They are the winners. They are the measuring stick. They are the best. Just say their name and everyone else knows what you mean.

Five members of the NorthJersey.com HS sports staff make their selections on which they consider the Program of the Decade.

Indian Hills softball

It's not easy to be a public school sports program anymore. Non-Public powerhouses often grab your most talented athletes. The youth sports machine has taken away others who would have been thrilled to play for their town, but by the time they're 14 years old, they're done. They want to do anything other than play

So public school coaches have to be creative. They have to turn the negatives into positives. They need to hammer home the lure of playing with your friends, not in front of thousands, but in front of hundreds of fans who have your best interest at heart. They need to play up the history, the alumni, while mixing in just enough demands with fun to keep the kids engaged.

Which is what the Indian Hills softball program does better than anyone. The Braves have provided a template for other public schools to follow.

Joe Leicht is at the heart of the effort. He uses his former players to work and coach with the younger players in town. He has kept detailed records and history on his program, so the girls know they are playing for something more than themselves.

He's hard on them. Ask any Braves softball player what it's like to get the "Joe Leicht Look" of incredulous disappointment after something goes wrong, then ask them how much fun it was to pose for prom pictures with a softball bat while he looks on beaming with

It's not easy, and Leicht works hard at it. That's probably why more public schools aren't able to achieve the same type of success. Indian Hills has played in six Bergen County softball finals, winning two - hey, there are many other Bergen County tournaments (especially on the girls side) that aren't dominated by non-public teams. The Braves won state titles in 2010, 2013 and 2014.

It's not easy to be a public school program anymore, but you can succeed in this environment. Indian Hills proves it.

Ridgewood football

My pick for Program of the Decade was solidified in the aftermath of the Maroons' hectic, 41-37 victory over Union in last month's North Group 5 regional fi-

Senior Jack Wittmaack brought the trophy over to the MetLife Stadium 50-yard line and planted it on the NFL logo, prompting teammates to plant themselves alongside. "This is our house now," he said.

The linebacker recalled running onto the same field earlier in the decade. His Ridgewood sixth-grade squad played a scrimmage at halftime of the 2013 Jets/ Giants preseason game, and many of those Junior Jets were senior members of the Maroons' title team.

"It all makes sense now," Wittmaack said with a laugh. "This is where it all started."

That encapsulates the things that make a true program. Success at all levels, from youth on up. Consistency - every Ridgewood team from Pee-Wee to varsity runs the Wing-T system that coach Chuck Johnson has been teaching them throughout their careers. Every Maroon to suit up since the mid-1980s has.

Ridgewood finished the 2010s with five appearances in sectional finals, a trio of North 1, Group 5 titles and its first perfect season (12-0 in 2016) since 1956.

Although Johnson was unable to coach the final seven games due to illness, his plans for the start of the next decade remain the same. Ridgewood's teambuilding Bench-A-Thon in June. A summer of teaching offensive intricacies at his Wing-T camp.

And then, back to work with the Program of the Decade.

Immaculate Heart swimming

Let's start with this: how many programs were the best team in North Jersey for the entire decade? How many won state and county titles at every step of the

That's the claim to fame for Immaculate Heart, which is unrivaled in the water. It's the surest thing in high school sports, since major upsets in swimming are almost statistically impossible.

The Blue Eagles have won all 21 Bergen Meet of Champions titles, often scoring twice as much as the next-best team. They've won more than 90 percent of meets this past decade and will start the new one on the verge of history. Immaculate Heart has a chance to break its own NJSIAA record with a 13th straight state

Rivals are quick to point out that the Blue Eagles can draw club stars from all over the region, but their success shouldn't be taken for granted. The faces change every season, but there is never an off day or off year at Immaculate Heart. There is always another swimmer, another younger sister, ready to step up.

As former coach Jason Schlereth once said, "Tradition never graduates".

Ridgewood boys and girls track and cross-country

This is not a cop-out. But frankly, even with nearly 50 years of experience, I can't separate one of the six programs that make up the Ridgewood boys and girls cross country, indoor and outdoor track teams.

They share head coaches. They have outstanding assistants throughout the years - usually alumni or alumnae, but also "outsiders" like current weight coach Warren Schoepfler.

They have stars - 14 members of the All-Decade cross country and track teams.

But most of all they have championships - an astounding 122 in the last decade in league, county, and state sectional competition, 56 percent of the 220 possible titles. Here's the breakdown:

CROSS-COUNTRY (48 of 80): Four boys and seven girls in Bergen County group meets; three boys and seven girls in the Bergen Meet of Champions; 10 boys and six girls in sectionals, five boys and six girls in

INDOOR TRACK (30 of 60): Five boys and three girls in leagues; six boys and five girls in sectionals, six boys and five girls in Bergen Relays.

OUTDOOR TRACK (44 of 80): Seven boys and five girls in leagues, seven boys and six girls in Bergen Relays; four boys and four girls in Bergen Groups and eight boys and three girls in state sectionals.

Add in the 2016 and 2019 girls Group 4 indoor state titles, and a combined 10 State Meet of Champions cross country finishes, all of whom led to top 10 finishes and six to state medals, and you've got a spectacular decade. You pick which season is best - I'm not going to do it.

Northern Highlands girls soccer

Northern Highlands rose to prominence with a dramatic stretch of dominance unmatched this decade in New Jersey girls' soccer.

Choosing this public school as my Program of the Decade is as easy as 1-2-3.

For starters, the Highlanders' won six state Group 3 championships in the 2010s, the most NJSIAA titles this decade by a girls' soccer team in the Garden State. They also won seven Bergen County crowns

Their success under coach Tara Madigan from 2011 to 2018 was especially staggering. They compiled a record of 179-4-4, featuring a state-record 65-game winning streak and state-record 88-game unbeaten streak from 2011 to 2014.

During that golden eight-year era, Northern Highlands won its seven Bergen titles and six state crowns. Their eight consecutive sectional titles represent the state record for a public school.

Northern Highlands dominated the NorthJersey-.com All-Decade team. The Highlanders had 13 of the 49 selections, including six on first team: Clare Shea (Class of 2014), Hana Kerner (2015), Morgan Busacca (2016), Casey Richards (2016), Eva Hurm (2017) and Sara Ghorashi (2019).

Along the way, Northern Highlands was recognized as a national powerhouse. The 2018 team won a record-tying fourth consecutive Bergen County title, a Group 3 crown, was 22-1 and finished tied for third in the USA TODAY/United Soccer Coaches Super 25 rankings.

Passalacqua and junior pole vaulter Shaun Herlihy and several other all-county
hopefuls in senior Jin Woo Song (D) and juniors Steven Hatano (D) and JC Baratta (S).
If others can step up, the Golden knights can contend.

Paramus has an outstanding senior class led by Ryan Fernando (S), Gabe Fernando (S), Dennis Hemans (S), Rylan Marquez (MD), Dan Stipanov (H/S/J), Melvin Macaayan (T), Brian Ribeiro (D), Vincent Sciglitano (T), Matt Ise (MD) and Jordan Tulkis (T).

Ramapo isn't very deep but has talent in every event. Top performers are seniors Francesco Ferrara (S), Tommy Cahill (J), Shane Campbell (J) and Patrick Kwasniak (S) and juniors Bobby Hymans (D), Luke Czerepak (S), Jeremy Miller (J) and Jacob Piskadlo (S/J).

Ridgewood is perennially a contender for league and sectional titles and with seniors Kwame Grant (S), Aidan Sheridan (D), Taylor Barnabic (D), Mason Zamboldi (D), Jason Theisen (PV), P.J. Sanchez (J), Ryan Seaver (MD), Arthur Dunn (J) and Luke Otterstedt (T) and juniors Ryan McKenna (D) and Jay Boogaert (D) and a host of good young performers they will contend in every major meet this year.

Teaneck has a new coach in Reginald James Jr., and he will have seniors Thai Remy (MD) and Ernesto Taveras (D) and sophs Joshua Carter (J/T) and Daye Karibi-White (T) to build the program around.

Freedom

Hackensack has some outstanding talent in seniors Chelsei Campbell (D), Luisa Davila (S), Julia Morrone (S/J), Shanice Murray (S), Mackenzie Scheili (T) and Karen Severino (T) and needs underclassmen to step up to bring the Comets back to contention.

