriented and thank goodness he was a track guy, because he brought his abilities to our sport."

Glynn's cross-country teams won a total of 30 county and sectional titles and reached the state Meet of Champions II times

"The last race he ever coached we ran a 7:39 and change at Nationals to become All-Americans," said Saladino. "To see him that excited was just so inspiring to be around. What a way to go out."

When this reporter was named local sports columnist in 2010, my first story detailed running the course at Garret Mountain. I figured so many kids in North Jersey had done it, but so few had

actually seen it. Glynn was my first phone call and made it happen. I hope he doesn't remember my time.

Married to Lorraine for 47 years -"we met on a blind date, I took one look
and said 'Holy Christmas'" - Glynn remains connected to his sport by serving
as a meet official and director. When he
was coaching, other coaches would
reach out to Glynn and ask for advice
and he'd always help out, even if the
schools were his rivals.

More proof that Glynn was always heading in the right direction, willing to help kids.

"The most important thing....winning was important, but the relationships I had with the kids was far more important," said Glynn, 74.

"I love them and I still love them now. They would share everything with me and I would share everything with them.

"It wasn't just track. It was life."

Muccio takes big step in comeback

Katherine Muccio of Ridgewood took a huge step in her comeback from a serious ankle injury last May with three outstanding performances at the Arcadia Invitational in California this weekend.

Muccio anchored a winning shuttle hurdles performance by the Maroons Friday night, finishing off the third fastest race in Bergen County history (61.71), after Sara VandenAssem, Victoria Purritano and Virginia Morley had kept Ridgewood close. Purritano executed a perfect somersault after falling on the final hurdle to keep the race alive.

Saturday afternoon she set a Bergen County record by winning the Open 300 hurdles in 43.13, beating her county and likely state rival at 400 meters, Grace O'Shea of Ramapo, who is now #2 all-time in the county after running 44.05. They rank #4 and #6 in New Jersey history.

Then Muccio ran a 57 second 400 leg on Ridgewood's 12:10.17 distance medley team which finished 11th against some of the best teams in the country in the Invitational race. The top 11 times of the spring so far in the country came from the race.

The Ridgewood boys sprint medley team of Alex Ruhl, Ryan McKenna, Luke Reinke and Will Baginski was second in the invitational in 3:32.23, tops in New Jersey so far this year.

"We were pretty good and then we broke our school record in the 4-x-100 totally unexpectedly last spring," said senior Ed Ahn, who led off all winning four Golden Hawk sprint teams this weekend at the Jack Yockers Bergen County Relays. "We don't have that guy like Conor Davidson (who anchored the previous record-setting team from four years ago). So we go out there and all try to run our best in every meet. We work hard and we work together."

After a good winter season that saw the 4-x-400 team win all-Bergen honors, the Golden Hawks have continued to improve, and Saturday they showed how good they can be.

Ahn, Aaron Furneaux, David Gibbons. Andrew Sanchez and David

Puentes, the only junior of the group, combined to win the B division 4-x-100, 4-x-200, 4-x-400 and sprint medley races (with an 800 anchor leg by Jon

Fontana in the latter event) and lead River Dell to its first division title since 2015, 112-100 over Ramsey, with threetime defending champ NV/Demarest a distant third with 84 points.

"I love watching the team progress," said Sanchez, who may not be that guy but is a pretty good approximation of the same with two 50 splits and a 21.8 200 to his credit this weekend. "People say track isn't a team sport but they're wrong. It's made up of individual events but we run for each other and run better in relays than individual races. What's more team than that?'

The Golden Hawks led all teams in three events at the meet, Bergen County's largest high school event, running 43.5 for the 4-x-100, 1:30.1 for the 4x-200 and 3:26.3 for 4-x-400. The throws team was second in three events and the distance medley, high jump and triple jumps also took seconds in division B.

Sanchez became the first River Dell athlete to win the Bernard Smith Award as the top boys runner at the meet.