The loss of Boston College-bound Kyla Krawczyk (MD/LS) to a soccer injury will create some problems for **Northern Highlands** but the Highlanders still are contenders with seniors Daisy Liljegren (D), Grace Smiechowski (MD/LS) and Nicole Waletzki (H/J) leading the way. Juniors Michelle Bechtel (PV), Randi Conroy (PV), Olivia Delorenzo (MD), Christina Hughes (J/H), Brynn Madonna (T) and Ella Santoro (H/J) will determine whether Highlands can win any titles.

NV/Old Tappan welcomes a new winter coach, spring coach Dave Burns and he has an excellent base to work with, although the Golden Knights lost a lot to graduation. The leaders are seniors Marisa DiGia (PV/J), Nia Watson (S/H), Taylor Thornton (S) and Min Seo (Kayleen) Bae (D). Junior Rebecca Gross (PV) and soph Cara Hilbocki (MD/LS) are great underclassmen and the Knights have a very good sophomore class.

Paramus is rebuilding with seniors Alexa Arevalo (H/J) and Regina Valencia (MD) and junior Sunny Yoo (T) the top returnees.

Ramapo loses Ivy League newcomers Grace O'Shea (Penn) and Sarah Adams (Dartmouth) to graduation but as usual, the Raiders are contenders. Seniors Sophia Schwartz (S), Lauren Judd (D), Bella Conway (J) and Allie Henke (PV), juniors Sophia Vernieri (S), Cortney Lander (S), Lindsay Arone and Megan Schneider (LS/MD) and sophs Izzie Anzaldo and Bianca Wertheimer (S) make up a very strong nucleus.

Ridgewood may have a difficult time repeating as state Group 4 Champs but with an excellent senior class led by Ellie Veenhof (J/PV), Sara VandenAssem (H/J), Nicoletta Venizelos (J/PV/S) and Caroline McCormack (MD), very good juniors in Sarah Policano (D) and Josephine Maasarani (S) and a sensational soph class led by state group 4 1,600 champ Camryn Wennersten (D), Olivia Shattuck (D), Lily Williams (D), AnnaMarie Tretola (D), Lucia Rabolli (S/H) and Olivia Grace (S), the Maroons can win everything else.

Teaneck has a new coach in Reginald James and some outstanding talent in senior Gabriella Walls (S), juniors Trinity Tiwari (LS/MD) and Grace McCullough (MD) and potential state champ Kayce Darby (S).

The team outlook

Eight teams won major titles last year: Bergen Catholic (Bergen Relays Non-Public and Big North United); Fort Lee (Big North American); Hasbrouck Heights (NJIC); Lakeland (Big North Independence); Passaic Tech (Big North Liberty and Passaic County); Ramsey (Bergen Relays Small Schools); Ridgewood (Bergen Relays Large Schools, North 1 Group 4 and Big North Freedom) and River Dell (North 1 Group 2 and Big North Patriot).

All eight teams should be in the mix for various titles this year. Northern Highlands, NV/Demarest, Pascack Hills, West Milford, Fair Lawn, NV/Old Tappan and Bergen Tech are other teams that can contend for the various winter titles.

Girls

State medalists galore?

While the absence of Rogers will deprive North Jersey of its best chance to win a State Meet of Champions title this winter, the girls should earn at least a dozen medals for the sixth time in seven years and approach the record of 18 medals set in 2015 and 2016.

The addition of the triple jump will help but there there are contenders in every event from North Jersey. Here's a list of the possible medalists with their rankings among returning state athletes. (* - underclassmen)

Can Ridgewood repeat as Group 4 champions?

The Maroons won their second state Group 4 championship in four years last winter as Wennersten won the 1,600 and was third in the 3,200 and joined the now graduated Katherine Muccio (2nd in 55) and Victoria Purritano (4th in the hurdles) for a two-point win with the lowest score since the scoring rules changed in 1992. But that 28 point total might again be the goal for the 2020 Group 4 winning team.

Wennersten is back but to ask her to equal her fantastic performance of last year is asking a lot of the sophomore, in the toughest of all the group meets. But the Maroons might be able to match or better the 16 points in distance races with a combination of Claire Hamlet, Sarah Policano, Olivia Shattuck, AnnaMarie Tretola, Lily Williams, all part of Ridgewood's sensational cross country team joining with Wennersten.

And seniors Sara VandenAssem (hurdles) and Ellie Veenhof (high jump) need to come close to the 12 points scored by Muccio and Purritano for the Maroons to match or better the 28 points that they probably need to try and grab a fifth overall group title, trailing only Columbia (10) and Plainfield (6) for titles in the group.

Other teams to watch

Ridgewood also won the Big North Freedom, Bergen Relays Large School and North 1 group 4 sectional meets. 2019 Champions included: Clifton: Big North Liberty and Passaic; NV/Demarest: Big North Patriot and North 1 group 2 sectional; Glen Rock: NJIC and North 1, group 1 sectional; IHA: Bergen Relays Non-Public; Paramus Catholic: Big North United; Ramsey: Big North American and Bergen Relays Small Schools; and Wayne Valley: Big North Independence.

Hasbrouck Heights, Holy Angels, Lakeland, Lyndhurst, Kinnelon, Northern Highlands, Passaic Tech; Ramapo and River Dell are other teams that can be contenders this year.

Indoor Track: Ridgewood tested in Big North Freedom double

Ridgewood extended its Big North Freedom indoor track championships streaks to four boys meets in a row and three straight girls titles Wednesday. But it wasn't easy.

The boys held off NV/Old Tappan, 104-98, helped by a distance double by senior Aidan Sheridan and a clutch third-place finish by P.J. Sanchez in the triple jump. The girls fell behind early but used a bravura performance by hurdler/jumper Sara VandenAssem and the usual top notch distance domination to hold strong efforts from Northern Highlands and Ramapo, 124-106 1/2-89 at Ocean Breeze in Staten Island.

"Those two wins by Aidan were huge," said Ridgewood head coach Patrick Ryan. "At the end of cross-country he was struggling and he got his ferritin (iron) levels tested the day the girls ran at the State Meet of Champions (Nov. 23). They were very low and he ended up needing an infusion and still takes iron supplements. He's been training very well and I knew the league meet races are usually tactical. So we let him run."

Not only did Sheridan, an all-North Jersey selection in cross-country beat fellow all-North Jersey selection Steven Hatano of NV/Old Tappan in the 1,600 and 3,200 races Wednesday, he ran indoor personal bests of 4:38.12 and 9:57.16 in the process.

Sanchez finished a solid third in the 55 hurdles, but had a rough night in the long jump and had trouble getting on the take-off board in the triple jump. But his good jump was an indoor PR of 41-6 and was enough to give him six points for third and clinch the win. Ridgewood's other win came in the 4-x-800.

Pat Passalacqua of NV/Old Tappan continued his hot throwing by winning the shot with a toss of 56-6.

As expected, the Ridgewood girls scored 55 of a possible 72 points in the 800, 1,600 and 3,200 with Camryn Wennersten winning the 800 (North Jersey No.1, 2:20.39) and joining with Olivia Shattuck in a 1-2 3,200 finish. The Maroons also went 1-2-3 in the 1,600 led by Sarah Policano and won the 4-x-800.

But VandenAssem's great day ultimately gave the Maroons a win.

"She's been on all year," said Ryan, after VandenAssem won the hurdles, took second in the long jump and won the triple jump. "She's always had issues with her quads so this was the first time we let her triple jump all season. And she came through like the champion she is."

Ellie Veenhof (high jump) was the only other Ridgewood winner.

Northern Highlands' Grace Smiechowski and Sophia Schwartz of Ramapo also enjoyed outstanding nights. Schwartz anchored the Green Raiders' 4-x-400 win, took third in the 55 and 400 and second in the 200 while Smiechowski won the 200 and was second in the 400, 55 and 55 hurdles.

Wennersten ran anchor on both of Ridgewood's 4-x-1600 and sprint medley winning teams and second place 4-x-400 team.





Ridgewood girls, Passalacqua shine

The Ridgewood girls distance medley team of Sarah Policano, Olivia Grace, Lily Williams and Camryn Wennersten finished second to North Rockland and their transcendent anchor Katelyn Tuohy at the Varsity Classic, but the quartet still managed to put on quite

Wennersten split a personal best of 4:52.45 on her 1,600 meter leg but couldn't catch Tuohy, who ran a 4:47.05 split, fastest time in the country this winter. Lounsbury, a sophomore who has been a spectacular cross-country runner in her first two seasons, easily won the 3,200 at the Armory with a big indoor personal best of 11:17.08.

Cahill, who has committed to Bucknell, became the first Bergen County high jumper to clear 6-5 this year at the Morris County Invitational. Cahill was third after missing once at six feet and twice at 6-2. But he made 6-4 on his first event, clinching the win after his opponents missed at the same height and then made 6-5, a personal best, on his third try.

The Millrose Games is one of the oldest and most famous indoor track and

field meets in the world, starting in 1908. From 1914 to 2011 it was held in the several arenas known as Madison Square Garden, often drawing capacity crowds of 18,000 or more and traditionally stood as the centerpiece of a vibrant indoor track circuit in the Northeast. Over the years more than 200 Olympic gold medalists have also won Millrose titles.

In 2012, it moved to the Armory Track Center in upper Manhattan and still draws capacity crowds, although the capacity is now about a quarter of its past numbers.

On Thursday, the 113th edition of the meet kicked off with several field events. Then Saturday, the meet begins at 11:30 a.m. and at least a dozen world and Olympic medalists are scheduled to compete.

So too are more than 20 North Jersey youth, high school, collegiate and professional athletes.

Rarely does an elite high school athlete get a confidence boost from an eighth-place finish.

But at the Millrose Games Girls High School mile run Saturday before a capacity crowd at the Armory Track Center

Her 4:51.60 clocking left her in the middle of perhaps the greatest girls high school field ever assembled as all 15 runners, from nine states, all broke five minutes, the first time that has ever happened.

And with that, Wennersten, who was 10th last year in 4:56.59 as the only freshman in the race did all of the following:

Ran the fastest race in New Jersey this year.

Broke a 35-year-old school record set by former National 1000 meter record holder Margaret Scutro in 1985.

Ran the fastest time by a sophomore in New Jersey state history and ninth all-time.

Ran the second-fastest time in Bergen County history, missing the 2015 record of 4:50.66 set by Catherine Pagano of Northern Highlands. Pagano won that race and just four girls went under five minutes that night.

"Last year was fun just getting here and this year my goal was to compete," said Wennersten. "Everyone ran so fast and most of us ran faster than we ever had before."

Race winner Marlee Starliper of Northern (PA), won in 4:37.76, a meet record and the fourth-fastest time in U.S. history, winning by nearly 50 meters over previous 2020 U.S. leader Juliette Whittaker of Maryland.

Wennersten beat two girls who had beaten her in last year's race including two-time Nike Nationals cross-country All American Charlotte Bednar of Lawreneguille

"I have more confidence now and I know to get out more conservatively and get comfortable in the race before moving up," said Wennersten, who was in the back of the pack in a still fast 72

Bergen title meet is tuneup for postseason

NEW YORK — The Bergen County Indoor Track Championships traditionally serves as a final tuneup before the postseason officially gets underway.

With the NJSIAA sectional meets scheduled to begin this weekend, the first leg on the road to the State Meet of Champions, local competitors used the annual Bergen County finals on Wednesday at the Armory Track & Field Center as a gauge for what's ahead.

Count Patrick Passalacqua as one of those participants contending for a state title. The NV/Old Tappan senior emerged from the Bergen County Championships as the front-runner and early favorite to win a state title next month when he threw a state-leading 60-02.75 in the shot put to repeat as champion.

"More than anything, winning the event and breaking 60 feet reminded me that I still have a lot left in the tank," Passalacqua said. "Sixty feet is a milestone, but it's more of a mental thing. I'm not over the moon happy with my performance because I know I can do better. But I used this meet to prepare for this weekend's sectional championships and to focus on the bigger picture.

It's a good start and it gives me confidence."

Junior Jemel Carter of Paramus Catholic led a strong Paramus Catholic team when he repeated in the boys 55 meters in 6.50 and captured the 200 in 22.45. Though Paramus Catholic and parochial schools do not participate in sectional qualifiers, Carter is looking two weeks down the road to the NJSIAA Group Championships.

"I feel good right now and I'm hitting the times I'm supposed to hit," Carter said. "Practice has been going well. I feel strong. Coach has been pushing me hard and I've been working on the little things. I'd like to work more on my start and getting out fast. I have enough power to get out fast."

Carter's teammate, Jordany Dely, won the won boys pentathlon with 3,373 points. The junior captured three of the five events, winning the 55 hurdles (7.66), long jump (20.96) and 1,000 meters (2:53.90).

"I enjoy the pentathlon. I tried it last year for the first time and really liked the style of the competition," Dely said. "It's new events I've never done before. I did well today. I hit a personal best in the long jump and that's one of the events I'll be concentrating on over the next few weeks. I'm going to keep working and practicing on the little stuff and my

techniques. Anything I can use to help me get better."

In the distance events, Ridgewood junior Jay Boogaert won the 1600 in 4:34.81 and Hackensack senior Joe Dutan captured the boys 3200 in 10:07.63.

"I think I went out a little too slow, but then I picked it up in the second half of the race," Boogaert said. "I know I can run a lot faster than this. I'm in good shape and I can run faster times."

Junior Jumal Perez of Fort Lee won the boys 400 in 50.87 and senior Andrew Martinez of Pascack Valley captured the boys 600 in 1:25.61.

In the middle distance events, Hackensack sophomore Ryan Pena won the 800 in 1:57.84 and junior Marcus Cheema of Westwood took the 1,000 in 2:35.55. Senior Daniel Van Duren of Mahwah won the 55 hurdles in 7.76.

In the field events, Max Zuckerman of Pascack Hills won the pole vault with a leap of 14-06 and Ramapo's Tommy Cahill repeated in the high jump with a leap of 6-02.

Rashawn Markman of Waldwick captured the long jump (21-07.50) and Cole Goodman of Bergen Tech won the triple jump (44-05).

Rogers sets the record straight

Senior Jenna Rogers of Rutherford

once again rewrote the county record books when she won the girls pentathlon with a record 3,292 points. The Nebraska signee finished first in the high jump and shot put and had runner-up finishes in the long jump and 800.

Fede hits the trifecta

Four North Jersey athletes win meet titles

The nation's oldest interscholastic meet celebrated its 86th anniversary Tuesday night and as usual, the Eastern States Invitational at the Armory Track Center produced some of the best performances of the winter season.

There were a pair of national No. 1 performances, meet records in the boys and girls pole vaults and the girls 400 and more than 20 performances that shuffled the nation's top 10 lists.

And North Jersey athletes enjoyed a sensational evening as well.

Four Bergen-Passaic athletes won titles at the prestigious meet, more than a dozen others earned medals and multiple North Jersey leading performances were achieved in individual and relay events.

Rogers, Wright-Collins take high jump crowns

Rutherford senior Jenna Rogers won't be competing in the State Meet of Champions in her preferred event, the high jump on March 8, due to concerns about the floor at the Bennett Center in Toms River where the state sectionals and group meets are held.

But the Nebraska-bound star loves jumping at the Armory Track Center and proved it again Tuesday, clearing a season's best 5-9 to regain the title she last won in 2018.

"It's been really frustrating jumping this year," said Rogers, whose clearance is the best in New Jersey this year and tied for third in the nation. "It's a technical problem and I've gotten into some bad habits that are hard to break."

Rogers had an early miss at 5-3 and another at 5-7 but still led Soledad Jean of Half Hollow Hills West on misses when the bar got to 5-9. Both missed their first two attempts before Rogers soared over the bar and responded with her signature smile and fist pump.

"It's so familiar jumping here," said Rogers, who will next jump at Nationals in mid-March also at the Armory. "It's easiest on my legs and I've always had success here."

The same goes for Kennedy's Jamier Wright-Collins, who repeated as the boys champion and tied his career best of 6-9 before three good tries at 6-Il.

"I feel good, and I'm trying to press my advantage," said Wright-Collins, who missed just once (at 6-7) until his three misses at 6-II. "I've learned a lot and am trying to keep focused and avoid bad misses at lower heights. Now I want to go get a state title."

Wright-Collins was the state Group 4 indoor champion last year both indoors and outdoors at the State Meet of Champions.

Fede and Passalacqua keep winning

There's been few things as dependable this winter as Mariah Fede of Paramus Catholic winning the girls 55 hurdles and Pat Passalacqua of NV/Old Tappan taking the boys shot put.