Unsung hero for Bergen Catholic

Bergen Catholic coach Bill Leonard is a believer in the old saying, attributed to Woody Allen that 80 percent of success is just showing up.

The Crusaders not only showed up and placed in every event in the Group E meet, but they won seven of the 16 events en route to a 136-117 win over Paramus Catholic. And the epitome of showing up is senior Paul Caprio.

Caprio was part of the very successful Crusader cross-country team last fall, but rarely steps on the track because of the deep BC distance team, a team that swept the 4-x-800, 4-x-1,600 and distance medley races en route to victory. But the absence of Rahmir Johnson (at the Red-White game at Nebraska) and injuries to some other athletes forced Caprio into the pole vault, javelin and discus events, where the Crusaders earned two wins and a third place finish.

"I use him some times as an example at practice or at a meeting," said Glen Rock boys coach J.P. McCarten, "He didn't run cross-country as a freshman. and missed making a very good soccer team, and he was an okay basketball player. And even in the spring he didn't crack our lineup right away.

"But he kept working hard and his gift developed and now he's one of the est runners in the school's history."

The Panthers won only the three events that Laguttuta anchored, but was second or third in 12 of the other 13 events, with seniors Andrew Stoddard, Pierce Tuttle, Garrett Boscoe, Jared Lipsky and Gabe Weinstock chipping in.

Pascack Hills senior Liam Landau became the first Cowboy to win the Steve Finlay Award, clearing 14 feet in the pole vault, and having one of the best jumps of the day in the long jump. capping a wild Saturday that also saw him on the winning 4-x-100 and shuttle hurdles team, all in the first two hours.



Ridgewood's Baginski returns to place in mile

Senior gets Penn Relays medal he had been pursuing for four years

PHILADELPHIA — A year ago, Will Baginski battled through the 1,600-meter leg of the distance medley at the Penn Relays, feeling a sharp pain in his back and suspecting his season was over.

Friday night, after waiting out two weather delays and running in a steady rain, the Ridgewood senior stepped on the Franklin Field track for the first time in a year and got the Penn Relays medal he had been pursuing for four years.

"I ran a pretty decent race as a freshman (in the 4-x-800) then I dropped the baton (in the 4-x-400) as a sophomore. Last year I knew I had a problem and my season might be over," said Baginski, who finished fifth in a tactical high school mile race in 4:20.12. The race was won by Foster Malleck of Kitchener, Ontario in 4:18.20, the slowest winning time in 53 years

"I've run in a bunched up race like this before but never with so many other kids," said Baginski, who ran a speedy 58 second last lap, in a wild eight man dash to the finish. "It might not have been the smartest plan because there were so many quality kids, but I'm satisfied with my race and can't wait for my next one."

Neither can Passaic's Luis Peralta, but perhaps for different reasons. For three laps he seemed to have the race exactly where he wanted it.

Peralta took the lead from the opening gun and promptly slowed the race to a quick trot, going through the 400 in 66 seconds and 800 in 2:16, probably 8-10 seconds slower than normal in a high quality race.

He still held the lead at the three quarter mark, in a pedestrian 3:20 and then he started to move.

But so did everyone else in the race, and while he still ran a 60 second last lap, he finished eighth in

"But it was too late, and the guys in front of me were too good," said Peralta, the defending outdoor national champion. "I tried to kick but it was too much."

Santa Cruz and Mathis earn medals

Two of North Jersey's best boys throwers share several things in common.

They're both seniors who will throw at Division I programs next year, both on the verge of breaking rarely achieved barriers in their events, and, after Friday, both proud medal winners at the Penn Relays.

Shot putter Connor Mathis of Don Bosco, who's been knocking the door of the 60 foot barrier since last June,came close again Friday, throwing 58-101/4 to take fifth in his event, while javelin thrower Jason Santa Cruz of NV/Old Tappan, stalking the 200 foot mark this season, threw a major meet best 192-8 in

the javelin for fifth in his event.