Both favorites came through at the Easterns, although neither had an easy time of it.

Fede battled a bad start in the finals and overcame Nadia Saunders of North Rockland at the tape in a huge personal best of 8.02 seconds, easily the fastest time in New Jersey this year and the second fastest time in Bergen County history.

She then ran a New Jersey high school best of 24.74 seconds in the 200 trials, but could "only" manage 24.82 in the final and finished second.

Passalacqua didn't score a fifthstraight personal best in the shot, but managed a seventh win in eight meets this winter, avenging his only loss of the winter by throwing 60-6½ on his fifth of six throws to defeat John Purvis of Winslow Township, who led throughout the competition and finished second at 59-11 3/4.

"It was good to have to come from behind," said Passalacqua, who fouled on a throw that appeared to be over 62 feet on the throw before his winning effort. "It's too bad I didn't improve on my best (a US No. 8 60-8) but throwing 60 feet for the third straight meet continues to push me to get better."

Purvis and Passalacqua are expected to meet three more times this winter, including at Nationals at the Armory in March.

Medals and North Jersey leading marks in relays

Ridgewood's girls added a North Jersey leading 4-x-800 time of 9:30.13 to their distance medley area leading mark and gave the Maroons the option of which event to choose at April's Penn Relays.

The all sophomore team of Lily Williams, AnnaMarie Tretola, Sarah Policano and Camryn Wennersten seemed to have the win in hand with 150 meters to go but LaSalle Academy of Philadelphia used a great anchor kick to beat Wennersten, who had split a sensational 2:12.73.

Ramsey's team of Maya Bender, Kaitlyn Garofalo, Jessica Nixon and Carolyn Coletti ran 9:39.44 for fifth out of the second heat to put themselves in line for a Penn bid, as did Ramapo, eighth in 9:42.25.

The Green Raiders' 4-x-200 team of Izzy Anzaldo, Cortney Lander, Sophia Vernieri and Sophia Schwartz broke 1:45 twice in the 4-x-200, the second time running 1:44.36, second fastest in Bergen history to gain fourth place medals, while Holy Angels was fourth in the

4-x-400 in 4:02.71.

The boys won no medals but Paramus (1:32.77) ran the fastest 4-x-200 in North Jersey this year and the Ridgewood boys (10:41.35) did likewise in the distance medley. Paramus returned in the 4-x-400 and missed a medal by just .02 seconds, running 3:25.91, one of the fastest times in New Jersey this winter.

Noteworthy individual marks

North Jersey athletes medalled in nearly every discipline at the meet, which included more than 300 schools from eight states.

Non-medalists Emily Grubb of Ramsey (8.45 for 9th in the 55 hurdles), Amanda Mircovich of River Dell (2:18.94 for 12th in the 800) and Brynn Madonna of Northern Highlands (39-9, 7th in the shot) all enjoyed personal bests and in Mircovich's case, the North Jersey lead.

TOMS RIVER – History finds a way of repeating itself.

It's just not that often it happens in such a short period of time.

For the second time in a week and only the second time ever, a Passaic County boys team claimed a state sectional indoor track title on Saturday when Passaic Tech captured the North 1 Group 4 crown at the NJSIAA Sectional Championships at the Bennett Track & Field Center.

The Bulldogs joined county rival Lakeland, who made history last weekend when they claimed the North 1 Group 2 sectional crown at the same location

Passaic Tech's Jordan Ricketts and senior Jayden Johnson were the Bulldogs only individual champions, but the Wayne-based school accumulated team points with two runner-up- and three third-place finishes and scored in six of 10 events to run away with the team title over second place Montclair (42).

"I'm doing good now. Everything was touch and go earlier," PCT coach Jeff Cioletti said. "Today started out as a disaster. One of our kids missed the bus, our high jumper pulled his hamstring and couldn't compete and we had a disqualification in another event that cost us some points. Even with all that we managed to pull out the win. We kept competing and pulled together. Our field events in the shot put and pole vault really helped us pull away."

Ricketts, a junior, won the 400 in 50.82 and Johnson had the top throw in the shot put of 46-07.50. Senior Julius Pallero finished second in the two mile and the 4-x-400 relay team of Truman

Williams, Nathan Bryan, Reuven Frye and Jessie Legister, finished behind champion Montclair.

Sophomore Ian Spoelstra and junior Juan Hernandez finished third and fourth in the pole vault.

"At this point of the season, this is all I've been thinking about," Ricketts said. "First it was the league, county and now the sectionals. This is my first season winning anything. I feel confident and the team has been working hard. We're strong and we're in a good place going forward."

The sectional title is Passaic Tech's third championship this season. Last month the Bulldogs won the Big North Liberty and Passaic County championships in convincing fashion.

The top six from each event qualify for the Group 1 and 4 championships Feb. 29.

Aviators soars to title

Hasbrouck Heights captured its first sectional boys title since 2016, edging Glen Rock in Group 1 by just three points, 49-46.

Senior Vincent Sedlmeir was the Aviators' lone champion, winning the 55 hurdles in 8.25.

"I felt very confident coming in. My sophomore year I came in fourth place and last year I lost by less than a second. So this year I set some goals and I knew what I wanted," Sedlmeir said. "I didn't give in. I trained a lot during the offseason and built up my strength and legs. I still want to reach my ultimate goal of 7.9 seconds. I'm right there. The team is working together and everyone is working hard. We're focused."

Similar to Passaic Tech, Heights accumulated most of their team points with top six finishes. Senior Maliki Bur-

"I'm really happy with the boys performance today. We had help in the distance events with third, fourth and fifth place finishes in the 3200 to give us 12 points. The Sedlmeir twins had a great meet. We put John (Sedlmeir) in the 400 today for the first time this year and he came in third from an unseeded heat and that gave us key points right there. We're healthy and trying to stay focused."

In the distance events, junior Nathan Armstrong of Pompton Lakes doubled up, winning both the mile (4:29.02) and two mile (9:52.12).

"I wasn't mentally prepared last year and that's the difference between this year and last," said Armstrong, who didn't qualify in either event last season. "I feel strong going into next week."

Another double winner was New Milford's Robbie Tormo, who claimed the 400 (51.48) and the 55 (6.82).

Glen Rock girls win by slimmest of margins

Two time defending team champion Glen Rock won a third straight Group 1 title, edging runner-up Hasbrouck Heights by just half a point, 44 – 43.50.

The Panthers got a boost from senior Karina Roze, who won the shot put with a throw of 35-09.25. It was Roze's season debut, after missing the last few months with a shoulder injury.

Senior Lindsey Burstiner finished second in the 55 hurdles behind cham-

Perez leads area contingent at Group Championships

TOMS RIVER - By now, you would think that Angelina Perez recognizes her synchronicity and is no longer surprised with her success

But even after all her accomplishments the last few months, the Lakeland track standout is still in awe after each big race.

Perez shocked herself again on Saturday when she won the girls 3200 race at the NJSIAA Group Championships at the Bennett Center.

The sophomore ran a personal best 10:45.41 to win the Group 2 title and qualified for next weekend's season ending State Meet of Champions.

"I'm really happy with my performance. It's a personal best since last week's sectional championships," said Perez, competing in her first indoor track season. "I felt more comfortable today. This is probably the calmest I've ever been before a meet. I usually get nervous the day before a meet, but not

"I'm just really excited to be going to the Meet of Champions. I'm still amazed at what I can do. I was not expecting this

Perez crossed ahead of sophomore teammate Abigail Horevay, who finished second in 11:09.96.

Two weeks ago, the teammates went back-to-back in the 2 mile at the Sectional Championships, with Perez recording a 10:48.05 and Horevay an 11:16.85. Both showed improvement on Saturday.

"I knew I was seeded first and my time was a couple of seconds faster than second place," Perez said. "I was just trying to keep calm and I think it definitely helped me with this race. I'm just hoping to do my best and give it all I've got next week."

Originally scheduled to compete in the mile earlier in the day, Perez and

Lakeland coach Damiano Conforti decided to skip out on that race for strategy and precautionary reasons.

"After I ran the 1600 at the sectional meet, I was getting some pain in the side of my foot and it was going to the sole," Perez revealed. "So I knew that I was seeded higher for the 3200 and if I made it to the Meet of Champions that was what I was going to run, so I wanted to save it all for that race today.