They grabbed their medals in distinctly different ways.

Mathis moved into fourth place on his third throw, slipped into fifth when Nikolas Hyde of Somerset, Pennsylvania threw 58-11 on his last throw and had to wait out a long toss by Mason Ellis of Cleamons, North Carolina on his last attempt which measured 58-8 1/2.

Santa Cruz slid into the finals in eighth place with a solid throw of 184 on his third attempt, then moved to ninth at the beginning of the last round, and then threw a major meet on his last throw, improving by nearly nine feet.

"I tried to stay composed even though the weather wasn't great," said Mathis, who qualified last in the field of 15 and battled through flu that restricted his practice and competition for a week and a half. "I'm not really thinking about because I know I'm working hard and when it comes it comes, but I'm really excited to get a medal today."

Mathis will throw at Wake Forest next year.

Santa Cruz admitted that he was happy to just make the Penn Relays field this year but as the competition went on, his resolve strengthened.

"When the guy knocked me into ninth, it increased my determination," said Santa Cruz, who will throw at Monmouth. "I just got out there, gripped it and ripped it. I'm pretty confident in my mechanics; I trusted what I did to get here and just let it go."

Ridgewood's Baginski banks on kick at end to win

CLIFTON — No matter where Will Baginski lies in the pack, he always considers himself a kick away from the lead.

That's because the Ridgewood distance runner feels he has a clear-cut advantage over the rest of the competition.

"Iknow that I have the most leg speed than anyone else in the race," Baginski said after narrowly winning the North I, Group 4 mile at the NJSIAA sectional meet on Friday at Clifton High School. "I figure anyone can dig it out if they want to and I'll hang with them. But if no one wants to do it, that's to my advantage because I can out-kick them the last four hundred meters."

Baginski, the reigning NJSIAA indoor champion, moved closer to adding an outdoor title to his resume when he finished a few steps ahead of senior Francis Martingale of Memorial-West New York.

Alternating the lead the final 600 meters, Baginski made his final move with 200 meters to go to pull away from Martingale and finish in 4:22.20.

Martingale crossed in a close second at 4:22.70.

"These races at the sectionals, I'm OK

if they're tactical, but after this I want to run fast times," said Baginski, a Dartmouth commit. "The benefit and only benefit of being a distance runner who weighs 160 pounds is that I have the extra bit of strength in my legs to push harder at the end.

"It doesn't really feel like my high school career is so close to being over, but I know I need to take every opportunity I can to run fast before I graduate."

Baginski's top finish is a big reason why the Maroons hold a first day lead in the boys Group 4 team standings. Ridgewood currently sits in first with 30 points, followed by Passaic County Tech (26.33) and third place Bergen County Tech (26). Montclair is fourth with 24 points.

Passaic County Tech is in contention after turning in two gold medal performances.

Junior Shamar Taylor won the 400 hurdles in 56.64 and senior Joel Ingram had the top leap in the triple jump of 45-02.25.

In his final track meet in Passaic County, Passaic's Luis Peralta won the 400 in 49.38.

Kennedy junior Jamier Wright-Collins won the high jump (6-06) and Hackensack junior Daniel Mai claimed the discus (145-01).

Group 1 boys

Hasbrouck Heights sits in first place in North 1, Group 1 with 40 points and holds a 12 point lead over Mountain Lakes.

Heights junior Vincent Sedlmeir has the Aviators first gold medal after winning the high jump with a leap of 6-0.

Pompton Lakes junior Zachary Smith won the 100 meter in 11.08 and New Milford freshman Robbie Tormo captured the 400 in 51.62.

Kinnelon junior Jabez Thomas claimed the triple jump (42-11.25), while Wallington junior Ervin Chaush won the discus with a throw of 142-05.

Butler senior Rebecca Kneppel won both the 100 and 400 meter races in Group 1.