Perez was one of six North Jersey girls to win individual and respective Group titles Saturday.

The top three athletes and teams in each of the 10 standard events advance to the SMOC March 8 at Ocean Breeze in Staten Island along with 12 wild cards in each event, from all six groups

Hawthorne senior Alexis Byfield was the first champion of the day when she claimed the Group 155 hurdles.

To be honest, I was in it to just compete to have fun. It's my senior year and my coaches pushed me as hard as they could," said Byfield, who ran a personal best 8.56. "They said have fun. My goal was to break the school record.

"I feel like if I just have fun again, it's less stress and less pressure and I feel like next week it's going to be the same. It's cool to just go to the state meet of champions. I didn't make it this far last year. I'm going to have as much fun as I can and continue to work hard. It's now the mental part I want to work on."

Demarest senior Jada Sewell won the Group 2 shot put with a throw of 44-00, ninth best throw in Bergen County his-

"I learned from the mile about finish-

ing the turn and using my stride and arms more," Wennersten said. "I used the same tactic as last week of pacing off someone else and then decisively making a move when I was ready. I keep getting more knowledge every day, even at practice and from others. Even when I lose I feel I learn more than when I win

"I'm not majorly disappointed with my performance in the mile. But I feel like I may have either made a move too early or didn't push myself at the end. I still have to decide between the mile and two mile for the state meet of champions. I'm not sure yet. I feel like I'm better in the 3200, but I also want to get revenge in the mile."

PC's Fede doubles

Mariah Fede of Paramus Catholic scored an impressive double and seven other North Jersey athletes won events Friday night at the Non-Public A and B Championships at the Bennett Center.

Fede, who has led the state all year in the 200 and 300 meters and the 55 meter hurdles, won the 55 hurdles race in the NP A meet in 8.19 seconds, edging Paul VI star Aliya Rae Garozzo, who had finished ahead of Fede at last year's Non-Public A 400 intermediate hurdles

Fede, who is headed for Northeastern in the fall to join former teammates Isabelle Dely and Kennedee Cox, won the 400 comfortably in 57.72, just off her personal best and added a fourth place in the 55 meter dash (7.26) in a busy first hour of the meet.

State Meet of Champions has all-new look

There's a new look for the State Meet of Champions which will be held Sunday at 10 a.m.

It starts with the venue, the beautiful Ocean Breeze Center in Staten Island, which will allow athletes to excel in a modern airy setting, and fans to actually see entire races and field events.

The shift to Ocean Breeze from the cramped Bennett Center in Toms River will also allow the long jump and triple jump to be held concurrently with the other events on the program. The long jump was added last winter but competition was held after school with no other events in the building and very few spectators.

This year, the long jump is back and added is the triple jump, giving the meet four showcase events (including the 200 and 4-x-800 relays) in addition to the ten standard winter events.

Qualification for the showcase events came from the top 24 entrants based on their seasonal performances. The standard winter events had 30 qualifiers, the top three in each group and the next 12 best performers from the group meet. For the first time, the order of events has a time schedule attached.

The top eight finishers in each event will medal.

Here's a look at North Jersey medal chances, event by event:

On the track

Girls 4-x-800 relay (10 a.m.): Union Catholic, Ridge and Haddon-

field are all within about a second of each other and are the favorites to win. Ramsey, Clifton and Ramapo have chances to medal if they can in the 9:35 range. River Dell was third last year and is entered again this year.

Boys 4-x-800 relay (10:25); Ridge and Kingsway have been among the best teams in the country all year and should have a terrific battle for the win. If Ridgewood runs the way it did at the Varsity Classic, the Maroons should grab a medal here. NV/Old Tappan and Clifton hope to run fast enough to qualify for the Penn Relays in April. The meet record of 7:56.49 is likely to fall. Girls 55 hurdles trials (10:45): Mariah Fede has been the fastest girl in the state all year, winning the Eastern States in a state leading 8.02. But Eastern Regional junior Jailya Ash had the fastest time at groups and Fede barely edged Aliya Rae Garozzo of Paul VI. The winner will come from this group. Group 1 champ Alexis Byfield of Hawthorne looks for a personal best.

Boys 55 hurdles trials (11:05): Jordany Dely of Paramus Catholic had his best race of the year at the Big North meet at Ocean Breeze but the Non-Public A champ needs to improve his start to have a shot at the finals and a medal. Dwight Henry of Irvington and Terrel Williams of Columbia are the favorites.

Girls 55 meters trials (Tl:20): Sanai Bryant of Dumont has seemingly improved her personal best in every meet. And if the soph can run a few hundreths faster, she can earn a spot in the final and an unexpected medal. Lauren Princz of Egg Harbor Township is the favorite, but four other runners are within .05 of her seed time.

Boys 55 meters trials (Ti:30): Defending champ Louis Akpadago of Hamilton North and James Bivins of Donovan Catholic are the favorites in this race and the meet record of 6.38, first set in 2008 and tied by Akpadago last year, could fall. Freshman Allan Hilton Clarke and sophomore Fabian France set personal records last week and Ray Schmitt of Lakeland has run well at Ocean Breeze but they would need to run personal bests in order to make the final and medal.

Girls 400 (Tt-40): Fede would have a shot at winning a medal, but she'll skip this race leaving Clifton's Brianna Rubio the area's best hope here. Grace Smiechowski of Northern Highlands and Sophia Vernieri of Ramapo look for personal bests. Jade Pope of Pennsauken, Nylah Perry of Winslow Township and Lily Orr of Rumson Fair Haven are the race favorites.

Boys 400 (Ti:50): Gabe Moronta of Pleasantville may try the 400-800 double, and is favored here over Liam O'Hara of CBA and Ramy Berberena of North Brunswick. Jordan Ricketts of Passaic Tech is the top local medal hope.

Girls 1,600 (12:25): Ridgewood's Camryn Wennersten was second in the race last year but will run the 3,200 meters this year. That leaves the favorite's role to Katie Hamilton of Westfield, Emma McGill of Voorhees and Lilly Shapiro of Colts Neck. Ridgewood's AnnaMarie Tretola and Sarah Policano are the top hopes for medals and hope to break 5:10.

Boys 1,600 (12:45): It's a terrific field with eight sub 4:21 runners in the field, led by Liam Murphy of Allentown and Jack Jennings of Mendham but it's unlikely any North Jersey runner will medal. Nathan Armstrong of Pompton Lakes looks to improve on his personal best of 4:23.89.

Girls 800 (1:00): Only two girls in the more than 40 years of the State Meet of Champions have won their event four times, Olivia Baker of Columbia (2011-2014 400) and Nicole Sims of Plainfield (1990-1993 shot put). Victora Vanriele of Gov. Livingston will be the third and should break her own meet record of 2:08.81. An-

drea Dubbels of Clifton and Amanda Mircovich of River Dell, coming off solid group races are significant medal hopefuls.

Boys 800 (1:15): Jordan Kaplan of Monroe Township and Nick Medeiros of Old Bridge are threats to defending champion Elija Brown of Union Catholic. Nick Ortiz of Passaic has had a terrific stretch and should medal, and Lakeland's Zach Voll who has had an excellent season and soph Ryan Pena of Hackensack can also contend for a medal.

Girls 200 (t20): Fede was third last year but has the three fastest races of the season and is the only girl under 25 seconds this winter. She is favored over Princz and Jewel Ash of Eastern. Maris Rodriguez of Holy Angels and Rubio can also medal and probably need to break 25.60 to do it. The meet record of 24.94 should fall. Boys 200 (t:30): No one has broken 22 seconds this year but Akpadago, Bivins and O'Hara are all capable of that. And they're the 4-5-6 seeds! Quincy Hendy of West Side, Greg McQueen of Elizabeth and Aaron Stillitano of Middletown South have the three fastest times of the winter. Jemel Carter of Paramus Catholic leads the local contingent.

Girls 3,200 (1:40): Potentially the race of the meet, especially for North Jersey fans. Group 2 champ Angelina Perez of Lakeland and Group 4 champ Camryn Wennersten of Ridgewood meet for the first time on the track as the top two sophomores in the state and two of the top 10 sophs in the country. They're the top two seeds in this race, although Laura Baeyans of Watchung Hills and Nicole Vanasse of Pingry are also championship contenders. Abigail Horevay, also a Lakeland soph is also in position to medal, and join her mother, 1993 1,600 third place winner Amy Mizzone as an SMOC indoor medalist.