Kneppel broke a 35-year-old school record in the 100 (12.34) and claimed the 400 in 100.41.

"I really didn't know much about my competition in the 100 and what to expect," Kneppel said. "I really don't like to know who I'm up against. I feel good about my performance and looking forward to the 200 race. I feel that's my best event."

54.50 points, with second place Hasbrouck Heights 17 points behind.

Will Baginski went from wondering if he'd ever win a sectional gold medal to winning four of them in a six-month span.

The **Ridgewood** star suffered a stress fracture in his lower back in mid-April last year, costing the distance runner his postseason his junior year.

He was out roughly two months before even starting physical therapy and "didn't hit my full mileage" until September. He came back as good as ever indoors, though, to win sectional titles in the 1,600 and 3,200 before going on to claim a Meet of Champions title in the 1,600 in a career-best 4:12.90.

"I'm firing on all cylinders," Baginski said.

The Ridgewood senior bound for Dartmouth claimed individual North 1, Group 4 sectional titles Friday and Saturday in the 1,600 and 3,200, respectively. He won the 1,600-meter title in 4:22.70, edging out Memorial's Francis Martingale by a half

Barely out of the breath just moments after the winning the 3,200 on Saturday, Baginski was quick to find his two other Ridgewood teammates to congratulate them on their fifth- and sixth-place finishes to earn the team an additional three points.

Aside from some seeking personal redemption after missing state season one year ago, Baginski was determined to help get Ridgewood back on top in North 1, Group 4 after the Maroons missed out on the title by five points to West Orange last year, with Baginski watching from the sideline.

"That's why I'm out here running so many events," said Baginski, who also ran in the 800 on Saturday, taking third in a race won by Passaic's Oregon-bound Luis Peralta, as well as running a leg on Ridgewood's third-place 4x400 relay team. "It was tough seeing us go down last year and not being able to do anything about it. It was tough to watch."

This time, it was quite a different story at Clifton.

CLIFTON — Two years ago, Kinnelon senior Kathryn Brown shifted her focus to track and field shortly after tearing her ACL playing soccer in the fall of her sophomore year.

Rather than swimming that winter, Brown decided to give indoor track a shot in an effort to get a jump start on the outdoor spring season. It's a move that has paid dividends for Brown as well as the Colts track team.

Brown pulled off the trifecta this weekend when she claimed gold in three events to help lead Kinnelon to its first NJSIAA North 1, Group 1 sectional team title since 2011 on Saturday at Clifton Stadium.

Kinnelon scored a team high 125.50 points, outdistancing runner-up and defending champion Hasbrouck Heights by 46 points.

"It's funny, I started out as a club soccer player and did track because I didn't really have anything else to do in the spring," said Brown, who won the 100 and 400 hurdles, long jump and finished second in the triple jump. "But after tearing my ACL my sophomore year playing soccer, I had to take some time off. So I came back and tried the 800 meter and long jump off my opposite

leg.

Brown accounted for 38 of the Colts' total points over two days.

"We went into this meet with the team trying to win," added Brown, a North Carolina native who is committed to the University of North Carolina-Asheville. "We all wanted to place as high as we could. This is a big meet and win for our team."

Sophomore Caroline Tighe won the high jump with a leap of 5-00 and senior Emma Kline (3,200) and Allyson Martini (100 hurdles) picked up an additional 16 key points off second-place finishes.

Sophomore Kallie Downey was third in the 100 meter and seniors Angelina Tarabokija and Jackie Thompson went 3-4 in the 800.

"We have an amazing group of seniors and all around we have some great athletes," Kinnelon coach Laura Chegwidden-Jacobs said. "This was

"This is a team that is very talented and has a ton of hard-working individuals," Ridgewood boys coach Patrick Ryan said. "We had our best two days to come out with the win. A lot of individuals exceeded their seeds and scored in events that they weren't expected to score in. A lot of big surprises. Every

point counts."

Less than 24 hours after winning the mile, senior Will Baginski added the two mile to his résumé and finished in 9:29.49.

Junior Luke Otterstedt won the javelin and senior Tom Vandalovsky had the top throw in the shot put.

The Ridgewood girls scored 120.50 points to repeat and held off runner-up Randolph (91) and third-place West Orange (87).

Senior Katherine Muccio won the 200, 400 and 400 hurdles and freshman Camryn Wennersten finished second in the 3,200 in 10:37.97.

"This sectional was so talented and a real challenge for our girls," said Ridgewood girls coach Steve Opremcak, whose team has won three of the last four sectional titles. "For us to respond to that challenge is very gratifying and it shows our focus. The kids were awe-some."



Passaic's Peralta repeats success at SMOC

COLUMBUS — Luis Peralta wasted no time in making a move.

As soon as the Passaic senior hit the halfway point in the boys 800 meter race on Saturday, he shifted his focus away from history and instead towards finishing first.

Though Peralta didn't compete at the pace and speed he displayed a year ago, he did enough to repeat at the 51st NJSIAA Meet of Champions at Northern Burlington High School.

"I felt like I needed to run my fastest race because it was my last time running in the state," said Peralta, who was clocked in 1:53.26. "I wanted to go out knowing that I left everything here. I knew after the first lap that my time was too slow. I had no chance for any records. At that point I just wanted to run my race and go for the win. It wasn't my best performance, but I did what I had to do to win."

Holding a slight lead over senior Tim McInerney of Christian Brothers after the first 400 meters, Peralta made a final kick with 300 meters to go to finish ahead of Monroe Township junior Jordan Kaplan. Four competitors finished under 1:55 with the top seven of eight place-winners coming out of the seeded two heat.

Last spring, Peralta won his first 800 SMOC title in 1:49.63 when he edged Hopewell Valley's Sean Dolan by just over a second. Dolan, who qualified for this year's half mile, chose not to participate in this year's event as he shifted his focus to the mile, which he won on Saturday.

"Thave another chance to break 1:50 at next week's nationals," said Peralta, an Oregon commit who also won last year's New Balance Nationals in 1:49.092. "When I run against fast competition I can run faster. I'm excited for what's ahead of me. I'm going to work hard at Oregon. Just being there is going to help me and I'm going to feed off the competition."

In his final New Jersey high school race, Ridgewood senior Will Baginski finished second in the mile and set a personal record in the process.

Hanging near the lead with Dolan in the final lap, Baginski turned in a 4:11.88 to add a silver medal to his collection.

"I was glad to be in the race. The big issues I've had in a lot of different races over the last year is that I've let the front of the pack get too far away and then I'm forced to run on the outside to make up ground," said Baginski, a Dartmouth commit. "I managed to avoid both those things today, which is good. I was in the race the whole time. It's why I ran the

fastest time I've ever run before. Sean [Dolan] is really good and that helped me with my pace. I was hoping to break 4:10. I feel like I ran really well. I always want to win but taking second to a runner like Sean Dolan is nothing to be ashamed of."

Baginski captured the NJSIAA MOC indoor mile title this past winter. He will run one final high school race at next week's New Balance Nationals at North Carolina A&T in Greensboro, NC.

"This puts me in a great spot. We have nationals in a week and after that I'm definitely ready for some rest as it's been a long season," Baginski said. "I'm not sad about my high school career coming to an end yet as it hasn't really sunk in. But it will sink in the next week

I'm sure. It's been an awesome four years. I'm glad there's still another chapter ahead of me, but it's sad to see the four years at Ridgewood come to an end"

The dominant ones

From the beginning of the track and field season on April 1 until the end (at Nationals June 16) Jason Santa Cruz of NV/Old Tappan and Luis Peralta of Passaic were unchallenged in the javelin throw and 800 meters, respectively, not just in North Jersey but throughout the state of New Jersey.