Boys 3,200 (1:55): It's not clear who will run this race and who will pick the 1,600 but there are eight entrants who ran 9:17 or better last week. Murphy won last year in 8:54.22. Lakeland's Jesse Campoverde should be in position to break 9:20 and could med-

Girls 4-x-400 relay (2:15): Ramapo was fifth last year but will have to bid for a medal from the next to last heat. Union Catholic is a heavy favorite but there are a dozen teams including the Green Raiders that could medal.

Boys 4-x-400 relay (2:50): It's been five years since a North Jersey boys team medalled here and more than 30 since a Passaic County team has placed but Passaic Tech has every chance of breaking those streaks. Union Catholic is a heavy favorite to end the running portion of the meet with a win.

In the field

Boys Pole vault: It's been quite a year in the event with Bradley Jelmert of Watchung Hills likely to break the meet record of 16 feet and take a run at the state indoor record of 17 feet set 40 years ago by Bill Lange. Jelmert will break a three year streak of Bergen County winners if he wins but Pascack Hills soph Max Zuckerman, the first Bergen 10th grader to clear 15 feet should continue the medal streak which began in 2009. Look for Shaun Herlihy of NV/Old Tappan to be in the medal mix as well.

Boys Long jump: Bivins and Highland Regional's Floyd Whitaker are the heavy favorites but North Jersey has five potential medal winners in seniors Justin Rhee of River Dell, Matt Brunelle of Emerson and Luke Bussetti of Northern Highlands, junior Rashawn Markman and soph Vanton Evans of Englewood and a 22 foot jump could cinch a too eight finish.

Girls Long jump: Nakaja Weaver of North Brunswick is the defending champ but Bridget McNally of Paul VI and A'Liyah Thomas of Union Catholic have jumped further this year. Isabella Sing of Rutherford and Fiona Carter of Paramus Catholic are the only North Jersey entrants and both underclassmen should gain experience.

Boys Shot Put: North Jersey throwers have medalled in nine of the last 10 meets, but no one has won since Bergen Catholic's Shaun McGregor won in 1996. But NV/Old Tappan's Pat Passalac-qua could end that streak as he has the top throw in the state this year, and fifth best in Bergen history, 61-7 3/4 in winning Group 2 last week. John Purvis of Winslow Township has battled Passalacqua all year and handed the Columbia bound senior his only defeat before losing the Eastern States and Group 3 meets to him. Northern Highlands' John Griffith and River Dell's Josh lyonsi should also medal and VeRon Garrison of Englewood can also grab one.

12:30 p.m.

Girls Pole vault: Caroline Dannenbaum of Pingry is the defending champion and is favored again. But last year's runner-up, Marisa DiGia of NV/Old Tappan is vaulting as well as she ever has after a Group 3 meet record 12-0 3/4 vault and should give Dannenbaum a battle. Non-Public B champ Grace Kellogg is also vaulting well and could be a dark horse to grab a medal if she can clear 10-6 on her first attempt.

Boys Triple jump: It would be fitting if Whitaker becomes the first indoor state champ in this event, after dominating the event last spring and this winter. Bergen Tech junior Cole Goodman has a great shot at a medal and Rhee is a contender here as well.

Girls Triple jump: Felicia Quainoo of Union Catholic, Teja Brown of Pope John and Dai'jah Wiggins of Elizabeth are the top seeds here. But look out for Tenaffy's Sophia Dongaris, who has a 37-3 jump to her credit, less than 10 inches from the top seed. Alejandra Bartutis of North Bergen is also a potential medalist.

Boys High jump: Can Jamier Wright-Collins break the three year Kennedy silver medal "jinx" and win gold? Jason Thobourne (2017), Jadon Watson (2018) and Wright-Collins himself (2019) have each won Group 4 and finished second in the SMOC. Wright-Collins loves Ocean Breeze, clearing his indoor best 6-9 there less than a month ago. He'll get a battle from Kameron Smith of Willingboro, Aden Tomeo of Audubon and Nate Robertson of Willingboro. Non-Public A champ Andre Barrett of Paramus Catholic and Bergen champ Tommy Cahill can medal and a 6-4 clearance would probably clinch one.

Girls High jump: The state's best high jumper, Jenna Rogers of Rutherford, will be throwing the shot while this is going on after skipping the state series because of a concern about the Bennett Center site. That probably means that the title will go to Carly Tarentino of A.L. Johnson with at least 10 other jumpers in the field over 5-4, including Gretchen Haray of NVJDemarest and Kaia Paulsen of Pascack Hills. There are nine North Jersey entrants in this event, more than in any other event.

Girls Shot put: Jada Sewell of NV/Demarest has had a terrific year but even she has to be surprised to be the top seed after most of the attention went to Bryanna Wilson of Donovan Catholic, Denae Hill of West Orange and Elizabeth Makar of Pinelands, but Sewell's two foot PR of 44 feet in winning Group 2 will do that. Brynn Madonna of Northern Highlands won Group 3 last week and should medal again. Look for Alyssa Campbell of Bergenfield to contend. And don't count out 2019 medalist Karina Roze of Glen Rock, who's coming back from injury.

4 get gold at State Meet of Champions

Mariah Fede and Angelina Perez are ready for a break, after a long and productive indoor track season. So when things weren't going so well for them during Sunday's State Meet of Champions at Ocean Breeze on Staten Island, both could have mentally checked out, satisfied with silver medals for second place after a season of great races.

Neither did and today both have gold medals and records after terrific performances, both mentally and physically.

Fede, the Northeastern-bound senior from Paramus Catholic, had finished second in the 55 hurdles earlier in the meet, despite having led New Jersey all year and having won the Eastern States championship two weeks ago. She was beaten by Jailya Ash of Eastern in the hurdles, not being able to overcome a slower than usual start.

"But I had my eye on the 200 all year, because I'm much more consistent in the 200 as you could see," said Fede, who came into the race as the only New Jersey girl under 25 seconds this year.

Her 200 start wasn't much better than her hurdle start, but it didn't matter as her ferocious final 50 meters gave her an easy five meter win in a meet and Bergen County record 24.34 seconds, nearly a half second of 55 winner Lauren Princz of Egg Harbor Township.

"It felt good to redeem myself from the hurdles," said Fede, who will run the championship 200 and Emerging Elite hurdles at next week's New Balance Indoor Nationals before taking a short break. "I wanted this badly." Perez, the sophomore from Lakeland, who has been a phenomenon from the first race of cross-country season six months ago, faced a different challenge in the 3,200 meters. She was a slight favorite but called herself "stressed" going into the race.

"It's been difficult this week," said Perez. "At the end of cross country I was physically drained and this winter I was mentally drained, (fellow sophomore and teammate) Abigail Horevay and I were trying to help each other all week but we were both so stressed."

So when Perez was passed by Ridgewood sophomore Camryn Wennersten with seven laps to go in the 16-lap race, she could have checked out and settled for second, knowing that she was "only" a sophomore and there would be other chances.

"I was trying but in the back of my mind I thought about just finishing the race when Camryn passed me and went far ahead," said Perez, who trailed by nearly 40 meters with three laps to go.

"I decided I really wanted it so I tried to push through the race," said Perez, who cut the lead in half on lap 14, pulled even at the bell and sped away in 37.21, her fastest 200 of the race, on the final lap to win in a Passaic County record 10:36.48, to become Passaic County's first 3200 champ since Cathy Feeney captured the 1989 race for Wayne Valley.

"I wasn't expecting that at all, but it's certainly going to help me with my confidence in the future."

Favorites Passalacqua and Wright-Collins finish the job

All season, NV/Old Tappan shot put-

ter Patrick Passalacqua and Kennedy high jumper Jamier Wright-Collins had led the state in their respective events. Sunday they completed their all but unbeaten seasons with impressive starts to finish with wins at the first state meet ever held outside the state.

Passalacqua took the lead in the shot on his first of 58-9, extended it to 59-6 1/2 on his fourth throw and then sealed the deal with his second best throw ever, 61-4 1/2 on his fifth attempt to become the first North Jersey athlete to win the boys shot since Bergen Catholic's Shaun McGregor won in 1996.