Santa Cruz, the top returning thrower in New Jersey from 2018, grabbed the state lead by throwing 188-2 at the Bergen County Jack Yockers Relays, his first major throw of the year and held it, ultimately reaching 208-1 at winning the State Meet of Champions on June 8 to become the third best performer in Bergen County history.

Along the way he won several major titles, threw more than 200 feet in half his meets and never lost to a New Jersey athlete -- actually no New Jersey athlete came within 10 feet of him in any meet all year. He ended up as an All-American, taking sixth at New Balance Nationals on June 15. He'll throw at Monmouth next year.

Peralta, the defending state and National champ, lost just twice in nine individual races all season, finishing eighth at the Penn Relays mile run after leading the field for the first three laps and then coming up just short of repeating as the New Balance Outdoor national champion, finishing second, five meters behind the winner.

He won both the 400 and 800 in Passaic County and sectional competition, won state Group 4 and repeated as the State Meet of Champions winner in a pedestrian (for him) 1:53.56, as no one chose to challenge him. His seasonal best of 1:51.09 at nationals ended his season. He'll next run for the University of Oregon.

The big three teams

Bergen Catholic, NV/Old Tappan and Ridgewood were locked in a three-way battle all season with all three teams spending at least part of the season as the top team in the NorthJersey.com/ Record rankings

While the Golden Knights and Maroons met three times head-to-head (four if you count the dual meet) with Old Tappan prevailing at the Big North Freedom and Bergen A meets, Bergen Catholic never got a direct shot at either because the Bergen County Relays and Group championships segregate the Non-Public schools from the Publics.

The three powerhouses combined for eight major titles, with OT taking the Group 3 sectionals for the sixth time in eight years, in addition to league and Bergen A titles. Ridgewood won its eighth Group 4 sectional in 10 years and fourth straight Bergen A relay crown, and BC won the Big North United and Bergen E relays for the second straight year and Bergen E individuals for the third straight time.

Standouts galore

North Jersey boys enjoyed a bit of a renaissance overall this spring after a few less than stellar seasons. Led by Santa Cruz, high jumper Jamier Wright-Collins of Kennedy, pole vaulter Liam Landau of Pascack Hills and shot putter Connor Mathis of Don Bosco, North Jersev athletes medalled in each of the seven field events at the State Meet of Champions for the first time since 2008.

Will Baginski of Ridgewood was second in a sterling 1,600 meter race in a career best time of 4:11.88, and medalled in both the Penn Relays and Nationals miles, earning double All-American status by anchoring the Maroons to a thirdplace finish in the sprint medley with a fine 1:51.12 800 anchor. Joel Ingram of Passaic Tech became the first Passaic County athlete to medal in both the long and triple jumps since 2007.

Other team champions

Thirteen different North Jersey teams took team titles in league, county and sectionals competition. In addition to the aforementioned Big Three, here's a list of those teams with their spring achievements.

Cresskill: Took the NJIC Patriot title for the seventh straight time.

NV/Demarest: Won the Bergen B relays and Big North Patriot titles for the third straight year.

Emerson: Won the Bergen D individual title for the second straight year and extended its D relays skein to four.

Glen Rock: Captured its third straight Bergen C relays and sixth consecutive NJIC Colonial titles.

Hasbrouck Heights: Won its ninth straight NJIC Meadowlands title, and first Bergen C and North 1, Group 1 titles since 2015.

Lakeland: Won its fifth straight Passaic small schools relays and second straight Big North Independence titles.

Lyndhurst: Extended its streak of NJIC Liberty titles to nine years.

Passaic Tech: Won its first Passaic County title since 2015, sixth Passaic large schools relays title in eight years

and eighth Big North Liberty title in nine

Ramsey: Won the Big North American title, its first divisional title since the Big North Patriot title in 2012.

River Dell: Won its first Bergen B relays title since 2015 and first North 1, Group 2 title since 2016.