"Nobody was really at their best today except for Chris (runner-up Tavarone of Morris Knolls, who was second with a three-foot PR at 60-5 3/4) because everyone was tight and trying to do too much," said Passalacqua. "Coach (Peter) Dunn told me coming in that might happen and he said 60-11 was going to be enough to win."

"I had a great opener with the 58-9 but then I had two poor throws and had some things to correct in the finals," said Passalacqua, who had a little scare when Tavarone made his big toss just before Passalacqua had his final chance.

"I didn't see where it landed, but he had such a big smile, I was a little concerned," said Passalacqua, who readied himself to try and take the lead back if necessary.

But the mark came and, for once, Passalacqua relaxed.

"I guess I had a sigh of relief and wasn't quite as focused on my last throw because I had already won."

There wasn't as much drama for Wright-Collins, until he tried to clear the magical seven-foot barrier.

He'd missed at 6-6, giving Nate Robertson of Willingboro the brief lead, but a first attempt clearance at 6-8 all but assured him of becoming the first North Jersey high jumper to win the event since Kennedy's Ron Thomas won in 1992

And after Robertson missed all three of his attempts at 6-10, Wright-Collins cleared on his final try, setting a personal best and giving him his first chances at seven feet.

"I had a real chance on my last jump at seven feet," said Wright-Collins, who broke a three-year streak of Kennedy silver medals in the event, the last own silver a year ago. "I really love jumping here"

Wright-Collins tried to stay humble all year despite being the season long favorite in the event.

"I tried not to keep the light on myself and kept working hard every day," said Wright-Collins, who will play football at Rutgers. "It paid off."

Both Passalacqua (who will play football at Columbia) and Wright-Collins will compete at the New Balance Nationals later this week at the Armory Track Center. Both are expected to be in contention for All-American status.

"I just want to have fun and do as well as i can," said Passalacqua. Wright-Collins echoed the thought.

"I'll do the best I can do to jump as high as I can," said Wright-Collins.

What we learned this past season

Here are five things we learned from the 2020 indoor track season in North Jersey:

Mariah Fede, Angelina Perez dominate

Two names stood out throughout the 2020 indoor track season, one who was expected to be one of the best in the state from the end of last winter and one who hadn't even run in the 2019 indoor track season.

Paramus Catholic senior Mariah Fede has had a terrific career. But sometimes she seemed to be eclipsed by the PC class of 2019, which included triple State Meet of Champs winner Tiffany Bautista, Isabelle Dely and Kennedee Cox. But Fede's spectacular 400 hurdles performance at last spring's State Meet of Champs made her one of the state's top returning athletes and she delivered all season.

Fede won the 200 meters at the State Meet of Champions, running a Bergen County record 24.34 seconds and finished nearly half a second ahead of the runner-up. She also took second in the 55 hurdles final and recorded the fastest time of any New Jersey runner this year, in winning the Eastern States Championship.

Lakeland sophomore Angelina Perez didn't even run winter track last year and made a very limited impact as a good freshman 800 runner last spring, finishing as the 120th-ranked freshman in New Jersey last spring.

But Perez was the breakout cross country runner of the fall, winning the Passaic County championship, easily, and taking second in the state Group 2 championship before a late season illness pushed her way back in the State Meet of Champions.

When the winter season started, Perez was ready. She won her first race of the year, running a solid 3,200 at the Coach Glynn Classic in December at Ocean Breeze on December 28. By the time she ran her final race 10 weeks later, also at the Staten Island facility, she had won 8 of 9 races, and improved her time in every single race, with her Passaic County record run of 10:36.48, #19 in the U.S.A.

A great senior class

Even though it is still nearly two weeks to the originally scheduled start to the 2020 New Jersey high school spring season, it is becoming apparent that even if there is a spring season, it will be unlike any such season in scholastic sports history.

and sixth at 55.

Brynn Madonna

Northern Highlands junior, shot put

Madonna had a breakthrough season, setting school records in the shot put five times in 11 meets, capped by a toss of 40-7½ to finish sixth in the State Meet of Champions. She won the Big North Freedom, North 1, Group 3 sectional and won the state Group 3 title. Her best throw puts her in 16th place in Bergen County with a year of throwing left

Angelina Perez

Lakeland Sophomore, 1,600 and 3,200 meters

Perez, who was the Passaic County cross country champ last fall, didn't run indoors last year but ran nine races this past winter. She won eight of the nine, losing only the Passaic 1,600 to Dubbels.

She ran faster in every race she ran that she had the race before, taking titles in the Passaic, North 1, Group 2, state Group 2 and State Meet of Champions 3,200 races, setting a Passaic County record of 10:36.48 in the final one.

Jenna Rogers

Rutherford senior, high jump, shot put and pentathlon

Nebraska gets one of North Jersey's all-time greats next fall, and the former National high jump champion gets to just high jump again.

The state's best high jumper won all six high jump meets she entered and had the state's top jump of 5-9. She also won six shot put titles including the NJIC and North 2, Group 2 meet and won the Bergen pentathlon with the second-best score in meet history.

Brianna Rubio

Clifton senior, 55 to 600 meters

She won the 200 at the Big North Liberty and Passaic Championships, won the 300 at the Paul Schwartz Invitational and took third at the Tom Zaccone 600. She also medalled in four 55 meter dash finals this winter. But Rubio owned the 400, winning major titles at the league, Passaic County and North 1, Group 4 state sectional meets. She ranks third all-time on the Passaic 200 and 400 lists.

Jada Sewell

NV/Demarest senior, shot put

Before this season, Sewell had just two meets where she threw the shot more than 40 feet. This winter, she had eight meets and threw the shot over 40 feet eight times with her best a throw of 44 feet in winning the state Group 3 championship. That was her fifth win of the winter, including the Big North American, Bergen championship and North 1, group 2 sectional. Her 44 foot throw leaves her ninth in Bergen history.

Camryn Wennersten

Ridgewood sophomore, 800 to 3,200 meters

Five seasons, five North Jersey selections for Wennersten, who is well on her way to joining the pantheon of all-time greats in North Jersey. She won the 800 and 3,200 races at the Big North Freedom meet, doubled the 1,600 and 3,200 at North 1, Group 4 sectionals, won the state Group 4 3,200 title and led most of the way at the State Meet of Champions 3,200 before placing second.

Ramapo 4-x-400 relay

Cortney Lander, Izzie Anzaldo, Sophia Schwartz and Sophia Vernieri Ramapo is synonomous with the 4-x-400 relay, and this year's was no exception. The Green Raiders ran 10 high quality races, winning five of them, including the Big North Freedom, Bergen Relays Large Schools, North 1, Group 3 and Bergen County championships. Their top time if 3:58.11 is third-best in Bergen County history.

Clifton 4-x-800 relay

Mia Dubac, Remy Dubac, May Yuasa and Andrea Dubbels

The Mustangs won early season meets at the Tom Zaccone Invitational and the Paul Schwartz Invitational and took second at the Spiked Shoe Holiday Festival.

The talented quartet then crushed the Passaic County record by running 9:41.96 in a second place finish at the Metropolitan Invitational, then took it even lower, running 9:36.75 for fourth at the State Meet of Champions.

Sara VandenAssem, Ridgewood — Multitalented hurdler/jumper had injury issues which held her back.

Ellie Veenhof, Ridgewood — Steady consistent point scorer for the power-house Margons.

Zuania Victoria, Passaic Valley Helped mold a Hornet resurgence.

Jalen Wynn, Holy Angels — Steady relay leg for Angels' top 4-x-200 and 4-x-400 teams.

Champions All

Until about 20 years ago, the indoor track season had few events where team scoring was included. But league championships by division became the norm in the now defunct NNJIL, NBIL and BCSL in the late 1990s, state sectionals began in 2008 the Big North started in 2011 and the NJIC followed suit in 2013.

This season, nine teams combined to

win the major team titles awarded. None won state group championships and none were first time winners of an event. Here's a look at the winners:

Ridgewood won its third straight Big North Freedom, North 1, Group 4 section and Bergen Relays Large Schools titles. It was the Maroons' fourth Big North, sixth sectional and record 20th Bergen Relays title. Clifton won its second straight Big North Liberty and third straight Passaic County title. It was the Mustangs' record setting 10th Passaic crown.

NV/Demarest won its 2nd straight Big North Patriot title and fifth overall and it's second straight North 1, Group 2 sectional title, both by one point over Ramsey.

The Rams however, still won a second straight Big North American and fourth overall and a second straight Bergen Relays Small Schools and seventh overall. IHA won a fifth Big North United title, it's first since 2014 and a 2nd straight Bergen Relays Non-Public title and eighth overall relays crown.

Glen Rock took its third straight North 1, Group 1 sectional crown, Hasbrouck Heights its fifth NJIC title overall, Lakeland its fifth Big North Independence and Northern Highlands its fourth North 1, Group 3 sectional title.

The winner will be revealed at the Sports Awards show, which will be held June 16 at Bergen Performing Arts Center in Englewood.

FIRST TEAM

Nathan Armstrong

Pompton Lakes junior, 800 to 3,200-meter run

After a wonderful cross-country season, Armstrong was even better in indoor track, earning fifth place in the State Meet of Champions 1,600 running a North Jersey leading and No. 2 Passaic County all-time mark of 4:19.96. He doubled the 1,600 and 3,200 at the NJIC meet and the North 1 Group 1 state sectional meet.

Tommy Cahill

Ramapo senior, high and triple jumps

The Bucknell-bound jumper excelled in both jumps throughout his career, earning a sixth-place medal at the State Meet of Champs in the high jump. He won three golds in the high jump, including the Bergen County title and was second in North Jersey with an indoor best of 6-5.

He also won the Big North Freedom long and triple jumps and ranked 14th in the state in the triple jump.

Jesse Campoverde

Lakeland senior, 1,600 and 3,200meter runs

Campoverde's last race of the season was his best as the senior ran a 12-second PR in the State Meet of Champions and finished ninth in the 3,200 meters with a stunning 9:17.76 time, tops in North Jersey this year and second all-time in Passaic County history. Campoverde is 10th all-time in Passaic 1,600 history.



The versatile Dely won the Big North United 400 title in, arguably, his fourthbest event. He won the Bergen County pentathlon with 3,373 points, seventh in the U.S. this year and eighth in Bergen County history. He also won the Non-Public A in the 55 hurdles, medaled in the State Meet of Champions in the same event and placed in the Non-Public A high jump.

Here are five things we learned from the 2020 indoor track season in North Jersey:

The move to Ocean Breeze was well worth it

After some hesitation, the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association took its State Meet of Champions out of the state from the Bennett Center in Toms River to Ocean Breeze in Staten Island.

The meet, aside from an inexplicable error in the seeded heat of the Boys 1,600, was a rousing success.

The meet's first 30 years at Princeton, on the slow Jadwin Gym track, seemed to be a stage show with spectators far away from the action and the shot put contested in the basement far away from the main track.

The folks at the Bennett Center stepped up a dozen years ago and filled a void left when Princeton priced themselves out of the meet and couldn't provide enough dates for the full state schedule.

The venue remains adequate for sectional competition and has been very helpful for South Jersey teams and athletes, but the hard surface made it difficult to high jump, and it remains a nightmare for spectators. And holding long and triple jump competitions at the same time as track events is impossible.

At Ocean Breeze, the air is fresh, the venue is brightly lit and spectators can spectate comfortably. The track is fast, the field event venues are top notch and the performances, up and down the entry list were sensational.

If only we could take the next step and move the group meets there as

Pat Passalacqua and Jamier Wright-Collins are really good

Coming into the winter season, both Pat Passalacqua of NV/Old Tappan and Jamier Wright-Collins of Kennedy had secured their college athletic

Eastern States meet and sixth in the State Meet of Champions.

Nicholas Ortiz

Passaic senior, 800 to 1,600 meters

After a promising start to his season, winning the 800 and 1,600 at the Big North Liberty meet and taking the 1,000 at the Paul Schwartz Invitational, Ortiz put together a strong fifth-place finish at the loaded Varsity Classic. He won the North 1, Group 4 sectional, took third in Group 4 and was sixth in the State Meet of Champions in a stunning 1:54.25, tops in North Jersey this year and third on the all-time Passaic County list.

Pat Passalacqua

NV/Old Tappan senior, shot put

One stat jumps out from a plethora of remarkable statistics from Passalacqua's 2019-20 indoor season: There were 7 throws of more than 60 feet in New Jersey this season. Passalacqua had 5 of them. He threw in 11 meets, winning 10. He set personal bests in

seven meets with a best of 61-7%, fifth in Bergen history and seventh in the nation. He became Bergen County's first boy state shot champ in 24 years.

Ray Schmitt

Lakeland senior, 55 and 200 meters Hopefully we'll get to see this former baseball player make his outdoor track debut after a consistently outstanding indoor season. He won major 55 titles at the Paul Schwartz, Big North Independence and Passaic County and earned five other major medals, including sixths at the Eastern States, Group 2 and the State Meet of Champions.

Jamier Wright-Collins

Kennedy senior, high jump, long jump and 55 meters

What Passalacqua did in the shot put, Wright-Collins did in the high jump. A fellow football recruit (Passalacqua to Columbia, Wright-Collins to Rutgers), Wright-Collins competed in 10 high jumps, winning 9, and cleared 6-10 in winning the State Meet of Champions. He also won the Passaic, league, Group 4 and Eastern States titles and finished with the No. 6 performance in the nation and No. 2 Passaic all-time.

Max Zuckerman

Pascack Hills sophomore pole vault

A solid freshman, he cleared 11-6 last spring and started his winter season with an astounding vault of 14-3 to win the Energice Coaches Hall of Fame Invitational. He won titles at the Big North Patriot, Bergen County and North 1, Group 2 sectional, was second in state Group 2 and was fifth in the State Meet of Champions, finishing as the top underclassmen in the state.

Passaic Tech 4-x-400 relay

Jordan Ricketts, Ian Steinberg, Amair Buffaloe and Keshon Holt

Ricketts and Buffaloe returned from last year's top squad, and this year's quartet was even better. After winning the Spike Shoe Invitational, Big North Liberty and Passaic County titles, the quartet was second at the North 1, Group 4 sectional meet, fourth in Group 4 and 5th in the State Meet of Champions.

The SMOC time of 3:23.58, set a Passaic County record and ranked No. 7 in New Jersey and No. 26 in the country. It was the first time in more than 30 years that a Passaic County boys relay placed in the State Meet of Champions.

Ridgewood 4-x-800 relay

Ryan Seaver, Aidan Sheridan, Mason Zamboldi and Jay Boogaert

This veteran team recorded the top time in the area, 8:07.22, taking second at the Varsity Classic and was the only North Jersey team to medal at the State Meet of Champions when it ran 8:11.57 for eighth place, paced by Sheridan's sub 2:00 split.

futures by committing to play football at Columbia University and Rutgers, respectively.

But both seniors were among the best returnees in the state in the shot put and high jump, respectively, and went into the season wanting to prove how good they were.

They did.

Each lost just one time all season, and swept sectional, league, county, Eastern States and group titles before dominating their competition at the State Meet of Champions.

Passalacqua has seven personal bests including a throw of 61-7½, fifth all-time in Bergen County and seventh best in the U.S. this year, while Wright-Collins jumped a personal best of 6-10, second all-time in Passaic and No. 6 in the U.S. this year.

The only thing that stopped both of them from earning official All-American status was the coronavirus outbreak that canceled the New Balance Indoor Nationals.

Passaic County boys can run

There are six running events in indoor track that don't involve hurdles. Five different Passaic County boys from four different schools led North Jersey in their respective events this season, four won medals at the State Meet of Champions and four are part of our All North Jersey team.

Ray Schmitt (55) and Jesse Campoverde (3,200) of Lakeland, Nathan

Armstrong of Pompton Lakes (1,600), Nick Ortiz (800) of Passaic and Jordan Ricketts of Passaic Tech (400) all moved up the all-time Passaic County list this year with their area leading performances with Schmitt, Armstrong and Campoverde all finishing second all-time on the list in their respective races and Ortiz third. Ricketts is "only" No. 10 in this event, but he's just a junior, and he is part of the Passaic County record holding Passaic Tech 4-x-400 relay

Championship rundown

Nine different schools won team titles this winter including several who won specific titles for the first time.

Fort Lee won its first Bergen Relays Small Schools title despite winning just one event and Paramus Catholic its first Large School Relays title. Lakeland won the North 1, Group 2 state sectional title, becoming the first ever Passaic County boys team to win a winter track sectional. A week later Passaic Tech won the North 1, Group 4 title.


